At the outset, Director & Chairman Senate welcomed the members of the Senate and accorded permission to present the agenda of the meeting for consideration of the Senate.

S 31.01 To confirm the minutes of the 30th meeting of the Senate held on 6.6.2017.

The Senate confirmed the minutes of the 30th meeting of the Senate held on 6.6.2017.

S 31.02 To note the actions taken report on the minutes of the 30th meeting of the Senate held on 6.6.2017.

The Senate noted the action taken on the minutes of the 29th meeting of the Senate held on 6.6.2017. At sr. no. 30.11 of action taken report, Prof. A. Swarup, the Chairman of the Committee informed that the report has been





submitted to the Director on 26.10.2017. It was decided that the report will be taken up in the next Senate meeting

S 31.03 To note the minutes of 52nd meeting of SCSA held on 13.9.2017.

The Senate noted the minutes of 52nd meeting of SCSA held on 13.9.2017.

S 31.04 To modify norms for re-continuation of GATE scholarship to M.Tech. students based on CGPA.

The Senate had detailed deliberations on re-continuation of GATE scholarship to M.Tech. students based on CGPA, once it is discontinued due to reappear or lower CGPA as per CCMT scholarship eligibility rules. It was decided to restore the M.Tech. GATE scholarship (from the day) when eligibility for GATE scholarship is reattained. The decision of the Senate is to be communicated to the MHRD.

S 31.05 To re-consider policy for M.Tech. students to do their dissertation work at Central/State govt. labs/Institutions.

The Senate resolved to allow M Tech. students to do their dissertation work at Central/State Govt. labs/Institutions/public sector & private industries of repute, subject to the conditions as approved in the 52nd meeting of SCSA held on 13.8.2017 vide item no. 52.2. In case of paid internships, no scholarship will be provided by the institute. Further, Senate authorized the Senate Chairman to review the conditions depending upon the nature of internship, if required

S 31.06 To consider the request of Mr. Mandeep Kumar, M.Tech. student to submit M.Tech. thesis beyond 5 years, under PG regulation, appeal 5.5.

The Senate deliberated on the request of Mr. Mandeep Kumar, M.Tech. student to submit M.Tech. thesis beyond 5 years in light of the academic regulations for PG programme. After long deliberations, it was decided that no extension can be given in such cases.



S 31.07 To consider and decide norms for change of branch to B.Tech. students.

The Senate decided that the existing rules for branch change cannot be changed. Hence the requests of two students of PIE branch cannot be acceded to. Further, the Senate decided that the branch change for new scheme for academic year 2017-18 will be implemented after 1st semester and it should be only on the basis of the performance of the students in first semester. Other modalities of the branch change will remain same. Further it was decided that Dean (Academic) should issue the instructions as required, for in time declaration of results and to maintain the uniformity of evaluation of answer sheets (where more than one teachers are associated for any course).

S 31.08 To consider and decide mercy chance to appear for backlogs for the students who have completed maximum duration of their respective degree programmes.

After detailed deliberation, the Senate agreed in principle to give mercy chance to the students of 2009 batch who could not complete their B.Tech. degree in stipulated period of eight years. In principle it was decided to give two chances for reappear (this time it may be May/June 2018 & Nov/Dec 2018). The Senate authorized the Chairman Senate, to constitute a committee which will decide the other modalities for such mercy chance for UG students as a policy matter, which can be implemented in future also.

S 31.09 To decide institute fee to be charged from the students repeating semester courses due to detention and other reasons.

The Senate approved the proposed formula as given below:

$$\text{Fee} = \{(\text{Tuition fee})/\text{No. of courses}\} \times \text{Repeat Courses}$$

Tuition Fee	The tuition fee applicable to his batch in the respective semester
No. of Courses	No. of courses in the respective semester including all theory/practical/project etc. courses



Repeat Courses	No. of courses in which the student was having detention and decided to repeat these courses to get normal grade
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In addition to this fees, the student need to pay hostel room rent as per availability and allotment to him/her and other miscellaneous expenses during his/her study in that semester.

S 31.10 To decide relaxation in prescribed fee for period of absence for UG & PG programmes of the institute.

Senate decided to charge full tuition fee from such students as per their batch, provided absence is with permission. If student remains absent from the institute without prior permission, he/she may be permitted to join back with the permission of the Director, with a penalty of Rs. 5000/- per semester, in addition to tuition fee.

S 31.11 To decide on change of name in Educational certificates of Ms. Manju Meena D/o Sh. JD Meena Roll No. 110831, student of B.Tech. ECE programme.

In accordance with the judgement of Hon'ble Court, the Senate decided to change the name of Ms. Manju Meena D/o Sh. J.D. Meena as Ms. Somya Jourwal, D/o Sh. Jaldhari Meena in place of Ms. Manju Meena D/o Sh. J.D. Meena in educational certificates and to issue fresh certificates on payment of fee/charges applicable as per rules.

S 31.12 To note eligibility criteria for allocation of seats under MEA (Welfare) quota in the NITs from the academic year 2018-19.

The Senate noted the eligibility criteria for allocation of seats under MEA (Welfare) quota in the NITs from the academic year 2018-19

S.31.13 To consider and approve the composition of DAC, BOS & DRC.

The Senate decided that there is no need to change the existing composition of DAC, BOS & DRC The existing practice shall continue. For small



departments such as Humanities & Social Sciences, Physics, Chemistry etc., the constitution of such committees will be decided by the Director

S 31.14 To consider and approve the report of the committee constituted for framing the rules for punishment to students resorting to use of Unfair Means in Examinations.

S 31.15 To consider and approve the report of the committee constituted for framing the rules for re-registration for Ph.D. cases beyond the normal period of seven years.

The Senate considered and approved the report of the committee constituted for framing the rules for re-registration for Ph.D. cases beyond the normal period of seven years with minor modifications in the following rules as:

Rule 1. The scholar will request the Chairman DRC with the recommendations of his/her supervisor (s) for re-registration within a period of 3 months of cancellation of his/her registration i.e. completion of 7 years after the date of registration. Supervisor/Supervisors will recommend the re-registration only if the quantum of required work and publication requirements for submission of Ph.D. thesis can be completed within next two years.

Rule 4. The re-registered scholar will not be permitted to submit his/her thesis before one year of his/her re-registration. The maximum period for a re-registered scholar to submit his/her thesis will be two years, beyond which the re-registration will stand cancelled automatically and no further re-registration will be possible.

In addition, it was decided that, all present research scholars who have already completed 7 years, can re-register up to 31st December 2017.

Supplementary Senate items:

- S 31.17** To consider and decide the modifications in Ph.D. ordinance.

The Senate deliberated upon the issue of modifications in Ph.D. ordinance and made following modifications in the existing criteria:

R-3 Eligibility

R-3.1 Educational Qualification:

An applicant possessing the prescribed qualifications shall be eligible for admission to a Ph.D. program of the institute. Degrees obtained through distance education programs shall not be considered. The course as well as University of qualifying degree must be recognized by AICTE & UGC will be verified by Academic Section before registration.

In order to encourage the candidates for interdisciplinary research which is the state of art in today's scenario, the eligibility criteria for Ph.D. is as below:

Master's degree in Engineering/Technology/Sciences/Humanities and Social sciences in respective discipline or equivalent with a minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 6.5 on a 10-point scale or equivalent as determined by the Institute wherever letter grades are awarded; or 60% marks in aggregate where marks are awarded.

OR

Bachelor's degree in Engineering/Technology with a minimum of 70% marks in aggregate or equivalent CGPA and a minimum of 10 years of work experience (at the level of Assistant Professor or equivalent) in



an engineering degree level technical institute or R&D organization/industry, and Evidence of Master's level R&D work completed.

R-11.3: Panel of Examiners

A panel of at least ten external experts, including foreign experts, and the authors of the recent papers in the references cited by the scholar in the area of his Ph.D. work would be suggested to the DRC by the Supervisor. The DRC will consider the suggested panel and will finally recommend to the Director (through Professor-in-charge, Exam.) Panel of ten external examiners, should include five Professor/Associate Professor in Academic institute or equivalent from outside India (preferably from developed countries) and remaining five with same cadre from India, preferably from IITs/NITs/ the Institutes of repute. The recommended panel will be considered and approved/modified by the Director.

R-16: Viva-Voce Examination

The existing rules in Ph.D. ordinance will continue. In addition to these rules, the viva-voce examination can also be conducted on skype or similar online tools after seeking prior approval of Hon'ble Director.

R-5: Shortlisting and Admission

The candidates from Govt. R&D organizations/national laboratories will be exempted from written test, however, they are required to appear in interview before DRC to evaluate their research potential.

R-3.3 Eligibility for Institute Scholarship

There will be no change in the existing rules.

R-11.1 Pre-synopsis Seminar

A research scholar will be allowed to deliver his pre-synopsis seminar only after getting at least a CGPA of 7.0/10.0 in course work and after



publishing/getting acceptance of at least two research papers out of his research work in non-paid peer reviewed SCI/SCIE/Scopus/ Web of Sciences Journals.

Further, the above modifications shall be applicable prospectively (i.e. students to be admitted from academic session 2017-18 onwards) except for R-16.

31.18 To consider and decide acceptance of soft copy of dissertation/thesis in M.Tech. & Ph.D. programmes.

The Senate approved the proposal for acceptance of soft copy of dissertation/thesis in M.Tech. & Ph.D. programmes.

31.19 To apprise and seek suggestions on the action plan on External Peer Review recommendations.

The Senate was apprised of the action plan report on EPR recommendations. No suggestion was received in the meeting. Senate decided that after going through report, senators can forward their suggestions to Prof. A. Swarup through email, within two weeks.

31.20 To consider the proposal for introduction of new elective subject in M.Tech. (I&P) & revision of Syllabus of the subject of Operation Management ME-544T in M.Tech. (I&P).

- (iv) Leave all materials like slips of papers/mobiles/digital diaries/ study material/ revision notes etc. outside the hall. Forgetting to take out in a hurry or worry is no excuse.
- (v) You must sit as per seating plan displayed outside the halls or notified on your intranet.
- (vi) You must ensure that you sign your attendance slip before leaving the Examination Hall.
- (vii) Only non-programmable calculators are allowed in the examination.

Not to Do List

- (i) Do not get late.
 - (ii) Do not carry unauthorized materials inside the examination hall:
 - (a) Short notes,
 - (b) Loose papers
 - (c) Notebooks,
 - (d) Mobiles,
 - (e) Digital diary,
 - (f) Do not write anything on covers.
 - (iii) Even if, material is not related to the examination, you will be charged for UFM.
 - (iv) You are not allowed to leave the hall before half time of paper.

2. Any contravention of these instructions and the use of any unfair means will render the student liable for punishment.

2.1 Actions by the Invigilator's on Detecting Unfair Means Case

The invigilator will report the matter to the centre superintendent. The invigilator/Center Superintendent will proceed as per the guidelines given below:

- (a) As soon as a student is suspected by the invigilator or any other authorized person of having resorted to unfair means he/she shall immediately take possession of the answer book along with the relevant material found with the student. The papers, notes, books, electronic devices etc. found in possession of the student shall be duly signed by the student and the invigilator, sealed and attached with the seized

answer-book in presence of the student. In case student is found to have written something on the body part a photo of same may be taken on the web cam available etc, if possible. In case student indulges in UFM other than possession of unauthorized material like talking to fellow student, attempting to copy from fellow student, allowing fellow student to copy, discussing answer with fellow student outside the hall etc., the nature of offence must be duly recorded by the invigilator.

- (b) The Invigilator/Center superintendent will get the prescribed form (attached as Annexure) for unfair means filled and signed by the student and give his / her comments on the same, in prescribed place.
- (c) After completing all the above formalities, a fresh answer-book shall be given to the student for completing the Examination.
- (d) If the student does not hand over the relevant material and / or refuses to fill up and sign the prescribed form, the same shall be recorded on the prescribed form. In this case, co-invigilator may sign as a witness to the event.
- (e) No extra time will be given for completing the Examination as a result of this procedure.
- (f) After Examination is over, these answer books duly marked as I (confiscated copy) and II (freshly issued copy) along with the material found in possession and the prescribed form duly filled and signed by the invigilator shall be delivered separately to the Prof. I/C Examination by Center Superintendent.

2.2 What constitutes an UFM Case

A student necessarily need not be actively involved in cheating to be viewed as a case of UFM. Willful or even unintentional mistake of noncompliance of instructions/guidelines for the examination may also be charged as UFM. The acid test for the same is possession of material or indulgence in an act which may provide unlawful gains.

2.3 Categories of Offences and Punishments

Following actions may be taken for different categories of offences enumerated below:

Category 1:

Nature of Offence

- (a) Talking to another candidate or any person inside or outside the examination hall without the permission of the invigilator.
- (b) In case of Practical examinations presenting to the examiner a practical or class work note book not prepared by himself / herself.
- (c) Refusing to obey the orders of the Centre Superintendent/invigilator.
- (d) Changing the seat without the permission of the Centre Superintendent/invigilator or occupying the seat not allotted to him / her.
- (e) Communicating or attempting to communicate, directly or through person, with an examiner with the object of influencing him / her in the award of marks.

The invigilator in charge of the room/hall shall immediately take possession of the first answer book. The student shall be informed that the first answer sheet is being recommended to be cancelled and same may not be evaluated. The student shall be provided with a second answer book. The first answer-book shall be cancelled after deliberations of the UFM committee and the second answer-book only is to be evaluated.

Action to be Taken: Disqualification for at least One Semester (forthcoming)

The upper limit of disqualification will be decided by Unfair Means Committee depending upon the nature of offence.

The candidate can appeal against the decision of Unfair Means Committee to the Director of the institute within 15 days of the receipt of the copy of the decision.

**Category 2:
Nature of Offence**

- (a) Being in possession in the examination hall, of papers, books, notes or writing on any part of the candidate's clothes or any writing on his/ her body or table or desk or instruments like programmable calculators, electronic gadgets, mobiles, bluetooth, iPod etc. or any other material intended to be of possible help to the candidate in the examination.
- (b) Leaving the examination hall without delivering to the invigilator concerned the answer book or any part thereof or taking away the same or tearing it or otherwise disposing it of or tearing the answer-book of other candidate.
- (c) Coming to the examination hall under the influence of alcoholic drink or drugs.
- (d) Copying or attempting to copy from the objectionable material found in his / her possession or copying or attempting to copy from another candidate or assisting another candidate to copy from the objectionable material in his / her possession or from his / her answer-book.
- (e) Receiving help or attempting to receive help for answering the question paper from any source in any manner, inside or outside the examination hall.
- (f) Swallowing or attempting to swallow a note or paper or running away with it or causing its disappearance or destroying it in any manner.
- (g) Writing on any piece of paper or on any other material any question or a part thereof set in the question paper or anything connected with it or a solution thereof.
- (h) Smuggling an answer book of a continuation sheet or any part thereof in or outside the place of examination.
- (i) Making an appeal to the examiner in the answer book.
- (j) Knowingly writing another person's Roll Number on one's answer book.

The invigilator in charge of the room/hall shall immediately take possession of the first answer book immediately on occurrence or detection and the student will not be supplied fresh answer book. The UFM committee may award cancellation of the concerned paper and direct for award of zero marks in the concerned examination

Action to be Taken: Disqualification for at least Two Semesters (forthcoming)

The upper limit of disqualification will be decided by Unfair Means Committee depending upon the nature of offence.

The candidate can appeal against the decision of Unfair Means Committee to the Director of the institute within 15 days of the receipt of the copy of the decision.

Category 3:

Nature of Offence:

- (a) Misbehaving with the Centre Superintendent/invigilator or any other member of the Supervisory staff or any member of the inspection team or the flying squad, before, during or after the examination or creating disturbance in the examination hall or in its vicinity or organising a walk out; or instigating others to walk out; or misconducting oneself in any manner in or outside the examination hall or disturbing or disrupting the examination in any manner whatsoever; or carrying into the examination hall fire-arms or any other weapon..
- (b) Using abusive or obscene language in the answer book.

Action to be Taken: Disqualification for at least Four Semesters (forthcoming)

The upper limit of disqualification will be decided by Unfair Means Committee depending upon the nature of offence.

The candidate can appeal against the decision of Unfair Means Committee to the Director of the institute within 15 days of the receipt of the copy of the decision.

Category 4:

Nature of Offence:

Getting oneself impersonation by someone in the examination or impersonating another candidate.

Action to Be Taken: Disqualification for at least four semesters (forthcoming) and FIR to be lodged against the concerned students







The Senate in its 31st meeting held on 30.10.2017 vide item no. S 31.15 approved the report of the Committee constituted for framing the rules for re-registration for Ph.D. cases beyond the normal period of seven years with minor modifications in the rules. The rules are as under:

Rule 1. The scholar will request the Chairman DRC with the recommendations of his/her supervisor (s) for re-registration within a period of 3 months of cancellation of his/her registration i.e. completion of 7 years after the date of registration. Supervisor/Supervisors will recommend the re-registration only if the quantum of required work and publication requirements for submission of Ph.D. thesis can be completed within next two years.

Rule 2 The application of the scholar will be forwarded/recommended through DRC and Dean (Academic) to the Director, and director may allow for re-registration to the scholar. If allowed, the scholar will deposit a re-registration fee of Rs. 5000/- (Rs. Five thousand only) and the date of submission of this fee will be considered as his/her date of re-registration. In addition to this re-registration fee, the normal semester fee of current semester will be payable, if not already paid. Semester fee for upcoming semesters will be payable as per rules.

Rule 3 The previous results of his/her course work and comprehensive examinations, if any, will be valid and the scholar need not repeat these steps again.

Rule 4. The re-registered scholar will not be permitted to submit his/her thesis before one year of his/her re-registration. The maximum period for a re-registered scholar to submit his/her thesis will be two years, beyond which the re-registration will stand cancelled automatically and no further re-registration will be possible.

Rule 5 The eligibility conditions (regarding publication requirements etc.) for submission of thesis shall remain same as applicable on him/her before the cancellation of his/her registration. For all other rules, the scholar is to abide by regulations and amendments made in regulations time to time.

In addition, it was decided that, all present research scholars who have already completed 7 years, can be register up to 31st December 2017.



The Senate in its 31st meeting held on 30.10.2017 vide item no. 31/17 considered the Ph.D. ordinance and made following modifications in the existing criteria:

R-3 Eligibility

R-3.1 Educational Qualification:

An applicant possessing the prescribed qualifications shall be eligible for admission to a Ph.D. program of the institute. Degrees obtained through distance education programs shall not be considered. The course as well as University of qualifying degree must be recognized by AICTE & UGC will be verified by Academic Section before registration. In order to encourage the candidates for interdisciplinary research which is the state of art in today's scenario, the eligibility criteria for Ph.D. is as below:

Master's degree in Engineering/Technology/Sciences/Humanities and Social sciences in respective discipline or equivalent with a minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 6.5 on a 10-point scale or equivalent as determined by the Institute wherever letter grades are awarded; or 60% marks in aggregate where marks are awarded.

OR

Bachelor's degree in Engineering/Technology with a minimum of 70% marks in aggregate or equivalent CGPA and a minimum of 10 years of work experience (at the level of Assistant Professor or equivalent) in an engineering degree level technical institute or R&D organization/industry, and Evidence of Master's level R&D work completed.

R-11.3: Panel of Examiners

A panel of at least ten external experts, including foreign experts, and the authors of the recent papers in the references cited by the scholar in the area of his Ph.D. work would be suggested to the DRC by the Supervisor. The DRC will consider the suggested panel and will finally recommend to the Director (through Professor-in-charge, Exam.). Panel of ten external examiners, should include five Professor/Associate Professor in Academic institute or equivalent from outside India (preferably from developed countries) and remaining five with same cadre from India, preferably from IITs/NITs/ the Institutes of repute. The recommended panel will be considered and approved/modified by the Director.

R-16: Viva-Voce Examination

The existing rules in Ph.D ordinance will continue. In addition to these rules, the viva-voce examination can also be conducted on skype or similar online tools after seeking prior approval of Hon'ble Director

R-5: Shortlisting and Admission

The candidates from Govt. R&D organizations/national laboratories will be exempted from written test; however, they are required to appear in interview before DRC to evaluate their research potential.

R-11.1 Pre-synopsis Seminar

A research scholar will be allowed to deliver his pre-synopsis seminar only after getting at least a CGPA of 7.0/10.0 in course work and after publishing/getting acceptance of at least two research papers out of his research work in non-paid peer reviewed SCI/SCIE/Scopus/ Web of Sciences Journals.

Further, the above modifications shall be applicable prospectively (i.e. students to be admitted from academic session 2017-18 onwards) except for R-16




