office of Director are as under:

I. Under this no action was required to be taken.

II. Under this the following actions have been taken:

- 1. Height and size of perimeter wall: The matter was placed in 19th B&WC meeting under its agenda Item No. 19.6 which was duly approved by B&WC in its 19th meeting held on 11.09.2014 and duly ratified by the FC in its 30th meeting and Board in its 34th meeting held on 19.09.2014 [Annexure I].
 - The allocation of the work to CPWD, i.e. providing concertina coil of approximately 40 cm diameter over the wall all around the Institute boundary wall, at NIT, Kurukshetra to CPWD is under process.
- 2. Main Entry and Exit Points: The entry & exit points of the Institute has been made limited and remaining are closed permanently. The same was informed to office of the Dean (Estate) by the Security Officer, wivide Letter No.SO/05/2014/285, dated 12.12.2014 [Annexure II].
- 3. Security Checks at Gates: The checking is being carried out as reported by the Security Officer vide letter No.SO/05/2014/285, dated 12.12.2014 [Annexure II].
- 4. Manpower and Vehicle Check: Checking of manpower and vehicle is being carried out as reported by the Security Officer vide letter No.SO/05/2014/285, dated 12.12.2014 [Annexure II].
- 5. System of Identity Cards & Vehicle Stickers: The identity cards have been issued by the outsourcing service providers to all their workers. The status regarding fulfilling the same was informed by all the outsourcing service providers (copies attached).
 - The updation of vehicle record owned by the Institute residents is under progress. The process for new holographic stickers for vehicles has been initiated by calling quotations as reported by the Security Officer vide letter No.SO/05/2014/285, dated 12.12.2014 [Annexure II].
- 6. CCTV Surveillance and Recording System: Sixty Seven CCTV Surveillance cameras are already installed in Institutional and Hostel areas including at Kirmich Gate No. 1 and Gate No. 2. Data are being stored in CCTV recording/control room of Security located at Golden Jubilee Administrative Building. The efforts are being made to install CCTV camera on the remaining part of the campus. [Annexure III].
- 7. Identification of Servants and Casual Workers: A Letter regarding police verification of all the domestic servants have been circulated by the Security Officer vide letter no. SO/06/2014/203, dated 15.09.2014 (Annexure IV). CPWD was informed to segregate the place of stay for their workers. This instruction has been complied by CPWD [Annexure V]:

- 8. Security Guards at Checking Points and Night Patrolling: Security Guards at sensitive locations have been deployed. The day & night patrolling with security vehicles have been increased in the campus. The same was informed to office of the Dean (Estate) by the Security Officer vide Letter No.SO/05/2014/285, dated 12.12.2014 [Annexure II].

- 10. Verification of Security Agency and their Employees: No action was required as the security agency is recognized by DGR & PSARA, Haryana and all security personnels are ex-servicemen.
- 11. Regulation/ Record of Students Movement out of Campus: A letter regarding this has already been sent to Dean (Academic) vide letter No. SO/05/2014/199 dated 11.09.2014 for further necessary action. The same was informed to office of the Dean (Estate) by the Security Officer vide Letter No.SO/05/2014/285, dated 12.12.2014 [Annexure II].
- 12. Regular Security Drills and General Awareness of Residents: Security drills are being carried out by security supervisors regularly to aware the residents of the campus as reported by the Security Officer vide letter No.SO/05/2014/285, dated 12.12.2014 [Annexure II].
- 13. Street and Area Lighting: The B&WC in its 11th meetings held on 28.07.2009 has already approved the work of providing & installation of electrical sub-station HT/LT distribution and feeder pillars in residential area at NIT, Kurukshetra under agenda item no. 11.3 [Annexure VI]. In this meeting it was decided that the work of HT/LT distribution in the residential area be taken after the completion of HT/LT distribution in the institutional buildings & hostels. As the first phase of work relating to institutional buildings & hostels is now complete, the second phase of the work in the residential area can start. The AA & ES for this work has been communicated to CPWD for execution vide this office letter No. CC/156/7071, dated 18.11.2014 [Annexure VII]. After the completion of this work, the illumination level in the residential area will improve.
- 14. Surprise Checks on Residents: Instructions have been issued to the Assistant Engineer (Civil) to make surprise checks in the residences of the Institute, so that there is no subletting.
- 15. Protocol for taking emergent action needed in the residential area: The matter is under process.
- 16. Security Manual: The action of Security Officer in this regard is enclosed as intimated by Security Officer to the Dean (Estate) vide letter No. SO/05/2014/285, dated 12.12.2014 [Annexure II].
- III. Under this the following actions have been taken:
 - a. Illegal Huts of Ex-employees within the premises of NIT Kurukshetra be removed: All the illegal huts have been removed from the premises of the Institute.



- b. One or two faculty members of the Institute be given the responsibility of Estate Manager so that they can be contacted for any emergency needs: The matter is under process as pointed above under Point II (15.)
- c. The PWD complex within the NIT Campus may be moved out as they are not being assigned any work of NIT. In the meantime their portion may be segregated by a wall: The segregation of PWD complex from NIT Kurukshetra will be done by construction of a boundary wall between NIT Kurukshetra and PWD Complex. This work will be completed along with the work of providing concertina coil of approximately 40 cm diameter be placed over the wall all around the Institute boundary wall. The allocation of the work to CPWD, i.e. providing concertina coil of approximately 40 cm diameter over the wall all around the Institute boundary wall, at NIT, Kurukshetra to CPWD is under process.



All the above Professor and Assistant Professors were appointed against vacant posts on probation for one year from the date of their joining as per model recruitment rules for faculty position of the Institute. The issue of trainee teachers scheme was discussed in the 7th meeting of Council of NITs held on 18.10.2013 and the NIT Council recommended as under:

7.5(ii) The top 15% meritonous students from NITs and other CFITs can be engaged as trainee teachers at NITs after due selection at NIT's, including their selection for M.Tech-cum-Ph.D programme by IITs. Each NIT will work out a prospective faculty recruitment plan for next five years based on current vacancies, projected growth, retirements and expected resignations.

The issue was referred to the Dean(Academic). The then Dean (Academic) sent a letter in this regard to all the HODs for motivating the concerned students.

The issue of trainee teachers scheme was discussed in the 8th meeting of Council of NITs held on 25.9.2014. A copy from the minutes of the meeting on the issue is enclosed as (Annexure - 35.6.i from pages - 49 to 50). The scheme given in the Kakodkar Committee Report is placed as (Annexure - 35.6.ii from pages 51 to 59).

The Institute has issued a notice in this regard, a copy of which is placed on (Annexure - 35.6.iii on page 60) for information of the Board.

Item No.8.1: Confirmation of the Minutes of the 7th meeting of the Council of NITs held on 18.10.2013.

Member Secretary and Additional Secretary (TE), Shri Amarjeet Sinha mentioned that the minutes of the 7th meeting of the Council of NITs held on 18.10.2013 were circulated amongst the members of the Council and were also posted on the website of NIT Council. However, no comments were received. The Council of NITs unanimously consented to confirm the minutes.

The progress with regard to implementation of the Trainee Teacher Scheme was apprised to Hon'ble HRM by the Directors of NITs. NIT, Delhi will start the programme form next academic year due to space constraints. NIT Manipur expressed problem of unavailability of e-learning infrastructure between NIT and IIT. Other suggestions offered by Directors of NITs. Hon'ble HRM desired that these suggestions may be sent to Ministry which can be studied.

7.5 (iii) To get its existing faculty, to continuously improve and perform better, a teacher's training and certification programme need to be evolved by NITs.

Hon'ble HRM informed the Members that the Ministry is soon going to operationalise a Council for Higher Education and Industry Collaboration (CIHEC) with the representation from across our Institutions of higher learning and the emphasize will also be to see how the Ministry can provide additional infrastructural support so that the Institute should have that industry linkage and provide structural support to NITs.

NIT Agartala cited the issue of legacy of old engineering college and thus upgrading the faculty of institution is difficult proposition. Hon'ble HRM said that continuous improvement of teacher will be facilitated by designing a reward system which should be linked with their career advancement.

Directors of other NITs also supported the idea of reward system.

Detailed Proposal

Introduction

Currently there is critical faculty shortage in technical education in the country. The proposed scheme is expected to fill up gap between demand and availability of bright committed aspiring teaching professionals, for example in NITs, taking fresh UG graduates, nurturing them for teaching along with the M Tech degree and PhD research carried out at IITs. The top 15% of the engineering graduates can fulfill their aspirations to receive their degree from leading prestigious Institutes in the country. It is expected that the present faculty crunch could be partially solved by implementing the "Trainee Teachers" scheme.

II Objectives

To enhance teaching quality and to address the faculty shortage issue, some of the best engineering graduates (i.e. top 15% meritorious students from the IIT, NIT, IISER, NISER and other AICTE/UGC approved

Institutions/Universities) could be attracted, motivated, and mentored. They would be engaged as Trainee Teachers at NITs. While initially they would assist in teaching, they would simultaneously go through part time M Tech and PhD programmes of IITs to acquire higher academic qualifications, which is a prerequisite for faculty at NITs and IITs. Following are broad objectives of this scheme:

- a. Create high quality teachers
- b. To provide attractive teaching cum research carrier path to the UG student
- c. Catch bright UG students to enable them to Teach and Earn while you Learn and providing top class training to become good academician / researcher.

III Key Aspects of the Scheme

Each NIT would work out a perspective faculty recruitment plan for next five years based on current vacancies, projected growth, faculty recruitment through other channels, retirements and expected resignations. The plan should be seen and approved by respective BoG to be consistent with MHRD approved projections and norms for the institute. The number of Trainee Teachers to be admitted in an year would be determined by distributing the admissions roughly equally over a period of five years. The perspective faculty recruitment plan could be reviewed periodically. Other channels of recruitment of faculty should also be pursued in parallel and should be factored in the perspective faculty recruitment plan.

Admission Methodology

NITs will advertise and shortlist required numbers of fresh bright B Tech students from the current or one year prior to the current academic year in appropriate branches. These prospective candidates will go through comprehensive fast track screening procedure that meets all requirements for the selection of entry level regular faculty. The selection process would be completed once the candidate is accepted by the concerned IIT for the M Tech and PhD program. These students must satisfy the criteria of being within top 15% ranks and above in institutions of higher standing such as IITs, NITs, IIITs, IISERs, NISER and other Centrally Funded Technical Institutions (CFTIs) or those who are in top 15% from other AICTE/UGC approved Institutions/Universities (non-CFTIs) and having a valid GATE score would also be eligible. The probable number of trainee and their specializations can be decided by the NITs such that the number shall be within a prospective faculty recruitment plan and with prior approval by BoG.

- ii. These short-listed students will be asked for preference of minimum two IITs who offers such scheme. These students will be evaluated by corresponding IITs considering their eligibility criteria and their potential for teaching and performing research for M Tech and PhD program in the NKN enabled virtual learning mode. If the candidate is not selected by IIT for M Tech and PhD program by IITs, he/she will not be offered the trainee-teacher scheme.
- iii. The IITs and NITs will collectively generate broad contours of ecourses to help the trainee to complete most of the credits while serving in the NITs. The trainee teacher will spend one semester in the entire duration of the programme in corresponding IIT for their M Tech and PhD work. Course work would include adequate coverage on teaching pedagogy in addition to covering courses relevant to M Tech & PhD programme.

Duration and Salary

- The Trainee Teachers will mainly help the Institute for Laboratory and Tutorial classes, Research and progressively play bigger role in academics and research in the NITs.
- ii. The status of Trainee Teachers will be like Contractual Employees with annually increasing consolidated salary on an equivalent scale (compensation higher than a regular PhD fellow but lower than an Assistant Professor) with regular leave, medical facilities, accommodation / HRA as applicable, transport allowance etc. Also all the fees and some professional expenses towards the M Tech and PhD programme will be reimbursed through this scheme. Part of the salary will be retained by the Institute, placed in Recurring Deposit (RD) and this would be returnable to the trainee in a phased manner, only after successful completion of PhD.
- iii. It is necessary for the Trainee Teachers to complete M Tech and PhD within 5-8 years. If candidate fails to complete his PhD within eight years, his or her candidature to be in this scheme will be discontinued. The trainee teacher also can opt out of the scheme by giving sufficient notice to the administration and it should be effective only after completing academic requirements towards the end of current semester. In such a case the amount kept in RD will be forfeited.

Regularization of Candidate

After successful completion of the PhD, the trainee teacher will be absorbed as Assistant Professor at appropriate pay scale in the parent NIT and service rendered as trainee will be counted for various benefits admissible to employees of NITs.

Implementation Support

The scheme will be reviewed every year by MHRD and after 3 years by an external committee.

IV Financial Outlay

Financial outlay has been worked out as per unit cost given in Annexure-IVa.

Financial Requirements for eight years

While the actual numbers to be admitted as Trainee Teachers at a NIT would be based on approved perspective recruitment plan as indicated above, purely for the purpose of working out the budgetary requirements a representative number of 300 Trainee Teachers to be admitted every year for all NITs put together has been assumed. Actual annual budgetary requirements would need to be adjusted based on annual MHRD reviews of the scheme. Table I given below indicates the details of buildup of possible number of candidates in the scheme as a first step

The numbers would stabilize hereafter -

Number of Trainee Teachers at any time to be within projected vacancy position at the end of training period of the given NIT(s). In the old NITs, currently there are about 30 to 40% faculty vacancies. In the first eight years of this scheme, it is expected that the number of vacancies would be reduced substantially.

Table II provides the committed expenditure (Rs. in Lakhs) based on the eligible students admitted up to academic year 2020-21 based on **indicative numbers of 300 TT per year**.

It is suggested that TT should get some funds for professional expenditure like membership of professional societies, attending conference, for which they should apply for, if their paper is accepted for presentation etc.

V Operational Details of the Scheme

For operational clarity, the scheme once approved should be implemented jointly by the IITs and NITs with their roles in the schemes as briefly outlined below.

1) Role of IITs:

- a. To select students jointly with NITs for "Trainee Teachers" programme
- b. If found suitable, enrol students for M. Tech and Ph. D programmes.

- c. To deliver the programme in Virtual Mode such that the "Trainee Teachers" are available to the parent NIT for a maximum period to facilitate teaching-learning activities at NIT
- d. To deliver contents related to pedagogy which are in addition to the conventional course / programme requirements
- e. To arrange review of progress once in a year by concerned IIT faculty supervisor(s) and representative(s) from sponsoring NIT
- f. Coordinate all activities in regard to its implementation of the scheme with NITs or a centralized body created for its implementation
- g. To nominate one contact / nodal person from each IIT side (may be Dean (R&C) / (Acad.) or equivalent) for its effective implementation, monitoring and co-ordination of the scheme.

2) Role of NITs:

- To plan and implement the scheme keeping in view the overall requirements of faculty in a given time frames
- b. To identify, shortlist and recommend bright students for "Trainee Teachers" programme
- c. To train TT as potential faculty and facilitate their interaction with IITs for M. Tech and Ph D programmes and also engage them suitably in teaching learning activities in their own institute
- d. To disburse salary and other perks and benefits to "Trainee Teachers" in their respective institutions including fees to IITs.
- e. To possibly join IIT faculty in review of the progress of the TT in Indian Institute of Technology.
- f. To absorb them in regular faculty positions upon successful completion of the Ph D programmes.

VI Conclusion

The scheme should be launched from the next academic year 2013-14 itself after obtaining necessary approval from the MHRD and other concerned GoI bodies. Necessary budgetary provisions (for year 2013-14) should also be made for financing the scheme on long term basis. The concerned BoG of every NIT should make effective plans to make use of the scheme to mitigate the shortage of faculty on a long term basis. While doing so, they should adequately balance the recruitments from various channels including the "Trainee Teacher" Scheme. NIT council shall create a sub-committee to coordinate and monitor the scheme.

Item 35.7 To consider the issue regarding modification in the Statute 18
(1) of the First Statutes on appointment of Deputy Directors in the NITs.

The Director (NITs), Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Higher Education vide letter No. F. No. 33 – 6/2013-TS.III dated 27th October, 2014 has referred the minutes of the 8th meeting of the Council of NITs held on 25.09.2014 wherein it was decided that a draft proposal will be prepared by the Ministry for guidance of BoGs of NITs for the process of appointment of Deputy Director keeping in view of NITSER Act, 2007 and First Statutes. The BoGs of the respective NITs may take necessary steps accordingly. A copy of the letter No. F. No. 33 – 6/2013-TS.III dated 27th October, 2014 referred to above, is enclosed as (Annexure – 35.7.i from pages 63 to 64).

In this context, it may be relevant to mention here that after omission of the word "Deputy Director" in Section 24 of the NITSER Act, 2007, "all appointments of the staff of every Institute, except that of the Director, shall be made in accordance with the procedure laid down in the Statutes, by-

- (a) the Board, if the appointment is made on the academic staff in the post of Lecture (now Assistant Professor) or above or if the appointment is made on the non-academic staff in any cadre the maximum of the pay scale for which exceeds ten thousand five hundred;
- (b) the Director, in any other case."

Thus from the above provisions, it is clear that the appointment of Deputy Director in NITs is to be made by the Board as per Section 17(5) and 24(a) of the NITSER Act, 2007 until further amendments are taken up in the NITSER Act, 2007. The manner referred in the Statutes No.18 of the First Statutes framed by the Central Government in 2009 needs to be modified in view of the recent amendments in the principal Act. The amendments proposed

to be carried out in Statutes No. 18 (1) in conjunction with the amendments in Section 17 (5) and Section 24 of the NITSER Act, 2007 are as under:

(1) the appointment of the Deputy Director shall be made by the Board on the recommendations of the Selection Committee Constituted in terms of provisions under Statutes 23 (5) (b) of the First Statutes of NITs.

Statutes 18 (2) to 18 (5) of the First Statutes shall remain as it is and appropriate modifications shall be carried out in the Contract of Service specified in Schedule-B of the First Statutes.

It may be worthwhile to mention here that any proposal for amendment in the First Statutes of NITs can be initiated only with the approval of the Board of Governors of the concerned NIT in terms of Statute No.5 of the First Statutes which provides, inter-alia, that the Board shall be empowered to make, modify or cancel the Statutes with the approval of the Hon'ble Visitor, from time to time and the new Statutes, additions or amendments of the existing Statutes shall be applicable only after the assent of the Hon'ble Visitor.

A copy of the Sections 17 & 24 of the NIT Act, before and after its amendment, is enclosed as (Annexure - 35.7.ii from pages 65 to 71).

The Board may consider the issue regarding modification in the Statute 18 (1) of the First Statute on appointment of Deputy Director in this Institute.

The following Act of Parliament received the assent of the President on the 5th June, 2007, and is hereby published for general information:—

THE NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF TECHNOLOGY ACT, 2007

No. 29 of 2007

[5th June, 2007.]

An Act to declare certain institutions of technology to be institutions of national importance and to provide for instructions and research in branches of engineering, technology, management, education, sciences and arts and for the advancement of learning and dissemination of knowledge in such branches and for certain other matters connected with such institutions.

BB it enacted by Parliament in the Fifty-eighth Year of the Republic of India as follows:—

CHAPTER I

PRELIMINARY

1. (1) This Act may be called the National Institutes of Technology Act, 2007.

Short title and commencement.

(2) It shall come into force on such date as the Central Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, appoint, and different dates may be appointed for different provisions of this Act.

Sec. 1]

13. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Board of every Institute shall be responsible for the general superintendence, direction and control of the affairs of the Institute and shall exercise all the powers of the Institute not otherwise provided for by this Act, the Statutes and the Ordinances, and shall have the power to review the acts of the Senate.

Powers and functions of Board

- (2) Without prejudice to the provisions of sub-section (1), the Board of every Institute shall;—
 - (a) take decisions on questions of policy relating to the administration and working of the Institute;
 - (b) institute courses of study at the Institute;
 - (c) make Statutes;
 - (d) institute and appoint persons to academic as well as other posis in the Institute;
 - (e) consider and modify or cancel Ordinances;
 - (f) consider and pass resolutions on the annual report, the annual accounts and the budget estimates of the Institute for the next financial year as it thinks fit and submit them to the Council together with a statement of its development plans;
 - (g) exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may be conferred or imposed upon it by this Act or the Statutes:
- (3) The Board shall have the power to appoint such committees, as it considers necessary for the exercise of its powers and the performance of its duties under this Act.
 - 14. The Senate of every Institute shall consist of the following persons, namely:----

Senate.

- (a) the Director, ex officio, who shall be the Chairman of the Senate;
- (b) the Deputy Director, ex officio;
- (c) the Professors appointed or recognised as such by the Institute for the purpose of imparting instructions in the Institute;
- (d) three persons, one of whom shall be a woman, not being employees of the Institute, to be nominated by the Chairperson in consultation with the Director, from amongst educationists of repute, one each from the field of science, engineering and humanities; and
 - (e) such other members of the staff as may be laid down in the Statutes.
- 15. Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Statutes and the Ordinances, the Senate of an Institute shall have the control and general regulation, and be responsible for the maintenance of standards of instruction, education and examination in the Institute and shall exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may be conferred or imposed upon it by the Statutes.

Functions of Senate

- 16. (1) The Chairperson shall ordinarily preside at the meetings of the Board and at the Convocations of the Institute.
- Chairperson of Board
- (2) It shall be the duty of the Chairperson to ensure that the decisions taken by the Board are implemented.
- (3) The Chairperson shall exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by this Act or the Statutes.
- 17. (1) The Director and Deputy Director of an Institute shall be appointed by the Visitor, on such terms and conditions of service and on the recommendations of a Selection Committee constituted by him in such manner, as may be prescribed by the Statutes.

Director and Deputy Director

- (2) The Director shall be the principal academic and executive officer of the Institute and shall be responsible for the proper administration of the Institute and for the imparting of instruction and maintenance of discipline therein.
 - (3) The Director shall submit annual reports and accounts to the Board.
- (4) The Director shall exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by this Act or the Statutes or Ordinances.



(5) The Deputy Director of every institute shall exercise such powers and perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by this Act or the Statutes or by the Director.

Regestrar.

- 18. (1) The Registrar of every Institute shall be appointed on such terms and conditions as may be laid down by the Statutes and shall be the custodian of records, the common seaf, the funds of the Institute and such other property of the Institute as the Board shall commit to his charge.
- (2) The Registrar shall not as the Secretary of the Board, Senate and such committees as may be prescribed by the Statutes.
- (2) The Registracishall be responsible to the Director for the proper discharge of his functions.
- (4) The Registrar shall exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by this Act or the Statutes or by the Director.

Other authorities and officers

- Grants by Central Government,
- 19. The powers and duties of authorities and officers other than those mentioned above shall be determined by the Statutes.
- 20. For the purpose of enabling the Institutes to discharge their functions efficiently under this Act, the Central Government may, after due appropriation made by Parliament by law in this behalf, pay to every Institute in each financial year such sums of money and in such manner as it may think fit.

Fund of Institute.

- 21. (1) Every Institute shall maintain a Fund to which shall be credited,—
 - (a) all moneys provided by the Central Government;
 - (b) all fees and other charges received by the Institute;
- (c) all moneys received by the Institute by way of grants, gifts, donations, benefactions, bequests or transfers, and
- (d) all moneys received by the Institute in any other manner or from any other source.
- (2) All moneys credited to the Fund of every Institute shall be deposited in such banks or invested in such manner as the Institute may, with the approval of the Central Government, decide.
- (3) The Fund of every Institute shall be applied towards meeting the expenses of the Institute including expenses incurred in the exercise of its powers and discharge of its duties under this Act.

Accounts and audit.

- 27. (1) Every institute shall maintain proper accounts and other relevant records and prepare an annual statement of accounts including the balance sheet in such form as may be specified by notification, by the Central Government in consultation with the Comptroller and Auditor-General of India.
- (2) The accounts of every Institute shall be audited by the Comptroller and Auditor-General of India and any expenditure incurred by him in connection with such audit shall be payable by the Institute to the Comptroller and Auditor-General of India.
- (J) The Comptroller and Auditor-General of India and any person appointed by him in connection with the audit of the accounts of any Institute shall have the same rights, privileges and authority in connection with such audit as the Comptroller and Auditor-General of India has in connection with the audit of the Government accounts, and, in particular shall have the rights to demand the production of books, accounts, connected vouchers and other documents and papers and to inspect the offices of the Institute.
- (4) The accounts of every Institute as certified by the Comptroller and Auditor-General of India or any other person appointed by him in this behalf together with the audit report thereon shall be forwarded annually to the Central Government and that Government shall cause the same to be laid before each House of Parliament in accordance with such procedure as may be laid down by the Central Government.

23. Every Institute shall constitute for the benefit of its employees such provident or Pension and pension fund or provide such insurance scheme as it may deem fit in such manner and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed by the Statutes.

24. All appointments of the staff of every Institute, except that of the Director and Appointments. Deputy Director, shall be made in accordance with the procedure laid down in the Statutes, by-

- (a) the Board, if the appointment is made on the academic staff in the post of Lecturer or above or if the appointment is made on the non-academic staff in any cadre the maximum of the pay scale for which exceeds rupees ten thousand five hundred:
 - (b) the Director, in any other case.
- 25. Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Statutes may provide for all or any of the Statutes. following matters, namely:---
 - (a) the conferment of honorary degrees;
 - (b) the formation of departments of teaching;
 - (c) the fees to be charged for courses of study in the Institute and for admission to the examinations of degrees and diplomas of the Institute:
 - (d) the institution of fellowships, scholarships, exhibitions, medals and prizes:
 - (e) the term of office and the method of appointment of officers of the Institute;
 - (f) the qualifications of teachers of the Institute:
 - (g) the classification, the method of appointment and the determination of the terms and conditions of service of teachers and other staff of the Institute;
 - (h) the constitution of pension, insurance and provident funds for the benefit of the officers, teachers and other staff of the Institute:
 - (f) the constitution, powers and duties of the authorities of the Institute:
 - (f) the establishment and maintenance of halls and hostels:
 - (k) the conditions of residence of students of the Institute and the levying of fees for residence in the halls and hostels and of other charges;
 - (I) the allowances to be paid to the Chairperson and members of the Board;
 - (m) the authentication of the orders and decisions of the Board; and
 - (n) the meetings of the Board, the Senate, or any Committee, the quorum at such meetings and the procedure to be followed in the conduct of their business.
- 26. (1) The first Statutes of each Institute shall be framed by the Central Government with the prior approval of the Visitor and a copy of the same shall be laid as soon as may be before each House of Parliament.

Statutes how

- (2) The Board may, from time to time, make new or additional Statutes or may amend or repeal the Statutes in the manner provided in this section.

 - (d) three persons, one of whom shall be a woman, not being employees of the Institute, to be nominated by the Chairperson in consultation with the Director, from amongst educationists of repute, one each from the field of science, engineering and humanities; and
 - (e) such other members of the staff as may be laid down in the Statutes.

(3) The Director shall submit annual reports and accounts to the Board.

- (4) The Director shall exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by this Act or the Statutes or Ordinances.
- (5) The Deputy Director of every Institute shall be appointed in such manner and on such terms and conditions as may be laid down by the Statutes and shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be assigned to him by this Act or the Statutes or by the Director.

Registrar

- 18. (1) The Registrar of every Institute shall be appointed on such terms and conditions as may be laid down by the Statutes and shall be the custodian of records, the common seal, the funds of the Institute and such other property of the Institute as the Board shall commit to his charge.
 - (2) The Registrar shall act as the Secretary of the Board, Senate and such committees as may be prescribed by the Statutes.
 - (3) The Registrar shall be responsible to the Director for the proper discharge of his functions.
 - (4) The Registrar shall exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by this Act or the Statutes or by the Director.

Other authorities and officers

19. The powers and duties of authorities and officers other than those mentioned above shall be determined by the Statutes.

Grants by Central Government.

20. For the purpose of enabling the Institutes to discharge their functions efficiently under this Act, the Central Government may, after due appropriation made by Parliament by law in this

behalf, pay to every Institute in each financial year such sums of money and in such manner as it may think fit.

21. (1) Every Institute shall maintain a Fund to which shall be credited,-

- (a) all moneys provided by the Central Government;
- (b) all fees and other charges received by the Institute;
- (c) all moneys received by the Institute by way of grants, gifts, donations, benefactions, bequests or transfers; and
- (d) all moneys received by the Institute in any other manner or from any other source.
- (2) All moneys credited to the Fund of every Institute shall be deposited in such banks or invested in such manner as the Institute may, with the approval of the Central Government, decide.
- (3) The Fund of every Institute shall be applied towards meeting the expenses of the Institute including expenses incurred in the exercise of its powers and discharge of its duties under this Act.
- 22. (1) Every Institute shall maintain proper accounts and other relevant records and prepare an annual statement of accounts including the balance sheet in such form as may be specified by notification, by the Central Government in consultation with the Comptroller and Auditor-General of India.
 - (2) The accounts of every Institute shall be audited by the Comptroller and Auditor-General of India and any expenditure incurred by him in connection with such audit shall be payable by the Institute to the Comptroller and Auditor-General of India.
 - (3) The Comptroller and Auditor-General of India and any person appointed by him in connection with the audit of the accounts of any Institute shall have the same rights, privileges and authority in connection with such audit as the Comptroller and Auditor-General of India has in connection with the audit of the Government accounts, and, in particular shall have the rights to demand the production of books, accounts, connected vouchers and other documents and papers and to inspect the offices of the Institute.
 - (4) The accounts of every Institute as certified by the Comptroller and Auditor-General of India or any other person appointed by him in this behalf together with the audit report thereon shall be forwarded annually to the Central Government and that Government shall cause the same to be laid before each House of Parliament in accordance with such procedure as may be laid down by the Central Government.
- 23. Every Institute shall constitute for the benefit of its employees such provident or pension fund or provide such insurance scheme as it may deem fit in such manner and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed by the Statutes.
- 24. All appointments of the staff of every institute, except that of the *Director* shall be made in accordance with the procedure laid down in the Statutes, by-
 - (a) the Board, if the appointment is made on the academic staff in the post of Lecturer or above or if the appointment is made on the non-academic staff in any cadre the maximum of the pay scale for which exceeds rupees ten thousand five hundred;
 - (b) the Director, in any other case.
- 25. Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Statutes may provide for all or any of the following matters, namely:
 - a) the conferment of honorary degrees;
 - b) the formation of departments of teaching;
 - the fees to be charged for courses of study in the Institute and for admission to the examinations of degrees and diplomas of the Institute:
 - d) the institution of fellowships, scholarships, exhibitions, medals and prizes;
 - e) the term of office and the method of appointment of officers of the Institute;
 - f) the qualifications of teachers of the Institute;

Item 35.9 To report the case of plagiarism in the Ph.D Thesis submitted by Shri Sandeep Santosh, Assistant Professor, Electronics & Communication Engineering Department.

Shri Sandeep Santosh, Assistant Professor, Electronic & Communication Engineering (ECE) Department, is a Part-Time Ph.D Scholar in the Institute under the supervision of Dr. O. P Sahu, Professor, Department of Electronics & Communication Engineering. He submitted his Ph.D Thesis on 7.3.2014. The Chairman DRC of ECE Deptt. was asked to submit Antiplagiarism check report on the said thesis by the Dean (Academic) vide letter dated 11.03.2014. The Dean (Academic) made the following observations vide letter dated 24.03.2014 Copy enclosed as (Annexure - 35.9.i on page 98) on the plagiarism check report obtained from ECE Department:

- 1. "The work claimed to be his own by the Ph.D candidate is contained mainly in chapters 5 & 6. Both these chapters are almost completely copied from two papers published in IEEE transactions. These papers are indicated as primary sources 1 & 2 in Antiplagianism check report. In view of the above this thesis is considered to be a case of large scale of Plagianism and therefore totally unacceptable.
- 2. Under clause-4 of conduct rules (Unfair means & Plagianism) the submission of the above thesis is a very clear violation of conduct rules requiring initiation of disciplinary action against the concerned employees.

In view of the observations, the Dean (Academic) has recommended that the candidate and the thesis supervisor may be asked to give their comments/explanations on the above facts so that further action may be taken as per rules of the Institute."

In view of the above observations, the candidate and the thesis supervisor were asked vide letter No.Estt.-I/PF/294/3090 dated 28.04.2014 to give their comments/explanations on the above. In response to this Prof. O. P Sahu, Supervisor and Shri Sandeep Santosh had submitted their reply on 30.04.2014.

After considering both the replies, Prof. (Dr.) K. L Chopra (Padamshri) Former Director, IIT Kharagpur was appointed as Chairman of the One-Man-Inquiry Committee to inquire into the alleged case of plagiarism in the Ph.D Thesis submitted by Shri Sandeep Santosh, Assistant Professor.

Dr. K. L. Chopra, Inquiry Officer in the presence of Prof. Baldev Setia, Dean (Academic) conducted the enquiry on 24.9.2014 into the alleged case of plagiarism in the PhD Thesis of Shri Sandeep Santosh, Assistant Professor, Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering and submitted the report Copy enclosed as (Annexure - 35.9.ii from pages 99 to 101).

The recommendations of inquiry officer are as under:

- 1. "that Shri Sandeep Santosh be required to submit a revised Ph.D. thesis by deleting the plagiarized parts of the thesis, by clarifying his own contributions, and if necessary by doing some more research work to make the thesis worthy of a Ph.D. of NIT Kurukshetra.
- 2. that Shri Santosh be allowed to continue his Ph.D. registration and submit the revised thesis of original work as certified by a suitable anti-plagiarism tool not earlier than one year after the date of notification by the Academic Section subject to the approval of his Ph.D. supervisor and DRC. It is understood that the candidate will have to satisfy related requirements of the Ph.D. regulations of the Institute.
- 3. The supervisor of a Ph.D. thesis is expected to take full responsibility for the originality of the research work. Regrettably, the supervisor, Prof. O. P Sahu, Electronics & Communication on Engg. Deptt. refused to take responsibility for the act of plagiarism in the thesis of Shri Sandeep Santosh, even though the originality of same has been certified by Prof. O. P Sahu in the submitted thesis.

The Institute should issue a warning to Prof. O. P Sahu to the effect that he should have acted more responsibly in this matter. Further, in view of his irresponsible attitude, the Chairman of the Inquiry Committee has recommended that the Institute not to allow Ph.D. supervision of any new research student by Prof. O. P Sahu during the next three years."

Further, the inquiry officer has recommended the following for consideration by the Institute:

- "The 'Declaration' given by the research student and his supervisor(s) on the thesis should state clearly that the research work reported is ORIGINAL.
- As far as possible the allotment of supervision of a new research scholar should ensure that the supervisor is interested and competent either directly or in the related field.

3. There should be no ambiguity to the fact that the supervisor is responsible for the quality and originality of the work done by a research scholar under his supervision."

The report of the inquiry officer was approved by the Director. As approved, letters vide No.Estt.-I/PF/294/6970, No.Estt.-I/PF/294/6969 & No.Estt.-I/PF/294/6968 dated 08.11.2014 have been issued to the Prof. O. P Sahu, Shri Sandeep Santosh and Dean (Academic) respectively Copy enclosed as (Annexure - 35.9.iii from pages 102 to 104).

The NIT Kurukshetra Teachers' Association vide their letter dated 03.12.2014 copy enclosed as (Annexure - 35.9.iv on page 105) have conveyed the minutes of the General Body Meeting of NITKTA held on 26.11.2014. The General Body Meeting held on 26.11.2014, resolved that since the Thesis submitted by Shri Sandeep Santosh has not even been sent for evaluation by the external expert, it does not amount to any act of plagiarism. Therefore, punishment given to Prof. O. P Sahu in this matter is illegitimate, unwarranted and unjustified. Therefore, the letter issued to Prof. O. P Sahu be withdrawn. The Teachers' Association further resolved that a uniform policy be framed by the Institute in this regard duly approved by the Senate and a copy of anti plagiarism software be made available to all the faculty members.

The case of plagiarism and action taken thereon is placed for information of the Board.

The resolution of the NIT Kurukshetra Teachers' Association is also placed for information of the Board.



As Chairman, One-Man-Enquiry-Committee appointed by the Director NIT Kurukshetra, I, in the presence of Prof. Baldev Setia, Dean (Acad.) conducted the enquiry on 24.9.2014 into the alleged case of plagiarism in the PhD thesis of Sh. Sandeep Santosh, Asstt. Prof. in the Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering.

The following documents formed the basis for the inquiry:

- 1. Thesis- Hard Copy & Soft Copy on a CD
- 2. Observations of the Dean (Academic)
- 3. Report of Anti Plagiarism Tool (turnit in)
- 4. Reply of Sh. Sandeep Santosh, the Ph.D candidate under inquiry
- 5. Reply of Prof. O.P. Sahu, Supervisor of Sh. Sandeep Santosh

The following persons were called for discussion:

- a) Sh. Sandeep Santosh, Ph.D candidate
- b) Prof. O.P. Sahu, thesis Supervisor of Sh. Sandeep Santosh
- c) Prof. Umesh Ghanekar, HOD, ECE Deptt.
- d) Prof. A.K. Gupta, former Dean (Acad.) and Prof. ECE

On the basis of extensive discussions with the individuals mentioned above, my observations and recommendations are as follows:

1. The Chapters 5 and 6 of the Ph.D thesis submitted, contain material taken largely from published literature in the field, as also supported by the anti-plagiarism tool (turnit in). Although Sh. Sandeep Santosh has given references of publications from which the material has been taken, yet the language in both the Chapters 5 and 6 indicate as if the plagiarized material is a contribution of Sh. Santosh. Infact, there is a considerable blurring between what is plagiarized and what work the scholar has done.

Further, it is not clear in Chapters 5 and 6 as to what original contributions of the candidate are. If the plagiarized material of the thesis is removed, the research contributions do not appear to be significant enough for earning a Ph. D in an institution of national importance.

It is, therefore, recommended:

- 1) that Sh. Sandeep Santosh be required to submit a revised Ph.D. thesis by deleting the plagiarized parts of the thesis, by clarifying his own contributions, and if necessary by doing some more research work to make the thesis worthy of a Ph.D. of NIT Kurukshetra.
- 2) that Sh. Sandeep Santosh be allowed to continue his Ph.D. registration and submit the revised thesis of original work as certified by a suitable anti-plagiarism tool not earlier than one year after the date of notification by the Academic Section subject to the approval of his Ph.D. supervisor and DRC. It is understood that the candidate will have to satisfy related requirements of the Ph.D. regulations of the Institute.
- 3) The supervisor of a Ph.D. thesis is expected to take full responsibility for the originality of the research work. Regrettably, the supervisor, Prof. O.P. Sahu, Electronics & Communication Engg. Deptt. refused to take responsibility for the act of plagiarism in the thesis of Sh. Sandeep Santosh, even though the originality of same has been certified by Prof. O.P. Sahu in the submitted thesis.

The institute should issue a warning to Prof. Sahu to the effect that he should have acted more responsibly in this matter. Further, in view of his irresponsible attitude, I recommend the Institute not to allow Ph.D. supervision of any new research student by Prof. Sahu during the next three years.

Arising out of the discussions during the inquiry, the inquiry officer recommends the following for consideration by the institute:

- 1) The 'Declaration' given by the research student and his supervisor(s) on the thesis should state clearly that the research work reported is ORIGINAL.
- 2) As far as possible the allotment of supervision of a new research scholar should ensure that the supervisor is interested and competent either directly or in the related field.

Item 35.11 To consider waiver of tuition fee for SC/ST students in NIT Kurukshetra.

The Institute received the MHRD letter F.No.33-4/2014-TS.III dated 5th May, 2014 (Annexure + 35.11.i from pages 118 to 119) regarding enhancement of fee for the various programs in NITs from 2014-15 as per the decision of Council of NITs. In the Para 5 of the letter, Institutes were directed that there will be no change in the existing exemptions of tuitions fee for SC/ST students.

In Para 2 of another letter of the MHRD, F.No.33-4/2014-TS.III dated 26th August, 2014 (Annexure - 35.11.ii on page 120), the Ministry justified the decision of Council of NITs to lower the tuition fee for Ph.D. program from Rs. 35,000/- to Rs. 15,000/- per student per year from 2014-15 onwards to encourage the Post Graduates to take up the Ph.D. programs. The SC/ST students can avail of 100% fee reimbursement under various scholarship schemes of State Governments. The NITs may facilitate grant of education loans to economic weaker section.

Further, the Institute received an email (Annexure 35.11.iii from pages 121 to 129) from MHRD on 22nd October 2014 along with attachment MHRD letters - F.No.28-2/2013-TS.III dated 21st October 2014, F.No.23-1/2002-TS.I dated 11th March 2003, No.F. 21-35/2009-TS.III dated 23rd June 2009, F.No.33-4/2014-TS.III dated 5th May 2014, and F.No.28-2/2013-TS.III dated 18th February 2013 on waiver of tuition fee to SC/ST students. As per Para 4 & 5 of the MHRD letter F.No.28-2/2013-TS.III, dated 21st October, 2014, the NITs were further requested to take necessary action and ensure strict compliance of above Ministry's direction. The Para 3(f) of letter F.No.23-1/2002-TS.I, dated 11th March, 2003 is reproduced below:

"The tuition fee for both post graduate (including final year students of dual degree programs) and research students in the IITs be reduced to Rs. 5000/- per annum with no provision for waiver except 100% waiver for SC/ST scholars"

This Para was applicable for the IITs (and not to the NITs). Now, the MHRD has clarified vide their letter F.No.28-2/2013-TS.III dated 21st October 2014 in Para 2 that 100% waiver for SC/ST scholars is also applicable to NITs.

The Institute has been charging full tuition fee from SC/ST students of all the programmes till date. In any of the Ministry's letters or orders it is not mentioned that the fee waiver to SC/ST students would be applicable for B. Tech programmes. However, in the MHRD letter F.No.28-2/2013-TS.III dated 21st October 2014, it is mentioned that the Para 3(f) of the MHRD letter F.No.23-1/2002-TS.I dated 11th March 2003 is also applicable to the NITs.

In view of above, the BoG may kindly consider the following:

- (i) Giving tuition fee waiver to SC/ST students studying in various M. Tech. programs of the Institute.

Fees from Rs.35,000/- to Rs.70,000/- per student per year for B.Tech., MCA and M.Tech. Programmes in the National Institutes of Technology (NITs), the Ministry of Human Resource Development had issued a clarification dated 18.07.2014 that the enhanced fee will be applicable to the new students seeking admission in the NITs from the academic session 2014 – 2015 onwards. It was also clarified that in case of Ph.D. students (both old and new), the fee prescribed by the Council of NITs would apply.

- 2. The Council of NITs decided to lower the tuition fee for Ph.D. programmes from Rs.35,000/- to Rs.15,000/- per student per year from 2014 2015 onwards to encourage the Post Graduates to take up Ph.D. programme. The SC and ST students can avail of 100% fee reimbursement under various scholarship schemes of State Governments. The NITs may facilitate grant of education loans to Economic Weaker Sections.
- 3. In the background of the issue, references / representations have been received from the students of NITs requesting this Ministry to roll back the fee hike in case of already enrolled students. The clarification dated 18.07.2014 has taken care of the concerns of the students enrolled in NITs prior to academic session 2014-2015.

This Ministry is in receipt of several requests received from many National Institutes of Technology (NITs) regarding waiver of tuition fee for SC/ST students of UG/PG/Research Scholar.

- 2. In this regard, MHRD letter no.F.23 1/2002.TS I dated 11th March, 2003 (copy enclosed), wherein para3 (f) specifically mentioned that the tuition fee for both post graduate (including final year students of dual degree programs) and research students in the IITs be reduced to Rs.5000 per annum with no provision for waiver except 100% waiver for SC/ST scholars. The same was also be applicable to NITs to ensure student of weaker section were participating in the enrolment in the Higher Studies and Research to reduce the gap in the shortage of faculty and also increase the Gross Enrolment Ratio percentage.
- 3. This Ministry vide its letter no F $\sim 21-35/2009.TS-III$ dated 23.06.2009 (copy enclosed) has further directed all NiTs that there will be no change in the existing exemptions to tuition fee for SC/ST students. Thereafter, Director of all newly established NiTs was also instructed to ensure the strict compliance of aforesaid Ministry's letter and take necessary action accordingly.
- It was also reiterated in the recent Ministry's order dated 05.05.2014 (copy enclosed) that there will be no change in the existing exemptions to tuition fee for SC/ST students.
- It is therefore, requested to take necessary action and ensure strict compliance of above Ministry's direction.

In continuation of this Ministry's letter No.30-4/2000-TS.1 dated 20th December, 2001, the undersigned is directed to say that yide letter under reference this Ministry had issued guidelines on Policy Framework for Promotion of Post-Graduate Education & Research in Engineering & Technology.

- 2. Under the Policy Framework for PG Education and Research the rate of scholarship for ME/M, Tech scholars and doctoral students were enhanced. Later the rate of emoluments for Junior Research Fellows (JRF) and Senior Research Fellows (SRF) was revised to a different level by Department of Science & Technology (DST) and Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR). It was noticed that most of premier institutions have scholars funded through the Ministry of HRD as well as through DST / CSIR and other agencies and differentials in rate of fellowships was causing difficulties and tension in these institutions.
- 3. In order to resolve this anomalous situation, the Policy Framework for PG Education and Research have been reviewed in consultation with DST, CSIR, other Departments, UGC, AICTE and premier academic institutions. While reviewing it was noted that the Council of ITTs in its meeting in 1995 had decided that the enhancement of stipends or scholarships given to postgraduate students and research scholars by CSIR be applicable in ITTs as well. It had further recommended that in future a unified decision by concerned Ministry / Departments and the UGC be taken. Based on detailed deliberations and consultations, the Government of India has in furtherance to the Policy Framework for PG-Education and Research taken the following decisions:
- a) Assistantship for ME, M.Tech or MS (by research) programmes by the Ministry of HRD may be maintained at Rs.5000 per month as approved in the policy framework for PG education and research in December. 2001. However, the rate of scholarship for M.Tech students need not maintain parity with Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) under the UGC / CSIR. Contingency at a rate of Rs.5000 per annum per scholar (as already

approved in the policy framework) would be available to the Department to meet departmental expenses on research related activities for the postgraduate students. All students getting assistantship would be required to purion at least eight hours of teaching, research and other work in the Institute. Assistantship for MS (by research) could be extended to the third year on case-to-case basis by the Institute.

- b) The number of assistantship supported by Minisary of HRD for ME, M. Tech and MS (by Research) scholars shall be restricted to a number fixed by the Ministry. This shall be provided to the scholars on the basis of merit determined through GATE scores. B. Tech graduates from the IITs getting a CGPA score of 8 or above (on a scale of 10) would also be entitled to the assistantship without having to appear in GATE. Deferred payment of assistantship may be resorted to wherever there is apprehension of scholars leaving the programs mid-way.
- c) Students of final year of dual degree integrated programmes would also be entitled to assistantship from the 9th semester onwards in case they get a CGPA score of 8 or above (on a scale of 10). Alternatively they could compete for assistantship through GATE. The number of ME, M.Tech scholars or students of dual degree programmes getting assistantship on the basis of CGPA scores would be included in the numbers of assistantship fixed by the Ministry of HRD. Information of these numbers will have to be provided to the Ministry annually.
- d) Support for doctoral programmes by the Ministry of HRD be termed as Research / Teaching Assistantship, the rate of this assistantship shall be enhanced to bring it to the DST/CSIR level. Contingency at a rate of Rs.20000 per annum per scholar (enhanced form Rs.10000 to bring parity with CSIR system) would be available to the Departments of IITs to meet departmental expenses on research related activities for the doctoral students. All scholars getting Research / Teaching Assistantship would be required to put in at least eight hours of research or teaching in the Institute. Enhanced rates shall be as follows.

Qualifying degree	First 2 years	For next 2 years
BE / B.Tech. / M.Sc. or Equivalent	Rs.8000 pm	Rs.9000 pm
ME / M.Tech. / MBBS or Equivalent	Rs.9500 pm	Rs.10000 pm

- e) The rate of fellowship for QIP scholars registered for Ph.D. programmes would also be enhanced to the DST / CSIR level.
- f) The tuition fee for both post graduate (including final year students of dual degree programs) and research students in the IITs be reduced to Rs.5000 per annum with no provision for wayer except 100% waiver for SC / ST scholars.
- g) Research / Teaching Assistantship for scholars at enhanced rate be restricted to 4 years as already approved in PG Policy Framework. All students in the first three years will automatically be covered under the revised scheme and scholars in 4th year may be

given an option either to continue at the pre-revised scale with a provision for extension by another year or opt for enhanced rate with 4-year time limit:

- h) IITs may appropriately allocate number of assistantships to the emerging and thrust areas in engineering.
- The above decisions will be given effect from the next academic year i.e. 1st July, 2003.
- 4. It is advised that different provisions in the on going programmes/schemes for PG education & research may be suitably modified by all concerned to bring them in conformity with the above decisions. All Organizations / Institutions are advised to absorb the additional requirement of funds due to enhancement of assistanceship / research fellowship within their existing non-plan budgets.

Previously, the F-type category houses in the Institute Campus were allotted to the Non-Teaching Staff on the basis of the House Allotment Rules (Non-Teaching) Schedule –I(B) which reads as under:

Further in the New House Allotment Rules the entitlement for F-type category houses has been amended as under:

Now, some of the employees having Grade Pay of Rs.1900/- & Rs.2000/- have applied for the F-type houses notified vide notification No.EO/3352/365 dated 04.09.2014. The House Allotment Committee in its meeting held on 20.11.2014 has recommended that

"the employees who were earlier entitled for the F-type category houses in the grade pay of Rs.1900/-, Rs.2000/- as per previous house allotment rules of the Institute and the employees with grade pay of Rs.1900/- and Rs.2000/- may be considered eligible for F-type houses as a one time measure because number of F-type houses are lying vacant.

In view of the above recommendations of the House Allotment Committee duly approved by the Hon'ble Director, the F-type houses may be allotted to the employees with a Grade Pay of Rs.1900/- and Rs.2000/- as a one time measure.

The matter is placed before the BOG for consideration and decision, please.

Item 35.13 Cheque signatory and re-allocation of work amongst the Registry Officers

The Finance Committee in its 28th meeting held on 15.10.2013 considered the issue of dual cheque signatory on all cheque payments and delegation of routine work to account section under agenda no. 28.7 and made the following recommendation to the Board:

"The Finance Committee approved to adopt the concept of dual signatory on all cheque payments with the Dy. Registrar (A/c) as the first signatory and Dy. Registrar (GA & Legal) or Registrar or Director as the second signatory. The system of bank transfer/RTGS/NEFT be evolved as more efficient mode of payments. The Finance Committee also approved the delegation of routine work of account section as per proposed agenda item."

The minutes of 28th Finance Committee were approved by the BoG in its 32nd meeting held on 03.01.2014.

Further, vide item no. 32.15, the BoG in its 32nd meeting held on 03.01.2014 decided: "The Board approved the re-designation of the three posts Deputy Registrar (General Administration & Legal), Deputy Registrar (Accounts) and Deputy Registrar (Academic) as 'Deputy Registrar'. The incumbents on the posts of Deputy Registrar may be posted in any of the Sections of the Institute."

It may be mentioned that after the 32nd BoG meeting held on 03.01.2014, Shri Pankaj Kumar Bayati joined the Institute as Deputy Registrar on 3rd March 2014.

In view of the above, the BoG may kindly consider approving the following:

- (i) the officers who will be cheque signatory may be decided by the Director as required in the interest of the Institute rather than limiting to the officers as decided in the 28th meeting of the Finance Committee.
- (ii) the re-allocation of the work amongst the Registry Officers may be decided by the Director as per need of the Institute.
