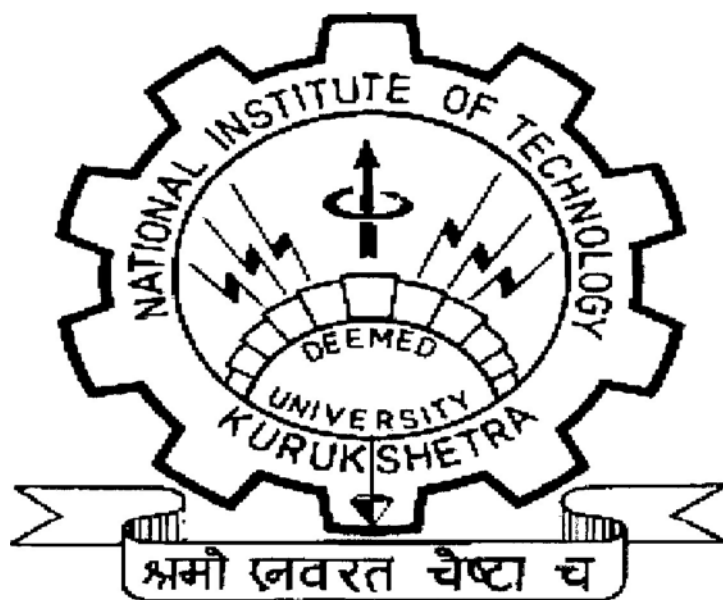

Before the Board of Governors started
deliberations, Dr.

S.N. Mahendra, the Director & Member-Secretary
warmly welcomed the Hon ble Chairman of the Board as
well as other members of the Board.

The Director and Member-Secretary also apprised the
Board about the National Board of Accreditation team
which visited the Institution w.e.f.

27.2.2004 to 29.2.2004 to consider accreditation
of the Departments of Civil Engineering,
Electrical Engineering, Mechanical Engineering
and Electronics & Communication Engineering.

The Chairman, Board of Governors expressed
the following views on the basis of observations
made by the NBA team on the concluding day of
its visit:-

- i) The NBA team observed about strengths of the Institute.
- ii) The team talked about research being done in
one of the Departments of the Institute and
wanted quantum of research in other
Departments to increase.
- iii) The team observed lack of research scholarships
even when funds are available.

iv) There is lesser number of technical staff in the laboratories.

During the course of discussions, the observations sent by Sh. Dharam Vir, IAS, Financial Commissioner & Principal Secretary to Govt. of Haryana, Technical Education Department, Chandigarh to the Director and Member-Secretary by fax on 15.3.2004 on the various decisions taken by the Board in its 4th meeting held on 8.12.2003 were considered.

The Board took the following decisions:-

5.1 To confirm the minutes of the 4th meeting of the Board of Governors held on 8.12.2003.

The Board noted comments sent by Sh. Dharam Vir, IAS, Financial Commissioner & Principal Secretary to Government of Haryana, Technical Education Department, Chandigarh on the agenda item 4.24 of 4th meeting of the Board held on 8.12.2003 that "there was no decision in regard to withholding the payment of Dr. K.K. Aggarwal and none made any reference to the enquiry report submitted by Sh. K.C. Shenmar",

After detailed discussion, the Board of Governors confirmed the minutes of the 4th meeting of the Board held on 8.12.2003 as already circulated by the Institute vide letter No. NITK/BOG/4th/762-66 dated 22.1.2004, Endst. No. NITK/BOG/4th/767-71 dated 22.1.2004 and corrigendum bearing No. NITK/BOG/4th/1179-87 dated 06.02.2004.

While confirming the decision taken on the agenda item 4.12, the Board agreed to implement the medical rules on the Central Government pattern w.e.f. 1.3.2004.

5.2 To note action taken on the minutes of 4th meeting of Board of Governors of **National Institute of Technology**, Kurukshetra held on 8, 12.2003,

The Board noted that follow-up action on the minutes of the 4th meeting of the Board held on 8.12.2003 are being taken by the Institute

and these will be reported to the Board in its next meeting. The Board, however, desired that in future follow-up action on the decisions taken by the Board in its preceding meeting should be reported to the Board.

The agenda item 5.20 regarding follow-up action taken on the minutes of 2nd meeting of the Board held on 19.4.2003 was also taken up by the Board and follow up action taken on the minutes of the 2nd meeting was noted by the Board as per details furnished in the agenda item 5.20.

6.3 To note and approve the nomination of an alumnus of the Institute from amongst Alumni in education/industry on the Board of Governors.

The Board approved the nomination of Er. Rakesh Bakshi, LAMA, FIE, Managing Director, Vestas RRB India Ltd., 180, Sukhdev Vihar, New Delhi as alumnus on the Board of the Institute.

5.4 To note the minutes of the 1st meeting of the Equipment & Stores Committee, National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra held on 11.2.2004.

The Board noted the minutes of the 1st meeting of the Equipment & Stores Committee of the Institute held on 11.2.2004.

5.5 To consider nomination of faculty members on the Board.

The Board approved the nomination of the faculty members on the Board as per details furnished in the agenda item.

However, the Board desired that in future only those faculty members be nominated on the Board who can complete their full term of one year up to their retirement and the faculty members who are not in a position to complete full term of one year on account of being on long leave/ EOL or deputation be not nominated on the Board.

5.6 To consider VISION document of NIT, Kurukshetra.

The Board considered VISION document of the Institute as prepared with the help of 'ITTI, Bhopal during the period 9.12.2002 to 11.12.2002 as per details furnished in the agenda item.

The Hon'ble Chairman, BOG observed that the VISION of the Institute should also be drawn graphically in a pictorial manner.

Dr. R.S. Sirohi, Director, IIT, Delhi observed that VISION of the Institute should be small one say "to produce excellent human resources for meeting social and national needs".

The comments sent by Sh. Dharam Vir, IAS, Financial Commissioner & Principal Secretary to Government of Haryana, Technical Education Department, Chandigarh on the VISION of the Institute read as under:-

"To be a world class center of excellence in education and research in Science, Technoloo^r and Management and should be responsive to changing global needs with emphasis on quality, innovation, entrepreneurial and leadership competencies, professional and human values, scientific and technological development and socio-economic upliftment of community".

The Board desired that VISION document of the Institute be updated after review keeping in view above **observations** of the Hon 'ble Chairman, BOG, Dr. R.S. Sirohi and Sh. Dharam Vir, IAS.

5.7 To consider implementation of World Bank Purchase Rules for procurement of goods, civil works and services under Technical Education Quality Improvement Programme Project of

Government of India, funded by the World Bank, simultaneously with the Institute Purchase Rules under its grant. .

The Director and Member-Secretary emphasized the need, on the basis of documents, for following World Bank Purchase Rules for procurement of goods, civil works and services under TEQIP Project of the Government of India so that there is no difficulty in getting reimbursement of the expenditure incurred by the Institute. Sh. V.S.Pandey, IAS, Joint Secretary(T), MHRD emphasized that the Institute Purchase Rules should be followed for spending money under the TEQIP Project and there will be no difficulty from the MHRD side in getting the reimbursement of the money spent.

After detailed discussions, the Board decided that procurement under TEQIP Project funded by the World Bank be made in accordance with existing purchase rules of the Institute except for those clauses which may not be in consonance with the World Bank regulations. However, the present financial limits imposed under the Institute Purchase Rules be adhered to.

5.8 To consider the minimum qualifications and experience prescribed for teaching posts in Degree Level Technical Institutions.

The Board decided to approve the minimum qualifications and experience for the post of Lecturers in Degree level technical institutions as prescribed by the NCTE as per details furnished in the agenda item, further adding the following desirable conditions in general:-

- i) The candidates with higher qualifications, if available, should be preferred.
- ii) The applications received should be screened Department wise keeping in view the number of post(s) advertised alongwith specialization(s) thereof wherever required.
- iii) Certain ratio/criteria should be fixed for calling the candidates for interview after screening the number of applications received for the post(s) advertised for a Department.

- 5.9 To delegate the powers to the Director for deciding various routine matters arising in view of adoption of the service conditions on the Central Government pattern.

The Board delegated powers to decide the following routine matter, in anticipation approval of the Board, strictly in accordance with the Central Government pattern:-

i) Grant of DA ii) To grant Bonus, Festival Advance, LTC, medical reimbursement (upto Rs. 1.5 lacs in each case at a time), House Rent Allowance, CCA, Transport Allowance, Washing Allowance and TA/DA.

- 5.10 To note the corrigendum pertaining to Career Advancement Scheme for teachers of Degree Level Technical Institutions.

The Board noted corrigendum issued by the AICTE vide letter No. FD/PSSC/Clarif./ /2003/1 dated 17.12.2003 carrying out certain amendments in the revised Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) for the faculty members.

The Board, however, stressed that revised qualifications/terms & conditions for recruitment of teachers as well as benefits under the CAS issued by AICTE/MHRD from time to time should be effective from date(s) of issuance of the notifications.

- 5.11 To consider the extension case of deputation of Smt, Sunita Chauhan, Lecturer in Electrical Engineering Department of NIT, Kurubhetra from 20,12.2003 to 19.12.2004,

The Board noted its earlier decision taken in the 2nd meeting held on 19.4.2003 that Smt. Sunita Chauhan was allowed extension in deputation upto 19.12.2003 subject to her submitting an undertaking to the Institute that no further extension will be given to her under Institute rules and she will have to resume her duty in the Institute after the expiry of her deputation period on 19.12.2003. Despite the said undertaking given by Smt. Sunita Chauhan, she did not join her duty at the Institute on 20.12.2003.

The Board did not agree to extend the deputation of Smt. Sunita Chauhan beyond 19.12.2003 and decided that she be directed to join her duty at NIT, Kurukshetra immediately failing which Institute should proceed against her as per its rules.

- 5.12 To note the action of the enquiry officer appointed in the case of Ms. Indu Nalwa, **Ex-Lecturer** in Humanities Department regarding her final settlement,

The Board noted that report of Dr. M.P. Kapoor in the case of Ms. Indu Nalwa is still awaited.

The Board authorized the Chairman of the Board to take further necessary action to decide the matter.

- 5.13 To note the suspension of Sh. S.C. Gupta, Lecturer in Mechanical Engineering Department of NIT, Kurukshetra.

The Board approved the action taken by the Institute in suspending Sh. S.C. Gupta, Lecturer in Mechanical Engg. Deptt. as per details furnished in the agenda item.

The Board appointed Sh. A.K. Saikia, Chairman, Board of Governors, 11T, Guwahati (Ex-Chief Secretary to the Government of Assam) as Enquiry Officer in the aforesaid case.

- 5.14 To note the **engagement** of Dr. S.K. Gupta, retired Professor of 11T, Kanpur for framing academic rules and Sh. S.P. Sharma, Deputy Registrar (Academic) on contract basis.

The Board noted that Dr. S.K. Gupta, Retd. Professor of Mathematics, 11T, Kanpur who had sufficient experience of framing academic rules has been engaged by the Institute at remuneration of Rs. 1000/- per day plus TA. The Board noted that Dr. Gupta will finish up the work within few weeks/ visits.

The Board also noted that Sh. S.P. Sharma, Retd. DR(Academic), North Eastern Regional Institute of Science and Technology, Itanagar, Arunachal Pradesh has been engaged as DR(Academic) on contract basis for a period of one year at a consolidated salary of Rs. 14,000/- per month. The Board, however, desired to ensure that Sh. S.P. Sharma is not in receipt of any pension from his previous employer(s).

- 5.15 To ratify action taken by the Chairman, BOG in engaging private Doctors for the employees of NIT, Kurukshetra,

The Board approved action taken by the Chairman of the Board in approving panel of additional 8 doctors as per details furnished in the agenda item.

The Board further agreed that the doctors of additional specializations, if required, be also engaged on the existing terms and conditions so as to make available atleast three doctors of each specialization.

5.16 To consider implementation of Assured Career Progression(ACP) to the non-teaching employees of NIT, Kurukshetra on State Government pattern prior to 1.1.2004,

The Board decided that the matter regarding ACP cases in respect of the non-teaching employees which are pending for disposal during the intervening period i.e. prior to 1.1.2004 be examined by the MHRD. Hence the matter be referred to the Ministry.

5.17 Service conditions of the employees of RECs upon their conversion as NITs with Deemed University status-payment of different allowances,

The Board decided that the service conditions for the employees of the Institute as circulated by the MHRD vide its Memo No. F.20-46/2003-TS.111 dated 22.12.2003 be implemented w.e.f. 1.7.2003.

The Board further decided that the amount already paid to Group-D staff on account of washing allowance on the State Government pattern upto 29.2.2004 be adjusted toward liveries required to be paid for winter season on the Central Government pattern as it is not desirable to provide the liveries for the winter season at this stage when the summer season has already commenced.

S. 18 To note matter regarding Ph.D. Registration.

The Board noted initiative taken by the Institute to get the Ph.D. candidates of NITK transferred from Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra for final award of Ph.D. degrees by the Institute.

The Board desired that the matter be expedited.

- 5.19 To consider research fellowships for promotion of Ph.D. programmes in engineering and non-engineering departments of the Institute.

The Board noted that ten (10) research fellowships already exist in the Institute as per details furnished in the agenda item. The Board desired that payment of the existing fellowships should be made from the Development Fund of the Institute.

The Board introduced fifteen (15) additional Ph.D. scholarships at the rates to be decided by the MHRD from time to time as per details furnished in the agenda item. The Board desired that the Institute should take up the matter with the MHRD regarding funds as it is a desired activity from academic point of view.

- 5.20 To note the follow up action taken on the minutes of the 2nd meeting of the Board held on 19.4.2003.

The agenda item 5.20 was discussed along with the agenda item 5.2.

- 5.21 To consider vacant non-teaching posts for lifting of ban.

The Board did not agree to lift ban on recruitment of non-teaching and supporting staff.

The Board desired that the process of rationalization be completed at the earliest. Keeping in view the observations made by the National Board of Accreditation regarding urgent need of technical staff for laboratories, the training scheme for those who have potential should be started immediately and they should be placed suitably.

Dr. R.S. Sirohi commented that needs of residential campus are different from those of non residential campus and hence the proposals of the manpower requirement be presented for Board's discussion and approval broadly keeping in mind the requirement of faculty to staff ratio and the data presented by the Institute.

- 5.22 To allow Dr. D.V.S.Verma, Professor in Civil Engineering Department to Join the Post of Director-Principal in Ch. Devi Lai Memorial Engineering College, Panniwaia Mota (Sirsa) on
deputation basis.

The Board allowed deputation to Dr. D.V.S.Verma, Professor of the Civil Engineering Department for a period of two years w.c.f.

17.3.2004 to 16.3.2006 to join as Director-Principal in Ch. Devi Lal Memorial Engineering College, Panniwala Mota, Sirsa (an Engineering Institute of the State Government) on the terms and conditions as furnished in the agenda item.

Further the Board authorized the Director and Member-Secretary to relieve Dr. D.V.S.Verma on 16.3.2004(AN) so as to enable him to join his new assignment on deputation on 17.3.2004(FN)

5.23 Any other item.

The question of the final settlement of the accounts of Dr. K.K.Aggarwal was raised by Sh. V.S.Pandey, IAS commenting that the Institute can not withhold his final settlement at this stage because such a recovery can not be made after four years of a particular event in the interest of natural justice. Sh. V.S.Pandey, IAS said that his final settlement should be made. The issue was followed by a formal discussion. The Board agreed for final settlement of accounts of Dr. K.K.Aggarwal.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.





Consequent upon sanction of an additional instalment of Dearness Allowance vide OM No. F. I (1/2003-E-II(B)) dated 1-3-2004 of the Ministry of Finance (Department of Expenditure), Government of India for Central Government employees, it has been decided to enhance the rate of DA from 59% to 61% of the pay in respect of employees of NITs w.e.f. 1-1-2004.

Similarly the rate of Dearness Relief shall stand enhanced from 59% to 61% in respect of pensioners of NITS w.e.f 1-1-2004 as notified vide OM No. 42/2/2004-P&PW (G) dated 15th March 2004 of the Department of Pension & Pensioners Welfare.

However, the question of merger of 50% of DA/DR in pay/pension would be notified separately.

Item 6.8 To ratify the action taken by the Chairman, BOG in **rationalizing** the scales of pay of nonteaching employees of NIT, Kurubhetra ~~adoption~~ of Central Government pay scales.

The MHRD vide letter No. F.20-46/2003-TS-111(Pt.IV) dated 76.2004 (copy enclosed as Appendix V (33-30)) issued instructions that all NITS should adopt the Central Government pay scales as notified under Central Civil Services (Revised Pay) Rules 1997 on the Central Government pattern. This rationalization of scales of pay as well as pay fixation would be effective from 1.4.2004. The MHRD had further informed that the process of rationalization shall have to be duly approved/ ratified by the Board of Governors of the NIT concerned,

The matter was put up to the Honble Chairman, Board of Governors for approval in anticipation of the approval of the Board. The Chairman has been pleased to approve the proposal of the Institute regarding rationalization of pay scales of nonteaching staff. Orders and comments of the Hon 'ble Chairman of the Board are enclosed as Appendix VI from pages _____ 35 to 36 Comments of the Honble Chairman have been noted for compliance. The list of adopted pay scales on Central Government pattern is given in Appendix _____ VI I pages 37 to 400

_____.

It may stated that the pay scales of the non-teaching employees of the Institute are almost identical to those of the Central Government pay scales as the Haryana Government have also adopted identical pay scales on Central Government pattern for employees of the State Government. However it is brought to notice of the Board of Governors that while implementing the above rationalization and carrying out individual pay fixation for non-teaching staff, some employees having longer service who are sitting at the verge of retirement may be put to disadvantage as the State Government pay scales are open ended ones, while the Central Government pay scales, though identical, are not open ended scales but have provision of biennial increments only, Further some of the non-teaching employees may lose the allowance, which they are getting on the State Government pattern. But when the MHRD has issued instructions that NITS should adopt the Central Government pay scales w.e.f, 1.4,2004, there is no remedy but to adopt the Central pay scales.

The Board may approve the action taken by the Chairman, Board of

Subject:- Rationalizations of Scales of Pay of lion-teaching employecs of National Institutes of Technology (NITS) — Clarification regarding.

The undersigned is directed to refer to a number of queries being raised by different NITS regarding rationalization/revision of the scales of pay for their staff in the light of their changed status as fully funded institutions of the Central Government and to clarify the issues in the following paragraph:-

2. While all NITS have adopted the scales of pay as approved by their respective BOGs & State Governments, a closer scrutiny of the scales of pay reveals that pay scales are quite identical to those notified under Central Civil Services (Revised Pay) Rules in most NITS while only in some of the NITS, the scales of pay have either been truncated or split with minor variations here and there. While the proposal to bring about a post-based revision of the scales of pay and consequent uniformity among identically placed employees of all NITS would require more time for in-depth analysis and consideration by an expert body, it has been decided to rationalize the scales of pay of employees of all NITS as a first step.

3. Procedure for Rationalizations:- Now all NITs would adopt exactly identical replacement scales of pay as notified under CCS (Revised Pay) Rules 1997 for the Central Government employees. In order to do this, NITS would have to refer to the pre-revised scales of pay prevalent in their institutes immediately before I-I-1996 which are identical to the scales of pay prevalent under the Central Government at that point of time. A complete list of pre-revised scales of pay and their revised equivalent introduced w.e.f. 1-1-1996 is contained in the CCS (Revised Pay) Rules which was circulated to all NITS vide letter of even number dated 27th February 2004. In those cases where there are no identical pay scales in the pre-revised scales of pay in NITS vis-à-vis the Central Government, NITS may have to club two or more pay scales so as to fit them into one of the existing standard pay scale which has a matching revised scale. This clubbing should be done depending upon the nature of the post. However, NITS may also directly adopt the revised scale of pay of such posts as are identical to those common categories of posts listed in Part-B of the CSS (Revised Pay) Rules 1997.

4. Pay Fixation:- The pay of an employee would be fixed at the same stage in the new scale of pay as was being drawn by him before introduction of this new pay scale. If he is fixed at a stage just next above his pay. Where the stage of basic pay of an existing employee is lower than the minimum of the newly introduced scale of pay, then his/her pay shall be fixed at the minimum of such pay scale and similarly, where existing basic pay of an employee is more than the maximum of the scale of pay adopted for that post, then the pay of that employee shall be fixed at the maximum of the scale of pay of his post and the difference between his existing pay and the pay fixed shall be protected as personal pay for that particular employee(s) which would be adjusted against future increments including stagnation increments. If the pay of an


employee is fixed at the same stage, then his date of increment shall not change and where pay is fixed just at the next higher stage, then that employee would draw his next increment after completion of 12 months' qualifying service.

4.1 Further, if any NIT like NIT Warangal is following State Government pattern of DA which is different from the Central pattern of DA due to late revision of the scales or pay [subsequent to January 1996], then the pay of an employee would be fixed at such a stage in the new scale of pay where the new pay + Central rate of DA on the date of such fixation would be equal to or just next above the existing pay + State rate of DA.

5. This rationalization of scales of pay as well as fixation pay would be effective from 01-04-2004 in all NITS including NIT Patna which was taken over by the Central Government w.e.f. 28-01-2004. The scale of pay to be adopted for teaching staff of NIT Patna shall be those approved by the Ministry vide Notification No.37-104/95-TS-II dated 9th October 1998. No employee shall be given any option to select the (late) of his/her pay fixation in the newly introduced scales of pay. Besides, there would not be any notional fixation of pay with effect from 01-01-1996. Therefore, no question of payment of arrear shall arise before 01-04-2004.

6. The introduction of new scales of pay as a process of rationalization shall have to be duly approved/ratified by the BOG of the NIT concerned. Any difficulty in the matter of pay fixation arising out of implementation of this order and/or if there is any peculiar condition regarding scales of pay in any particular NIT, the same should be referred to the Ministry for clarification.

7. NITS may please send a statement indicating the pre-revised and revised scales of pay of all posts in NITS which have been introduced consequent upon implementation of this order.

Subject' **Rationalization** of scales of pay of non-teaching employees of NIT Kurukshetra and merger of 50% DA with basic pay as per instructions of the **M.H.R.I**

I. The Ministry Of Human Resource Development, Government of India, New Delhi, vide their letter No. F.20-46/2003-TS-III(Pt.IV) dated 16.6.2004 (copy enclosed as Annexure-A) have issued instructions that all MTS will adopt exactly identical replacement scales of pay in respect of non-teaching employees as notified under Central Civil Service (Classified Pay) Rules 1986 for the Central Government employees w.e.f. 1.4.2004. This has become necessary in the light of changed status of NITS as fully funded Institutions. In this connection it may be stated that the pay scales of non-teaching of the Institute are on the State Government pattern since its inception, the scales of non-teaching are identical to the Central Government revised scales and Government have also adopted the scales of the Central Government for employees of State Government. The pay scales of faculty and Administrative Officers of the Institute are already on the Central Government pattern.

The M.H.R.D. vide their letter dated 7.6.2004 as referred to above have communicated the introduction of new scales of pay as process of rationalization shall have to be duly approved/ratified by the Board of Governors of the NIT concerned.

2. The Institute vide their letter No F.20-38/003-TS-111 dated 11.6.2004 (copy enclosed as Annexure-B) have also issued instructions to grant merger of 50% of DA with basic pay on the Central Government pattern of employees of MTS w.e.f. 1.4.2004 subject to the following conditions:-

- ~~The NITS must first adopt the Central pattern of scales of pay (DA) for its employees/pensioners w.e.f. 1.4.2004 as circulated by this Ministry~~ X
 i). ~~vide OM NO. F.20-46/2003-TS-III(Pt.IV) dated 7th June, 2004;~~
 ii) NITS should assess and meet the additional expenditure due to this merger from within its own resources as no additional fund could be given by the Ministry for this; and iii) This proposal should be approved by the BOG of the Institute.

The statement indicating the pre-revised and revised pay scales of all non-teaching posts in the Institute has been sent to the MHRD on 24th June, 2004.

The next meeting of the Board of Governors is not likely to be held in near future. The Chairman, Board of Governors is, therefore, requested to approve the rationalization of pay scales for non-teaching employees of NIT, Kurukshetra, for bringing them on Central Government pattern (CCS revised pay scales of 1997) w.e.f. strictly in terms of the MHRD letter No F.20-46/2003-TS-III(Pt.IV) dated 7.6.2004 already referred to. The matter will be reported to the BOG in its next meeting.

The issue relating to merger of DA with basic pay will be taken up subsequently.





Subject: Merger of Dearness Allowance/Dearness Relief with basic pay/pension to employees of autonomous bodies following Central Government pattern of pay scales/allowances regarding,

The undersigned is directed to refer to this department's O.M of even number dated the 1st March, 2004 regarding merger of DA to the extent of 50% of pay with basic pay in respect of Central Government employees and to say that it has been decided that, with effect from 1.4.2004, DA equal to 50% of the existing basic pay would be merged with basic and shown distinctly as Dearness Pay (DP) in respect of all employees of autonomous bodies following Central Government pattern of pay scales/allowances. This Dearness Pay would count for all purposes like payment of allowances, retirement benefits, contribution to GPF/CPF, Various advances, etc. The entitlements (or LTC/LTA, TADA while on tour and transfer and accommodation would, however, continue to be governed on the basis of the basic pay alone without taking into account Dearness Pay. In autonomous bodies following Central Government Pension-cum-GPF Scheme, Dearness Relief or the existing pensioners equal to 50% of their pension will, with immediate effect, be merged with pension and shown distinctly as Dearness Pension.

Dearness Allowance/Dearness Relief converted into Dearness Pay/Dearness Pension respectively would be deducted from the existing rate of Dearness Allowance/Dearness Relief.

2. Further, in order to ensure that employees working in autonomous bodies following Central Government Pension-cum-GPF Scheme and retiring between 1.4.2004 to 31.1.2005 do not face any loss in fixation of pension, as a special dispensation in their case, DA equal to 50% of the basic pay would be treated as basic pay for purposes of computation of pension in respect of basic pay received by them prior to 1.4.2004. Consequently, element of dearness pension will exist only for pensioners retired/retiring from such autonomous bodies up to 31.1.2004.

3. No additional funding from Government of India would be provided for this purpose and all autonomous bodies would need to absorb the additional expenditure occurring on this account within the approved budgetary allocations.

Item 6.10 To consider implementations of Assured Career Progression (ACP) to the non-teaching employees of N.I.T. Kurukshetra on State Govt. pattern prior to 01.01.2004..

The Institute had been allowing the ACP Scales to its non-teaching employees as per Haryana Government ACP Rules-1998. The committee at the Institute level last met in January,2003 to release ACP Scales to the non-teaching employees on the State Government pattern. However, the grant of ACP scales were suspended in May,2003 as per instructions of the Central Government received in May,2003.

The Board in its 4th meeting held on 08.12.2003 vide agenda item No.4.12 decided to adopt service conditions such as (i) Probation Period On Recruitment (ii) Leave Rules (iii) Conduct & Disciplinary Rules (iv) Medical Rules (v) Traveling Allowance & Daily Allowance (vi) Leave Travel Concession (vii) Performance Assessment System (viii) Career Advancement Scheme(CAS) (ix) Assured Career Progression (ACP) (x) Working Days (xi) Holidays w.e.f.01.01.2004 on the Central Government pattern in terms of the M.H.R.D. letter No.F.20.46/2003-TS-III .dated 09.11.2003.

The matter regarding grant of ACP Scales on the State Government pattern to the non-teaching employees who were eligible during the transit period i.e. before adoption of the ACP Scheme on Central Government pattern was placed before the Board in its 4th meeting held on 08.12.2003 (Agenda Item No.4.20). The Board decided as under:

-

"In implementation of ACP of the Central Government, a number of Institute employees loose privilege of ACP of the State Government of Haryana. The proposal given in the agenda needs further discussion and decision. "

The matter was again placed before the Board of Governors in its 5th meeting held on 15.03.2004 vide item No.5.16. The Board decided as under: -

"The Board decided that the matter regarding ACP cases in respect of the non-teaching employees which are pending for disposal during the intervening period i.e. prior to 01.01.2004 be examined by the M.H.R.D. Hence the matter be referred to the Ministry."

Accordingly, the matter was referred to the M.H.R.D. vide DO. letter No.2514 dated 31.03.2004, but the same is still under consideration of the Ministry.

Since the Central Government ACP rules are to be followed w.e.f. 1.1.2004, the non-teaching employees who are eligible for ACP pay scales as per the Haryana Government pattern during the transit phase i.e. prior to 1.1.2004 may be considered to be allowed ACP scales. There are about 40 ACP cases which are pending for disposal during the said intervening period and the total financial implications on account of releasing the said ACP scales on the State Government pattern amount to Rs. 50,000/(approx.) only. The ACP scales as per State Government pattern are required to be released on completion of 10/20 years service whereas in the Central Government the ACP scales are granted after completion of 12/24 years of service.

It may be stated that the employees of the Institute should not be put to any disadvantage during the transit phase on upgradation of the Institute. The following clauses from existing Bye-laws/Rules and new MOA/Rules of the Institute suggest that the new rules/conditions of service should not be to disadvantage of the employees.

Existing Bye-laws/Rules

Rule 1 "Provided that any condition laid down in the appointment letter of any employee, prior to the date of making of these bye-laws by the Board of Governors and their approval by the State Government and the Central Government, shall not be changed by the provisions of these bye-laws to the disadvantage of the employees of the Society

Rule 4 "Provided that the conditions of service of an employee of the College, as given in his appointment letter, or subsequently decided by the Board, shall not be varied to his disadvantage."

New MOA/Rules of the Institute

13. "Terms and conditions of service of employees of the Institute

Every person employed by the Regional Engineering College immediately before these Rules coming into being shall hold office or service in the corresponding Institute by the same tenure, at the same remuneration and upon such terms and conditions and with same rights and privileges as to pension, leave, gratuity, provident fund and other matters as he/she would have held if the Rules were not changed and shall continue to unless and until his/her employment is terminated or until such tenure, remuneration and terms and conditions are altered by further change in MOA/Rules".

The Board may consider and allow ACP scales to the non-teaching employees of the Institute during the transit phase i.e. prior to 1.1.2004 on the State Government pattern.

Item 6,11 To consider medical reimbursement claim of Dr. N.P. Mehta, Professor, Mechanical Engg. Deptt. of NIT, Kurukshetra.

The matter regarding medical reimbursement claim of Dr. N.P. Mehta was placed before the Finance Committee in its 3rd meeting held on 24.5.2004. The matter was deferred.

Dr. N.P. Mehta, Professor, Mechanical Engineering Department of the Institute proceeded on Extra Ordinary Leave for a period of two years w.e.f. 1.3.2004 to join as Director in M M Engg. College, Mulana (Distt. Ambala). Due to his personal reasons he submitted his joining in the Institute on 22.3.2004. Instead of the E.O.L. from 1.3.2004 to 21.3.2004 he has been allowed leave as under:

- (a) Earned Leave - 1.3.2004 to 3.3.2004
- (b) Medical Leave - 4.3.2004 to 21.3.2004

As per information received from Dr. N.P. Mehta vide his letter bearing No. NPM/MED/- 103 dated 29.3.2004 (Copy enclosed as Appendix^{IX} on page to he had severe chest pain in the morning of 4.3.2004. He contacted the para-medical staff of the Institute Health Centre and the Pharmacist of the Institute Health Centre advised him to contact the Heart specialist immediately. Due to very serious condition, he immediately went to Dr. Atul Arora's Clinic of Kurukshetra, being his personal physician. On seeing the condition of Dr. Mehta, Dr. Atul Arora advised him to take treatment from Fortis Heart Institute & Multi Specialty Hospital, Mohali (Punjab) (a private hospital recognized by the State of Haryana). On examining the serious condition of Dr. Mehta, the specialists of the Forties Hospital, Mohali did Angiography on 4.3.2004 itself and Angioplasty on 4.3.2004 and on 5.3.2004 as he was diagnosed as Coronary Artery disease patient (Acute interior Wall MI and Double Vessel Disease). He was discharged from the Hospital on 7.3.2004.

On account of his treatment taken in Fortis Hospital, Mohali he has preferred medical reimbursement claim amounting to Rs. 3,27,840.00 signed by the Medical Officer and countersigned by the Medical Superintendent of Fortis Hospital, Mohali.

It is not out of place to mention that our Institute has been following the State Govt. Medical Attendant & Reimbursement Rules upto 29.2.2004 and w.e.f.

1.3.2004 the Institute has switched over to the Central Govt. Medical Attendant Rules. As per State Govt. Rules, the above mentioned Hospital is recognized for the purpose of medical treatment and reimbursement thereof, but the Central Govt. has not recognized the above mentioned Hospital. In such a situation the Institute is not in a position to ascertain as to what amount is admissible to Dr. Mehta against the medical reimbursement claim preferred by him.

The matter is placed before the Board for consideration and decision.

Emergency Treatment of Mr. N.P. Mehta, Professor of Mechanical
Engineering Department, NIT, Kurukshetra

On 4.3.2004 at about 9.30 AM, I had severe chest pain followed by sweating & dizziness. On seeing SERIOUS condition, my wife rang telephone number 264 of the Health Centre of Kurukshetra. The telephone was picked up by staff nurse Mrs. Sushma. My wife asked staff nurse to send Mr. Gulshan, (he staff of the Health Centre). Mrs. Sushma told my wife that Mr. Gulshan was on leave but available in the house. My wife then rang 111 Mr. Gulshan his residence telephone. He came immediately and gave first aid to me. On seeing bad condition, he advised me to consult Heart Specialist and get ECG done immediately. My wife telephoned in the office (in the Director's, NIT) to send a driver to fetch me to the hospital. Driver Jai Kumar came for this purpose and I went to the clinic of Dr. Anil Arora who was my consulting Physician as I was previously suffering from 1-1-hypertension. My wife was with me in car.

On reaching the clinic of Dr. Anil Arora, I did 12-lead ECG and within two minutes [1011"] I have attack and has to be shifted (Dr. H. J. Institute) as the sufficient facilities not available in the town. He asked where I would like to be shifted. As per the rules of the Institute knew that the employees of NIT Kurukshetra could get the treatment from Civil Institute & Multi Speciality Hospital, Mohali. I told the doctor that the arrangements may be made. (Dr. Shift me to

Mohali) The doctor told my wife to call some friends/relatives and arrange for transportation as I have to be shifted immediately.

The moment I was told that I had heart attack, I immediately rang up the Secretary of the Director, NIT Kurukshetra through the cellular Phone of the doctor requested

Item 6.12 To release travel expenses for attending International Conference abroad to Dr. R.C. Bhattacharjee, Asstt. Prof., Civil Engg. Department, National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra.

The matter cited as above was placed before the Finance Committee in its 3 meeting held on 24.5.2004. The matter was deferred.

Dr. R.C. Bhattacharjee, Assistant Professor, Department of Civil Engineering presented a research paper entitled "OPTIMAL DESIGN OF A SETTLING CHAMBER AND AIR POLLUTION CONTROL DEVICE" in the 11th International Conference, AIR POLLUTION 2003, organized by Wessex Institute of Technology, UK held in CATANZA, ITALY from 17th to 19th September, 2003. Dr. Bhattacharjee vide his letters dated 01.05.03, 14.05.03 etc. requested the Institute to bear the entire expenditure in respect of TA/IDA (for 14 days), Registration fee etc. for the above foreign tour out of TEQIP grant wherein this provision exists. In this regard, the decision of Board of Governors taken in its 69th meeting held on 20.2.87 is reproduced below:

The Board further decided that in future in order to make use of the Economy Excursion Air Ticket, Halftage charges for a minimum period of 14 days and also academic leave for 14 days will be granted subject to the usual condition that 50 percent of the total expenditure involved is met with either by the University Grant Commission or any other sponsoring agencies. Also in such cases, a proper academic programme for 14 days Halftage will be worked out and submitted by the concerned teacher before attending the Conference. On return, he will submit a detailed report which will be put up to the Board of Governors.

Dr. Bhattacharjee requested AICTE to release Travel Grant for attending the above International Conference. The AICTE in August 2003 sanctioned a sum of Rs. 53,806/- (including 50% of Rs.45,600/- towards Air Fare as prevalent at the time of submission of application to AICTE i.e. on 13.06.03) as their share to support 50% expenditure towards Air Fare, Registration Fee and Per Diem for 5 days.

The Institute allowed Dr. Bhattacharjee to attend the above International Conference and sanctioned an advance of Rs. 1,07,000/- to meet the travel expenditure and also sanctioned journey and leave for 14 days vide our letter No. GA-UPF/5533 dated 22.8.2003 as per following details:

- i) Academic Leave for six days w.e.f. 15.9.03 to 20.9.03 ii)
- Earned Leave for eight days w.e.f. 21.9.03 to 28.9.03

Dr. Bhattacharjee vide his letter dated 11.09.03 informed that the AIR INDIA quoted Rs. 63,047/- for the economy class ticket in the shortest route as prevalent at that time. In view of this, Dr. Bhattacharjee vide his above referred letter requested AICTE as well as the Institute to accord revised sanction for the enhanced Air Fare. However, ultimately the Air Ticket was procured from AIR INDIA for Rs. 61,882/-.

In the mean time, as regards supporting the total expenditure including 14 days Per Diem out of TEQIP grant, the Board of Governors in its 3rd meeting held on 6.10.2003 vide item No.3.13 - TRAVEL GRANTS TO ATTEND INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCES ABROAD OUT OF FUNDS PROVIDED UNDER TEQIP resolved as under:

The travel grant for paper presentation in International Conferences overseas may be utilized by a faculty member as per UGC guidelines as per agenda item and as per TADA rates already approved by the Board of Governors of the Institute in their 2nd meeting held on 19.4.2003 subject to the condition that some funds are arranged by the concerned faculty members desirous to present papers in the International Conferences overseas from other funding agencies like NCTE etc. While granting funds, the outside funding agency will judge quality of the research paper. The Institute will pay balance of funds as per UGC rules minus funds received from other funding agencies such as AICTE etc.

The UGC rules suggest supporting expenses on Air Fare, Registration Fee, Daily Allowance, charges for accommodation, incidental expenses and internal travel expenses within the country concerned. Further the selected teachers may spend atleast 2 weeks abroad and utilize the period outside programme days for visiting Institutions of their subject field.

After attending the Conference Dr. Bhattacharjee sent his case to the AICTE for getting share from the AICTE. The AICTE issued their sanction to the tune of Rs. 53,133/- in Feb., 2004 on the basis of original sanction and subsequently also released the said amount.

Dr. Bhattacharjee remained abroad for 19 days w.e.f. 16.09.03 to 05.10.03 and apart from attending Conference in Catania, Italy visited two other North American Universities and delivered talks there. He has submitted a detailed report on the above study tour. After completing all the required formalities, Dr. Bhattacharjee has submitted a claim for Rs. 1,70,664/- as per details given below:

i) Air fare & local mileage in India Rs. 63,482/(from India to place of Conference & Back) ii) Taxi, Room rent & Regn. Fee Rs. 58,882/€520 @ Rs.55.57 & €580 @ 51.70 iii) Per Diem US\$ 1050/- @ Rs. 46/- per dollar

After checking the bills as preferred by Dr. Bhattacharjee, the total amount admissible to him comes to Rs. **1,68,079/-**. It is reiterated that before going to attend the above said International Conference he was paid an advance of Rs. **1,07,000/-** in 8/03 and Rs. 45,000/- in 8/04 on his request thereby total advance of Rs. 1,52,000/-. The balance amount payable to him comes to Rs. 16,079/-. The total booking of expenditure of Rs. 1,68,079/- is proposed as under:

The Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Secondary & Higher Education, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi vide their notification No. F.20-46/2003-TS-III dated 9th June, 2004(copy enclosed as

Appendix X ___ on page 62 'i has intimated that the Government of India, 'Ministry of Finance has issued certain notifications with regard to introduction of New Pension Scheme based on the Defined Contributions. The Government of India has extended the Provision of such Pension Scheme to the employees to Autonomous Bodies/ Public Sector Undertakings under various Central Ministries/Departments.

It has clearly been mentioned that the NITS which are operating a Pension Scheme on the date of their conversion from RECs to NITS shall continue to operate the same for all such employees who were regularly recruited by the Institute up to 31.12.2003. However, this New Pension Scheme will be applicable to the employees who have been recruited in any NIT on or after 01.01.2004. No fresh recruitment has been made by the Institute after 01.01.2004 due to the ban imposed by the Government of India. However, two employees have been inducted under Ex-gratia employment rules.

It is also relevant to mention that the Government of India, Ministry of Finance has issued further notifications in this regard. On the basis of the latest instructions of the Government of India the salient features of the New Pension Scheme are contained in

Subject:- Pension Scheme in National Institutes of Technology (NITS) - Clarification regarding accounting procedures & Introduction of New Pension Scheme.


The undersigned is directed to refer to a number of queries being raised by different NITS regarding accounting procedures to be followed by NITS for calculation of qualifying service, pension and other retirement benefits in the light of their changed **status as fully funded institutions of the Central Government** and to convey the following instructions:-

NITS which were operating a pension scheme on the date of their conversion from regional Engineering Colleges to NITS, shall continue to operate the same for all such employees who were regularly recruited by the Institute up to 31-12-2003. The method of calculation of qualifying service, pension and other retirement benefits shall be made in accordance with the instructions contained in the Central Civil Services [CCS] (Pension) Rules, 1972 as amended from time to time. In fact, each NIT has to adopt the provisions of CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972 which would have to be approved / ratified by their respective BOGs.

3. This accounting procedures would be effective from 01-04-2004. Pension cases already decided prior to 01-04-2004 as per the existing pension rules of the Institutes need not be reopened.

4. It may also be added here that all employees recruited in any NIT on or after 01-01-2004 shall be covered under a New Pension Scheme based on defined contributions. The existing pension scheme will not be applicable to such newly recruited employees. A copy of the Notification No.S/7/2003-ECB & PR dated 22-12-2003 giving details of such New Pension Scheme as well as copy

of Jt/ED/2UOI dated 13th November 2003. IHBud by 1110 Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India extending provision of such Pension Scheme to the employees of Autonomous Bodies/Public Sector Undertakings under various Central Ministries/Departments are enclosed for reference & guidance.

Appendix XI

The salient features of the New Pension Scheme applicable to the employees who were recruited on or after 01.01.2004.

1. The New Pension Scheme will work on defined contribution basis and will have two tiers Tier-I and II. Contribution to Tier-I is mandatory for all Government servants joining Government service on or after 01.01.2004. Whereas Tier-II will be optional and at the discretion of Government servants.

2. In Tier-I, Government servants will have to make a contribution of 10% of his Basic Pay plus DA, which will be deducted from his salary bill every month by the PAC concerned. The Government will make an equal matching contribution.
3. Tier-I contributions (and the investment returns) will be kept in a non-withdrawable at the option of the Government servant. Government will not make any contribution to Tier-II account.
4. The existing provisions of Defined Benefit Pension and QPF would not be available to new Government servants joining Government service on or after 01.01.2004.
5. In order to implement the Scheme, there will be a Central Record Keeping Agency and several Pension Fund Managers to offer three categories of Schemes to Government servants, viz., options A, B and C based on the ratio of investment in fixed income instruments and equities. An independent Pension Fund Regulatory and Development Authority (PFRA) will regulate and develop the pension market.
6. As an interim arrangement, till such time the Statutory PFRA is set up, an interim PFRA has been appointed by issuing an executive order.
7. The respective Central Record Keeping Agency and Pension Fund are appointed and the accumulated balance under each individual account are transferred to them. It has been decided that such amounts representing the contributions made by the Government servants and the matching contribution made by the Government will be kept in the Public Account of India. This will be purely a temporary arrangement as announced by the Government.
8. It has also been decided that Tier-II will not be made operative during the interim period.
9. A Government servant can exit at or after the age of 60 years from the Tier-I of the scheme. At exit, it would be mandatory for him to invest 40 per cent of pension wealth to purchase an annuity (from an IRDA regulated Life Insurance Company), which will provide for pension for the lifetime of the employee and his dependent parents/spouse. In the case of Government servant who leaves the Scheme before attaining the age of 60, the mandatory annuitization would be 80% of the pension wealth.
10. The following guidelines are issued for the implementation of the New Pension Scheme during the interim arrangement for the guidance of the PAC/SSIs:

- (a) The pension scheme becomes operational with effect from 01.01.2004.
- (b) Contributions payable by the Government servants towards the Scheme under Tier-I, i.e. 10% of (Basic Pay plus DA), will be recovered from the salary bills every month.
- (c) The scheme of voluntary contributions under Tier-II will not be made operative during the period of interim arrangement and therefore no recoveries will be made from the salaries of the employees on this account.
- (d) Recoveries towards Tier-I contribution will start from the salary of the month following the month in which the Government servant has joined service. Therefore, no recovery will be effected for the month of joining. For example, for employees joining service in the month of January, 2004, deductions towards Tier-I contribution will start from the salary bill of February, 2004. No deduction will be made for his salary earned in January, 2004. Similarly, deductions for those joining service in the month of February, 2004 will start from the salary bill of March, 2004 and so on.
- (e) No deductions will be made towards GPI contribution from the Government servant joining the service on or after 01.01.2004 as the GPI scheme is not applicable to them.

- (f) It has been decided that pending formation of a regular Central Record Keeping Agency, Central Pension Accounting Office will function as the Central Record Keeping Agency for the above scheme.
- (g) Immediately on joining Government service, the Government servant will be required to provide particulars such as his name, designation, scale of pay, date of birth, nominee(s) for the fund, relationship of the nominee, etc., in the prescribed form (Annexure-I). The DDO concerned will be responsible for obtaining this information from all Government servants covered under the new Pension Scheme. Consolidated information for all those who have joined service during the month shall be submitted by the DDO concerned in the prescribed format (Annexure-II) to his Pay and Accounts Officer by 7th of the following month. Annexure-I will be retained by DDOs.
- (h) On receipt of Annexure-II from the DDOs, PAO will allot a unique 16 digit Permanent Pension Account Number (P PAN). The first four digits of this number will indicate the calendar year of joining Government service, the next digit indicates whether it is a Civil or a Non-Civil Ministry (for all Civil Ministries this digit will be "1"), the next six digits would represent the PAO code (which is used for the purpose of compiling monthly accounts), the last five digits will be the running serial number of the individual Government servant which will be allotted by the PAO concerned. PAO will allot the serial number pertaining to individual Government servant from '0001' running from January to December of a calendar year. The following illustration may be followed:-

The first Government servant joining service under Ministry of Civil Aviation under the accounting control PAO (Sectt.), New Delhi in 2004, shall be allotted the following

- (i) The Pay and Accounts Officer will maintain an Index Register for the purpose or allotment of P PAN to new entrants to Government service. Format of the index register is, given in Annexure-VII.
- (j) The PAC will remain to the DDO concerned. a copy of the statement in which is mentioned therein the Account numbers allotted to each individual by 10th instant. DDO in turn will intimate the account number to the individuals concerned and also note in the Pay Bill Register.
- (k) The particulars of the Government servants received from the various DDOs will be consolidated by the PAO in the format (Annexure-II-A) and sent to the Principal Accounts Officer by the 12th of every month.
- (l) The Principal Accounts Officer in turn will consolidate the particulars in the prescribed format (Annexure-II-B) and forward the same to Central Pension Accounting Office by 15th instant. The will feed this information in their computer database.
- (m) The CDDOs will prepare separate Pay Bill Registers in respect of (be Drawing Government servants joining Government service on or after 1 joining 1.2004. The DDOs/CDDOs will have to prepare separate pay

bills in respect of these Government servants and will send the same with all the schedules 10 the PAO on or before 20th of the month to which the bills relate. Chq. DDOs may note that hereafter in respect of Government servants service on or after 1.1.2004, they will only prepare pay bills and not make payment. Such bills will be sent by them to the Pay and Accounts Offices (Or pre-check and payment).

- (n) The DDO/CDDO will prepare a recovery schedule in duplicate in the prescribed form (Annexure-III) for the contributions under Tier-I and attach them with the pay bills. The amount of the Contributions under Tier-I should tally with the total amount of recoveries shown under the corresponding column in the pay bill.
- (o) The accounting procedure for these deductions is being finalized and shall be notified shortly.
- (p) It may be noted that along with the salary bill for the Government servants who join service on or after 1.1.2004, the DDO/CDDO shall also prepare a separate bill for drawal of matching contributions to be paid by the Government and creditable to Pension account. (q) The bill for drawal of matching contribution should also be supported by schedules of recoveries in form (Annexure-IV).
- (r) On receipt of the salary bills in respect of Government servants joining service after 1.1.2004, will exercise usual checks and pass the bill and make the payments. *After the payment is made and posting done in the Detailed Posting Register, one set of schedules relating to Pension contributions will be detached from the bills as done in the case of other schedules such as GPF, Long-term advances. The schedules will then be utilized for posting the credits of contributions in the Detailed Ledger Account of the individual.
- (s) The employee's contributions under Tier-I and Tier-II and Government's contribution should be posted in different columns of the individual ledger account (to be maintained in the format in Annexure-V) and Bro. of ledger and related bills the accounts figures as being done in the case of GPF. These accounts should not be mixed with QPF accounts and these records/ledger accounts should be independent of GPF maintained in the case of pre-1.1.2004 entrants.
- (t) The PAC will consolidate the information available in the New Scheme schedules received from the various DDOs and forward the same in a floppy in the prescribed form (Annexure -VI) to Principal Accounts Officer 12th of the month following the month to which the credit pertains. Principal Accounts Officer in turn will consolidate the information and send the same in electronic form to the Central Pension Accounting Office by 15th.

(v) CPAO on receipt of this information from all the Pr. AOs (including the Non-Civil Ministries) will update its database and generate exception reports for missing credits, mismatches, etc., which will be sent back to the PAOs concerned through the Pr. AOs for further action.

(w) Whenever any Government servant is transferred from one office to another either within the same accounting circle or to another accounting circle, balances will not be transferred by the PAO to the other Accounts Office. However, the Drawing and Disbursing Officer should clearly indicate in the LPC of the individual the unique account number, the month up to which Government servant's contribution and Government's contribution have been transferred to the Pension Fund.

(x) No withdrawal of any amount will be allowed during the interim arrangement. Provisions regarding terminal payments in the event of untimely death of an employee or in the event of his leaving the Government service during the interim period shall be notified in due course.

(y) Detailed instructions on the interest payable on Tier-I balance shall be issued in due course.

(z.) At the end of each financial year, the CPAO will prepare annual account statements for each employee showing the opening balance, details of monthly deductions and Government's matching contributions interest earned, if any, and the closing balance. CPAO will send these statements to the Pr. A.O. for onward transmission to the DI-DO through the PrAO.

aa) After the end of each financial year, CPAO will have to report the details of the balances (i.e.) to each Principal Accounts Office. It will forward the information to each PAO for the purpose of reconciliation. It will reconcile the financial statements of contributions posted in the ledger account of the individuals as per their ledger with figures as per the books.

After the appointment of CIR.A and Fund Managers, this office will issue detailed instructions on transfer of balances to CRA.

Item 6. ¹ 4 To ratify the action taken by the Chairman, BOG in allowing the Institute to get the annual accounts audited by Chartered Accountant for the financial year 2003-2004.

The audit of the Institute is undertaken in the month of June/July every year by the AG(A) Haryana. The audit of the Institute is entrusted by the Government of India, Ministry of Finance, Department of Economic Affairs to CAG under Section 20(1) of C&AG's (DPCS) Act, 1971. The previous period of audit was up to 31.3.2003. The Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Secondary & Higher Education, New Delhi was requested vide our letter No. A/ 1017/2674 dated 6.4.2004 to take up the matter with the Ministry of Finance for further taking up the matter for entrustment of audit with the Comptroller and Auditor General of India. The issue was also discussed by the Deputy Registrar(Accounts) of our Institute with the Ministry.

As stated above the entrustment of audit is pending with the Ministry of Finance, Department of Economic Affairs and Comptroller and Auditor General Of India. With the result there may be possibility of considerable delay in submission of Annual Report and certified/verified Annual Accounts for the year 2003-2004 to the MHRD.) Further, the Ministry will not be able to place the same before the Parliament. To overcome this difficulty, a note was submitted to the Hon'ble Chairman, Board of Governors in 1st week of August, 2004 wherein a proposal was made to get our accounts for the year 2003-2004 audited from a reputed Chartered Accountant empanelled with the CAG of India and subsequently accounts be also got audited and certified from the AG(Audit) Haryana as soon as the AG(Audit) is authorized by the Government of India to conduct the audit of the Institute. The Hon 'ble Chairman, Board of Governors has given his consent to the aforesaid proposal.

Accordingly, we have engaged M/S Rakesh Dhall and Associates, Chartered Accountant, Arya Samaj Market, Kurukshetra to conduct the audit of our Institute so. that the annual accounts duly audited by the Chartered Accountant may be sent to the Ministry for placing the same to the Parliament as per guidelines issued by the Government of India from time to time. The Chartered Accountant has agreed to conduct the audit of the Institute with a remuneration of Rs. 25,000/- + Service Tax which will be paid out of Institute Funds. The said Chartered Accountant is reputed one duly empanelled with CAG of India. The Board may ratify action taken by the Chairman, BOG.

- 3.4 To consider fixing the criteria for admissions to the M.Tech. Programmes.

- i) For the Session 2004-05, the criterion for admission in M.Tech. may remain the same as was last year. The admission may be made giving weightage to GATE score and the qualifying examination in the ratio of 70:30. The admission of the sponsored category candidates may be made on the basis of B. Tech./B.E./other qualifying examination as per existing pattern.
- ii) The M. Tech. admission notification for the session 2004-05 may be released as early as possible.
- iii) For M.Tech. admission during the year 2005 onwards, a core committee consisting of all Chairmen of the Departments may recommend the detailed criteria/ procedure to decide the mode of weightage(s) and criteria for sponsored category candidates. The senior most Chairman amongst the Chairmen of Departments may chair the said meeting.

- Item 3.5 To consider prescribing cut-off date for receiving applications for Ph.D. registration.

After detailed discussions, the Senate decided as under:-

- i) The notification for admission of Ph.D. scholars may be released twice in the year i.e. in the even semester and the odd semester.
- ii) The cut off dates for receiving applications i.e. 31st August for July-December (Odd) semester and 31st January for January-May (Even) semester were approved.

- iii) The Departments may, however, accept applications not received in response to the advertisement or after the prescribed date for consideration.
- iv) The applications based on recommendations of DRC and BOS may be sent by the Departments to Academic Section for enrolment. However, the fee for full semester shall be payable by the candidate as and when he/ she is finally registered during the semester. For subsequent semesters, the scholar will pay the renewal fee on normal dates prescribed for UG & PG students.

In the 4th held on 8.12.2003, the Board of Governors had approved engaging Prof SK Gupta, a retired Professor of 11T Kanpur to assist the Institute to frame Academic Regulations comparable to an 11T. At our request, Prof Gupta visited the Institute and held discussions with Chairmen of the Departments, Deans and others first in February and then on March 17, 18, and 19, 2004 and sent a write up indicating some practices prevalent in 11Ts including the decision making process, the curriculum/course structure, Summer Term, Academic Calendar, the Grading and continuous evaluation system, examinations, the slow paced programme etc. Earlier, in February, Prof Gupta supplied a copy of UG **Programmes** (Procedure and Requirements) as prevalent in 11T, Kanpur.

His briefings and material supplied have proved very useful in initiating our own process of updating the Academic Regulations. A team of faculty members has already the exercise of shuffling the course structure and changing the scheme of teaching. The sum of credit counts of all B.Tech. courses from 1st to 8th Semester shall be maintained at 179 or 180.

The BOG like to on record its appreciation for the good work done by Prof SK Gupta for this Institute.

The BOG may also kindly note that besides TADA for his travel from 11T; Kanpur to NIT Kurukshetra in February and March, 2004, he was paid an honorarium of

Rs. 10,000 (Rs. 5000 +Rs. 5000) for lecture meetings and providing a write up on

academic practices at 11Ts. The total expenditure thus came to Rs. 14,615/- only.

Item 6.2¹ To consider filling up the post of Assistant Registrar (Accounts) on deputation basis.

A post of Assistant Registrar (Accounts) was created by the SAAC/BOG in their meetings held on 29.7.88 and 4.11.88 respectively. As per decision of the Board of Governors the salary of this post was to be met out of the College Development Fund (College share of consultancy) with no liability on State Government/Central Government. The post remained filled up to 31.10.1991 till Sh. M.K. Ahluwalia, the then Finance Officer, remained in the services of the Institute (against the post of AR(Acs.):.

Keeping in view the increased work- load of the GA Section the post of Assistant Registrar(Acs.) was converted to the post of Assistant Registrar(Establishment) as per decision of the SAAC taken its 14th meeting held on 21.4.94 and ratified by the BOG on 9.5.94. However, the post of Assistant Registrar (Establishment) was never filled up.

Later on, on receipt of instructions from Government of India, Human Resource Development, New Delhi the Institute was advised to reduce 10% staff strength of the College and also to identify the posts for abolition. Accordingly the matter was placed before the Board of Governors in its 88th meeting held on 15.3.97 wherein the Institute identified two posts i.e. a post of Landscape Officer and Assistant Registrar(Establishment) for abolition. While considering the above issue the Board decided as under:

"The Board decided that the posts of Landscape Officer and Assistant Registrar (Establishment) be kept in abeyance."

Now keeping in view the increased work- load of the Institute on account of introduction of Technical Education Quality Improvement Programme, switching over from State Government pattern to Central Government pattern, grant of Deemed University Status and shortage of staff in Accounts Branch, it has been felt that the post of Assistant Registrar (Establishment) kept in abeyance may be filled up on deputation for the Accounts Branch as Assistant Registrar (Accounts). The incumbent will look after the work of internal audit of the Institute as well as other duties to be assigned by the Director. It is pertinent to mention here that while conducting the audit of the Institute the AG Office

invariably has been making observations regarding non-existence of internal audit in the Institute.

The Board may consider and accord approval to fill up the above post as Assistant Registrar (Accounts) on deputation basis from AG (Audit) Haryana/AG(A&E)/ Central Government Organizations initially for a period of 3 years as per terms & conditions of the lending department. The Pay and Allowances of the incumbent will be met out of the Institute Development Fund (consultancy share) and there will be no financial liability on the part of the Central Government.

Item No. 6,22.....To consider Retirement age of Non-Teaching Staff

The Govt.. of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development New Delhi vide letter No. F,20-11/2003-TS.111 dated 12.11.2003 decided that henceforth the non-teaching staff of all NITS shall be allowed to serve up to the age of 60 years subject to their fulfilling the provision of Screening beyond 58 years of age,

The matter was placed before the Board of Governors in its 4th Meeting held on 8.12.2003. The Board decided to defer the matter.

However, the matter stands referred to the Ministry for reconsideration. It was contended that as per the relevant existing bye-laws/ rules of the Institute the age of retirement on superannuation in respect of non-teaching employees of NIT, Kurukshetra is already 60 years without any screening at the age of 58 years or at any stage but the Ministry has not taken any decision so far,

Rule 1 "Provided that any condition laid down in the appointment letter of any employee, prior to the date of

Rule 4 "Provided that the conditions of service of an employee of the College, as given in his appointment letter, or

Rule 11(d) 9The age of retirement of both Teaching and Non-teaching making of these bye-laws by the Board of Governors and their approval by the State Government and the Central Government, shall not be changed by the provisions of these to the disadvantage of the of the Societ .

Employees of the College be 60 years."

Further, the Government of India, Ministry of Human Resourx3e Developrnent, New Delhi approved the MOA and Rules of the Institute(NITs) when the NITS came into existence, The (.11ause No. 13 appeared at page 12 of the MOA and Rules has also contended the san-le lines, which is reproduced as under:

"Every person employed by the Regional Engineering College immediately before these Rules coming into being shall hold office or service in the corresponding Institute by the same tenure, at the same remuneration and upon such terms and conditions and with same rights and privileges as to pension, leave, gratuity, provident fund and other mattet% as he/she would have held if the Rules were not changed and shall continue to unless and until his/her employment is terminated or until such tenure, remuneration and terms and conditions are altered by further change in MOA/ Rules."

It may be stated that as per decision of the Board taken in its 4th meeting held on 8.12.2003, the new service conditions for the employees of NIT Kurukshetra are effective from 1, 1.2004. The age of retirement of the non-teaching employees of the Institute is already 60 years without any screening at any stage and the introduction of new px)vision at the age of 58 years is in contradiction oc the existing Bye-laws/ rules as well as the new MOA/ rules of the Institute. It is disadvantageous to the non-teaching employees recruited before upgradation of the Institute to NIT.

The Board may like to take a decision that the new provision of the screening at the age of 58 years will be applicable to the non-teaching employees of the Institute recruited after 1.1.2004 only.

Further Dr. Mehta again vide his application dated 12.3.2004 informed that he was admitted in Fortis Heart Institute, Mohali in the Evening of 4.3.2004 and he was hospitalized upto 7.3.2004 and operated for Coronary Artery Double Vessel Disease and was discharged on 7.3.2004 and the Doctor advised him to take rest for two weeks. Due to illness he requested in his application dated 12.3.2004 for modification in his leave applied in letter dated 4.3.2004 as under:-

Item No. 3.14. To consider implementation of World Bank Purchase Rules for procurement of Goods, Civil Works, and Services under Technical Education Quality Improvement Program Project of Govt. of India Funded by World Bank

This Institute has received financial approval to the tune of Rs. 1092.86 Lacs and additional 8% of the grant for operation and maintenance from NPIU, Govt. of India under TEQIP Project for procurement of Goods (Equipments, Furniture, Books, Learning Resources, and Education Material and Small items and Services related to Goods), carrying out civil works and services. The matter regarding participation of NIT, Kumareshtra in TEQIP was placed before the Board of Governors in its 3rd meeting held on 6.10.2003 (Item No. 3.14) which was noted by the Board.

Subsequently the matter for implementation of World Bank Purchase Rules for procurement of Goods, Civil Works, and Services under TEQIP simultaneously with Institute Purchase Rules was placed before the Board of Governors in its 5th meeting held on 15.3.2004 but it was decided by the Board that procurements under Project be made in accordance with existing Purchase Rules of the Institute except for those clauses which may not be in consonance with the World Bank Purchase Regulations. However the present financial fruits imposed under the Institute Purchase Rules be adhered to.

A meeting was held by the Ministry of Human Resources Development, New Delhi on 1.7.2004 with the Directors of NITS, wherein the expenditure under TEQIP Project was also reviewed and found the expenditure on lower side on the part of the Institutions. One of the reasons for low expenditure pointed out by the Directors of NITS was lack of clarity regarding procedures to be followed for procurements under the Project.

Subsequent to above meeting, the Central Project (Wc) NPIU, Govt. of Noida has issued a letter No. A/TEQWGEN/2004 dated 12.7.2004 enclosed as Appendix WI Page 106 that all procurements of Goods and Services under TEQIP Project will be made according to the World Bank Procedures as per the Agreement.

The Board may reconsider its decision taken in the meeting held on 15.3.2004 in light of above letter of NPIU and approve implementation of the World Bank Purchase Rules for procurements under TEQIP Project funded by World Bank.

(Reference: Schedule I, Section I, Part 4 of Project Agreement).

Deviation from Project Agreement may cause disallowance of reimbursement claims and post audit problems.

2.1 DEFINITIONS

2.1.1 The defirffi)ns in tNs secüon should be interpreted in the context of tlñs docunent only..

Department : **Department** shall include Department/Inter-Divisional/Project/Central facility/Unit or any entity in the which has a separately allocated budget.

Project: Project shall mean any **sponsored**, funded or any other activity which has a project sanctioned through the Institute.

Principal Investigator : Any faculty of the Institute, whose name is recorded as a Project **Investigator** in the record pertaining to the project. At any point of time only the first named Project Investigator in the records of the Institute will be considered as the **Principal Investigator** for operational purposes (e.g. exercise of financial power).

Indenter : Any faculty/officer who raises the indent.

Supplier : A supplier refers to the **company/vendor/dealer/agent/individual** from whom the Institute may purchase goods or services.

Temporary Advance : It is advance which can be taken to meet contingent expenditure on MAS/MIA/CS/Miscellaneous items. This should normally be taken from the appropriate budget head.

Imprest : It is a rolling advance which is taken to meet day to day contingent expenditure of minor nature.

3. CLASSIFICATION OF STORES

3.1 All stores shall be classified into three **categories viz.** MAS — Major Assets (Non-Consumable Stores), NfA — Minor Assets (Non-Consumable stores). and CS — Consumable Stores.

3.2 Major Assets (MAS) — Stores **satisfying** any one of the following conditions shall be classified as Major :

- i) Stores are intended to be used for a long period (more than 5 years) before becoming unusable or obsolete, and costing 'above' Rs. 10,000/-.
- ii) Wooden, Steel Furniture and Office Equipment

Example : The example includes the following: Platts, Instruments, printers, motors, assembled instruments, fabricated **equipment**.

3.3 Minor Assets (NfA) — Stores satisfying any one of the following conditions shall be classified as Minor Assets :

- i) Stores costing any amount and useful life of less than five years, which lose rapidly their value/relevance with the passage of time or have very little or negligible disposal value.
- ii) Stores which can be upgraded either by computerized or which can be rendered obsolete by the release of new version or editions.

6 DISCREPANCY IN SUPPLY

6.1 Where stores supplied found not **acceptable** due to damage in transit, wrong supply and are consequently rejected, the department concerned or SPS shall immediately such rejection the grounds on which such rejection has been made to the supplier & directly depending upon who initiated the **purchase** and take necessary action for getting the items as the specification of the Supply Order.

6.2 In case of IMPORTS the following will apply :

6.2.1 Where stores found partially defective and **are considered** to be capable of being rectified at the department or in the Workshops of the Institute, the particulars thereof shall be to the SPS at an early date specifying the exact nature of the defect and the estimated cost of repair/rectification. Extra expenditure, if any, in this shall be borne by supplier for which **necessary** intimation shall be given to the supplier by the SPS.

6.2.2 When stores are found defective and it is considered necessary to have them repaired at the supplier's arrangement made by the supplier, particulars of such defect shall also be notified to the SPS at early date specifying the exact nature of defect.

6.2.3 Where stores found defective and it is necessary to have the defects rectified by returning the articles to the supplier, the particulars thereof shall also be notified to the SPS **immediately** specifying the exact nature of the defect.

6.2.4 In all such cases indicated above, the SPS shall report the **discrepancy** to the supplier concerned and for immediate action. Copies of such reports shall also be to the concerned.

6.2.5 Where packages of containers have been found broken and where damages and breakages are attributable to transit a claim lodged by the agency the SPS the a **certificate** on shortage/damage by the railway and should be sent to the supplier concerned and the Indentor,

6.2.6 Notwithstanding contained herein, where a claim is covered by instruction in and where & for damages or breakages attributable to handling in transit, appropriate for shall be lodged by the SPS with the under-writers concerned

6.2.7 In case of the stores being rejected they should be returned to the Stores Purchase Section by **packed, who shall** return **such** stores to the purveyor.

6.2.8 Where stores and equipment, machinery or fittings found or otherwise rejectable the firms should be asked by the SPS to replace or to **rectify**

the stores under their own **arrangement** and at their own cost at once. All expenditure for repair or replacement of defective stores supplied shall be borne by the Supplier.

8.0 MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS :-

A record of an purchases the purchase project funds shall be maintained by the concerned Deptt./Sec. in the MAS category, be recorded in the major assets register and the WA category in the minor assets register. For consumable stores, issue record shall be maintained at the department level. Proper care needs to be taken by the Deptt./Sec. to monitor consumption of consumable stores. Two Registers one each for MAS and MIA shall also be maintained at the department/sectional level. The first page of Stock Register should have the signature of the Head of Deptt./Sec. certifying the total number of pages, number of entries and the total value of assets in MAS & categories separately.

8.1 Processing of Documents

8.1.2 Major & Minor Assets

On receipt of the Stores of MAS & NAA Category the Deptt./Sec. shall get the Stock entry made in the MAS/MIA Stock Register and put a page on Cash memwBill. The first copy of the cash memwBill will be sent A/C8. for payment/adjustment and second copy be kept in respective Deptt./Sec. for record. The information of the receipt of assets be sent to maintenance of Assets Register.

All original **documents** relating such purchases including certificate inquired report of purchase commitments, sanction notes; purchase order, delivery challan, inspection etc. shall remain in department or SPS depending on who the purchase. These records documents will be maintained for such period stipulated by the Institute-

8.2 Stock Verification

The stock verification of all items on various stock register of the ~~departments/section~~ shall be ~~conducted~~ annually through SPS.

8.3 Write-off and Disposal

8.3.1 The departments shall have a Standing Committee of not less than three members. This MAS and NAA stores and recommend write-off for which are not useable and serviceable. 8.4 Upgradation of Assets

In case of upgradation or purchase of assets buy back management, the old asset which has been upgraded or exchanged will be treated written-off i.e. **its** value will be written-off from records. In case of the sum of cost of old asset and the differential cost will be considered as cost of the upgraded asset, however in case of buy **back** the sum of the disposal value of old asset and the **differential** cost paid will be considered as cost of the new asset.

8.5 Transfer of Stores

Transfer of stores within the institute from one department to another may be ~~done~~ with the approval of Dean (P&I) through a voucher under intimation to the Section in case of MASMA.

- vi) "FAMILY" means the wife, husband, children, parents, brothers & sisters residing with and dependant on an allottee.
- vii) 'SENIORITY' of an allottee for the purpose of allotment of a house shall be as decided under these rules.
- viii) "PAY" means the basic pay of the allottee.
- ix) "LICENCE FEE" means the amount payable by the allottee as licence fee for a house allotted to him/her under these rules exclusive of fan , water and other charges.
- x) "PENAL RENT" the licence fee charged from an unauthorized occupation as per clause- 19. .

ELIGIBILITY

Clause-3

An allottee's eligibility for alloünent of a category of house shall be as approved by the Board of Governors of the Institute from to time. Schedule-I gives the eligibility as approved by the Board of Governors.

SENIORITY CRITERIA Clause-4

- i) The will be made in order of seniority.
- ii) For the purpose of allotment of a house of any type a category, seniority amongst all eligible employees shall be in accordance with the date when an employee becomes eligible for that category of houses. In case of employeês becoming eligible for a particul category of house, (viz. Professor for Professor's houses, Assistant Professor for Assistant Professor's houses etc.) the seniority amongst them shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of Inter Departünental Seniority Rules as approved by the Standing Administrative and Academic Committee in its 9th meeting held on 8.5.1990 vide item No. 9.20 and further approved by the Board of Governors in their meeting held on 29.6.1990 which are given below:

- a) By the length of continuous service, whether temporary against a leave vacancy or permanent/temporary against regular vacant posts.
- b) In case of teachers joining on the same date, their inter-se Seniority shall be determined as under:-
 - i) In case of a tie between internal teacher and external teacher- by the amount of pay. The teacher recommended with a higher pay shall have precedence over the teacher selected with lower pay and where the pay is same the internal teacher shall be senior.
 - ii) In case of a tie between Two external teachers, the seniority shall be determined by pay and in case of same pay by age - the older being senior.
 - iii) In case of a tie between two internal teachers by length of service in the immediate lower teaching posts. Where the length of service is also the same, seniority between them shall be determined by age - the older teacher taking precedence over the younger teacher (As a one time measure in case of selection of professors in January/February, 1984, the Professors who joined on 21.5.1984 or 22.5.1984 against that selection may be treated at par as decided by the Board of Governors on 4.11.1988).
- iv) A teaching staff member be considered eligible for ~~lotment~~ of house of lower category if the category of house to which he/she being eligible is not available. For such allotment a teaching staff member holding higher post shall be allotted a lower category of house provided he/she joined the services of the Institute before other employees, otherwise eligible for that category of house. However, a teaching staff member holding higher post shall be

mehta

considered senior to all other employees for the allotment of DBU type house only.

- v) In case of non-teaching employees, the seniority of an employee for the purpose of house allotment shall be decided on the basis of total length of service in the category to which the quarter belongs, plus a credit of 114th of the length of service in the previous lower category subject to a maximum of 3 years. This criterion for deciding seniority shall be applicable in case of such employees who are promoted/upgraded due to revision of pay scales or otherwise from time to time and if there is a tie between two or more eligible employees for the allotment of a house. However, if the tie still remains undecided — the senior between them shall be determined by age — the older being senior to the younger.

A list of all eligible employees according to seniority shall be maintained by the Estate Officer and the list is to be reviewed from time to time (January/July).

Clause-5 An employee shall maintain his/her seniority in the category of houses to which he/she is eligible for further allotment ~~whether he/she~~ accepts allotment of a lower category house under Clause 4(iii) or joint allotment under Clause-14 or does not accept under any of these two clauses.

Clause-6 If husband and wife both are the employees of the Institute then only one house shall be allotted to them. But this Clause shall not apply where the husband and wife are residing separately in pursuance of an order of judicial separation made by a Court.

Clause-7 If two allottees marry each other, they shall surrender one of the two houses within one month of the marriage failing which

allotment of the lower type of house shall be deemed to have been cancelled on expiry of the aforesaid period of one month and where both the houses are of the same type the allotment of one of these houses shall be deemed to have been cancelled.

In case he/she fails to accept the allotment within seven days it shall stand cancelled. Such allottees as above and those who relinquish a house within one month -after having accepted it, shall not be entitled to House Rent Allowance for a period of six months and will not be entitled for house allotment for a period of one year.

The Estate Officer may anticipate the house likely to be vacated and should notify the same for allotment at least 8 days prior to the date it is likely to be vacated so that the time in the occupation of the house is not wasted.



If an allottee commits any breach of these rules or the terms & conditions of the allotment or uses the house or permits it to be used for the purpose other than what is stated under Clause-30 or conducts himself/herself in a manner which in the opinion of the Director is prejudicial to the maintenance of harmonious relations with the allottee's neighbours or peace on the campus or if it is found that the allottee has knowingly furnished incorrect information in any application or written statement with a view to securing the allotment, the Director may without prejudice to any other disciplinary action that may be taken against the allottee :-

- a) Cancel the allotment of house;
- b) Declare the employee in-eligible for any fresh allotment of a house for a period ranging from one year to three years; and
- c) Declare the employee ineligible for House Rent Allowance upto six months.

2. Sh. Moü La], Ex-Lecturær, ECE Department of the Insütute had expilEd on 28.9.1994. The Technical Education Department, Govt. of Haryana vide letter No. 40/54/94-4TE dated 6.5.1996 addressed to the Vice-Chancellor, Kurukshefra University, Kurukshetra, with a copy to the Principal, REC, Kurukshetra informed that the State **Vigilance** Burtau had desiæd the Kuru.kshefra University, Kuruksheüa to inquit into irregulariües regarding pmmoüon case of Sh. Moü la-I. Accordingly She K.C. Shenmar, IPS, IG(Retd.) Punjab and Fellow Punjab University was appointed by the ViceChancellor, Kurukshefra University, Kuruksheüa to conduct inquitly in the death case/pmmoüon of She Moü Leal. After **completing**

inquiry report in May, 97 Sh. Shenmar submitted his report to the Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra on 5,6, 1997,

3, A copy of the said inquiry report was sent by the Commissioner & ~~Secretary~~ to Govt. of Haryana, Technical Education ~~Department~~ to the Institute for placing the inquiry before the Board of Governors for consideration and further necessary action. Accordingly the inquiry was placed before the BOG of the Institute in its 90th meeting held on 25.11.1998 and the Board decided as under: -

The Board considered the inquiry report submitted by K.C. Shenmar, IPS IG(Retd.) Punjab Police regarding death of Sh. Moti Lal, **Ex-Lecturer**, Regional Engineering College, **Kurukshetra**

The Board decided to file the said inquiry report".

4. Smt. Ketaki Rani w/o late Sh. Mohi Lal reported in April, 1999 that the report of Inquiry Committee may be communicated to her. Accordingly a letter was written to the Financial Commissioner and Secretary to Govt. of Haryana in April, 1999 itself seeking an advice in connection with the aforesaid of Smt. Ketaki Rani. The State Govt. the request of Smt, Ketaki Rani to its Law **Department** for advice and thereafter the following was communicated by the State Govt. to the Institute: -

'The Govt. is not bound to supply the copies of report.

There will be no legal consequences."

The above advice of the State Govt was communicated to Smt. Ketaki Rani in August, 1999. Some more correspondence took place between the State Govt. and the Institution on the subject under reference.

The Financial Commissioner and Principal Secretary to Govt- of Haryana, Technical Education Department vide his Memo No. 40/ 10/20034TE dated nil (received in the Institute on 9.11.2003) addressed to the Director, NIT Kurukshetra has enclosed a copy of inquiry no. 11 dated 19.6.1995 conducted by the State Vigilance Bureau, Haryana with an advise that further necessary action in the matter may be taken by the Institute.

matter was placed before the Board of Governors in its 4th meeting held on

8.12.2003 as mentioned in 1st para of the agenda item,

6. The concluding para of the report (as contained in inquiry no. 11 dated 19.6.1995) is given below:-

Aggarwal and none made any reference to the enquiry report submitted by Sh, K. C, Shen-mar'.

The Board in its meeting held on 15.3.2004 also decided under any other item (5.23) as follows:-

11. Smt. has not mentioned as to what has been done for her by the Institute after the death of Shri Moü Lal. The Institute appointed her on compassionate ground as Telephone Operator-cum-Receptionist in the pay scale of Rs. 950-1500 by relaxing her qualifications as per decision of the Board of Governors taken in its meeting held on 30.9.1994. Further on her subsequent requests she was also allowed the ~~maximum~~ of the scale i.e. Rs. 1500/- per month as per orders of the then Chairman, of Governors.

Subsequently her pay scale as Telephone Operator-cum-Receptionist of the Institute was upgraded to Rs. 1400-2600 (provised) from Rs, 950-1500. The payment of Senior Scale due to late Moü Lal, Ex-Lecturer of this Institute was balance ~~payments were~~ also released in her favour, She is in the service of this Institute on compassionate ground since 16, 1, 1995. She has been ~~provided~~ accommodation in the Institute campus, So far as education of children is concerned her son is doing M.Tech.

Mr. (Roorkee) had joined as Lecturer in Electronics & Communication Engg. Deptt. at Regional Engg. college, Kurukshetra on 1981. While in service Mr. Lal was selected in 1987 for Ph.D. Roorkee and IIT Delhi and he was sponsored for Ph.D. in (Electrical Engineering) IIT Delhi for three years -e. f. D. 7. 1987 to 16.7. 1990.

Mr. Moti Lal did many courses and obtained satisfactory grades as per prospectus of IIT Delhi. For his Thesis was asked to work under joint guidance of Dr. V.K. Jain and Dr. H. M. Gupta.

While doing Ph.D. Sh. Moti Lal applied for senior scale in the college as he became eligible w.e.f. **30.3.1987** after completion of six years service. **appeared before the** screening committee on and recommended by Sh. Moti Lal. (The grant of senior scale vide letter No GA1/3029/32 18-23 27.2.91).

The senior scale was not given to Mr. Moti Lal in his lifetime and he died on **28.9.1994** (due to ill health) which include constancy, irregularities, irregularities in his promotion by Dr. K.K. Aggarwal, Dr. R.A. Aggarwal - both professors holding the position of Principal of the college.

In the above case an enquiry was conducted by Sh. K.C. Shenmar IPS, IG Police & Fellow Punjab University CII (later appointed by Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of K.U. Kurukshetra to enquire into the issues of irregularities committed by the college authorities in the death case of Mr. Lal.

Mr. Shenmar IPS examined 38 teaching and non-teaching staff of the college including Dr. K.K. Aggarwal, Dr. R.A. Aggarwal, Prof. P.V. (Gupta) principal and Mrs. Ketaki W/o Late Sh. Moti Lal. The report, based on examination of physical witnesses, documentary evidence, college records, and the issue arising out of the inquiry report of the State Vigilance Bureau was sent to the Principal, Regional Engg. College, Kurukshetra in 1997 for necessary action. The college authorities seen to so under

heavy pressure guilty & influential persons that even in spite of my requests and representations no action on the report is taken till (date).

Item 6,28 To consider Enquiry Report received from Prof. K.N. Tripathy in respect of Sh. S.C. Gupta, Lecturer (under suspension) Mechanical Engineering Department.

Sh. S.C.Gupta, Lecturer in Mechanical Engineering Department of the Institute was put under suspension in December, 2003 on account of various acts of omission. He was served charge-sheet in January, 2004. The matter was placed before the Board of Governors in its 5th meeting held on 15.3.2004. The Board appointed Sh.

A.K. Saikia, Chairman, IIT Guwahati as Enquiry Officer. However, Sh. Saikia expressed his inability to accept it for health reasons. The matter was then again taken up with the MHRD to appoint another Enquiry Officer. The MHRD vide their office letter No. F.9-16/2004-TS-III dated 12.5.2004 appointed Prof. K.N.Tripathy, A94/2 SFS Saket, New Delhi. His appointment was also got approved from the Board of Governors by way of circulation. Prof. K.N. Tripathy visited the Institute several times for conducting the enquiry. He has submitted the Enquiry Report in confidential cover to the Director & Member-Secretary on 14.8.2004. The Enquiry Report as received from Prof. Tripathy is placed before the Board on table in the same confidential cover.

The Board may like to go through the report and take decision.

Item 6•²⁹ To approve recommendations of the Selection Committees for grant of Senior Scale of R.s. 10,000-15200 to the Lecturers.

The Senior Scale and Selection grade to 36 eligible Lecturers were earlier released under CAS in July, 2000 w.e.f. 9.10.1998 or the date of their eligibility whichever is later as per instructions of the MHRD. Thereafter the implementation of the CAS in the Institute was put to hold till 2003-2004 as per instructions conveyed by the Directorate of Technical Education, Haryana. The MHR-D also issued Instructions in May, 2003 that implementation of the CAS should be kept pending. As per MHRD letter dated 15.9.2003 (i) promotion under CAS shall be effective after approval of the recommendations of the Selection Committee by the Board of Governors of the NIT concerned and (ii) the effective date for giving benefit under CAS shall be the date on which the candidate becomes eligible for consideration under CAS or the date of implementation of the revised Scale of Pay in the Institute whichever is later. In our Institute the revised pay scales effective from 1.1.1996 were implemented in November, 1999 as the same were approved by the State Government vide their letter dated

5.11.1999.

Subsequently more clarifications were received from the MHRD. The MI-IRD vide letter No. 20-18/2003-TS-III dated 4.6.2004 issued the following instructions:-

i) The initial date of introduction of CAS in a REC/NIT shall be the actual date of notification regarding implementation of the revised scale of pay in the Institute but not the retrospective date of implementation of the revised scales of pay i.e. 1.1.96. Further, the crucial date for determining the fulfillment of eligibility criteria for promotion under CAS shall be 1st July of every calendar year. This is to say that all those persons who have fulfilled the prescribed criteria for promotion prior to 1st July shall be considered en bloc as a batch and the inter-se seniority of those actually promoted, as a batch shall be maintained with reference to their original seniority in the initial entry grade. However, where promotion of more than one batch has taken place together, all persons of the first batch shall rank senior en bloc to the next batch and like wise.

ii) It is also clarified that the period between the crucial date and the date of the meeting of the BOG in which promotions recommended under CAS are approved shall count as qualifying service for future promotion without entailing any financial liability — notional or actual — on part of the Institute. However, this would not be applicable in respect of those who have not been found suitable for promotion in the first instance where the benefits would be given from the date

of the meeting of the BOG only.

- iii) All cases of promotions made/to be made under CAS in NITS may accordingly be regulated as per this clarifications excepting those where a member of the faculty has already retired.

The Selection Committees met on 4.6.2004 to consider the grant of Senior Scale of Rs. 10,000-15,200 to the eligible Lecturers. The recommendations of the said committees are placed before the Board on table in confidential covers.

The Board may approve recommendations of the aforesaid Selection Committees for grant of Senior Scale to the Lecturers. The actual financial benefit on account of grant of Senior Scale may be allowed from the date of approval of the Board i.e. 18.9.2004. The benefit of qualifying service may be allowed to them w.e.f.:

5.11.1999, the date of implementation of the revised pay scales in the Institute or from the date

of eligibility whichever is later.



Item-6.31 To consider promotion to Lecturer(Selection Grade)/Asstt. Professor under CAS.

The Senior Scale and the Selection grade to eligible Lecturers were earlier released under CAS in July, 2000 w.e.f. 9.10.1998 or the date of their eligibility whichever is later as per instructions of the MHR-D. The AIC TE vide its letter No. FD/PPSC/Clarif./2003/I dated 10.9.2003 issued detailed clarifications and revised Career Advancement Scheme. Subsequently AICTE vide its letter No. FD/PPSC/Clarif./2003/I dated 17.12.2003 (copy enclosed as Appendix-XXIII on page 168-172) communicated that there was a "typographical error" in the eligibility criteria as communicated vide its letter dated 10.9.2003 and accordingly the same was corrected by the AICTE vide its letter dated 17.12.2003 as mentioned above.

. As per MHRD letter dated 15.9.2003 (i) promotion under CAS shall be effective after approval of the recommendations of the Selection Committee by the Board of Governors of the NIT concerned and (ii) the effective date for giving benefit under CAS shall be the date on which the candidate becomes eligible for consideration under CAS or the date of implementation of the revised Scale of Pay in the Institute whichever is later. In our Institute the revised pay scales effective from 1.1.1996 were implemented in November, 1999 as the same were approved by the State Government vide their letter dated 5.11.1999. More clarifications were received from the MHR-D vide their letters dated 4.3.2004, 6.4.2004 and 4.6.2004.

Further the MHR-D vide their office memo No. F.20-18/2003-TS.III dated 17.8.2004 (copy enclosed as Appendix-XXIV on page 173) clarified that instructions contained in the AIC TE letter dated 10.9.2003 with regard to eligibility criteria for promotions under CAS for different posts of faculty shall be applicable to NITS but any other clarifications issued by AIC TE subsequently shall not be applicable to NITs. The Institute conducted interviews on 31.7.2004 and 1.8.2004 for Lecturer(Selection Grade)/Asstt. Professor under CAS with the eligibility criteria as communicated by the AICTE vide its letter dated 10.9.2003 duly corrected by its subsequent letter dated 17.12.2003 as mentioned above. The recommendations of the

Selection Committees are placed before the Board on table in confidential covers.

It may however be stated that Mrs. Jyoti Ohri joined as Lecturer in the Institute (Elect. Engg. Discipline) on 30th September, 1994 and she was granted senior scale after 5 years of service i.e. with effect from 30th September, 1999. Although she has not so far completed 5 years of service as Lecturer(Senior Scale) but after counting her past service rendered at CRSCE, Munhal w.e.f. 19.3.1993 to 29.9.1994 as Lecturer she becomes eligible for Lecturer(Senior Scale) from 9.10.1998. As a result she becomes eligible for the next benefit i.e. Lecturer (Selection Grade) with effect from 9.10.2003. Accordingly she has been considered for Lecturer(Selection Grade)/Assistant Professor under CAS by the Selection Committee in its meeting held on 1.8.2004. Her said interview was conditional subject to approval of the Board. The Board may consider counting her past service rendered at CRSCE, Murthal for the purpose of Senior Scale at this Institution. It may be stated that the above benefit is admissible as per UGC/AICTE norms

The Board may approve recommendations of the aforesaid Selection Committees for grant of Selection Grade of Rs. 12000-18300/designation of Asstt. Professor. The actual financial benefit on account of grant of Selection Grade/designation of AP may be allowed from the date of approval of the Board i.e. 18.9.2004. The benefit of qualifying service may be allowed to them w.e.f. 5.11.1999, the date of implementation of the revised pay scales in the Institute or from the date of eligibility whichever is later.

"Masters degree and completed five years OJ service at (the level of Lecturer (senior scale)). Those who do not have Ph.D. degree, they are required to obtain Ph. D. degree Within a period of seven years from the date of his/her promotion to the post Assistant Professor...

Instead of

"Lecturers in the Senior Scale having Ph.D. degree with 3 years of experience in teaching / industry/ research at the level of Lecturer (including the period passed in the grade of Lecturer Senior Scale) or equivalent



Supplementary Note to the Agenda Item 6.31 being Considered b" the Board of Governors in its 6th Meeting held on 30.9.2004 regarding Promotion to Lecturers (Selection Grade)/Designation of Assistant Professor under Career Advancement Scheme.

It may be added that the Ministry of Human Resource Development, New Delhi vide their letter No. 20-1 8/2003-TS-III dated 4.6.2004 issued the following instructions:-

- i) The initial date of introduction of CAS in a shall be the actual date of notification regarding implementation of the revised scale of pay in the Institute but not the retrospective date of implementation of the revised scales of pay i.e. 1.1.96. Further, the crucial date for determining the fulfillment of eligibility criteria for promotion under CAS shall be the first of every calendar year. This is to say that all those persons who have *fulfilled the prescribed criteria for promotion prior to 1st July shall be* considered en bloc as a batch and the inter-se seniority of those actually promoted as a batch shall be maintained with reference to their original seniority in the initial entry grade. However, where promotion of more than one batch has taken place together, all persons of the first batch shall rank senior en bloc to the next batch and like wise.
- ii) It is also clarified that the period between the crucial date and the date of the meeting of the BOG in which promotions recommended under CAS are approved shall count as qualifying service for future promotion without entailing any financial liability — notional or actual — on part of the Institute. However, this would not be applicable in respect of those who have not been found suitable for promotion in the first instance where the benefits would be given from the date of the meeting of the BOG only.
- ii i) All cases of promotions made/to be made under CAS in NITS may accordingly be regulated as per this clarification excepting those where a member of the faculty has already retired.

The crucial date for determining the eligibility may be treated as 5.1.1.1999, the date of implementing the revised pay scale in the Institution. As already stated in the agenda item 6.31 the Board may approve the recommendations of the Selection Committee meetings held on 31.7.2004 and 1.8.2004 for grant of the Selection Grade of Rs. 12000-18300/ designation of Asstt. Professor. The actual financial benefit on account of grant of the Selection Grade/designation of Asstt. Professor may be allowed from the date of approval of the Board i.e. 30.9.2004. The benefit of qualifying service may be allowed to them w.e.f. 5.1.1.1999 or from the date of eligibility, whichever is later. Earlier cases before 5.1.1.1999 will have no bearing.

Appendix—I

– Revised Career Advancement Schemes for Teachers of Degree Level Technical Institutions.

1.1 General

1.1.0 Minimum length of service for eligibility to move into the grade of Lecturer (Senior Scale) would be four years for those with Ph.D., five years for those with M. Phil. , M.Tech., and six years for others at the level of Lecturer, and for eligibility to move into the grade of Lecturer (Selection Grade)/ Assistant Professor, the minimum length of service as Lecturer (Senior Scale) shall be uniformly five years.

1.1.1 For movement into grades Pf Professor, the minimum eligibility criterion would be Ph.D. Those without Ph.D. can go up to the level of Lecturer (Selection Grade)/ Assistant Professor.

1.1.2 An Assistant Professor with a minimum of eight years of service in that grade will be eligible to be considered for appointment as a Professor.

1.1.3 The Selection Committees for Career Advancement shall be the same as those for Direct Recruitment for each category..

1.2 Lecturer (Senior Scale):

A Lecturer will be eligible for placement in a senior scale through a procedure of selection if she/ he has:

- (i) Completed 6 years of service after regular appointment with relaxation of one year and two years respectively, for those with M.Phil, M.D., / M. Tech. and Ph.D.
- (ii) Participated in summer / winter schools of total duration of 4 weeks, or engaged in other appropriate continuing education programme of comparable quality as may be specified or approved by the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE).
Consistently satisfactory performance appraisal

1.3 Lecturer (Selection Grade):

Lecturers in the Senior Scale who do not have Master's degree or equivalent published work, and who do not meet the scholarship and research standards, but fulfils the other criteria given below for the post of Assistant Professor, and have a good record in teaching and, preferably, have contributed in various ways such as to the corporate life of the institution, examination work, or through Research & extension activities, will be placed in the Selection Grade, subject to the recommendations of the Selection

Committee which is the same as for promotion to the post of Assistant Professor. They will be designated as Lecturers in the Selection Grade. They could offer themselves for fresh assessment after obtaining Master's degree and/or fulfilling other requirements for promotion as Assistant Professor and if found suitable, could be given the designation of Assistant Professor.

1.4 Assistant Professor:

1.4.1 A Lecturer in the senior scale will be eligible for promotion to the post of Assistant Professor if he/ she has:

(i) Master's Degree and completed five years of service at the level of Lecturer(senior scale). Those who do not have Ph.D degree, they are required to obtain Ph.D degree within a period of seven years from the date of his/her promotion to the post of Assistant Professor.

AND

- (ii) Made some mark in the areas of Scholarship and Research; as evidenced e.g. self assessment, report of referees, quality of publication, contribution to education / innovation, development of new courses and curricula and extension activities.
- (iii) After placement in the senior scale participated in winter/ summer schools (short-term courses) of total duration of 4 weeks, or engaged in other appropriate continuing education programmes of comparable quality as may be specified / approved by the AICTE.

(iv) Possesses consistently good performance appraisal reports.

- 1.4.2 Promotion to the post of Assistant Professor will be through a process of selection by a selection committee to be set up under the statutes / ordinances of the concerned institute / university or other similar committees set up by the appointing authorities.

1.5 Professor:

1.551 In addition to the sanctioned position of Professors which must be filled up through direct recruitment through all India advertisement promotion may be made from the post of Assistant Professor after 8 years of service as Assistant Professor.

1.5-2 The selection committee for promotion to the post of Professors should be the same as that for direct recruitment for the promotion from Assistant Professor to Professor the following methods of promotion may be followed:

The candidate should present her/ himself before the selection committee with some of the following:

- (a) Self-appraisal report (required).
- (b) Research Contribution — books, articles, etc published (at least 4 papers in Journals required). The best three written contribution of the teacher (as defined by her/ him) may be sent in advance to the experts for reviewed before coming for the selection committee interview. The candidate should submit in three sets with the applications.
- (c) Seminars / conferences workshops attended which should be at least 4 seminars/ conferences/ workshops.

at the national/ international level or must have attended summer / winter schools (short term course) of total duration of 4 weeks.

- (d) Significant contribution towards teaching / academic environment / institutional corporate life.
- (e) Adequate extension and field research activity.

- (f) Development of course/ lecturer material / monographs, CDs / modern teaching tools including E- learning tools.
- (g) Participation in continuing education programme.
- (h) Any other academic contribution.

1.6 The requirement of consistent satisfactory performance appraisal report shall be the mandatory requirement for Career Advancement from Lecturer to Lecturer (Senior Scale) and from Lecturer (Senior Scale) to Lecturer (Selection Grade) / Assistant Professor.

For requirement of completing the courses would be as follows:

- (i) For Lecturer to Lecturer (Senior Scale), summer / winter school courses of total duration of 4 weeks would be compulsory.
- (ii) For Lecturer (Senior Scale) to Lecturer (Selection Grade)/ Assistant Professor, Summer / winter school courses of total duration of 4 weeks would be compulsory.
- (iii). The senior teachers like Assistant Professor / Lecturer (Selection Grade) and Professors may opt to attend 4 seminars / conferences / workshops (National Or International Level) in their subject area and present papers on those areas or attend AICTE approved summer / winter school courses to be offered by various approved institutions.

Note: Other terms and conditions of Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) will remain same as per the addendum issued vide Letter F.No. 165/CD/NEC/ 98-99 dated July 31st 2001.

SUBJECT: -Promotion under Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) for faculty members in National Institutes of Technology (NITs) Clarifications regarding eligibility criteria prescribed AICTE.

The undersigned is directed to refer to para 4 of this Nfinis(rv's orrsec Memorandum (OM) of even number dated 15-09-2003 on the subject mentioned above and to say that the Ministry has been receiving a number of queries from NITS regarding the exact eligibility criteria for promotion under CAS as AICTE has issued different clarifications at different points of time which are at variance with each other. The matter has been considered in the Ministry and it is clarified that instructions contained in the letter No. FD/PSSC/Clarif./2003/1 dated 10-09-2003 or AICTE, with regard to eligibility criteria for promotions under CAS for different posts of faculty shall be applicable to NITS. But any other clarifications issued by AICTE subsequently after this date shall not be applicable to NITS. If there is any specific operational difficulty or anomaly with regard to implementation of this order, the same may be referred to the Ministry for appropriate consideration and clarifications.

Item No. 6.32 To consider the penal rent outstanding against
Dr. B.L Sharma, Ex-Professor of the Physics Deptt.

Dr. BtL, Shan-na, Ex-Professor in Physics Department of this Institute, retired from the Institute services on 30.6.08. On his request, he was allowed to retain his existing house NoDB-4 (Institute Accommodation) on normal rent under Clause 3(-) of House Allotment Rules of the Institute up to 30.9.98. He was also allowed to retain the House NoaBB-4 on normal rent for a further period of three months up to 31.12.98 under Clause 30 of House Allotment Rules.

Further, Dr. B.L. Sharma requested the then Chairman, Board of Governors that he may be allowed to retain the Institute accommodation DB-4 of Professors' category on normal rent for a further period of 'one year'. Dr. Sharma also requested the then Chairman, Board of Governors that alternatively the said house may be allotted to his wife Mrs. Manjula Shatana, Lecturer (Senior Scale) in the Department of Humanities of the Institute on purely temporary basis for a period of one year. The then Chairman, Board of Governors allowed Dr. Sharma to retain the House No.BB-4 for one year w.e.f. 01.01. 1999.

As per House Allotment Rules of the Institute, Mrs. Manjula Sharma was not eligible for 13B -type house which was in the name of Dr. B.L Sharma before his retirement. It is pertinent to mention here that if the Professor category house was allotted to a Lecturer, on normal rent for one year, it would have been a wrong practice and bad precedent which could create problems to the Institute. House Allotment Rules do not provide for retention of House after retirement beyond six months from the date of retirement under any circumstances. Hence, Dr. B. L. Sharma was informed several times that the rules do not permit to retain the house for more than six months and the penal rent of 100% of the basic pay is due to be charged w.e.f. 01.01. 1999 i.e. RS. 6700/- p.m. subject to revised pay scale, which may come to over RS, per month.

The matter was placed before the Board in its 91st meeting held on 11.5.1999 and the Board decided as under:-

"The Board decided that penal rent as per College Rules be charged w.e.f. 1.99 from Dr. B.L.Sharma, Ex-Fellow of Physics Department for retaining the House No. BB-4 unauthorisedly. The penal rent will be again calculated which the grades are revised and shall be adjusted from the arrears to be paid to the employee. The Board further decided that Dr. B.L. Sharma be asked to vacate the College Accommodation immediately."

In view of the above decision of the Board, a notice dated 22.7.1999 was issued by the Estate Section of the institute for the recovery of amount of penal rent (100% of the basic pay as on 30.6.98, w.e.f. 1.99 to 30.6.1999 and 200% w.e.f. 1999 till the vacation of house No. BBA by Dr. B.L. Sharma. Dr. B.L. Sharma vacated the Institute accommodation on 27. Thus Dr. B. L. Sharma retained the accommodation unauthorisedly for the period from 1.99 to 27.9.2000. The penal rent for this period on the basis of revised pay scale amounted to Rs. 3,68,491.62. The Institute had retained 14 1/2 months gratuity and 7 days Leave encashment of Dr. B.L. Sharma which amount to Rs. 3,18,741/-

Dr. B.L. Sharma filed a suit against the above notice dated 22.7.99 of the Estate Officer in the Hon'ble Distt. Courts, Kurukshetra on 4.8.1999 and the Hon'ble Court of Addl. Civil Judge (Sr. Division), Kurukshetra allowed the suit partly on 30.4.2002 deciding therein that order dated 22.7.1999 passed by the Institute is hereby set aside and Dr. B. L. Sharma is entitled to all his retirement benefits after deducting house rent on normal rent upto 31.12.99 and penal rent 100% till vacation of house. However, the Institute as well as Dr. B. L. Sharma filed an appeal and cross appeal against the above orders, Both the appeals are pending before the Distt. & Session Judge, Kurukshetra for orders.

Subsequently Dr. B.L. Sharma withdrew his said appeal against the Institute vide his letter dated 17.5.2004. Further, Dr. B. L. Sharma vide his letter dated 7.9.2004 (copy enclosed as Appendix XXV on page 176) while requesting to consider his case sympathetically has pointed out that even the trial court, which decided the case in his favour on 30.4.2002 had ruled that Institute can charge penal rent only for the period of occupation beyond that permitted by the Chairman, Board of Governors i.e. beyond 31.12.1999.

The Board may consider and decide.

Release of gratuity and other retirement benefits: waiving of penal rent.


This is in continuation of my letter dated 26.11.2002 (addressed to the Chairman BOG with copy endorsed to you) on the subject.

It has been more than six years since I retired from the services of the College/Institute on 30.6.1998. Had my gratuity and other dues amounting to Rs.3,68,491.62 been released immediately after retirement, it would have earned me an interest of more than Rs.2.5 lakh (at the rates prevalent then). I have therefore, already been penalized to the tune of Rs.2.5 lakh plus. Imposing any additional penalties would therefore be extremely harsh and unjust. I may point out here that even the trial court which decided the case in my favour, had ruled that the College/Institute can charge penal rent only for the period of occupation beyond that permitted by the Chairman, BOG, i.e., beyond 31.12.1999.

Keeping the aforesaid points in view, I request you once again to consider my case sympathetically, keeping in view the penalty already suffered by me.

Shri Sandeep Singhal, Lecturer in Mechanical Engineering Department of this Institute was offered appointment by AICTE as Assistant Director vide letter No, F, 104-10/B1/Admn/S/2001 dated 5.6.2003. He was allowed deputation for a period of one year by the Director of the Institute in anticipation of the approval of the Board to join AICTE for a period of one year

from 30.9.2003 to 29.9.2004 vide letter No. GA-I/PF/6540 dated 29.9.2003 (copy enclosed as Annexure x.xvr Page 179—180). The Board ratified the action taken by the Director. As per terms and conditions of deputation Shri Sandeep Singhal is to join back on 30.9.2004 after the expiry of the deputation otherwise action will be taken as per terms and conditions mentioned in the letter vide which he was allowed deputation,

Sh. Singhal vide his application dated 30.6.2004 has requested extension for another one more year w.e.f. 30.9.2004, In this connection it is mentioned that it is a matter of prestige when such teachers on deputation to a Govt. Department/ Council of National level. The AICTE is a prestigious council to which the Institute is involved in many ways. Thus the experience of Sh. Singhal will not only be beneficial to him but also to the Institute. Sh. Singhal joined this Institute on 2.8.89 and has completed about 14 years service in the Institute. The rule with regard to sending a person on deputation/ EOL as resolved by the Board of Governors in their 91st meeting held on 11.5.99 reads as under:-

- "(a) An employee will be allowed one year's Extraordinary Leave for every completed five years service subject to a maximum of three years Extraordinary-1Y Leave during the entire service with the College. However, in case an employee is appointed to a prestigious position like Vice-Chancellor, his EOL may be extended to a maximum of five years.
- (b) An employee will be allowed deputation to a maximum period of three years during his entire service with the College, The deputation will only be allowed if it is in the interest of the College, the State Govt. or Govt. of India.
- (c) The total absence of an employee from the College due to EOL or EOL plus deputation will not be allowed to exceed five years under any circumstances (till the entire service of the employee" ,

The Institute has been granted the Deemed University Status w.e.f. 26.6.2002, The rules regarding deputation are under process for preparation. For the time being the Institute is following the deputation rules of Central

Govt. servants and as per Swamy's Handbook 2004 the abstract of deputation is as under:-

"The deputation will be for a maximum of three years. Deputation to other Ministries/ Departments for the fourth year may be granted with the approval of the Secretary of the borrowing Ministry, Extension for one year beyond the fourth year requires the approval of the Minister of the borrowing Ministry; but no Deputation Allowance is admissible for that period. Extension beyond fifth year can be only with prior approval of Department of Personnel and Training'.

Sh. Sandeep Singhal has at his credit about 14 years service. So he is entitled for one year deputation from 30.9.2004 to 29.9, 2005 as per BOG decision taken in their 91st meeting held on 11.5.1999 as referred above. AICTE vide its letter No. 101-164/B1/Admn.(S)/2002/465 dated 13.9.04 has also recommended for extension of deputation period of one year to Dr, Singhal,

Item 6 34 To consider matter regarding **rationalization** of non-teaching staff.

The Board of Governors in its 2nd meeting held on 19.4.2003 decided as under:-

Item 2.25

"However, Board was very specific that we should maintain ratio between teaching and non-teaching posts in the range of 1; 1.5. The Board felt that to keep this ratio the Institute can do the rationalization of the non-teaching posts ~~recommendations~~ by appointing a Committee at the ~~from the Board~~ Institute level. The of such Committee may be got approved

Item 2.27

The Board noted the vacant non-teaching posts in the Institute, The Board is of the opinion that ratio between teaching and non-teaching staff be maintained as 1:1.5. However, in some cases where there is acute shortage of teaching-supporting staff separate request may be put up to the Board for allowing a few non-teaching posts. The Institute will do the rationalization as noted in item 2.25".

The matter as regards filling some of the non-teaching posts was placed before the Board of Governors in its 5th meeting held on 15.3.2004. The

Board decided as under: -

"The Board did not agree to lift ban on recruitment of non-teaching and supporting staff,

The Board desired that the process of rationalization be completed at the earliest. Keeping in view the observations made by the National Board of Accredited

regarding urgent need of technical staff for laboratories, the training scheme for those who have potential should be started immediately and they should be placed suitably.

Dr. R.S. Sirohi commented that needs of residential campus are different from those of non residential campus and hence the proposals of the manpower ~~ment~~ be presented for Board's discussion and approval broadly keeping in mind the ~~requirement~~ of faculty to staff ratio and the data presented by the Institute".

In view of above decision of the Board, a Committee was constituted at the Institute level for the said purpose under the Chairmanship of Dr. S.K, Sharma, Professor & Chairman of the Mechanical Engineering Department. The Committee has submitted its report and the same is being examined by the office.

It may be appreciated that NIT Kurukshetra being a very big residential institution has several hostels, instructional buildings, residential buildings, other buildings and huge infrastructure etc. etc. It has, therefore, been felt that the Institute may be allowed to maintain ratio between teaching and non-teaching posts as 1:2 instead of 1:1.5. As per recommendations of the Expenditure Reforms Commission (ERC) as communicated by the MHRD the ratio between teaching and non-teaching staff can be maintained in the range of 1:1.5 to 1:2.

It is proposed that the Institute may be allowed to do rationalization of non-teaching staff by maintaining ratio between teaching and non-teaching posts as 1:2 with the following guidelines:-

- (i) All posts in Estate Section relating to maintenance work and Watch & Ward Section except some skeleton posts may be abolished and maintenance and Watch & Ward work may be outsourced on contract basis. -
- (ii) The ratio between teaching and non-teaching posts as 1:2 may be further apportioned as under:-

- (a) Technical Supporting Staff such as Supervisors,
Draftsman, Technician Grade A &B,
System Attendant, Laboratory Attendants etc. 1
- (b) Ministerial Staff such as Registrar,
Dy. Registrars, Assistant Registrar, Dy. Supdts.,
Assistants, Accounts staff, Sr. and Jr. Stenos,
Clerks and other ministerial staff. 1:0.5
- (c) Other non teaching supporting
staff such as staff of Health
Centre, Library Staff & other non-
teaching supporting staff
not covered under (a) & (b) above. 1:0.5

Due to the ban imposed by the State Government on the recruitment since 1996 and frequent retirement of the non-teaching staff, vacancies are increasing day by day and it has become very difficult to run the classes, labs, various departments and various administrative office smoothly. The Chairmen of the respective departments and Heads of Sections are pressing very hard to fill up the vacant teaching supporting and non-teaching posts as the work is enormously increasing due to manifold activities of the Institute, particularly on its becoming NIT with Deemed University Status. The Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development vide letter No. P.32-1/ 1999-TS.III dated 28th May, 2003 also issued instructions that no recruitment/ promotions should be effected until the new service rules are notified by this Ministry.

Pending the rationalization of the non-teaching staff, the Institute may be allowed to fill up the following non-teaching posts which are 25 in number by way of direct recruitment on the basis of existing qualifications, rules and roster of the Institute. However, the Selection Committee for the purpose will be as per new MOA/ Rules. The above mentioned posts are minimal and essential requirement to be filled up urgently to run the administration, laboratories and classes of the students.

As per the decision of the Board referred to above, the Institute has adopted the liveries rules on the Central Govt. pattern and allowed summer uniforms to the eligible Class IV employees but the reprtsentatives of the Karamchari Sangh of the Institute intimated that several Clause IV employees

have been left out from the ambit of the liveries who being provided liveries on the State Govt. pattern.

To settle the issue the constituted a committee consisting of 5 members headed by Dr. RC Bhattacharjee, Professor-in-Charge (Estate & Construction) wherein two representatives of the Karamchari Sangh were also included as members and the said Committee with reference to letter No. GAIII/ Liveries/ 5903-06 dated 9.8.2004 submitted its detailed report and recommendations on 13.9, 2004. The said report along with the

The Board may consider the recommendations submitted by the Committee constituted for looking into the difficulties relating to the liveries and washing allowances with some other specific categories belonging to Class 'C'. The Committee has recommended that the liveries rules followed by IIT Delhi may be implemented in NIT, Kurukshetra.

The above committee was asked to examine the issue of supply of liveries to the eligible employees.

The above committee met several times and collected information from NIT Jaipur & IIT, Delhi through the representatives of Karamchari Sangh. While examining the rules & practice adopted by erstwhile REC, Kurukshetra, the committee observed that all Group-D employees of REC, Kurukshetra were getting the liveries allowance on the

State Government pattern, which included washing allowance also. On elevation from REC to NIT, Kurukshetra, the Board of Governors vide item No. 5.17 decided to allow liveries to the eligible employees as per norms prescribed by Government of India. While implementing the decision, it was observed that the liveries prescribed for various categories of employees were in variance vis-à-vis the previous norms/practice. This has created dis-satisfaction among the eligible Non-teaching employees, who wanted that the liveries be sanctioned to the eligible employees as per past practice or on the pattern of IIT, Delhi pattern. However, on perusal of the relevant Central Government Rules i.e. O.





M. No. 14/8/90-JCA dated 29.6.1990, the Committee observed that all Group-D employees of the categories of Jamadars/ Daftris/ Peons/ messengers /record sorters etc. and certain categories of Group—C employees are eligible for liveries. Further, it was observed that in the case of employees not covered by these orders i.e. technicians and specialized Group-D staff the concerned organization should itself decide the question for issue of uniforms and scales thereof in consultation with the appropriate financial authorities i.e. Governing Body of the Institute. In view of the rules reproduced above (typed in Italics), the committee observed that all the Group-D employees working in NIT, Kurukshetra fall under the same categories as mentioned above in respect of their nature of duties.

While perusing the rules in vogue in IIT, Delhi, it revealed that the liveries given by IIT, Delhi to some Group-C and all Group-D employees are in accordance and 'within rules of GOI. IIT, Delhi has made some minor modifications in the liveries in terms of shades,

quality and quantity etc. which too is within rules by providing less quantity of liveries with better quality, and thus total value over a block year has also not exceeded.

In view of above observations, recommendation of the Committee are as under:

- a. The liveries rules followed by IIT, Delhi be implemented in NIT, Kurukshetra.
- b. All the group-D employees of the Institute be provided liveries as prescribed by IIT, Delhi.
- c. Some selected categories of Group-C employees i.e Security Officer, Staff Nurse & all Technical Staff below the Rank of Supervisors, vehicle drivers, Pump Drivers and Asstt. Pump Drivers be also sanctioned liveries as per norms prescribed by IIT, Delhi.
- d. Item/Quality/quantity/shades of liveries including stitching charges and washing allowance will be at par with those admissible at IIT, Delhi.
- e. All the items of the liveries be procured from NTC/Khadi Gram Udyog/DGS & D-RC and distributed among the eligible employees over a block year (Annexure I). The admissible stitching charges be paid to the concerned employees on production of stitched garments alongwith the cash receipt.
- f. The liveries already purchased by the Institute be distributed among the eligible employees i.e. all Group-D and some Group-C employees as mentioned at Sr. No. (c) above, during the current block year. However, the IIT, Delhi norms be followed from the next block year.
- g. The amendments, if any, made by IIT, Delhi in future may also be allowed for implementation suo moto.
- h. Any issue not covered in the above recommendations, will be made operative on IIT, Delhi norms.



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



Subject:- Guidelines for Recognition of Service Associations in NITs regarding

The undersigned is directed to refer to this Ministry's OM no. even number (dated 1st May regarding Non-recognition of the so-called All India National Institute of Non-Teaching Federation and to say that this Federation has constituted in accordance with the approved guideline issued by the Government of India in this regard.

2. It is hereby clarified that the Government of India had issued the following notifications [Office Memorandum regarding recognition of Service Association and Recognition of Federation of Service Associations/Unions by the Central Government employees].

(i) Notification No. 2/10/80-IC'A (dated 5th November 1993 regarding the Central Civil Services (Recognition of Service Associations Rules, 1993).


(ii) Office Memorandum No.2/14/98-JCA dated 11th July regarding recognition of Federation or Service Associations/Unions formed by the Central Government employees. Copies enclosed.

The instructions contained in the above-mentioned two orders, in litatis mutandis, shall apply to the employees or NITs. Accordingly the existing Associations and the new Associations to be formed shall be regulated in accordance with these instructions.

3. It is also clarified that the existing Associations which have been duly recognized by the BOG of the Institute shall also have to furnish their membership list, MOA (Model Rules of the Association) and the list of elected officers/bearers as per the above guidelines to the Director of the Institute for placing it before the BOGs by September 2004 for appropriate consideration and recognition. In case any recognized Service Association does not follow the above guideline, that Association would stand automatically de-recognized. The list of Associations recognized by the BOGs of the Institute shall also be furnished to the Ministry.

4. Forming of the Federation of Service Associations, such of the recognized Associations in accordance with these guidelines shall require Ministry for accord necessary approval and recognition.

MINISTRY OF PERSONNEL, PUBLIC GRIEVANCES & PENSIONS
(Department of Personnel & Training),
Government of India

NOTIFICATION

New Delhi, (15th November, 1993)

G.S.R. 689(F).—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 and clause (5) of article 148 of the Constitution, after consultation with the Comptroller and Auditor General in relation to persons serving in the Indian Audit and Accounts Department, and in supersession of the Central Civil Services (Recognition of Service Associations) Rules, 1959 except as respects things done or omitted to be done before such supersession, the President hereby makes the following rules, namely:—

1. Short title and commencement: (1) These rules may be called the Central Civil Services (Recognition of Service Associations) Rules, 1993.

(2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. Definition.—In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires, —

- a. "Government" means the Central Government.
- b. "Government servant" means any person to whom the Central Civil Services (Conduct) Rules, 1964, apply.

3. Application : These rules shall apply to Service Associations of all Government servants including civilian Government servants in the Defence Services but shall not apply to industrial employees of the Ministry of Railways and workers employed in Defence Installations of Ministry of Defence for whom separate Rules or Recognition exist.

4. Service Associations already recognised : A Service Association or a Federation which has been recognised by the Government before commencement of these rules and in respect of which the recognition is subsisting at such commencement, shall continue to be so recognised for a period of one year from such commencement or till the date on which the recognition is withdrawn, whichever is earlier.

5. Conditions for recognition of Service Associations.—A Service Association which fulfils the following conditions may be recognised by the Government, namely:—

- a. An application for recognition of Service Association has been made to the Government containing Memorandum Association, Constitution, Bye-laws Association, Names of total membership and any other information as may be required by the Government,
- b. the Service Association has been formed primarily with the Object of promoting the common service Interest of its members,
- c. Membership of the Service Association has been restricted to a distinct category of Government servants having common interest, all such Government servants' being eligible for membership of the Service Association,
- d. The Association represents not more than 35 per cent of total number of a category of employees provided that where there is only one association which comprises more than 35 per cent membership, another Association with second highest membership, although less than 35 per cent may be recognized if it comprises at least 15 per cent membership:

(ii) The membership of the Government servant shall be automatic (continued on his ceasing to belong to such category:

- e. Government employees who are in service shall be members or office bearers of the Service Association
- f. The Service Association shall not be formed on the basis of any caste, tribe or religious denomination or of any group within or section such caste, tribe or religious denomination,
- g. the Executive of the Service Association has been appointed from amongst the members only; and
- h. The funds of the Service Association consist exclusively of subscriptions from members and grants, if any, made by the Government, are applied for the furtherance of the objects of the Service Association.

6. Conditions subject to which recognition is conferred Every Service Association recognized under these Rules shall comply with the following conditions, namely:-

- a. The Service Association shall not send any representation or deputations except in connection with a matter which is of common interest to members of the Service Association.
- b. the Service Association shall not espouse or support the cause of individual Government Servants relating to service matters,
- c. the Service Association shall not maintain any political fund or lend itself to the propagation of any party;

The views of any political party or a member of such party shall be submitted through proper channel and shall be addressed to the Secretary to the Government/In-charge of the Organisation or Head of the Department or office,

- c. a list of members and office bearers and tip-to-date copy of the rules and an audited statement or accounts of the Service Association shall be furnished to the Government annually through proper channel after the general annual meeting so as to reach the Government before the 1st day of July each year.
- f. The Service Association shall abide by, and comply with all the provisions of its constitution/by-laws;
- g. Any amendment in the constitution/by-laws or the Service Associations, and its recognition under these Rules, shall be made only with the prior approval of the Government;
- h. The Service Association shall not start or publish any periodical, magazine or bulletin without the previous approval of the Government.
- i. The Service Association shall cease to publish any periodical, magazine or bulletin, if directed by the Government to do so, on the ground that the publication thereof is pre-judicial to the Government, the Central Government, the Government or any State or any Government authority, or to good relations between the Government of India and the Government of India and the Government of a foreign state;
- j. The Service Association shall not address any communication to, or enter into correspondence with, a foreign authority except through the Government which shall have the right to withhold it,
- k. The Service Association shall not do any or assist in the doing of any act which, if done by a Government servant, would contravene any of the provisions of the Central Civil Services (Conduct) Rules, 1964 and its Communications addressed by the Service Association or by any office-bearer on its behalf to the Government or a Government authority shall not contain any disrespect or improper language.

7. Verification of membership: (1) The verification of membership for the purpose or recognition of a Service Association shall be done by the Government by the System in pay-rolls at such intervals and in such manner as the Government may prescribe.

(2) The Government may, at any time, order a special verification of membership if it is of the opinion, after an enquiry, that the Service Association does not have the membership required under sub-clause (i) or clause (d) of rule 5.

8. **Withdrawal of Recognition** . If, in the opinion of the Government, a Service Association recognized under these rules has failed to comply with any of the conditions set out in rule 5 or rule 6 or rule 7 the Government may after giving an opportunity to the Service Association to present its case, withdraw the recognition accorded to such Association.

9. **Relaxation** The Government may dispense with or relax the requirements or any of these rules to such extent and subject to such conditions as it may deem fit in regard to any Service Association.

Interpretation: If any question arises as to the interpretation of any of the provisions of these rules or if there is any dispute relating to the fulfilment of conditions

for recognition it shall be referred to the Government, whose decision thereon shall be final.

CONSTITUTION/MOA]RULES

1. NAME

The Sangh shall be known as the National Institute of Technolog Karamchali Sangh Kurukshetra (earlier known as Reöonal Ensneering College Karamchari Sangh, Kurukshetra). It was a registered society under the Societies **Registration** Act.

2Aims & Obiectives. subiect to Bye-laws/MOA]rules of the Institution.

- (a) To promote the social and cultural activities for the benefit of the non-teaching fraternity of Institute.
- (b) To promote and maintain the organisation of the Institute employees working in the Institute and foster solidarity miongst all persons employed in the Institute.
- (c) To promote and safeguard the economic, educational, cultural and social interests of Institute workmen and to make efforts for their general uplift.
- (d) To establish co-operative housing socieües and credits societies, Clubs, etc. for the benefit of Institute employees in general and to organise occasional lecturers and social gatherings with a view to developing an understanding of the advantages and facilities of organised life.
- (e) To safeguard and promote rights and privileges of college employees in all matters relating to conditions of sersice and to work for the ameliorafon of their **conomic**and social conditions.
- (f) To federate with or affiliate itself to any other AssociationÆederation in India having kindred aims and objectives with prior approval of the Govt. of India.

3. MEMBERSHIP AND FEES

Every member of the non-teaching of the National Institute of Technoloy shall be entitled to be member of this Sangh.

There shall be no patron, life member, or ex-officio member of the Sangh.

Every person intending to be member of the Sangh shall apply on a prescribed form and pay an admission fee Rs. 5/- and his monthly subscription @ Rs. 10/- per month. On the receipt of the form and fee he shall be enrolled as a member of the Sangh.

Any member whose subscription has fallen into arrears for more than three months shall cease to be a member and his/his name shall be removed from the rolls by the Executive Committee. Any member thus ceasing to be a member shall be entitled to re-enrolment on payment of the arrears.

The Executive Committee may raise special contribution from the members if the circumstances so warrant.

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All members shall pay their monthly subscription by 10th of the following month and pay special contribution in a manner of the Executive Committee.

4. POWERS & FUNCTIONS OF THE SANGH

The Sangh shall be competent to delegate any or all of its powers the power to dispose of real property to any authority or body working under this constitution. The Society through appropriate authority, shall have the power inter alia:-

- (a) To hold, own, or dispose of real and moveable property in trust or otherwise, received or for the prosecution of the objects above named, or any of them;
- (b) To accept donations or grants money or in kind trust or otherwise, for the objects above named or any of them provided that no donation which is expressly **intended** to promote any sectional activity or propaganda shall be accepted.
- (c) To initiate and/or co-operate in any such enterprise pertaining to the advancement of its members which in the opinion of the Executive Committee of the Sangh, appears appropriate and advisable;
- (d) To appoint auditors and fix remuneration if any;
- (e) To review, approve, and sanction any changes in the Constitution, subject to such procedure as may be provided for in that behalf by the Rules under the constitution.

5. AUTHORITIES OF THE SANGH

The General Body of the Sangh consisting of all the Members shall be the **supreme** authority of the Sangh.

Under the General Body there shall be President two Vice-President, a General Secretary, Joint Secretary, Secretary, Treasurer and an Executive Committee, with such powers and functions as provided under this constitution, or such as may be conferred upon them by the General Body from time to time.

6. THE GENERAL BODY

The General Body shall in conference or otherwise as and when necessary, but shall meet at least twice a year and hold its annual meeting some time during August, September with the prior of the General Body.

The General in his absence, Joint Secretary, shall not less than 10 days before each annual meeting of the General Body issue to each member a notice of the same. The agenda for this meeting shall be issued to the members not less than five days before the date fixed for the meeting and it shall include; (i) The annual Report,

(ii) The financial report, and the audited statement of accounts of the following year.

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(e) To take practical steps towards the carrying out of the various aims and objects of the Sangh specified in the constitution.

(f) To accept donation from my public authority, the private body or individual to promote the aims objects of the Sangh.

(g) To raise special funds for specific purposes when necessary.

8. FUNCTION OF THE OFFICE HOLDERS OF THE SANGH.

1 PRESIDENT

The President shall call the of the General Body as stated in Clause VI of this Constitution. He shall be responsible for all moneys which may from time to time be received into the funds of the Sangh and for duty banking them into the Sangh's account. He shall make payments towards all sanctioned expenditures against the respective vouchers. All bills vouchers etc. should be duly passed and signed by the General Secretary/Joint before payment is made. He shall be responsible on behalf of the Executive Committee of the Sangh, for the management of the moveable and immoveable properties and the funds of the Sangh.

He shall preside over all the meetings of the General Body and the Executive Committee.

It shall be his task to supervise the work of the Sangh,

11 THE VICE-PRESIDENT

The Vice-President shall perform the duties of the President in his absence.

111 THE GENERAL SECRETARY

The General Secretary shall look after the routing work of the Sangh and maintain its office. He shall call the meeting of the Executive Committee as stated in Clause-VL

He shall prepare the annual report of the Sangh and also submit it along with a financial statement to the Executive Committee for its consideration and submission to the General Body.

He shall prepare the Agenda for the meetings of the Executive ~~Committee~~ and the General Body, and keep minutes of their meetings.

He shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by the Executive Committee of the Sangh from time to time.

THE JOINT SECRETARY

He shall assist the General Secretary in conducting the work of the Sangh and shall be in charge of its social and cultural activities.

v

THE ~~PROPAGANDA~~ SECRETARY

He shall do propaganda for the welfare of the Sangh.

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The President, may in consultation with the Executive Committee, convene a special meeting of the General Body on a requisition in writing submitted by not less than 11 members of the Sangh within 7 days of the date of such a requisition.

7. THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE :

The day-to-day administration of the ~~Sangh~~ shall be entrusted to the Executive Committee, which shall consist of:

- (a) President of Sangh
- (b) The Vice-President (Two)
- (c) The General Secretary
- (d) The Joint Secretary
- (e) The Propaganda Secretary
- (f) The Treasurer
- (g) Nine members elected by the General Body.

The President of the Sangh will be the President of the Executive Committee.

The General Secretary of the Sangh shall be the General Secretary of the Executive Committee.

The office-holders of the Sangh and the members of the Executive Committee shall hold office till next annual meeting of the General Body, and shall be eligible for re-election to the same or any, other office, provided that no person shall be eligible for more than two consecutive terms, save by the two third votes of the members of the General Body present at the meeting.

The Executive Committee shall meet atleast one during the term.

It shall consider the annual report and the statement of the accounts of Sangh prepared by the General Secretary before submitting it to the General Body for adoption at the annual meeting.

It shall be the responsibility of the Executive Committee to the accounts of the Sangh audited within a fortnight of the close of the financial year. It shall place the audited accounts alongwith the Treasurer's report on the financial position of the Sangh, before the General Body at its annual meeting for adoption-

Subject to the provision of this constitution, the Executive Committee shall have powers:-

- (a) To formulate the policy of the Sangh in regard to all matter covered in aims and objectives.
- (b) To make rules regulating the financial administration of the Sangh and any matters connected with the governance of the Sangh provided that such rules are placed before the next meeting of the General Body for their approval.
- (c) To hold, own and manage the name of the Sangh's real or moveable property belonging to the Sangh.
- (d) To make arrangements for any conference of the Institute employees that may be convened by the Sangh.

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THE TREASURER

He shall be responsible for all moneys which may from time to time be received into the funds of the Sangh and for duly banking them into the Sangh's account. He shall make payments towards all sanctioned expenditures against the respective vouchers. All bills vouchers etc. should be duly passed and signed by the General Secretary/Joint Secretary before payment is made. He shall be responsible on behalf of the Sangh, for the management of the moveable and immovable properties and the funds of the Sangh.

9. ELECTIONS

The General Body of the Sangh shall elect the President and the **Vice-President** at its **annual** meeting by secret ballot.

The General Secretary, Joint Secretary, the Propaganda Secretary and the Treasurer of the Sangh shall be elected by the General Body, also by the secret ballot or shall be by show of hands the system of preferential voting.

10. MISCELLANEOUS

- (a) The Sangh can pass vote of non-confidence against its President by 2/3rd majority of the House.

(b) Vacancies:- Any vacancy caused in any of the office mentioned above including membership of the Executive Committee for the remainder of the term of office shall be fixed in by EC except that its choice of the President and the General Secretary shall be subject to the confirmation by the General Body at its next meetings.

(c) The financial Year:- Financial year of the Sangh shall be from 1st September to 31st August.

Pending the election of the new President, the Vice-President, the General Secretary, Joint Secretary, the Propaganda Secretary and the Treasurer and of the Executive Committee then existing Executive-Committee shall be responsible for the conduct of the elections, subject to the Constitution and the rules made there under, nothing done by the Executive Committee in good faith during this period shall be deemed invalid.

(d) The QUORUM- The quorum for the meeting of the Executive Committee shall be seven. For the meeting of the General Body, the Quorum shall be not less than one of the members on rolls at the time of the meeting. For a deferred meeting the General Body the Quorum shall be 1/5th of the members of the Sangh.

(e) Funds:- The General Funds of the Sangh shall comprise of donations, subscriptions, fees and special contribution raised by the Executive Committee and the profits and on deposits and investments and other receipts of the like nature.

(f) Membership Register:- Membership register of the Sangh shall be kept of all its members containing the following particulars:-

(FINANCIAL POWERS AND OPERATION OF THE ACCOUNTS

General Secretary upto Rs. 500/- at an single item (subject to the Approval of the President/Vice-President),

Executive above Rs. 5000/- with the approval of the Executive Committee.

The Account will be operated by any two of the following persons:-

1. Vice-President.
2. General Secretary.
3. Treasurer.

11. REVISION OF THE CONSTITUTION

Change in the Constitution may be made at any ordinary meeting or a special requisitioned meeting of the General Body. No change in the Constitution shall be processed except by at least ten members* signifying in writing their desire to do so.

Not less than Ten days notice shall be for the consideration of any such proposed change.

Change in the constitution can be made only by a Two thirds majority of the members present at the meeting.

12. AFFILIATION

Any resolution relating to the affiliation of the Sangh to any other organisation in India shall be adopted by 2/3rd majority of the members present at the meeting,

If for any reasons the Sangh is wound up its net assets be transferred to the Institute, and shall be utilised by the Institute authorities for the benefit of the Employees.

13. Instructions to be followed by the above Association after its recognition.

- (a) It will send representation or deputation relating to the common interest to members of the Sangh.
- (b) The Sangh will not espouse or support the cause of individual NIT Kunjshetra employee relating to service matters.
- (c) The Sangh shall not maintain any political fund or lend itself to the propagation of the views of any political party or a member of such party.
- (d) All representation of the Sangh shall be submitted through proper channel and shall be addressed to the Secretary to the Government/Head of the Organisation or Head of the Department or office.

- (e) The Sangh will submit a list of members and office bearers and up-to-date copy of the Nies and an audited statement of accounts of the Sangh to Government

armually through proper channel after the general annual meeting so as to reach the Government before the 1st day of July each year.

- (f) The Sangh shall abide and comply with all the provisions of its consütutionybyelaws.
- (g) Any amendment in the constitution/bye-laws of the Sangh after its recognition under these Rules, shall be made only with the prior approval of the Government.
- (h) The Sangh shall not start or publish any periodical, magazine or bulletin without the previous approval of the Government.
- (i) The Sangh shall cease to publish any peliodical, magaïne or bulletin, if directed by the Government to do so, on the gound that the publication thereof is prejudicial to the interests of the Cenü•al Government, the Government of any State or any Government authority, or to good relations between the Government of India and the Government of a state.
- G) The Sangh shall not address any communication to, or enter into corespondence with, a authority except through which the Government shall have the right to withhold it.
- (k) The Sang.h shall not do any act or assist in the doing of any act which, if done by a Government servant, would contravene any or the provisions of the Central Civil Sendces (Conduct) Rules, 1964 and
- (l) Communications addressed by the Sangh or by any office-bearer on its behalf to the Government or a Government authority shall not contain anv disrespectful or improper language.



NOTIFICATION

New Delhi, the 5th November, 1993

G.S.R. 689(E).- In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 3(1) and clause (5) of article 148 of the Constitution, after consultation with the Comptroller and Auditor General in relation to persons serving in the Indian Audit and Accounts Department, and in supersession of the all Civil Services (Recognition of Service Associations) Rules, 1959 except as respects things done or omitted to be done before such supersession, the President hereby makes the following rules, namely :

1. Short title and commencement: (1) These rules may be called the Central Civil Services (Recognition of Service Associations) Rules, 1993.

(2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. Definition • In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires, -

- a. "Government" means the Central Government.
- b. "Government servant" means any person to whom the Central Civil Services (Conduct) Rules, 1964, apply,

3. Application : These rules shall apply to Service Associations of all Government servants including civilian Government servants in the Defence Services but shall not apply to industrial employees or the Ministry of Railways and workers employed in Defence Installations or Ministry of Defence for whom separate Rules or Recognition exist.

4. Service Associations already recognised : A Service Association or a Federation which has been recognised by the Government before the commencement of these rules and in respect of which the recognition is subsisting at such commencement, shall continue to be so recognised for a period of one year from such commencement or till the date on which the recognition is withdrawn, whichever is earlier.

5. Conditions for recognition of Service Association : A Service Association which fulfills the following conditions may be recognised by the Government, namely :-

- a. An application for recognition of Service Association has been made to the Government containing Memorandum or Association, Constitution, Bye-laws of the Association, Names of Office-bearers, total membership and any other information as may be required by the Government,
- b. The Service Association has been formed primarily with the object of promoting the common interest of its members,
- c. Membership of the Service Association has been restricted to a distinct category of Government servants having common interest
(Government servants' being eligible for membership of the Service

Association;

- d. (i) The Association represents minimum 35 per cent of total number a category of employees provided that where there is only one Association which commands more than 35 per cent membership, another Association with second highest membership. Although less than 35 per cent may be recognised if it commands at least 15 per cent membership;

(ii) The membership of the Government servant shall be automatic all v (liquidation) his ceasing to belong to such category;

- e. Government employees who are in service shall be members of the Service Association;
- f. The Service Association shall not be formed to represent the interests, or on the basis, or any caste, tribe or religious denomination or any group within or section of such caste, tribe or religious denomination;
- g. The Executive of the Service Association has been appointed from amongst the members only and
- h. The funds of the Service Association consist exclusively of subscriptions from members and grants, if any, made by the Government, and are applied only for the furtherance of the objects of the Service Association.

6. Conditions subject to which recognition is continued Every

1 . NAME 'l he Association will be known as : National Institute of Technology, KurukBhetra Teachers' Agsociation. sli01t name will be 'Association' or 'NITK TA'.

TERMINOLOGY:- (a) House:- The General body, where all the Teaching staff members sit together under the auspices of this Association be known as House. (b) Members:- The member(s) of the teaching staff who is(are) on roll of (his Association) will be known as member(s).

(c) Teaching staff :- Director, Professors, Workshop Supdt., Assistant Prof., Lecturer, Associate Lecturer, Librarian, Asstt. Librarian, Foreman-Workshop and Sports Officers will constitute the teaching staff.

3. Membership:- (a) All members of the teaching staff of the National Institute of Technology, Kanskshetra (including those who may be deputed out of relation by the Society) will become automatically the members of the Association.
(b) Any member of the teaching staff will become automatically the member of the Association and he will pay his subscription within two months of his joining the Society.
4. Subscription: (a) The annual subscription for the member towards this Association be Rs. only.
(b) The Association with the approval of the House may realize the subscription over and above this subscription of Rs. from the members if at certain stage it becomes necessary.
5. Aims:- The aims of the Association will be to associate with, promote and discharge any activity, which may be in the best interest of the members, Institute, students and Alumni, in the constitutional manner. This may be of social, academic and general nature but of common interest.
6. Office Bearers :- (a) The following will be the office bearers of the Association : (i) President
(ii) Vice-President
(iii) Secretary
(iv) Joint Secretary-cum-Treasurer.
(b) All the above posts shall be filled in by election by simple majority vote.
(c) The elected office bearers shall hold office for one year only. They shall however be eligible for re-election.
(d) Normally fresh elections shall be held every year in the month of August.
7. There will also be an executive committee of eleven members in all as follows : -
 - a) President of the Association (Ex-officio Chairman of E.C.),
 - b) Vice-President of the Association (Ex-officio Vice-Chairman of E.C.),
 - c) Secretary of the Association (Ex-officio Secretary of E.C.),
 - d) Joint Secretary cum-treasurer of the Association (Ex-officio Joint Secretary of
 - e) Seven members elected by the House by simple majority vote. The elected members shall be governed by the same conditions as laid down for the office bearers of the Association.
 - f) All the office bearers of the previous year will be ex-officio E.C. members.
 - g) In addition, two senior Professors will be nominated as E.C. members by the President on the recommendation of E.C.
8. Duties:- (a) President:
 - (i) He will preside over all the meetings of the Association.
 - (ii) He will regulate the business of the House from time to time.
 - (iii) He may call the meeting of the House, when he feels it to be necessary in the interest of the Association.

(b) Vice President:

- (i) In the absence of the President he will assume all powers and duties of the President.
- (ii) He will help the President in organizing and proper functioning of the Association.

(c) Secretary:

- (i) He shall call the meeting of the House, within the framework of the constitution and in consultation with President.
- (ii) He shall record the proceedings of the meetings of the House,
- (iii) He shall conduct the correspondence relating to the Association,
- (iv) He shall prepare the agenda of every meeting and will circulate it to the members of the House before it is convened.
- (v) The Secretary will frame annual budget of the Association and place it before the House in its first or second meetings of the year for its approval,
- (vi) He will circulate the proceedings of the House to its members along with the agenda of the next meeting.

(d) Joint Secretary-cum-Treasurer:

- (i) He shall assume all the duties and powers, of the Secretary in his absence,
- (ii) He shall collect the subscription from the members of the Association and keep a proper record for the same, subject to auditing,
- (iii) He shall submit audited report on the financial aspect of the Association in the first meeting of the House in the coming year.

(e) Executive Committee: The day-to-day affairs of the Association will be carried out by the Executive Committee. It

- (i) will approve the budget of the Association before it is placed before the general body meeting.
- (ii) will take necessary decision on any matter in case of emergency or matter of routine nature and report the decision to the House in its next meeting.
- (iii) will pursue and take necessary steps for the implementation of the decisions of the House.
- (iv) may discuss preliminarily the items to be included in the agenda of the general body meeting or any other important matter and report the opinion to the House.
- (v) The presence of six will be the Quorum of the executive committee meeting.
- (vi) The agenda of the executive committee will be decided by the Secretary in consultation with President/ Vice-President.

9. Financial Year:- Academic year of the institution shall be the financial year of the Association.

10. Expenditure:- (i) The Joint Secretary will operate the accounts of the Association in State Bank of India, NIT, Kurukh in the name of Association. (ii) The Secretary can incur expenditure upto Rs. 250/- at any time in connection with the work of the Association. However, for expenditure exceeding Rs. 250/- the sanction of House is necessary. (iii) The Secretary can keep with him an imprest upto Rs. 500/- for contingent expenses. (iv) All the payments will be made by the treasurer.

11. Auditors:- (i) The House will appoint two members of the House as auditors, who will audit the accounts of the Association. (ii) The appointment of the auditors will be held annually in the last meeting of the House in that particular year.

12. Removal from the office:- (a) Any of the elected office bearers can be removed from the office by 2/3 majority vote in the meeting of the House. A fresh election shall be held in the same meeting. (b) If any of the office bearers of the Association submits resignation the same shall be put before the House for its acceptance. The election for the same post will be held in the same meeting.
13. Code of conduct for the members:- (i) All the members of the Association will maintain the dignity of the House. (ii) No member of the House will indulge in any such activity, which may bring bad name to the Association, its members or to the society.
14. Withdrawal of membership:- A member shall cease to be a member of the Association if (i) He fails to pay his subscription when due. (ii) He resigns in **writing** and the resignation is accepted in the next meeting of the House. (iii) He ceases to be the member of the teaching staff of the National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra. (iv) He is found to disobey the code of conduct of the Association. His decision is to be approved by the House. But however the House can reduce the punishment upto disqualifying the member for specified number of meetings or other appropriate punishment.
15. Miscellaneous any :- (i) To convene the meeting of the House, the Secretary either on his own or on the direction of President will circulate a notice with agenda among the members at least three days before the proposed date of meeting, provided further that in case of an emergency the meeting can be convened at a short notice also. (ii) Ordinarily there will be two meetings of the House in a semester. (iii) The meeting of the House can also be convened as a result of a written request of at least 1/5 of the total members of the Association within ten days of such a request. (iv) A minimum number of 1/5 of the total strength of the Association shall be required for **holding** meeting of the House. (v) Any resolution will be deemed to have been passed by the House if it is voted for at least by a majority vote within from the members present in the meeting. (vi) Any resolution which is to be moved in the House for discussion will be sent to the Secretary at least 10 days in advance. However, the resolution should bear the names of the members, who propose and second the resolution. (vii) The voting in the House for a particular matter be by raising hands, until and unless the House proposes otherwise. (viii) The power for adjournment of the House, while it is still transacting its business, lies with the House. All such proposals should come from at least 2 majority of the House. However, if continuous pandemonium exists in a meeting, the President can adjourn the House for a certain period. (ix) In case a resolution is not being passed due to the reason of equal votes on either side, the President will a casting vote over and above the vote exercised by him as a member of the Association. (x) In case of any other matter, not covered under these bye-laws, the same should be referred to the House for decision. (xi) In case the President and Vice-President are not present, the Chairman may be elected with in from the members who are present in the meeting.
16. Amendments:- Any amendments to the constitution can take place through 2/3 majority vote of the House.
17. Executive Committee of the Association should take a proper action for the Registration and recognition of the Association.
18. The income and property of the Association shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the objects of the Association as set forth in the columns 1-3 above and


no portion thereof shall be paid or transferred, directly or indirectly, by way of dividend, bonus or otherwise by way of profit to the members of the Association.

19. No member of the governing body of the Association shall be appointed to any salaried office of the Association or any office of the paid by fee, that no remuneration shall be given to the Association to any member of the such governing body except repayment of out of pocket expenses and interest on money lent or rent for premises demised to the Association.
20. The Association, by its constitution is required to apply its profit, if any, or other income in promoting its objects.
21. If upon the winding up or dissolution of the Association there remains after satisfaction of all its debts & liabilities, any property whatsoever, the same shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Association, but shall be given or transferred to some other Institution objects similar to the objects of the Association to be determined by the members of the Association at or before the time of dissolution,

22. INSTRUCTION TO BE FOLLOWED BY THE ABOVE ASSOCIATION AFTER ITS RECOGNITION

- (R) It will send representation or deputation relating to the common interest to members of the Association.

- (c) The Association shall not maintain any political fund or lend itself to the propagation of the views of any political party or a member of such party.

- (d) All representation of the Association shall be submitted through proper channel and shall be addressed to the Secretary to the Government/Head of the Organisation or Head of the Department or office.
- (e) The Association will submit a list of members and office bearers and up-to-date copy of the rules and an audited statement of accounts of the Association to Government annually through proper channel after the general annual meeting so as to reach the Government before the 1st day of July each year.
- (f) The Association shall abide and comply with all the provisions of its constitution/laws.



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Mr. G. Lal filed the following two cases with the claims mentioned against each:

1. CWP No. of 2000 - The petitioner Mr. G. Lal approached the High Court with a prayer to revise his pay scale of Rs. 1000-420-18300 with Pay fixation of Rs. 14940/- w.e.f. 1.1.1995 (equal par with other Assistant Professors of Regional Engineering College, Kurukshetra). He also claimed arrears on account of pay revision which were wrongly denied to him along with interest @ 18 percent p.a. from 1.12.1999 asserting that similarly situated Assistant Professors of REC, Kurukshetra were paid the same pay. HC also sought directions to confirm him as Assistant Professor by pointing reliance on Bye-law 11 of the Bye-laws framed by Regional Engineering College, Kurukshetra Society as he had already completed three years period probation and accordingly to include his name at the appropriate place in the interdepartmental seniority list of the College.
2. CWP No. 4579 of 2002 - The petitioner Mr. G. Lal filed this petition on 28.2.2002 when one month's notice was issued to him for dispensing with his services in the Entrepreneurship Development Cell w.e.f. 31.3.2002. A prayer has also been made for quashing the aforesaid notice with all consequential benefits. A further prayer has also been made for quashing the decision taken by the BOG on agenda item no. 94.26 in its meeting held on 19.11.2001. He also prayed for a direction to the Institute to merge ED Cell with the College in terms of the guidelines issued by the DST, New Delhi. A Civil Misc. (CM) No. 18495 of 2002 was also filed in the abovesaid CWP No. 4579/2002 for retaining the CC-I house, allotted to him earlier by the Institute. As his services were dispensed with, hence he was asked to vacate the House. The Hon'ble Court pleased to pass an order on 12.7.2002 that he will not be evicted from the hostel accommodation in the Engineering College

Campus.

After hearing the final arguments of both the parties, the Hon'ble Judge Mr. M. M. Kumar, Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandigarh announced the following judgement on 2nd April, 2004:

In view of the discussion, both the writ Petitions are allowed. The petitioner is held entitled to the revised pay scale w.e.f. 1.1.1995 for the purposes of pay fixation in the

pay scale of Rs. 12000-18300 and] the payment be made
w.e.f, 1.12.1999 as has been given to the Assistant
Professors working in the Repinnal Engineering College
Kurukshetra. The order dated 28.2.2002 and the decision of the
Board of Directors (dated 10.11.01 on item no 0/1 are quashed
and a direction is to the respondent to pay the petitioner the
Assistant Professor in Electrical Engineering'. The petitioner
shall
entitled to costs of the writ petition is Rs. 10,000/- in each
petition. (to be paid within a period of two months from the date
a copy of the order is received by the respondents).

Against the above orders of the Hon'ble Single Judge, the
two LAs have been filed before the DB (District Bench) of the
Court, Chandigarh on 27.5.2004. In staying the execution of
the orders of the Single Judge and also for the review of the case. It is
also mentioned here, that both the LAs were dismissed-in-default
due to non-appearance of the petitioner, but a standing counsel has filed an application for restoration of
LPA which fixed for 19.9.2004, but the same were not taken up for hearing on
18.9.2004 and the case is now fixed 24.9.2004.

Meanwhile, Mr. G. Lal has filed a Civil Original Contempt
Petition No 1 for implementation of the aforesaid orders of Hon'ble Judge of 9.4.2004 as no
has been granted in the Institution against the

aforesaid order. The Contempt Petition is fixed for 1.11.2004 for appearance in
person or through counsel.

The Bench may consider and decide.
