Minutes of 58<sup>th</sup> SCSA Meeting held on 07.05.2020.

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At the outset, Hon'ble Director and Chairman of the Senate welcomed all the members of SCSA in this online meeting, and enquired & wished for the wellbeing of all the faculty/staff members and their families. He talked about global health crisis prevailing in the form of COVID-19 and appreciated efforts of the faculty in conducting online classes and for being in constant touch with the students to uphold their motivation levels. He also stressed upon the need to remain vigilant and prepared for future challenges, as the fight is not yet over. He emphasized that an unprecedented situation like this demands innovative, decisive and coordinated policy action for the conduct of examination by resorting to unusual tools. With the enduring efforts of all, the Hon'ble Director is confident that we will succeed as an Institute, as a society, as a nation, and as the entire global human race in our fight against the virus.

Thereafter, the agenda was taken up for detailed deliberations that lasted for about two hours.

## SCSA 58.01 To consider and approve plan Examination and Academic Calendar / Schedule for the year 2020-2021 in view of COVID-19 Pandemic.

All the Deans, HoDs, School Coordinators and Registrar I/c expressed their concern for the academic loss, placements & future of the students and wished for the well-being of the students in the prevailing conditions due to COVID-19. The proposed plan for the examinations (UG, PG & PhD) for terminal and intermediate semesters for the current academic session (2019-20) only in view of the COVID-19 Pandemic was deliberated in detail keeping in view all the stated factors in various Government orders/directions/guidelines related to COVID-19, students' feedback, decisions of other premier institutes, and other related issues. After incorporating the suggestions of the members, the following was decided:

## I. <u>Examination of Terminal Semester of B.Tech. and MBA students</u> (B.Tech. 8<sup>th</sup> Semester & MBA 4<sup>th</sup> Semester)

- 1. Grading of the students for end/external semester examinations to be composite of 50% marks on the basis of the internal evaluation/assessment and the remaining 50% marks on the basis performance in previous semester (i.e. SGPA) only.
- 2. The students to be given full attendance from March 25, 2020 to April 24, 2020 (i.e. period of lockdown during which online teaching continued). The actual attendance will be attendance in regular mode plus attendance in online mode/lockdown period. In case, the actual attendance falls short of 75%, it is to be treated as 75% so that no student be detained in the prevailing conditions.

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- 3. Marks as obtained in the first test/sessional to be considered for the second test/sessional. In case, a student has not appeared in first test/sessional, the marks to be awarded based on online/offline assignments, etc. for the purpose of internal assessment. The benefit of assignments, etc. be also given to the students who have appeared in first test/sessional by upscaling the marks in first test/assessment.
- 4. The **Seminars** of the students, if remaining, to be conducted by the concerned teacher through Skype or any other online tool from **27**<sup>th</sup> **to 29**<sup>th</sup> **MAY**, **2020**.
- Project viva-voce, Comprehensive viva-voce & GFPA to be conducted simultaneously at one go, by a team of faculty members nominated by HoD of the concerned department, through Skype or any other online tool from 1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> June, 2020.
- 6. The re-appear exam/assessment of terminal semesters to be held along with the regular exams/assessment on similar lines. The students have to apply for re-appear exams after downloading the relevant form from Institute website. The guidelines for submission of re-appear form will be notified on the Institute website by Academic section.
- 7. The details for awarding marks/grade in a theory course and practical courses are given in **Annexure I and II** respectively along with illustrations.
- 8. The awards/results are to be submitted to Examination Cell in the same format and procedure as followed in the Institute by **10<sup>th</sup> June, 2020.**
- 9. The results may be declared by **30<sup>th</sup> June,2020**.

## II. <u>Examination of Terminal Semester of M.Tech. & MCA students</u> (M.Tech. 4<sup>th</sup> Semester & MCA 6<sup>th</sup> Semester)

- 1. The students who have completed their dissertation work need to **submit their final version of thesis/dissertation** *(.pdf document)* **online** to the concerned supervisor with a copy to HoD/School Coordinator, examination branch and library.
- 2. The students whose dissertation work is pending due to experimentation or any other reason are allowed to submit their thesis/dissertation up to September 30, 2020 without paying any additional fee. However, those who submit thesis beyond this date are required to pay full semester fee for next semester. It is pertinent to mention

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that GATE scholarship will be paid up to June 30, 2020 or date of submission of thesis whichever is earlier, subject to fulfilment of conditions for the scholarship.

- 3. The **viva-voce to be conducted online** through skype or any other online tool. The HoD/School coordinator may appoint one Internal faculty member (subject expert) who in coordination with supervisor may conduct viva-voce. It is pertinent to mention that **no external examiner** will be appointed for conduct of viva-voce.
- 4. As the students may not be able to present their papers in conferences due to prevailing conditions of COVID-19, the conditions/need of publications for securing particular grade stands waived-off. However, in case a student has published/presented papers in Journals/Conferences, due weightage/ consideration be given accordingly while awarding marks/grade.
- 5. The result in the same format and procedure as followed in the Institute is to be submitted to Examination Cell within five days of conduct of viva-voce.
- 6. The results may be declared within fortnight of conduct of viva-voce.

## III. Examination of Intermediate Semesters of UG, PG and PhD course work

- Grading of the students for the end/external semester examinations (theory, practical, seminar etc.) of all intermediate semesters (odd and even both) to be composite of 50% marks on the basis of the internal evaluation/assessment and the remaining 50% marks to be on the basis of performance (i.e. SGPA) in previous semester only. In the situations where previous SGPA of previous semester is not available (i.e. like for students of 1<sup>st</sup> semester & Ph.D students ) 100% evaluation may be done on the basis of internal assessments.
- 2. The students to be given full attendance from March 25, 2020 to April 24, 2020 (i.e. period of lockdown during which online teaching continued). The actual attendance will be attendance in regular mode plus attendance in online mode/lockdown period. In case, the actual attendance falls short of 75%, it is to be treated as 75% so that no student be detained in the prevailing conditions.
- 3. Marks as obtained in the first test/sessional to be considered for the second test/sessional. In case, a student has not appeared in first test/sessional, the marks to be awarded based on online/offline assignments, etc. for the purpose of internal assessment. The benefit of assignments, etc. be also given to the students who have appeared in first test/sessional by upscaling the marks in first test/sessional.

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- 4. The re-appear exam/assessment of all intermediate semesters (odd and even both) to be held along with the regular exams/assessment on similar lines. The students have to apply for re-appear exams after downloading the relevant form from Institute website. The guidelines for submission of re-appear form will be notified on the Institute website by Academic section.
- 5. The awards/results are to be submitted to Examination Cell in the same format and procedure as followed in the Institute by **30<sup>th</sup> June,2020**.
- The evaluation of 6<sup>th</sup> semester Internship/Industrial training/Project work to be conducted through skype or any other online tool and to be completed by 15<sup>th</sup> July, 2020. The students are required to submit their final internship/project report online by 7<sup>th</sup> July, 2020 to their respective faculty mentors.

Further, the COVID-19 Lockdown period will be treated as work from home and is to be counted towards the stipulated 18 weeks' duration of the aforesaid internship/industrial training/ project work.

7. Comprehensive exam and Pre-synopsis of Ph.D students may be conducted online through any suitable mode by DRC/SRC of the concerned Department/School until the Institute opens and the classes resume in regular mode.

## IV. Academic Calendar for Academic Year 2020-21

The odd semester of Academic Year 2020-21 may commence from August 01, 2020, except for fresh batch/students. However, the Academic calendar for the Academic Year 2020-21 will be notified later on after making a comprehensive assessment of the level of preparedness, residential status of the students, status of COVID-19 pandemic spread in their city / region / state and other factors; and after developing a plan before the resumption of session, strictly following the norms of "social distancing" and other required precautions, to avoid any eventuality arising due to COVID-19.

No other item was taken up in the meeting.

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## S39.04 To consider and approve online Teaching Plan and Academic Calendar / Schedule for the odd semester of Academic Year 2020-2021 in view of COVID-19 Pandemic.

The agenda for Examinations for odd semester of Academic Year 2019-20 and Academic Calendar / Schedule for the year 2020-2021 in view of COVID-19 Pandemic & MHRD letter notified vide F.No.33 – 6 / 2020 – TS.III dated 1<sup>st</sup> May, 2020 was taken up in 58<sup>th</sup> SCSA meeting held on May 07, 2020. SCSA approved the plan for examinations for odd semester of AY 2019-20 and decided to notify the academic calendar for AY 2020-21 later on.

In continuation with the above cited subject & communication received from Ministry of Home Affairs Order No. 40-3/2020-DM-I(A) dated 29 June, 2020 regarding Guidelines for Phased Re-opening (Unlock II), it is mentioned under 1(i) that educational Institutes will remain closed till July 31, 2020 and online/distance learning shall continue to be permitted and shall be encouraged. Considering the prevailing conditions of COVID-19, it is proposed to start the odd semester of Academic Year 2020-2021 from August 17, 2020 in online mode for 2<sup>nd</sup> year onwards students of UG & PG and for 1<sup>st</sup> Semester students of MBA, the admissions for which have already been completed. The schedule for 1<sup>st</sup> semester students of B.Tech./M.Tech./MCA/Ph.D., will be notified later after the completion of admission process. The academic calendar for odd semester of Academic Year 2020-2021 is proposed (Annexure-I).

The online teaching mode will be followed as proposed below, till the Institute reopens and offline classes commence, as per the guidelines of Centre/State Government.

1. The time table may be prepared for regular mode (physical teaching) of the classes. However, till the institute re-opens, the classes may be held in the online mode and institute time-table may be followed for engaging the classes as far as possible. In unprecedented situations, the faculty members may choose convenient time slot for online teaching, in consultation with

other faculty members and the students, depending upon the circumstances prevailing.

- 2. The online teaching may include Power Point Presentations (PPT's) to be shared with students. The faculty members may deliver online lectures of their courses using PPT's shared through platforms like Google Meet, Microsoft Team, Jio Meet, Skype, Webex etc. The advanced sharing of PPT's may lead to better understanding of the content by the students and help them raise queries in the online class.
- 3. PPT's of all experiments in each lab, with suitable illustrations and photographs of equipment/flow diagrams/line sketches etc. may be made available to the students. If possible, small videos of working of machines/carrying out of experiments may be shared with the students.
- 4. All the faculty members may provide list of links of course materials (theory and practical) of their courses, available on various platforms like NPTEL, SWAYAM, Coursera, YouTube etc. to supplement online teaching.
- 5. The attendance of students may be taken in any appropriate mode.
- 6. The students may be given assignments to be submitted online.
- Mid semester examinations may be conducted in online mode till the Institute opens. Faculty members may opt for Subjective/Multiple choice based Question Paper/Open book/Quiz etc.
- The modalities of end semester examinations for the odd semester of Academic Year 2020-21 may be finalized later on, taking into account the directions of the MHRD/Central/State Governments.

## Guidelines for Phased Re-opening (Unlock 2)

[As per Ministry of Home Affairs Order No. 40-3/2020-DM-I (A) dated 29 June, 2020]

## 1. Activities permitted during Unlock 2 period outside Containment Zones

In areas outside Containment Zones, all activities will be permitted, except the following:

 Schools, colleges, educational and coaching institutions will remain closed till 31 July, 2020. Online/ distance learning shall continue to be permitted and shall be encouraged.

Training institutions of the Central and State Governments will be allowed to function from 15 July, 2020, for which Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) will be issued by the Department of Personnel & Training (DoPT).

- (ii) International air travel of passengers, except as permitted by MHA.
- (iii) Metro Rail.
- (iv) Cinema halls, gymnasiums, swimming pools, entertainment parks, theatres, bars, auditoriums, assembly halls and similar places.
- (v) Social/ political/ sports/ entertainment/ academic/ cultural/ religious functions and other large congregations.

Dates for re-starting the above activities may be decided separately and necessary SOPs shall be issued for ensuring social distancing and to contain the spread of COVID-19.

## Domestic flights and passenger trains have already been allowed it a dimited manner. Their operations will be further expanded in a calibrated manner.

## 2. Night curfew

Movement of individuals shall remain strictly prohibited between 10.00 pm to 5.00 am throughout the country, except for essential activities, including operation of industrial units in multiple shifts, movement of persons and goods on National and State Highways, loading and unloading of cargo and travel of persons to their destinations after disembarking from buses, trains and airplanes. Local authorities shall issue orders, in the entire area of their jurisdiction, under appropriate provisions of law, such as under Section 144 of CrPC, and ensure strict compliance.

## 3. National Directives for COVID-19 Management

National Directives for COVID-19 Management, as specified in **Annexure I**, shall continue to be followed throughout the country.

## 4. Lockdown limited to Containment Zones

 Lockdown shall continue to remain in force in the Containment Zones till 31 July, 2020.

- (ii) Containment Zones will be demarcated by the District authorities after taking into consideration the guidelines of Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW) with the objective of effectively breaking the chain of transmission. These Containment Zones will be notified on the websites by the respective District Collectors and by the States/ UTs and information will be shared with MOHFW.
- (iii) In the Containment Zones, only essential activities will be allowed. There shall be strict perimeter control to ensure that there is no movement of people in or out of these zones, except for medical emergencies and for maintaining supply of essential goods and services. In the Containment Zones, there shall be intensive contact tracing, house-to-house surveillance, and other clinical interventions, as required. Guidelines of MoHFW shall be effectively implemented for the above purpose.
- (iv) Activities in the Containment Zones shall be monitored strictly by the State/ UT authorities, and the guidelines relating to containment measures in these zones shall be strictly implemented.
- (v) States/ UTs may also identify Buffer Zones outside the Containment Zones, where new cases are more likely to occur. Within the buffer zones, restrictions as considered necessary may be put in place by the District authorities.

# 5. States/ UTs, based on their assessment of the situation, may prohibit certain activities outside the Containment zones, or impose such restrictions as deemed necessary.

However, there shall be no restriction on inter-State and intra-State movement of persons and goods including those for cross land-border trade under Treaties with neighbouring countries. No separate permission/ approval/ e-permit will be required for such movements.

## 6. Movement of persons with SOPs

Movement by passenger trains and *Shramik* special trains; domestic passenger air travel; movement of Indian Nationals stranded outside the country and of specified persons to travel abroad; evacuation of foreign nationals; and sign-on and sign-off of Indian seafarers will continue to be regulated as per SOPs issued.

#### 7. Protection of vulnerable persons

Persons above 65 years of age, persons with co-morbidities, pregnant women, and children below the age of 10 years are advised to stay at home, except for essential and health purposes.

#### 8. Use of Aarogya Setu

- (i) *Aarogya Setu* enables early identification of potential risk of infection, and thus acts as a shield for individuals and the community.
- (ii) With a view to ensuring safety in offices and work places, employers on best effort basis should ensure that *Aarogya Setu* is installed by all employees having compatible mobile phones.

(iii) District authorities may advise individuals to install the *Aarogya Setu* application on compatible mobile phones and regularly update their health status on the app. This will facilitate timely provision of medical attention to those individuals who are at risk.

### 9. Strict enforcement of the guidelines

- (i) State/ UT Governments shall not dilute these guidelines issued under the Disaster Management Act, 2005, in any manner.
- (ii) All the District Magistrates shall strictly enforce the above measures.

### 10. Penal provisions

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Any person violating these measures will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, besides legal action under Section188 of the IPC, and other legal provisions as applicable. Extracts of these penal provisions are at Annexure II.
