Subject: Report regarding Branch Change in B. Tech. Scheme
This is with reference to letter No Dean(Acad.)/197 dated 5/6-03-2018, wherein a committee was constituted to review the process of branch change from the next academic session. The committee deliberated upon the various issues related to the branch change under new B. Tech. scheme, which has been implemented with effect from academic year 2017-18.

The major issues relating to branch change process are:

1. The branch of a student is changed based on the result of first semester. All the students do not study common subjects in first semester. The students of CS, IT \& ECE branches study Communication Skills in English and Engineering Practice while the students of CE, ME, EE \& PR study Economics for Engineers and Engineering Graphics. The other subjects for all the branches are same except one branch specific subject. It is not fair to prepare the merit list based on results of different subjects which are having different levels of difficulty.
2. When a branch of student is changed in the second semester, the student has to clear the branch specific subject offered in the first semester as per the Senate decision (S32.17). It puts extra load on the student in second semester. The students have to attend the classes in extra time or on Saturday to attend the classes of that subject. Further, this creates another issue of allowing faculty to engage classes for these students. Non avatabitty of sufficient faculty in departments will aggravate this issue.
3. The students whose branch is changed from CE, EE, ECE, ME \& PR to CS/T have to study an additional subject of Engineering Graphics (Web Design).
4. Manohar Award of Excellence is given to topper of B. Tech lIst year (based on the results of first and second semester). The students whose branch is changed are put to disadvantage because their load of subjects is more in second semester as they have to study additional subjects.
5. The branch change was smooth in the previous B. Tech scheme because the branch was changed after $2^{\text {nd }}$ semester and all the students used to study same courses up to second semester.

Keeping in view the above difficulties arising out because of branch change, it is proposed that branch change should not be allowed in the current B. Tech scheme as it is branch specific from the first semester itself.
