

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Item 9.1 To note assumption of charge as Director, National Institute of Technology (Deemed University) Kurukshetra by Dr.Manabendra Nath Bandyopadhyay, Professor, Electrical Engineering Department, National Institute of Technology, Hamirpur & ratify the contract of service.

The Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Secondary and Higher Education, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi vide DO letter No. F.20-6/2005-TS-111 dated 10.10.2005 informed that the name of Dr. Manabendra Nath Bandyopadhyay, has been approved for appointment as Director of National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra for a period of five years with effect from the date he takes over the charge in the grade ofRs. 18400-500-22400 (minimum to be fixed at Rs. 19,400/-) per month in accordance with the terms and conditions laid down in the Memorandum of Association of NIT, Kurukshetra.

In view of the above directions, Dr. Manabendra Nath Bandyopadhyay has assumed the charge as Director of National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra with effect from 1.11.2005

A copy of the agreement of contract of service entered into by the Hon'ble Chairman, Board of Governors N.I.T. Kurukshetra and Dr. Manabendra Nath Bandyopadhyay is given in Appendix-I pages 2 to 6.

The Board may note the assumption of charge by Dr M N Bandyopadhyay as the Director w.e.f. 1.11.2005 and ratify the contract of service signed by Dr. Bandyopadhyay and the Hon'ble Chairman, BOG.

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CONTRACT OF SERVICE

An **agreement** for %rvice made this date, the 2nd November, two thousand and five between Dr, Manabendra Nath Bandyopadhyay . (thereinafter called the appointee) of the one part and the National Insütute of Technolow, Kurukshetra (hereinafter-called the Insütute).

WHEREAS in terms of Memorandum of Association of National Insütute of Technolow (heœinafter called the MOA), the Government of India' has been pleased to approve the appointment of the appointee as the Director

Item: 9.2 To note the action taken by the Director in nominating one Professor and one Assistant Professor of NIT Kurukshetra to serve on its Board of Governors.

The Board of Governors of the Institute in its 86th meeting held on 22.1.1996 authorised the Principal to nominate faculty members on the Board of Governors, in anticipation of the approval of the Chairman, Board of Governors as per College Bye-Laws/Rules. The matter may be reported to the Board of Governors in its

next meeting for confirmation.

As per new Memorandum of Association and Rules of the National Institute of Technology (Deemed University), Kurukshetra, the Board of Governors of the Institute shall include one Professor and one Assistant Professor of the Institute by rotation . The faculty members are nominated on the basis of seniority for a period of one year.

One year term of the present two faculty members, Dr. RK. Bansal, Professor in Civil Engineering Department and Dr. R.C. Bhattacharje, Assistant Professor, in Civil Engineering Department expired on 31.8.2005.

Now the following Professor and Assistant Professor have become eligible, in turn, on the basis of seniority for nomination to serve as members on the Board:

- 1. Dr. T.K. Garg, Prorfessor, Mechanical Engineering Department, National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra.
- 2. Dr. ML. Garg, , Assistant Professor, Mathematics Department, National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra.

Accordingly, Dr. T.K. Garg, Professor and Dr. M.L. Garg, , Assistant Professor, have been nominated to act as members on the BOG for a period of one year w.e.f. 1.9.2005 to 31.8.2006.

The Board of Governors may note.

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Item 9. 3 To confirm the Minutes of the 8th meeting of The Board of Governors held on 23.7.2005.

The Minutes of the 8th meeting of the Board of Governors held on 23.7.2005 were circulated to all the members of the Board vide our office letter No.NITK/BOG-8th/4991-97 and Endst. No. NITK-BOG-8th/4998-5004 for their kind perusal and comments, if any.

The Board's decision recorded on Item 8.9 (prosecuting Shri Sareshth Ahuja and Shri Vikas Mittal, Lecturers (under suspension) in Electronics and Communication Engineering Departments was as under:

"The Board discussed the matter in details. The Board was, Prima-facie, of the opinion that Shri Vikas Mittal, Lecturer (under suspension) in ECE Department was not directly involved in the said corruption case. Hence the Board did not accord sanction for prosecuting him by the police authorities. However, the Board permitated the police authorities to prosecute Shri Saareshtha Ahuja, Lecturer (under suspension), ECE Dept. u/s 7.13(i), 49, Anti Corruption Act — 1988".

The Hon 'ble Chairman, Board of Governors vide his letter dated 11.8.2005 addressed to all members of the Board sent his comments .aŠ under:

"My suggestion is that the Director of NIT Kurukshetra be directed to obtain a legal opinion from the Institute's Standing Counsel before the Board takes a considered decision in this case. The court has already granted bail to both accused persons. The question of granting permission for prosecution to the police can then be again discussed by the Board in its next meeting or by circulating the contents of the legal suggestions from our Counsel".

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The Institute received written comments from some members of the Board with reference to Agenda Item No. 8.9 confirming that legal opinion of the institute counsel may be obtained and the item be deferred for the time being. The legal opinion given by the Institute counsel is reproduced as under:

"I have gone through the record and of opinion that police after investigation has prepared challan against both S/Sh Sareshtha Ahuja and Vikas Mittal. It is the satisfaction of appointing/punishing Authority only u/s 19 of P.C. Act for according sanction for prosecution because no court can take cognizance without the previous sanction of competent authority. In case the authority is not satisfied with the investigation/allegation then sanction can be refused giving detailed reasons differing with the police investigation showing that employees were not involved."

In view of the above, Agenda Item 8.9 stands deferred. The matter is again being placed before the Board in its present meeting vide Agenda Item No. 9. 2¹4.

The Board of Governors may confirm the minutes of its 8th meeting held on 23.7.2005(except Agenda Item 8.9) as circulated to the members as given in Appendix-II pages 10 to 27.

Before taking up the agenda, Dr. N.P. Mehta, Director and Member Secretary welcomed the Hon 'ble Chairman, Board of Governors and other members of the Board.

The Board took the following decisions:-

8.2

8.1 To note the nomination of Shri C.B. Mathur as Chairman, Board of Governors, N.I.T. Kurukshetra.

The Board noted the nomination of Sh. C.B.Mathur as Chairman, Board of Governors, NIT, Kurukshetra for a period of five years w.e.f. 21.03.2005.

To confirm the minutes of the 7th meeting of the Board of Governors held on

19.2.2005.

The Board confirmed the minutes of its 7th meeting held on 19.2.2005.

8.3 To note the actions taken on the minutes of the $7^{\, th}$ meeting of the Board of Governors of NIT Kurukshetra, held on 19.2.2005

The Board noted the actions taken on the minutes of its 7th meeting held on 19.2.2005 as explained in the agenda item 8.3.

8.4 To consider deputation of Dr. MK Soni, Professor in Electrical Engineering Department of the Institute as Director-Principal, C.R.S.C.E. Murthal beyond 15.6.2005 and retention of institute house on normal rent.

The Board allowed deputation to Dr. M.K. Soni, Professor in Electrical Engineering Department of the Institute as Director-Principal, CRSCE, Murthal upto 30.9.2005 as requested by the State Government of Haryana in public interest.

The Board on the request of Commissioner and Secretary to Government Haryana

Technical Education Department made vide DO. No. 94/CTE/2005 dated 8th July, 2005 allowed Dr. Soni to retain his house in the Institute on normal rent during the extended period of deputation as a special case not to be cited as precedent.

8.5 To consider final settlement of Dr. Vinay Kumar, Ex- Professor in Department of Mechanical Engineering of the Institute.

The Board considered outstanding penal rent against Dr. Vinay Kumar, Ex Professor of the Mechanical Engineering Department along with other cases of outstanding penal rent as per list appended with the agenda item 8.5.

The Board noted that a decision has already been taken by the Board in its 7th meeting held on 19.2.2005 vide item no. 7.18 to recover penal rent from Dr. Vinay Kumar for unauthorizedly retaining the Institute accommodation in accordance with the decision of its 3rd meeting held on 6.10.2003 which comes to Rs. 18,06,857/-.

After detailed discussion, the Board reviewed its earlier decision regarding penal rent to be charged from Dr. Vinay Kumar and decided as under:-

- i) The penal rent be charged from Dr. Vinay Kumar for unauthorized occupation of the Institute accommodation @ equivalent to market rent for the period he was required to pay 100% of basic pay and double the market rent for the period he was required to pay 200% of basic pay.
- ii)The Board further noted that Dr. Vinay Kumar had unauthorizedly kept the house locked for a long time and damage was done to the property for which the Institute has spent around R.s. 30,000/- on its renovation. The Board decided that the amount spent by the Institute for renovation may also be recovered from Dr. Vinay Kumar.
- iii) The Board further decided that other cases of outstanding penal rent, as mentioned in Appendix-VI] to item 8.5, be also disposed off on the same pattern as mentioned in para (i) above as one time measure.
- 8.6 To note the decision taken by the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court at Chandigarh in LPA filed by the Institute against Shri Gurbachan Lai, ExSr. Project Leader of the EDC.

The Board noted the decision taken by the Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court at Chandigarh in the LPA filed by the Institute against Sh. Gurbachan Lal, Ex Sr. Project Leader of the Entrepreneurship Development Cell.

8.7 To consider the promotion of Mrs. Manjula Sharma, Assistant Professor in Humanities Department under Career Advancement Scheme and acquiring Ph.D. before retirement.

The Board observed as under:-

- The Lecturers (Senior Scale/Selection Grade) who do not have Ph.D. Degree are required to obtain Ph.D. degree within a period of seven years from the date of their promotion to the post of Asstt. Professor under Career Advancement Scheme.
- ii) Mrs. Manjula Sharma, Lecturer (Senior Scale), Humanities Department who was promoted as Asstt. Professor in October, 2004 under CAS was required to obtain Ph.D. degree before her retirement i.e. 31.12.2007 failing which she would abide by the decision of the Board.
- iii) Mrs. Manjula Sharma does not fulfil eligibility conditions for doing Ph.D. and she has not so far registered herself as a Ph.D. scholar.
- iv) It was practically impossible for her to acquire Ph.D. degree before her retirement.

The Board, therefore, decided that Mrs. Manjula Sharma be reverted from the post of Asstt. Professor and she be designated as Lecturer (Selection Grade) in the pay scale of Rs. 12,000-420-18300.

8.8 To consider follow up action on the decision of the Board regarding final settlement of Miss Indu Nalwa, Ex-Lecturer in Humanities Department of the Institute.

The Board decided that calculations of the recovery in respect of Miss Indu Nalwa, Ex Lecturer, Humanities Department of the Institute be made as per legal advice received from Sh. A.S.Virk, Institute's standing counsel in the Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court at Chandigarh and accordingly a show cause notice for making the recovery be issued to her.

The Board authorized the Chaiman of the Board to take final decision in the matter relating to the recovery and the final settlement of Miss Indu Nalw.

8.9 To consider sanction for prosecuting Sh. Sareshth Ahuja and Sh. Vikas Mittal, both Lecturers (under suspension) in Electronics & Communication Engineering Department.

The Board discussed the matter in details. The Board was, prima-facie, of the opinion that Sh. Vikas Mittal, Lecturer (under suspension), ECE Deptt. was not directly involved in the said coruption case. Hence the Board did not accord sanction for prosecuting him by the police authorities. However, the Board permitted the police authorities to prosecute Sh. Sareshtha Ahuja, Lecturer(under suspension), ECE Deptt. u/s 7.13(i), 49, Anti Corruption Act-1988.

8.10 To consider marking attendance during suspension period by the employees of the Institute.

The Board decided that there was no necessity to mark attendance by teaching and non-teaching employees of the Institute under suspension. However, they are required to seek proper prior permission of the competent authority for leaving station/headquarter.

8.11 To consider recommendations of the Screening Committees relating to screening of the Non-Teaching staff (**Group-I,II,III** and IV) at the age of 58 years.

On the basis of recommendations made by the Screening Committees, the Board allowed extension to the non-teaching employees of the Institute beyond 58 years upto the age of 60 years as per details furnished in the agenda item 8.11.

The Board, however, took a lenient view in respect of Sh. Gurmukh Singh, Chowkidar and allowed him to complete his term in the Institute service till 60 years of age.

8.12 To consider reconstitution of Selection Committee for direct recruitment of faculty and including for granting financial upgradation under C.A.S.

The Board considered the Nfl-1RD letter No. F.20-l/2003-TS-111 dated 9.6.2005 and decided that constitution of Selection Committee for direct recruitment of faculty as well as promotion] financial upgradation under CAS be as under from the decision of the Board:-

- i) Director of the NIT Chairman. ii) One nominee of UGC Member iii) One nominee of AICTE Member iv) Two experts to be nominated by the Board of Governors Members
- v) One expert nominee of the Senate. Member vi) Head of the Department concerned. Member.

(For the post for which selection/promotion is being made is at least one step lower than the one occupied by the Head/Chairperson of the Department).

8.13 To consider the rationalization of non-teaching posts in view of the decrease in the teaching posts.

The Board decided that rationalization of the non-teaching posts be made considering the latest faculty strength of the Institute.

The Board further decided that the non-teaching posts other than the teaching supporting and secretarial/administrative posts can be outsourced by the Institute.

8.14 To fill up three posts of lecturers on contract basis against suspended teachers.

The Board decided that three Lecturers be engaged on contract basis against three suspended Lecturers for the odd semester (2005-06 Academic Session) or till their suspension is revoked whichever is earlier out of Student Fund with no liability on the Government of India.

8.15 To consider and ratify minutes of the 5th meeting of the Finance Committee, National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra, held on 22.6.2005.

The Board approved minutes of the 5th meeting of the Finance Committee, National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra, held on 22.62005 as per details furnished in the agenda item 8.15.

8.16 To note action taken by the Institute in granting interest free Festival Advance during the financial year 2005-06 to class Ill and IV employees of the Institute.

The Board noted the action taken by the Institute in granting interest free Festival Advance during the financial year 2005-06 to class Ill and IV employees of the Institute.



8.17 To note the action taken by the Chairman, Board of Governors in deciding medical reimbursement claim of Dr NP Mehta, Professor Mechanical Engineering Department — now Director of the Institute.

(As per conventions, Dr. NP Mehta, Director & Member Secretary BOG, left the meeting when this item came up for discussion).

The Board discussed the matter regarding medical reimbursement claim of Dr. N,P. Mehta at length and decided that as a special case permission of the NMR-I) be obtained for making reimbursement of actual expenditure incurred by Dr. Mehta on his medical treatment taken from the Fortis Heart Institute, Mohali in emergent condition.

8.18 To ratify the action taken by the Chairman, BOG in allowing full reimbursement of telephone bill of Dr NP Mehta, Director- Incharge, NIT Kurukshetra.

The Board also decided that the non-plan funds required for attending International Conferences by the faculty be continued to be provided under relevant Head of Account in the normal Budget of the Institute when the funds under the TEQIP are exhausted.

Degree in September, 1999 and has also obtained Ph.D. Degree in November, 2003 and hence he possesses the requisite qualification and experience for the purpose of grant of said scale of Rs.12,000-420-18,300.

12,000-420-18,300 (that of Asstt. Professor) subject to screening by the Committee constituted for the purpose of direct recruitment of teachers as well as Career Advancement Scheme.

"My suggestion is that the Director of MT Kurukshefra be directed to obtain a legal opinion from the Institute's Standing Counsel before the Board takes a considered

decision in this case. The court has already granted bail to both accused persons. The question of granting permission for prosecution to the police can then be again discussed by the Board in its next meeting or by circulating the contents of the legal suggestions from our Counsel"

In response to the above said suggestion of the Chairman sent to the members of the Board, we have received vu•itten comments from some members of the Board with reference to Agenda Item No. 8.9. confirming that legal opinion of the institute counsel may be obtained and the item be deferred for the time being.

The legal opinion of the institute counsel given vide his note dated 18.8.2005 on the case file is reproduced as under:

"I have gone through the record and of opinion that police after investigation has prepared challan against both S/Sh Sareshtha Ahuja and Vikas Mittal. It is the satisfaction of appointing/punishing authority only u/s 19 of P.C. Act for according sanction for prosecution because no court can take cognizance without the previous sanction of competent authority. In case the authority is not satisfied with the investigation/allegation then sanction can be refused giving detailed reasons differing with the police investigation showing that employees were not involved."

Accordingly no follow up action has been taken on the decision of the Board under agenda item No. 8.9 of the 8th meeting of the Board held on 23.7.2005. and the matter stands deferred. The matter along with legal opinion of the Institute Counsel will be placed before the Board in its nekt meeting.

The Quality **Improvement** Programme was launched by the Govt. of India, Mini8üy of Human Resource Development, Depainent of Education in May 1988 for **improving** the method and quality of teaching in Enöneering/Technical Institutions. Accordingly the Board of Governors formulated some NIes for the Quality Improvement Programme in its 73rd meeting held on 26.5.1989 as under:-

1. "Teachers may be sponsored under the Quaüty Improvement Progamme-One for M. Tech. md one for Ph.D from each Engneering Depaunent at a Such a sponsored teacher should be a permanent employee of the College and should have put in a minimum of 3 yean service in the Conege for **being** sponsored for M.Tech. and 5 yean senice in the College for being spongot&d for Ph.D.

Teachers would be sponsored as per needs of the

Departiment/College for M.Tech./Ph.D (i) in those areas only where facilities do not exist in the College or (ii) in the al*as of new **emerging**technologes.

The selection will be made by the Committee comptisi.ng the Principal md the Chairman, of Governors.

- 2. Only one teacher at a ime from each Ensneering Depalunent may be permitted for Study Leave according to the Study Leave Rules.
- 3. Exü•aordmary Leave would be as per rules of the College to a person or persons provided the total number of teachers on Quality Impromnent Progamme/Study Leave/Exfraordi.naty Leave/Sabbaücal Leave at a üme are not more thm 10% of the sancüoned in each Enuneering Department.
- 4. In the Depañnents of Chemõ, Physics, **Mathematics**, Humaniües and Trúing & Placement not more than 10% of the sanctioned st•ength taken together at a fitne shall be sponsored for QIP or allowed Study Isave/EOWSabbatical Leave".

The above rules were also **considered** by Board in its 7æ meeüng 29.6.1990. In addition to the above rules ±eady approved, töllowing clause was also incorporated by the Board on 29.6.1990•. -

"Provided further that where it is required to allow more than 10% Qf the sanctioned strength in an Engineering Department jor purposes of Quality Improvement by acquisition higher degree the cases be put up to the Chairman, Standing Administrative and Academic Committee, jor consideration and approval.'

The Finance Depaunent, Govt. of Hayma in October, 2001 decided that "the practice of nominatiig/permjtting jn sen^rice Govt. employees tor higher studies on full pay **is**discontinued forthwith. However, the **employees** who have already been pemitted this facility would be allowed to complete their higher studies in accordance with the terms & conditions provided in the sanction letter." Accordingly the of the faculty members läider the QIP was discontinued as per insüucüons of the State Govt. mentioned above.

Prior to 266.2002 the Institute was a joint enterprise fimded by the State Govt. and the Central Govt. After having grauing of deemed Imiversity, it is tilliy by the Govt. from the **financial** 2003-04. The rules for sponsormg faculty tmder Quahty Improvement were not reviewed. 'The faculty members of the Institute are requesting and again for restoration of the QIP scheme. An item for the same was placed before

The Chainnan, Mechanical Eng. Deptt has förwarded his applicaüon. Dr. N.P. Mehta joined the services of this InsÜtute on 10.7.1967. In this way, he has completed more than 38 years service in this Insütute. It is further stated that Dr. Mehta will be retiring from the Insütute's services after supermuaüon on 31.5.2006.

As per old Bye-Laws and as per BOG deciú)n in their meeung held on 11.05.1999 the same is reproduced below.

"An employee will be allowed one year's **Extraordinary** Leave for every completed five years service subject to a maximum of three years **Extraordinary** Leave during the entire senice with the College. However, in case employee is appointed to a presügous position like Vice-Chancellor, his EOL may be extended to a maximum of five years.

- (a) An employee will be allowed deputation to a maximum period of the years during his entire service with the College. The deputation will only be allowed if it is in the interest of the College, the State Government or Govt. of India.
- (b) The total absence of an employee from the College due to EOL or EOL plus deputation not be allowed to exceed five under my **circums**during the entire service of the employees".

'The relevant Government of India/Il'I', Delhi rule reads as under: -

- (1) Extraordinary leave shall always be without leave sala:y and may be ganted when no other Knd of leave is admissible or when other leave being admissible, the member of the staff concerned specifically applied in writing for the gant of leave.
- (2) The period of leaxæ shall not count for incrvment except when such leave is due to sickness on medical certificate or for pursuing higher studies, provided

- that in case of any doubt whether the **extraordinary**leave taken was for pursuing higher stu&s or not, the decision of the Competent Authority shall be final.
- (3) (a) Except in the case of a permanent employee, the duration of **extraordinary** leave on any one occasion shall not exceed the f0110S'ing limit:
- (1) Three months
- (II) Six months, in case of employee who has completed three years continuous service on the date of expiry of the leave admissible to him under the rules and his request fbr such leave is supported by a Meücal Certificate.
- (III) Eighteen month where the employee is suffeting from tuberculosis or leprosy and undergoing treatment in a recogüßd clinic or under a specialist.
- (b) Where an employee other than a pennanent employee fails to duty on expiry of the **maximum** amount of exraorüa:y leave ganted to him or where such an employee who was ganted a lesser of leave than the maunum amount admissible to him, remains absent from duty for period which, together with the petiod of leave to him exceeds the limit upto which he could have been ganted leave under subrule (a), he shall, unless the Board in view of the exception circumstances of the case othe:wise determine, be deemed to have resigled his appointment and shall cease to be in the Institute employment.
- (4) 'The authority empowered to gant leave may commute retrospecüsœly the period of absence without leaE **nto extraordinary**leave.

Note: 'The power of commuting ret@pecuvely periods of absence without leave into **ordinary** leave is absolute md not subject to the condiuons menuoned in

(i) above.

Du:ing his semce in this Insütute, he has already availed 2 years 79 days EOL. In tems of Leave Rules of the Insütute, reproduced above, I.Y. Mehta is eliöble tor 9 months and 15 days EOL.

Accordingly Dr. N.P. Mehta has been allowed 6 months Exü•aordinary Leave (Without pay) from 3.11.2005 (AN) to 3.5.2006 to take up assiU)ment with M.M. Engneering College Mullana and House as per rules.



Mrs. Manjula Sharma is not Ph.D, which is a requiltment tor promotion as Assistant Professor under CAS, On submitting an undertaking that she will complete her Ph.D, before her suËrannuation i.e. 31.12.2007, she was promoted as Assistant Professor and a cimular was issued in October, 2004 that the employees promoted under CAS will get actual monetary benefits on account of the aföltsaid promotion fix)m the date of approval of the BOG and Lecturtrs (Senior Scale) without Ph.D Deute will be requiltd to obtain Ph.D. Degrte within a period of 7 years from the date of their promotion to the post of Assistant Pmfessor. Accordingly Mrs. Manjula Sharma was **required** to obtain Ph.D. Deute bef01t her **retirement** on superannuation, fhil.ing which she will abide by the decision which may be taken by the Board in this regard in füturt.

Mrs. Manjula Sharma will be retiring on 31.12.2007 on completion of 62 years of age. The Selection Committee meetings under the Career Advancement Scheme were held on

31.7.2004 and 1.8.2004 to consider promotion of Lecturers (SS/SG) under CAS. No. F.20-18/2003-TS-III dated 4.6.2()04 (copy enclosed as Appendix ______ on page 53) clarified that the crucial date for determining the fulfillment of eligibility criteria for promotion under CAS shall be 1 st July of every calendar year, This is to say that all those persons who have fulfilled the prescribed criteria for prx)motion prior to 1 st July shall be consideæd en bloc as a batch and the inter-se seniority of those actually promoted, as a batch shall be maintained with reference to their original seniority in the initial entry glade. However, where promotion of more than one batch has taken place together, all persons of the first batch shall rank senior en bloc to the next batch and like wise. The MHRD ftuther clarified that the period between the crucial date and the date of the meeting of the BOG in which promotions recommended under CAS are approved shall count as qu³/4ing service for future promotion without entailing any financial liability-notional or actual-on part of the Institute.

- 2. The Board of Governors of the Institute in its 6th meeting held on 30.9.2004 while apprxwing recommendations of the Selection Committees made on 31.7.2004 and 1.8.2004 för the grant of Senior Scale, Selection Grade/ designation of Assistant Professor decided that the issue of effective date i.e. 5, 11, 1999 for determining the qualifying service should be œviewed by the MHRD. Accoldingly the matter was referred to the MHRD, It has been decided in consultation with the MI-IRD that the date of qualifying sewice for the purpose of eligibility under CAS would be
- 5, 11.1999 in our Institute.
- 3. The All India Council for Technical Education has also been issuing guidelines lüting to eligibility for promotion of various categories of the faculty under CASs As per instructions issued by the AICTE on 17.12,2003 a candidate for promotion as Professor under CAS is required to present her/ himself the selection committee with some of the following:
 - (a) Self-appraisal report @quired).

(b) Research Contribution — books, articles, etc, published (at least 4 pape1S in Journals requiœcl). The best three. written contribution of the teacher (as defined by her/ him) may be sent in advance to the experts for Ive?iewed before coming for the selection committee interview. The candidate should submit in three sets with the applications.

However, the AICPE on 22nd July, 2005 clarified regarding eligibility for pmmotion as Professor under CAS as under: -

"The requirement of 4 papers in Journals is one of the several components of the overall assessment of the candidates for promotion to the Post of Pmfessor under CAST It is not mandatory and cannot be used to eliminate candidates from consideration, i.e., it is not an eligibility condition. The whole idea is to evaluate the performance and the work of the candidate in holistic manner,"

4. Taking into consideration the date of qualiiÿing service as 5, 11, 1999 and clarification given by the AICIE that the requirement of 4 papers in Journals is not mandatory, the cases of Senior Scale/ Selection Grade and promotion as Assistant Pli)fëssors and Professors under CAS who were considered eligible upto 30.6.2005 taking into account the date of rualifying service as 5.11.1999 have been taken up by the Institution.

The Selection Committees met on 23.12.2005 and 24.12.2005. The recommendations of the said committees will be placed before <u>the</u> Board of Governors on table,

It may be mentioned for information of the Board that two Lecturers namely Shri Vikas Chaudha1Y Lecturer in Humanities

Department and Shri Anil Kumar Dahiya Lecturer in Electrical Engineering obtained orders from the Hon ble High Court that they may be interviewed provisionally txating them eligible but their results should be retained in a

sealed cover and the same may be opened only on receipt of express direction of the Hon'ble High Court, However Shri Vikas Chaudhary Lecturer in Humanities Department (Economics) could deliver the orders of the Hon 'ble High Court. after meeting of the selection committee held on 23 rd December, 2005 had ended and the external experts had already left. Hence he could not be interviewed, Shri Anil Kumar Dahiya was interviewed by the Selection Committee for senior scale Lecturer in Electrical Engineeling under CAS on 24th December, 2005 as he brought 01ders of the Hon'ble High Court: ' i in time. The recommendations of the selection committee is lying in the institute in a sealed cover which will be opened after eceipt. of express direction of the Hon'ble High Court. The notice of motion in the said court case has been fixed by the High Court for 7th February, 2006.

The Boalxå may approve recommendations of the Selection Committees for grant of senior scale/ selection grade/ promotion as Assistant Profëssors and Pmfessors in respect of the faculty members of the Institute. The actual financial benefits will be allowed to them from the date of appli)val of the Board as per instructions of the MHRD.

This has reference to your letter dated 18.7.2005 sent to us by FAX seeking certain clarifications.

1) Regarding cfTcctive date of implementation

The CAS and incentives for higher qualifications shall be ectèctive from the date the revised Pay Scales have been adopted i.e. from 1 .1.1996 or from the later date if the respective State Govt. has implemented the revised scales later than 1 . 1.1996. However, for NITs. the matter may be referred to the MHR-D for uniform implementation of the effective date of CAS benefit.

2) Relaxation of qualification for promotion under CAS

The desired relaxation is already provided for diploma level technical institutions, however, for degree level institute this is to be decided by the Board of Governors(BOG) of the concerned institute taking atl the parameters in to consideration.

3) Relaxation of Summer/winter School

The matter is being put up for consideration in AICT E. However, till such time as a final decision in this regard, it may be decided by the Board of Governors (BOG) of the concerned institute.

4) Summer/Winter School or equivalent continuing Education Programme

The matter is being put up for consideration in AICTE. However, till such time as a final decision in this regard, it may be decided by the Board of Governors (BOG) of the concerned institute/ selection committee for CAS.

5) Papers publication in Journals.

The requirement of 4 papers in Journals is one of the several components of the overall assessment of the candidates for promotion to the Post of Professor under CAS. It is not mandatory and cannot be used to eliminate candidates from consideration. i.e. it is not an eligibility condition. The whole idea is to evaluate the performance and the work of the candidate in holistic manner.



The Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development vide their letter No. F.20-11/2003-TS.III dated 12.11.2003 decided that the non-teaching staff of all NITS shall be allowed to serve up to the age of 60 years subject to their fulfilling the provision of screening beyond 58 years of age.

Item 9,13 To accord approval for filling of the posts of Driver for

Institute vehicle and Helper in the Institute Guest House on contractual basis, involving essential services.

There are four sanctioned posts of Driver in the workshop for the smooth running of four vehicles of the Institute. There is one sanctioned post of Cook-cum-Chowkidar and one sanctioned post of Helper in the Guest House. One post of Driver and one post of Helper are lying vacant since long at both the places. To run the vehicles smoothly and also to provide better services in the Guest House, the Institute has been engaging the persons to work on the said posts for a short period say one/ two/ three months contract basis which is not fulfilling the purpose as these posts are essential in nature. If these posts remain vacant, the work of maintenance of the vehicle and the services in the Guest House will be badly affected.

It is pertinent to mention here that the Guest House building has been extended and it is not possible for single Cook-cumChowkidar to take care of the whole Guest House comprising of two blocks.

The Board of Governors of the Institute in its 6th meeting held on 30.9.2004 decided as under:

The Board decided that pending rationalization of the nonteaching posts, the Institute may fill some of the nonteaching posts by direct recruitment on contract basis. The Board authorized the Chairman of the Board to decide all issues relating to filling the above mentioned technical and nonteaching posts (27 posts) by direct recruitment on contract basis such as their qualifications, salary, period of engagement, age and constitution of Selection Committees etc. and further related issues."

In view of the above the Board may consider and accord its approval for filling up the above mentioned posts on contractual basis by direct recruitment for a period of two years subject to extension further for one year on the existing qualifications, service terms and conditions and on the lines as decided by the BOG for mentioned 27 posts.



National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra was established in 1965-66 having its office at Kurukshetra — 136 119. (Hereinafter referred to as "NITKKR")

1. Recitals

- a. TCS is in the business of Software development and Consultancy Services and other allied business for its Clients world wide.
- b. NITKKR is a Deemed University (Pls. fill).
- C. The purpose of this agreement is with reference to conducting ethe TCS specific Software Engineering course by the faculty of NITKKR for the students offered placement at TCS during the campus interview.

2. Operative Provisions

The following are the points of agreement between the parties:

- a) The course is based on Software Engineering component of TCS Initial Learning Programme (ILP).
- b) The course need not be a part of the formal academic programme.
- c) TCS has made its web course on •Software Engineering" public (URL for elearning is http://etearning.tvm.tcs.co.in).
- d) NITKKR shall conduct the said course for the students offered placement in TCS before they join TCS.

- e) TCS shall conduct an evaluation of the students at the end of the programme.
- f) Post Training issue: The successful candidates would go through a suitably redefined. ILP, when they join TCS. The remaining would go through the regular II-P.

3. Cost

T CS shall make the following payment to NITKKR:

i) To faculty:

- Rs. 1000/- for every student trained, after the evaluation of the students is completed. ii) To institution.
 - Rs.50, 000/- for the library to populate with Software Engineering I Systems Engineering books One time payment
 - An annual grant of Rs.50, 000/- for meeting incidental expenses. iii)

To students:

 A complementary copy of a standard book on "Software Engineering" ● Rs.5, 000/- to every successful student at our evaluation, payable after the student joins TCS.

4. Term

The relationship is committed for three consecutive academic years by both TCS and the institute concerned, starting from the academic year 2005-2006. The arrangement can be renewed after three years, based on mutual agreement. Termination of this agreement will not affect •ny rights of a party against the other party, which accrued up to, and including termination or any provisions of this agreement which by their nature survive termination.

5. Representatives

The Academic Relationship Manager, Delhi of TCS would be the single point of contact for this programme, at the TCS side. NITKKR shall nominate a person at their end as a single point of contact.

6. Non Disclosure of Confidential Information.

NITKKR agree and acknowledges that in the course of this assignment mentioned in this agreement, that TCS will disclose information of confidential and proprietary nature to NITKKR or its representatives. For the pufposes of this clause all information of TCS disclosed to the NITKKR, including but not limited to information and details relating •to its business, products, know-how, technology, customers, employees and financials howsoever disclosed, shall be considered as confidential Information of TCS. NITKKR agree to keep confidential and secret at all,times, not directly or indirectly, disclose to any party other than its authorized personnel strictly on a need to know basis, without the prior written permission of the TCS and not make any use thereof other than for the purposes agreed herein, all such confidential information received by NITKKR which it may learn or come to know in the course of its association with TCS and, if for any reason, this cooperation agreement is not entered into, to return to TCS,

without retaining copies, all confidential information and data furnished to it. NITKKR agrees not to disclose the same without the explicit written permission of the disclosing party.

NITKKR acknowledges that any breach by it of its respective obligations under this clause may cause irreparable harm to TCS for which its remedies at law may be inadequate and that in the event of any such breach TCS shall be entitled to seek equitable relief (including without limitation injunctive relief and specific performance) in addition to other remedies provided hereunder or available at law.

ypon termination or dissolution of this Agreement, or upon earlier demand thereof, NITKKR shall. return to the other party all of TCS's known tangible forms of the confidential information and copies thereof in the possession of NITKKR and shall delete or erase all intangible confidential information of TCS in its possession. If requested by TCS, an officer of the NITKKR shall certify in writing that all such confidential information of the other was returned, erased or deleted.

The confidentiality obligations under this clause shall survive during the term of this cooperation agreement and for a period of 24 months thereafter.

7. Intellectual Property Rights

By entering into this agreement NITKKR undertakes:

To protect TCS intellectual property used by it in the course of this assignment, Not to use TCS3 intellectual property without the prior express written consent of it. Ensure the confidentiality of such intellectual property, not to use TCS's intellectual property, should this agreement be dissolved or terminated or at any other time, without the prior written consent of

•rcs.

NITKKR agree that it shall not gain by virtue of this Agreement any rights of ownership or any other interest, right or title in any copyrights, patents, trade secrets, trade marks, or any other intellectual property rights owned by TCS, and nothing herein shall mean nor shatt be construed to mean that they are at any time assigned, licensed or otherwise alienated to NITKKR, nor NITKKR shall be entitled to claim any right, title or interest therein, at any time, This clause shall serve the term and termination of this agreement.

8. Public Announcement

Except as required by taw or regulation, or joint announcement, no party will make any public announcement or issue any press retease in relation to this business cooperation agreement without the prior written approval of the other party.

9. Relationship

This Agreement does not create any joint venture, partnership, and agency or like relationship between the parties hereto. Neither party shall be entitled to make any commitment binding or non binding, financial or otherwise, on behalf of the other, without the prior written consent of the other.

10. Assignment

Either party shall not assign the rights and obligations under this Agreement hereto without the prior written consent of the other party.

11. Liability

Except in the case of breach of confidentiality obligations and infringement of intellectual property rights, neither party shall be liable to the other for any indirect, incidental, consequential or special damages arising out of, in connection with or under this MOU.

12. Governing Law & Arbitration.

This Agreement will be subject to and construed in accordance with the laws of India. In the event of any dispute between the parties as to interpretation of any term herein or any other. matter connected with or arising out of this Agreement, the same shall be resolved by arbitration in accordance with the rules of Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996. Unless the

parties mutually agree on a Sole Arbitrator, the arbitration shall be by a tribunal consisting of three arbitrators. Each party will appoint one arbitrator. The two arbitrators appointed by the parties will appoint the third arbitrator. The venue of the arbitration shall be in Delhi. The arbitration shatt be conducted in English language.

PERFORMANCE AUDIT REPORT

BACKGROUND

The Technical Education Quality Improvement Programme was started in March 2003 in six states viz. Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra and Uttar Pradesh. A year later, seven other states viz. Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Uttaranchal and West Bengal joined the program in April 2004.

Eighteen centrally funded institutions and 114 state sponsored institutions are currently participating in the program.

All the participating institutions have agreed (i) to implement all the elements of the project; and (ii) to carry out all the agreed reforms.

The institutions prepared their self determined plans for achieving excellence, schedules and targets to be met etc. The plans are given in their concise Institutional Proposals.

PROGRAMME OBJECTIVES

The broad objectives of the Programme as given below have been derived from the National Policy on Education (NPE 1986 as revised in 1992):

- a) To create an environment in which engineering institutions selected under the Programme can achieve their own set targets for excellence and sustain the same with autonomy and accountability.
- b) To support development plans including synergistic networking and services to community and economy of competitively selected institutions for achieving higher standards.
- C) To improve efficiency and effectiveness of the technical education management system in the States and institutions selected under the Programme.

It is envisaged under the Programme that as part of institutional reform the institutions under the Programme will establish mechanism for quality audit and during programme quality and efficiency audit using external agencies will be conducted every six months. The findings of these audits will be used for

causing remedial actions to improve performance of the institutions in the Programme implementation.

PURPOSE OF PEFORMANCE AUDIT

The conduct of performance audit quality and (efficiency) twice a year is a legal binding on the state/SPFUs and the GOI/NPIU under the program.

The performance audit is an important activity to monitor the progress of the program. However, this audit is to basically assess the current situations on a large number of activities that aught to be undertaken by all institutions under the program and to evaluate the extent and quality of achievement in select areas.

Subsequent audits will be computerized to generate scores from the responses of the stakeholders and will measure/monitor the progress in various activities of the project.

METHODOLOGY

In the current audit the auditors were required to give holistic evaluation and frank and constructive suggestions/comments that would be of (a) help to institutions to identify areas for improvement in project implementation; (b) help to mentors in identifying areas needing priority mentoring attention; and (c) help to SPFUs and NPIU in facilitating removal of bottlenecks/hurdles causing under-achievement in one or more of the essential activities. The copy of the audit report is to be provided to the chairman BOG and Mentor of the respective institution.

The auditors evaluated performance of Project Institutions in respect of the following only for which the questionnaires have been drawn on:

o Implementation of institutional projects as described in their Concise Institutional Proposal (CIPs) o Implementation of Institutional Reforms o Administrative and managerial efficiency improvements o Quality of Education, Training and Services offered by the institution.

Four response sheets were prepared for assessing the progress from four major stakeholders, viz. Director / Principal, HODs, Faculty and students.

Auditor's evaluation was based on:

- a) Response received in the Response Sheets from (i) Principal /
 Director, (ii) all HODs, (iii) Representative faculty, and (iv)
 Representative students.
- b) Focused Group Discussions (FGDs) with HODs, faculty and students.
- c) Selective visits to labs, workshops, hostels, and campus in general.
- d) Review of records / documents and discussions with select persons, as considered necessary, to look deeper into utility and relevance of reported action/processes.

The auditors made their own perceived overall assessments, giving a score of zero for highly unsatisfactory / negligible performance and 10 for excellent / highly satisfactory performance.

The auditors gave perceived scores for each aspect stated in the individual reports. The auditor also provided an overall average perceived score for each performance audit. Observation and suggestions against each aspect were also given by the auditor.

The individual institutional performance audit reports are summated at the state level and national level to show status of project implementation at the respective level.

REPORT

The audit was conducted in all the project institutions. However, Gujarat state did not respond as on the date of preparation of report.]harkhand sent one report only. Report on two institutes from Madhya Pradesh and one each from

Haryana and Uttar Pradesh could not be included in the absence of the reports from there.

The reports from all other institutions were received and are summarized. The summary audit reports concerning all the audited institutions are consolidated and presented in the following categories. The number of institutions included in the report in each category is shown against it.

OBSERVATIONS

The specific comments and key observations are given in the reports. Based on the reports, observation and suggestions of the auditors, the following key issues emerge.

1. The autonomy and delegation of powers up to the lowest level of functionary along with accountability needs to be in place. It is difficult task particularly due to the mindset of the stakeholders. A training program on mission mode is the need.

- 2. The large number of vacancies in the faculty of various institutions is a cause of concern. Shortage of well qualified, competent and stable teachers makes it difficult to concentrate on reforms.
- 3. The concept of community service is new to most institutions and needs to be taken up more seriously.
- 4. Flexibility in programs is limited to a few optional subjects only.

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- 5. Most institutions follow only the traditional mode of teaching. Modern methods / means are not used. Facilities for self-learning by students are provided but system is not geared to achieve the same.
- 6. The feed back from students for improving the teacher's performance is lower priority. It may be related to shortage of teachers.
- 7. There are hardly any incentives to a meritorious teacher in the system in majority of cases.
- 8. Networking with other institutions has not picked up though some of them are serious.
- 9. Campus wide networking is in progress in most institutions.
- 10. Mentoring and handholding of the institution is important particularly in respect of implementation of reforms and achieving academic excellence.



To approve Annual Report, Audit Statement of Accounts and Audit Report (2004-2005) both in English and Hindi versions.

As per instructions of the Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Secondary & Higher Education, New Delhi, 50 copies of Annual Report and Annual Accounts (both in English and Hindi version) of the Institute are required to be sent to the Ministry duly approved by the Board of Governors for laying the same the Parliament.

The Annual Accounts of the Institute for the year 2004-05 were earlier approved by the Finance Committee and the Board of Governors in their meetings held on 22.6.2005 and 23.7.2005 rtspectively, The Annual Accounts of the Institute were inspected/examined by an Audit Party—the Office of the Accountant General(Audit), Haryana during the period from 09.08.2005 to 24.08.2005. The Audit Report on the annual accounts was issued by the Accountant General (Audit) Haryana on 6.12, 2005.

The Annual Report and the Audit rEport along with audited statements of accounts (both in English and Hindi version) are appended as Annexure to Item 9.17 of the Agenda.

The Board may consider and the Annual Report and the Audit Report along with audited statements of accounts of the Institute for the year 2004-05.

Item 9.18 To consider payment of remuneration for discharging examination related duties to the faculty members.

The institution was affiliated to Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra, for all academic purposes since inception. The faculty and other staff assigned with the examination duties used to get honorarium at the rates prescribed by Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra.

In June 2002, the Institute (earlier REC Kurukshetra) was upgraded and renamed as National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra with Deemed University Status. This Institute continued to follow the norms for payment of honorarium related to examinataion duties upto August, 2003 for the faculty.

The Board of Governors in its I st meeting held on 19.10.2002 decided as under:

After detailed deliberations the Board approved proposals as furnished in the agenda item for conducting examinations and awarding of degrees from the 1 st semester of Academic year 20022003 for B.Tech/BE and M.Tech. which were earlier being conducted by Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra. However, the Board emphasized that the 11T pattern in this regard should be followed from the next academic year.

On the basis of information received from the 11T Delhi, no remuneration/honorarium is paid to the faculty staff due to the fact that the examination work is treated as part and parcel of academic activities. Hence our faculty members are not getting any remuneration for performing

examination related duties.-

However, the non-teaching employees are being paid the remuneration for discharging their duties at the examination centre.

The faculty members are pressing hard that they should be paid remuneration on account of discharging various examination related duties such as paper setting, examination duties, evaluation of answer books, conducting practical /viva-voce, project examination, dissertation, Ph.D. examination, flying squad duties and preparation/declaration of results etc etc.

The Board may consider and decide. If approved the matter with details will be placed before the Finance Committee along with financial implications involved.

Item: 9, 19 To note action taken. by the Chairman, Boasd of Governors for according sanction engaging a Senior avocate at Hon'ble Supreme Court, New Delhi defending the Special Leave Petition filed by Shril Lai, Ex-Senior Project Leader of the EntrepreneuNhip Development Cell (EDC) of the Institute.

Sh. G. bal, Ex-Senior Project Leader of the Entrepreneurship Development Cell (DC) of the Institute has filed a Special Leave Petition before the Hon ble Supreme Court at New Delhi under SLP No. 14579-80/2005 against the orders of Hon 'ble DB of Punjab and Haryana High Court dated 26.5.2

Before filing the SLP by Sh.G.Lal, the Institute preferred to file a Caveat in the Hon ble Supreme Court at New Delhi so that our counsel may be heard before giving any directions in this regard. Our legal counsel at Honble Supreme Court Sh.S. Srinivasan, an advocate-on-record appeared in the said SLP on 1,8.2005. After hearing the Senior AdSÄ)cate Mr. P.P. Rao, the Hon ble Supreme Court vide its orders dated 1.8.2005 directed the Institute not to evict the petitioner from the house already allotted till further orders in the SLP and four weeks time was given to file the counter in the SLP, Accx)rdingly the Institute has filed the counter written statement in the said SLP within four weeks of the orders of the Court.

The matter was discussed with our legal Counsel at Hon ble Supreme Court. He has advised to engage a Senior **Advocate** for appearing in said SLP on behalf of the Institute.. As per practice in the Hon 'ble Supreme Court, the Senior Advocates charge Rs. 15000/- to 33000/- per hearing. As per discussion, Sh.Srinivasan aveed to consult a Senior Advocate

for defending the abovesaid SLP on behalf of Institute. He also suggested that Senior Advocate will be engaged for three or four hearings during final arguments only.

It is pertinent to mention here that a Senior Advæate Sh, Rajeev Atma Ram was also earlier engaged by the Institute at Punjab and Haryana High Court at Chandigarh to defend both the LPAs and contempt pmceedings pertaining to Sh.G, Lal on payment of Rs.one lac in lump-sum. The said amount was paid out of Institute Development Fund with the approval of the Board.

The Chairman, BOG vide his orders dated 188.2005 has accorded approval in anticipation of Board for engaging a Senior Advocate at Hon 'ble Supreme Court on payment ranging from Rs. 15000/- to Rs.33000/- per hearing (as will be finalized by our legal counsel) to defend the above SLP alongwith our legal counsel in the interest of Institute

The Board may note the action taken by the Hon 'ble Chairman, BOG in the above said case. The payment will be made from the Institute Development Fund (Consultancy share)

The undersigned i9 directed eonvey the sanction of the President to the grant of Npn%oducgivitÿ Linked Bonus (Ad-hoc Bonus) equivalent to 30 days emoluments for the aCCötûltfr2È year 2004-2005 to the Central Government employees in Group C and D and all non-gazetted. employees in Group B, who not covered by any Productivity Linked Bonus Scheme. The calculation ceiling of Rs.2500/- will remain unchanged. The peyment will also be admissible to the Central Police Para•militàiªý :PeësOnnëi and- Fersónnel of Armed Fo+ces. The orders will be deemed to be extended to the employees of Union Territozy Administration—which follow the Central Gkñ'étnmeflt pattern ôf ei'nolurfièñts and are not covered by any other bonus or ex-gratia scheme..

2. The benefit will be admissible subject to the following terms and conditions:-

- (i) only thos&employees who were in service on 31.3.2005 and have rendered at least six. months of continuous serviæ during the year 2004-2005 will be eligible for payment under these orders. Pro-rata payment will be admissible to the eligible employees for period of continuous service during the year from six months to a full year, the eligibility period being taken in teFms of number of months of service (rounded to the nearest number of months).
- (ii) The quantum of Non-PLB (ad-hoc bonus) will be worked out on the basis of average emoluments/calculation ceiling whichever is lower. To calculate Non-PLB (Ad-hoc bonus) for one day, the average emoluments in a year will be divided by 30.4 (average number of days in a month). This will thereafter be multiplied by the number of days of bonus granted. To illustrate, taking the calculation ceiling of Rs.2500 (where actual average emoluments exceed Rs.2500), Non-PLB (Ad-hoc bonus) for thirty days would work out to Rs.2500x30/30.4- Rs.2467.10 (rounded off to Rs.2467/-)
- (iii) The casual labour who have worked in offices following 6 day week for at least 240 days for each year for 3 years or more (206 days in each year for 3 years or more in the case of offices observing 5 day week), will be eligible for this Non-PLB (Ad-hoc Bonus) payment. The amount of non-PLB (ad-hoc bonus) payable våll be (Rs.1200x30/30.4 i.e. Rs.1184,21 (rounded off to Rs.1184/-). Subject:- Payment of Dearness Allowance to Central Government employees - Revised Rates effective from 1.7.2005

. The undersigned is directed to refer to this Ministry's Office Memorandum No. 1 (1)/2005-E-11 (B)/263 dated 31 st March, 2005 on the subject mentioned above and to state that the President is pleased to decide that the Dearness Allowance

payable to Central Government employees shall be enhanced from the existing rate of 17% to 21% with effect from 1st July, 2005.

- The provisions contained in paras 3,4 and 5 of this Ministry's O.M, No. 1 (13)/97-E-II (B) dated 3.10. 1997 shall continue to be applicable while regulating Dearness Allowance under these orders. However, with effect from 01.04.2004, Dearness Allowance is computed on the basis of Basic Pay, Dearness pay, Stagnation Increment and NPA. Provisions contained in para 3 of this Ministry's' OM No.1(13)/97-E.II.(B) dated 3.10.1997 therefore stand amended to this extent.
- 3 The additional installment of Dearness Allowance payable under these orders shall be paid in cash to all Central Government employees.
- These orders shall also apply to the civilian employees paid from the Defence Services Estimates and the expenditure will be chargeable to the relevant head of the Defence Services Estimates. In regard to Armed Forces personnel and Railway employees separate orders will be issued by the Ministry of Defence and Ministry of Railways, respectively.
- In so far as the persons serving in the Indian Audit and Accounts Department are concerned, these orders issúe after consultation with the

Comptroller and Auditor General of India.

Item <u>9.23</u> To note action taken by the of Residence of the Institute to purchase a Vehicle for day to day use in the Institute Hostels.

A meeting of the Board of Residence of the Institute was held under the Chairmanship of Director on 30.6.2005. Looking into the difficulties faced by the Hostel management in day to day purchasing, it was decided to purchase a low cost vehicle like Maruti Van (OMNI) for use of Hostels in the interest of Hostel students,

In view of the above decision of Board of Residence, a Maruti Van (OMNI) 8 seater BS,III having a cost of Rs,2,40,OOO/- has been purchased by the Hostel Management out of the consolidated Hostels Fund taken fiX)rn each of the Hostels being used by Hostel Management separately,

There is no liability on the Institute or on the Government for the said purchase as the said purchase has been made out of the Hostel Funds.

The Board may note and approve the above action taken by the Board of Residence for the welfare of Hostel students.

Item 9.24 To consider sanction for prosecuting Shri Saresbth Abuja and Shri Vikas Mittal, both Lecturers (under suepension) in Electronics and Communication EnØneering Department.

An Item 8.9 was placed before the Boaxd of Governors in its 8th meeting held on 23, 7.2005 for granting sanction for pmsecuting Shri Sareshth Ahuja and Shri Vikas Mittal, Lecturers (under Suspension) in Electxx»nics and Communication Engg Deptt.

The Board after detailed discussions resolved as under:

The Board discussed the matter in details, The Boaxd was, prima-facie, of the opinion that Sh. Vikas Mittal, Lecturer (under suspension), ECE Deptt, was not diltctly involved in the said corruption case. Hence the Board did not accord sancú)n for pmsecutin.g him by the police authorities. However, the Boald permitted the police authorities to prosecute Sh. Sare.shtha Abuja, Lecturer(under suspension), ECE Deptt. u/ s 7, 13(i), 49, Anü Corruption Act- 1988."

The Minutes of the 8th meeting were circulated to all the members of the Board for their perusal and comments, if any. The Hon'ble Chairman, Board of Governors vide his letter dated 11.8.2005 addressed to all members of the Board suggested as under:

"My suggestion is that the Director of NIT Kurukshetra be directed to obtain a legal opinion fmm the Institute's Standing Counsel before the Board takes a considertd decision in this case. The court has granted bail to both accused persons. The question of granting permission. for pmsecution to the police can then be again discussed by the Board in its next meeting or by cimulating the contents of the legal suggestions from our Counsel."

In esponse to the above suggestion of the Chairman sent to the members of the Board, the Institute had eceived written comments fmm some members of the Board confirming that. legal opinion of the Institute counsel may be obtained and the item be deferred for the time being. Hence the matter stands deferred.

The legal opinion in the matter given by Shri J,S. Virk, who is a ceputed and senior criminal lawyer at district courts Kurukshetra and is Standing Counsel of our Institute, is as under:

"I have gone through the œcord and of opnion that police after investigaüon has prepared challan against both S/ Sh. Sareshtha Ahuja and Vikas Mittal. It is the satisfaction of appointing/ punishing authority only u/s 1 19 of P.C. Act tör according sanction for plX)secution secause no court can take cognizance without the

previous sanction of competent. authority. In case the authority is not satisfied with the investigation/ allegation then sanction can be refused giving detailed reasons differing with the police investigation showing that employees were not involved."

The relevant rules on "Offences and Penalties" and "Sanction for Prosecution and other Miscellaneous Provisions" (pages 179 & 181 of Swamy's Compilation of Conduct Rules) have also been consulted. The relevant rules read as under:

- 7. Public sen.yant taking gratification other than legal comuneration in espect of an official act. — Whoever, being, or expecting to be a public servant accepts or obtains or agrees to accept or attempts to obtain from any persons, for himself or for any other person, any gratification whatever, other than legal remuneration, as a motive or for doing or for bearing to do any official act or for showing or forbearing to show, in the exercise of his official functions, favour or disfavour to any person or for rendering or attempting to render av service or disselvice to any person, with the Central Government or any State Government or Parliament or the Legislature of any State or with any local authority, corporation or Government company referred to in Clause (c) of Section 2, or with any public senzant, whether be or otherwise, shall punishable imprisonment which shall be not less than six months but which may extent to five years and shall also be liable to fine,
- 13. Criminal misconduct by a public servant. (1) A public servant is said to commit the offence of criminal miscond uct: -
 - (a) if he habitually accepts or obtains or to accept or attempts to obtain from any person for himself or for any other person any gratification other than legal remuneration as a motive or reward such as is mentioned in Section 7; or

- (b) if he habitually accepts or obtains or agræes to accept or attempts to obtain for himself or for any other person, any valuable thing without consideration or for a consideration which he knows to be inadequate frx»m any person whom he knows to have been, or to be, or to be likely to be concerned in any **proceeding** or business Uansacted or about to be transacted by him, or having any connection with the official functions of himself or of any public servant to whom he is subordinate, or from any person whom he knows to be interested in or related to the person so concerned; or
- (c) if he dishonestly or fraudulently misappmpriates or otherwise converts for his own use any property entrusted to <u>him</u> or under his contml as a public servant or allows any other person so to do; or
- (d) if he:-
 - (i) by corrupt or illegal means, obtains for himself or for any other person any valuable thing or pecuniaxy advantage; or
 - (ii) by abusing his position as a public servant, obtains for himself or for any other person any valuable thing or pecuniary advantage; or
 - while holding office as a public **servant**, obtains for any person any valuable thing or pecuniary advantage without any public **interest**; or
- (e) if he or any person on his behalf, is in possessi)n or has, at any fme during the period of his office, been in possession for which the public servant cannot satisfactorily account, of pecuniary resources or property dispmportionate to his known sources of income..

Accordingly decision of the Board taken in its 8 th meeting held on 23.7.2005 on the item under reference was withheld.

The Superintendent of Police Kurukshetra is pressing hard time and again to convey him the sancüon for prosecuting both the Lecturers.



OFFICE ORDER NO. 31/5/05

Sub:- Guidelines to be followed by the authorities competent to accord sanction for prosecution u/s. 19 of the PC Act.

The Commission has been concerned that there have been serious delays in according sanction for prosecution under section 19 of the PC Act and u/s 197 of CrPC by the competent authorities. The time limit prescribed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court for this is 3 months generally speaking. The Commission feels this delay could be partly due to the lack of appreciation of what the competent authority is expected to do while processing such requests.

There have been a number of decisions of the Supreme Court in which the law has been clearly laid down on this issue:-

1 Jagjit Singh Vs. State of Punjab, 1996 Cr.L.J. 2962.

- 2. State of Bihar vs. P.P. Sharma, AIR 1991 SC 1260.
- 3. Superintendent of Police (CBI) Vs. Deepak Chowdhary, AIR 1996 SC 186.
- Vineet Narain Vs. Union of India, AIR 1998 SC 889.
- 2. The guidelines to be followed by the sanctioning authority, as declared by the Supreme Court are summarized hereunder:-
- i) Grant of sanction is an administrative act. The purpose is to protect the public servant from harassment by frivolous or vexatious prosecution and not to shield the corrupt. The question of giving opportunity to the public servant

at that stage does not arise. The sanctioning authority has only to see whether the facts would prima-facie constitutes the offence.

- II)The competent authority cannot embark upon an inquiry to judge the truth of the allegations on the basis of representation which may be filed by the accused person before the Sanctioning Authority, by asking the 1.0. to offer his comments or to further investigate the matter in the light of representation made by the accused person or by otherwise holding a parallel investigation/enquiry by calling for the record/report of his department.
- iii) When an offence alleged to have been committed under the P.C. Act has been investigated by the SPE, the report of the 10 is invariably scrutinized by the DIG, IG and thereafter by DG (CBI). Then the matter is further sautinized by the concerned Law Officers in CBI.
- iv) When the matter has been investigated by such a specialized agency and the report of the 10 of such agency has been scrutinized so many times at such high levels, there will hardly be any case where the Government would find it difficult to disagree with the request for sanction.
- v) The accused person has the liberty to file representations when the matter is pending investigation. When the representations so made have already been considered and the comments of the 10 are already before the Competent Authority, 'there can be no need for any further comments of 10 on any further representation.
- vi) A representation subsequent to the completion of investigation is not known to law, as the law Is well established that the material to be considered by the Competent Authority is the material which was collected during investigation and was placed before the Competent Authority.
- Vii) However, if in any case, the Sanctioning Authority after consideration of the entire material placed before it, entertains any doubt on any point the competent authority may specify the doubt with sufficient particulars and may request the Authority who has sought sanction to clear the doubt. But that would be only to clear the doubt in order that the authority may apply its mind proper, and not for the purpose of considering the representations of the accused which may be filed while the matter is pending sanction.
- viii) If the Sanctioning Authority seeks the comments of the 10 while the matter is pending before it for sanction, it will almost be impossible for the Sanctioning Authority to adhere to the time limit allowed by the Supreme Court in Vineet Narain's case.

The Commission has directed that these guidelines as at para 2(i)(vii)should be noted by all concerned authorities for their guidance and strict compliance.

The Summary of the regarding Sh.Sareshtha Ahuja and Sh.Vikas is as

under:

1. Sh.Artun Kumar Sinha., Roll No,2K099, a passed out student of this Institute moved an application dated 1.7.12.2004 before the Deputy Commissioner. Kurukshetra with its subject "Regarding bribety case of Teachers", mentioning therein that though he was a passed out student. but had compartment in one subject. Sh.Sinha stated that Professor Vikas Mit..tal, IR.cturer F,cË Department of this Instituhad given him unsatisfactory marks and thus he was failed lateron. He also stated that he contacted Professor Ahuja, another Lecturer of the Department who told him that a deal had been settled in a sum of Rs.6000/with Professor Vikas Mit.tal and he had to pay that amount at 12.00 noon on 17.12.2004 to Professor Vikas Mitta..l.

On the complaint. of Sh.Sinha, the Deputy Commissioner, Kurukshetra handed over the said complaint to DSP "HQ' Kuruk.shetra on the same day i.e. on 17. IQ.2004 for investigation. Shri Surender Pal Singh, Deputy Director, Agriculture, Kurukshetra was also directed to join as a witness in the raiding party. Sh. Sinha was asked to give 12 currency notes of the denomination of Rs.500/- totaling

Rs,6000/- to the police upon which the DSP Kurukshetra as well as Deputy Director Agriculture, Kurukshetra made their initials and after spreading powder, the same werehanded over to the complainant. It is also mentioned in the police file that a shadow witness namely Ravinder Pal Singh constable was made to stand to give signal immediately after handing over the currency notes by the complainant to Professor Ahui,a. After getting signal from constable Ravinder Pal Singh, DSP raided the house of Professor Ahui,a and found one person sitting in his computer room and on interrogation he disclosed his name as Sureshth Ahuia, Lecturer in NIT. Kurukshetra. He was asked to handover the bribe taken by him, upon which he took out 12 currency notes of the denomination of Rs.SOO/-. After completing the formalities of washing hands and jacket of Prof. Ahuia by the police, the accused Professor Ahuia was taken into custody. During further investigation, he made a disclosure statement that he had taken the said bribe on behalf of Professor Vikas Mittal and both will divide the same. On this tisclosure statement, Professor Vikas Mittal, co-accused. was also arrested from his house who also made

disclosure on 18.12.2004 that Professor Ahuja was asked to collect Rs.6000/- on his behalf which would be divided by them. Answer sheets were also taken by the police into possession from Sh.Vikas Mitta.l office room in the Institute on the same day.

- 3, On 18.12.2004, the In-charge, Post Station. KUK informed the Institute with regard to arrest of two Lecturers mentioning therein that a case under section 7, 13 (1), 49 Anti Corruption Act, 1988 had been registered against Sh.Shreshtha Ahuja and Sh.Vikas MittaJ on 17.12.2004 under FIR No.280. On 18.12.2004, both the Lecturers were plX)duced before Judicial Magistrate, 1 st Class, Kurukshetra and they were remanded up-to 24.12.2004 in the judicial custody.
- 4. Vide letter dated 20.122004, both the Lecturers were suspended by the Institute under the Conduct and Disciplinary Rules of the Institute w.e.f. 17.12.2004 (AN) based on the police report regatding their detention ffll further orders.

On 21/22.12.2004, the Institute requested the Superintendent of Police. Kurukshetra to inform about the full facts of the case so that the Hon ble Chairman BOG could be informed accordingly. On 30.122004 it was also requested that necessary permission may kindly be given to the Institute to take the delivery of answer sheets which were in possession of Sh.Vikas Mittal, The Police arranged to handothe answer sheets to the Institute.

6. On 8.12005, the Supdt. of Police, Kurukshetra requested the Institute to arrange to check the answer sheet of Sh.Arun Sinha from the three professors of (IT, Delhi, On 12.1.2005, the SP was intimated that the request of the police cannot be acceded to as there is no provision in the Institute Rules for getting anwer sheets revaluated from any external source as well as in the Institute. The deviation in the provision is beyond the competency of the Director.

Vide letter dated 17.1 2005, the SP, Kurukshetra again requested the Institute to revaluate the answer sheet of Sh.Arun Sinha through a Board of three Professors of the Institute. On 23.1 ,2005, the Institute constituted a panel of three Professors of the Institute for revaluating the answer sheet of Sh.Arun Sinha. The Board of three Professors of NIT, Kurukshetra on 17.3.200S gave 36 marks to She Arun Sinha whereas Sh.Vikas Mitt-al had given him 34 marks The SP. Kurukshetra also got the answer sheet œvaluated from three Professors Board of 11Tp Delhi. The Diœctor, 11T Delhi Vide letter dated 17,3.2005 informed that of Examiners of IIT, Delhi had given him 67 marks for the said answer sheet.

As per orders passed by the Presiding Officer and Special Court under Prevention of corruption Act, Kurukshetra on 27.1.2005, accused/applicants Sh,Shreshtha Ahuja and Sh.Vikas Mittal were admitted to bail subject to their furnishing bail bonds in the sum of Rs,.50,000/- and two sureties of the like amount each.

9. On 14.282005. the SP, Kurukshetra requested the Institute for granting permission to prosecute the accused in the said Criminal case. A number of requests in this regard have been received from the SP, Kurukshetra in the Institute. The matter was placed before the BOG in its 8 th meeting held on 23,7.2005. After considering the item in details, the matter was deferred for the next BOG meeting.

It is perfnent to mention here that Sh.Arun Sinha filed writ petition on 25.2005 in the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandi.garh for declaring his result on the basis of marks given by JIT, Delhi. Our counsel appeared in the same c.a se on 23.5.2005. The meantime, ShrArun sinha also re-appeared in the said paper F;cE343 on 195.2005. He got 68 marks in the said paper. The Institute declared the result on 30.5,2005. On 31.5.2005, Sh.Arun Sinha withdrew above case from Hon ble Punjab and Haryana High Court.

Both these accused assuared complainant Arun Kumar Sinha that they will clear/passed his paper and will take Rs. 6000/- in lieu of this task. After scting this deal complainant informed the concernred authority. Item 9.25 To consider creation of a post of Asstt. Engineer(Elect.) in the Institute for HT/LT Substation Management.

The Institute, since its inception, gets the electricity supply for the State Electricity Board (UHBVN) through L.T. connections. With the expansion in infrastructure, the electric load of the Institute has increased manifold and the UHBVN has been refusing to release further LT connections, thus requiring HT connection for bulk electricity supply. For this pupose, the Board of Governors approved the installation of HT/LT substation in its 6 meeting held on 30.9.2004 vide item No. 6.30 and the Govt. of India released Rs. 100.00 lacs to initiate the work. In this regard, an expert committee was constituted to examine various issues relating to HT/LT substation installation, and the committee recommended for the creation of an additional post of Asstt. Engineer(Electrical) for effective operation and maintenance of the sub-station which was approved by the Institute Building & Works Committee in its 4th meeting held on 13.12.2005 vide item No. 4.17. As per the prevalent administrative norms in Government and Autonomous bodies e.g. IIT, Delhi, NSIT, Delhi, NIT, Hamirpur, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra etc. the HT/LT sub-stations are managed by an officer of the rank of Assistant Engineer(Electrical) due to the technical requirements of such installations.

In view of the above it has become necessary to create the post of Assistant Engineer(Electrical) for manning the electrical sub-station. It is, therefore, proposed that a post of Assistant Engineer(Electrical) may be created in the Institute in the pay scale of Rs. 8000-275-13500 with the following qualifications:-

"Degree in Engineering(Electrical) from a recognized University or equivalent. The candidates should have 3 yrs. experience in designing, preparation of estimates, supervision and execution of electrical installations work in buildings, installations of overhead/underground LT/HT transmission and distribution lines, motors with associated control gears. Should be well conversant with Indian Electricity Act and Rules and Government s eci zcations or electrical works in the buildin s. Ca able o

preparation of contractors' bills and tenders for electrical works independently.

The Board of Governors in its $7^{\rm th}$ meeting held on 1922005 (copy of the agenda item is enclosed) decided as under:

i) The remuneration and the conveyance allowance be allowed to the Chief Warden, the Deputy Chief Warden and the Wardens as per recommendations of the Board of Residences of the Institute as per details in the agenda item.

ii)The Proctor may also be allowed the remuneration and the conveyance allowance at par with the Chief Warden.

iii) The Board approved the rcomrnendations regarding telephone charges to the CW, Wardens and the officer/offcials as mentioned in agenda item in principle and desired that the Director may discuss the matter with the Mobile Service Provider for providing mobile phones to the Chief warden, the proctor, the Deputy Chief Warden, Wardens and other need the members/officers/offic.ials. The matter may then be placed before the Finance Committee with composite proposal and expenditure involved therein."

The payment of remuneration and conveyance allowance has already been made to the chief Warden, Proctor, the Deputy Chief Warden and wardens as per decision of the Board w.e.f. 19.2.2005-

For taking decision on the matter at (iii) above, a Committee at the Institute level was constituted to consider the matter. The Committee recommended that the above officers [officials should be paid as per the detailed mentioned in the minutes of the meeting, A copy of the minutes is enclosed as appendix XVI pages 144 to 145 . The recommendations of the Committee were placed before the Finance Committee in its 5th meeting held on 23.7.2005. The Finance Committee decided as under:

'The Finance Committee recommended to the Board that Telephone Allowance may be paid to Proctor, Chief Warden, Dy. Chief Warden, Wardens and needv administrative Officers. / officials of the Institute on the pattern of 11T, Delhi."

In view of the above decision of the PC, the matter s,vas referred to the 11T Delhi. The Assistant Registrar (R-I), 11T Delhi vide his letter dated 9.9,2005

(copy enclosed as Appendix $\underline{\text{WII}}$ pages to rxyrn 146 to $\underline{148}$) informed as under:


- a) The Wardens and Assistant Wardens are entitled to reimbursernent of telephone bills upto a ceiling of Rss 750/- pan. in their capacity as members of the faculty of the Institute.

 - c) The reimbursement be made on every six monthly basis.

 - d) The Chief Warden/ Proctor and legal official be paid as per $^{\rm r}$ ecommendations of the Committee constituted at the level of Institute @ $^{\rm R}$ s. 1000/ -per month and 350/- per month respectively.

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

He took initiative and stressed the need to prepare the Roadmap for the Institute for the next 20 years as per instructions of the MHR-D in order to take up the challenges in future and successfully implement the Institute Vision. Though the existing infrastructural facilities of the Institute are sufficient to cater to the requirements of the students at present but due to the rapid advances taking place in the field of engineering and technology there is a need to upgrade the facilities for the future requirements, to start new courses in the emerging areas and to ensure that the Institute is well equipped in all respects. In addition there is a need to increase the intake of students in the existing courses in view of the increase in the requirement of technical manpower. The following committee was constituted for the said purpose:-

The meeting of the committee members including special invitees were held number of times for the preparation of the Roadmap. As a result of the discussions in the meetings a broad structure (suggestive guidelines) of the Roadmap was framed on the basis of which all the Chairmen/Section Heads submitted their individual requirements for preparation of the Roadmap for the next 20 years. These requirements have been given keeping in view the vision of the Department/Section in particular and vision of the Institute in general.

The information thus received was compiled and presented with Roadmap in such a manner that the financial/manpower requirements of each Department/Section is clearly visible in blocks of five years spread over 20 years. Subsequently a comprehensive summary for all the blocks has been presented indicating the requirements of the Institute as a whole for 20 years. In addition the inputs were also taken from other stakeholders such as Deans, students, faculty and staff, alumni, industry and NGOs. In this regard various rounds of discussions were held with students, faculty

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and staff and others. The comments/suggestions of the alumni, industry and NGOs were taken through emails.

Based on the above miscellaneous inputs, important observations which emerged are as follows:-

- ➤ There is an urgent need to fill up the vacant posts of all categories (teaching, teaching supporting and non-teaching). Due to acute shortage of staff various activities of the Institute such as teaching in classes and labs, administrative work, developmental work etc are suffering. Delayed decision in this regard will further deteriorate the condition
- There is a need to restructure the existing administrative setup of the Institute for its smooth functioning. The administrative hierarchical structure is proposed in this direction.
- ➤ To have transparency and effectiveness in the Institute, minutes of the BOG meetings should be accessible to all and the governing rules of the Institute should be available in a booklet form in each Department/Section.

- ➤ Benefits like pension, career advancement scheme etc. should be given to employees of all cadres.
- There should be a grievances cell for the faculty also to address their grievances at the Institute level itself.
- ➤ There is a need for new investment in modem teaching aids like overhead projectors, PA systems, LCD projectors, multimedia etc. The existing LAN of the Institute should be upgraded and extended to classrooms, hostel rooms and faculty houses.
- ➤ The research environment should be promoted at all levels. There should be a provision for research grant to all faculty members and there should be full time research scholars in each Department.
- The curriculum is excellent but should be revised at least 5 years.
- There is a need to enhance the facilities like sports, medical, training and placement, student activity centre, auditorium, intercom etc.
- ➤ There is a need to encourage all Departments for generating revenues from consultancy in industry.

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> The Institute should be a leader in academic programs, tuned to India's technological vision making students sensitive to India's social problems and equip them with basic skills to play a role in tackling it.

1. If a student gets "E" Grade in a subject, he/she can improve the grade only by reappearing in the end-semester examinations. His/her sessional marks will remain the same as was earned in the first attempt. He/she will require a total of 40 marks including sessional & new end semester exam marks, to pass.

If a student gets 'E' Grade in a subject, he/she may be allowed to improve his/her grade, sessionals and both in end-semesters examinations. In sessionals, while there will be no change in the marks he/she has got for 'class work', he/she may be allowed to appear in the two testsNiva-voce (20 marks each). Similarly for the subject of Practical /Seminar/Project, he/she will be allowed to improve upon his/her performance through teacher's evaluation during the semester. However, in such cases the maximum sessional marks be limited to 40%.


This will also be applicable to all old students of the GBES if their sessional marks are less than 40%. However, such



		students will be permitted a maximum of two chances. The tests of such students will be conducted by the respective departments along with the test series of the regulars semesters.

One semester Certificate Course in Information Security

Details of Courses

10 courses and one graduate major project may be offered in M. Tech. in Information Security Curriculum program, with the following break up:

i. Minimum of three courses form Information Security ii. Minimum of three course from Computer Science & Communications iii. Minimum of two courses from Management iv. Electives from related streams: Electronics, Communications, Nanotechnology etc.

Item 9.31. To consider extension of communication facility in the Institute.

At present the Institute is having a small telephone exchange (EPABX). The internal communication facility is available in the Institute through EPABX. The communication system in the Institute is not up to the requirement resulting thereby various Heads of the . Departments/Sections are deprived of this facility. There are a few lines in the EPABX and the internal communication system in the Institute is also very weak. In order to strengthen this facility it has been felt that we should get more number of BSNL lines on FWT, CUG and CLIP basis and this will cater the needs of various staff members. It is proposed to extend this facility to the staff members (need based) at the residences as well as the offices to introduce a better communication system.

The matter was taken up with the Area Manager (Telecom), BSNL Kurukshetra and he has given very economical proposal which is as under:

Initial Deposit

Security Deposit Rs. 1,000/- (it can be deposited in two (Refundable per connection) instalments).

Tariff Plan.

Monthly Rental a) Rs. 180/- (for local & STD connection)

b) P.s. 120/- (only for incoming connection)

CUG Rent Nil
CLI charges Nil

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Free calls in above monthly 50 (for local and STD connection). Rental.

(i.e. effectively only Rs. 200/- per month including insurance charges for FJUT, CUG and CLIP per line for STD/local line and Rs. 140/- per month for incoming only)

The above concessional offer, as detailed above is valid for minimum 200 new connections booked in the name of Director/any other authority of the Institute.

On the basis of the proposal given by the BSNL, we have worked out our requirement of telephone connections as 387 (205 for offices, 132 for residences and 50 for incoming connections) and our expenditure will be as under:

- A. Initial Deposit Rs. 3,87,000 (Refundable security)
- B. Tariff Plan

i)Monthly rental for local and STD: 337*200 = Rs. 67,400/ii) Monthly rental for L/C only 140 =Rs. 7,000/-

Total Rs. 74,400/- p.m. Rs. 8,92,800/- p.a.

The above proposal is very economical and useful for a leading Institute like ours. It is proposed that we may go ahead with the BSNL for getting 387 telephone connections so that the communication facility in the

Item No.9.35 To consider purchase of new car for the Director of the Institute.

There are four vehicles in the Institute — Car (Ambassador), Tata Sumo, Bus and Pick-up Van. The Car is exclusively meant for Director. The Bus and Pick-up Van are used by the students for educational tours/ purposes. The Tata Sumo is used by the Deans, Chairmen of the Departments, Professor Incharges, Officers and other Heads of the various Committees/sections for local official purposes as well as out station official visits. Very recently anc OMNI Van has been purchased for the students out of the Hostel funds. It will be exclusively used for the student affairs in the emergent cases and Hostels purchases.

There is a dire necessity in the Institute for an additional vehicle for the Senior Administrative Officers and faculty members as they are required to attend official meetings at Delhi, Chandigarh and other places like 11T Delhi, 11T Roorkee and other Institutes/Organizations very frequently, visit Hon' ble courts at the District Headquarters, Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandigarh and Apex Court at New Delhi and perform other duties including purchases at and outside Kurukshetra.

Most of other NITS are having at least 6 vehicles. The Directors of some NITS have been provided Cars such as ESTEEM. The Director NIT Calicut is having BALENO (Maruti).

The MHRD issued instructions in April 2003 that as economy measures no vehicle should be purchased by any organization without obtaining specific approval from the Ministry.

A Committee at the Institute level was constituted to examine the matter regarding purchase of additional vehicle. The recommendations of the Committee are as under:

- 1. A new car BALENO (Maruti) with a cost of Rs. 7.00 lacs (Approx) may be provided to the Director as has been done in case of Director, NIT Calicut.
- 2. Since there is instruction of the MHRD that no vehicle should be purchased without obtaining their specific approval, the new vehicle for the Director may be purchased from the Institute Development Fund earned from consultancy so that there is no financial burden on the Ministry.
- 3. The new vehicle for the Director may be purchased after placing the matter before the Board of Governors.
- 4. While new vehicle will be used by the Director, the existing Tata Sumo and the existing Ambassador Car will be used by the Administrative Officers and the faculty members for official purposes.

The Board may consider and decide.

The above arrangement will not only save the non-plan expenditure but also increase efficiency in maintenance and security of the Institute. However, the present incumbents ernployed against the sanctioned posts in Estate Section, Watch & Ward Section and in various departments may continue on their posts till their retirement.

The work relating to maintenance, security and cleanliness/ sweeping may be got done on contract basis by hiring outside agencies as per requirement of the Institute. Item 9.37 To consider the panel of external experts <u>in</u> various subjects.

As per existing Bye-laws of the Institute, the Director is required to maintain a panel of external experts in various subjects as approved by the Board of Governors, to be revised after every two years. As per latest instructions of the NMR..D, two outside experts to be nominated by the Board of Governors are required to be on the Selection Committees for direct recruitment of faculty as well as promotion/financial upgradation under CAS.

The existing two years term of the panel of the external experts already approved by the Board of Governors in its 4th meeting held on 8.12.2003 has expired on 7.12.2005. Since the CAS interviews were held on 23 rd and 24th December, 2005 and the BOG meeting could not be held at that time, the Hon'ble Chairman, Board of Governors was requested to approve the life span of the existing external experts till the fresh panel is approved by the Board. The Hon'ble Chairman, BOG very kindly approved the same on 3.12.2005.

A notification was sent to Chairpersons of all teaching departments to suggest fresh names of experts who should be from top class Institutions on all India basis. The Chairmen of the Departments sent the names of the external experts by holding meeting of the respective Departmental Affairs Committee. The Director has revised the panel of external experts after making some additions and subtractions therein. The lists containing panel of the external experts are available as Appendix to item 9.37 from pages 248 to 280.

The Board may approve the action taken by the Hon'ble Chairman, Board of Governors regarding the life span of the existing external experts. The Board may also approve the panel of external experts as suggested above for a period of two years w.e.f. the date of this BOG meeting. -248

Intellectual Property Policy for MT, Kurukshetra.

The IP Policy:

This policy is applicable to all NITK personnel, as well as non-MTK personnel associated with any activity of NITK and covers different classes of Intellectual Property — Patent, Copyright, Trade Mark / Service Mark, Design Registration, Trade Secret, Confidential Information and Integrated Circuits Layout.

(I) Ownership:

<u>I (a) Invention(s)</u>, <u>Designs</u>, <u>Integrated Circuit Layouts and other creative works:</u>

Invention(s) including software, designs and integrated circuit layouts, created by NITK personnel without the use of significant NITK resources and not connected with the profession for which employed at NITK, shall be owned by the creator(s).

For Invention(s) including software, desigls and integated circuit layouts, produced during the course of sponsored and/or collaborative activity, specific provisions related to IP made in contracts governing the collaborative activity shall determine the ownership of IP.

NITK shall be the owner of all invention(s) including software, designs and integrated circuit layouts created by teams of NITK and non-NITK personnel, associated with any activity of NITK. Non-MTK personnel, who create invention(s) including software, designs or integrated circuit layouts at NITK but without intellectual contribution of NITK personnel or significant use of NITK resources, shall be the owner of such invention(s).

Except as stipulated above, NITK shall be the owner of all invention(s) including software, desiB'1s and integated circuit layouts created at NITK.

I (b) Copyrightable Work:

Ownership of copyright of all copyrightable work shall rest with the author(s) with the following exceptions:

- a. If the work is produced during the course of sponsored and/or collaborative activity, specific provisions related to IP made in governing such activity shall determine the ownership of IP.
- b. NITK s hall be the owner of the c opyright of work, i ncluding s oftware, c reated by
 - NITK personnel with significant use of NITK resources.

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- c. NITK shall be the owner of the copyright on all teaching material developed by NITK personnel as part of any of the academic programs at NITK. However, the authors shall have the right to use the material in her/his professional capacity. As the traditional exception, NITK shall not claim ownership of copyright on books, publications and presentation materials authored by NITK personnel.
- d. NITK shall be the owner of copyright of work produced by non NITK personnel associated with any activity of NITK with the intellectual contribution of NITK

personnel. However, the authors shall have the right to use the material in her/his professional capacity.

<u>I(c)</u> Trade Mark(s) /Service Mark(s):

Ownership of trade mark(s)/service mark(s) created for NITK shall be with NITK.

In cases of all IP produced at NITK, NITK shall retain a non-exclusive, free, irrevocable license to copy/use IP for teaching and research activities, consistent with confidentiality agreements where entered into by NITK.

(II) Disclosures, Confidentiality and Assignment of Rights:

For sponsored and/or collaborative work the provisions of the contract pertaining to disclosure of creative work are applied.

For all other invention(s) produced at NITK, if the inventor(s) wish to protect the invention(s) they produce, then they are required to disclose the creative work to the IPAC (IP Assessment Committee) at the earliest date using an Invention Disclosure fonn (IDE). All NITK personnel and n on-NITK personnel associated with any activity of NITK shall treat all IP related information which has been disclosed to the IPAC and/or whose rights are assigned to NITK, or whose rights rest with NITK personnel, as confidential. Such confidentiality shall be maintained till the date as demanded by the relevant contract, if any, between the concerned parties unless such knowledge is in the public domain or is generally available to the public.

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(Ill) Assessment of Innovation(s) for Protection:

To facilitate assessment, a three-member IP Assessment Committee (IPAC), of which at least one shall be an expert in the concerned area, shall be formed by the Dean (P&D)/(R&D). The creator(s) would be free to suggest names of faculty who are qualified to evaluate the creative work who may be invited by the Dean (P&D)/(R&D) to be a part of the IPAC.

The I PAC shall assess the disclosure in a month and shall make recommendations to the Dean (P&D)/ (R&D) about the patentability of the invention. The IPAC may make one of the following recommendations:

- That NITK shall take the responsibility of protection of the IP, in which case,
 NITK will initiate appropriate processes.
- ii) That NITK shall not take the responsibility of protection of the IP, in which case, the rights to the disclosed invention shall be promptly reassigned to the creator(s).

The creator(s) may then choose to protect the creative work on their own.

Fillings of IP Applications in foreign countries: Within six months of filing the Complete IP Application in India, NITK shall, based on available information decide on the suitability of protection of the invention in foreign counü•ies. If NITK opts not to undertake such protection in any specific requested by the inventor(s). NITK shall assign rights of the IP in that counfi•y to the creator(s) for the purpose of such protection.

Renewal of IP Rights: A decision on the annual renewal of IP Rights will be taken by a committee consfituted by the Dean (P&D)/ (R&D). If NITK decides not to renew the IPR in any country, then it will assign the rights of the IP in that country to the creator(s) upon a request to that affect from the creator(s). In case of patents, the process of reassignment will be completed in a period of three months before the due date for its renewal.

In all cases where IP rights in any specific country have been reassigned to the inventor(s). NITK shall not claim any share of proceeds earned through that IP in that country excepting for the costs already incurred by NITK.

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(IV) Support:

(IVA) Contracts and Agreements:

All agreement including but not limited to the following categories, undertaken by any NITK personnel and students need to be approved by NITK.

- 1 . Allegiance, Affirmation & Confidentiality Agreement
- 2. Consultation Agreement
- 3. Evaluation Agreement
- 4. Research and Development Agreement (R&DA/MOU)
- 5. License Agreement
- 6. TechnologyTransfer Agreement
- 7. Alternative Dispute Resolution Agreement

8. Classified Information Non-disclosure (specific) Agreement

Director acts as a final signing authority in all the categories of agreements listed above.

(IVB) Obtaining IPR:

If NITK opts to protect the creative work, it shall provide an IPR advisor/Patent Attorney for drafting the IP application as appropriate. NITK shall pay for access to the relevant IP information databases and other associated costs. The inventor(s) shall conduct IP searches, study the prior art and provide the necessary inputs to assist in the drafting of the IP application. N ITK shall bear all costs of drafting and filing an Indian IP application. If NITK chooses to file IP applications in other counffies, then it shall bear the cost of application and other associated costs. NITK shall be free to enter into agreements with overseas institutions for protection and licensing of the IP.

(V)Technology Transfer:

NITK shall strive to market the IP and identify potential licensee(s) for the IP to which it has ownership. The creator(s) are expected to assist in this process.

NITK may contract the IP to a Technology Management agency, which manages the commercialization of the IP.

For the IP for which exclusive rights have not been already assigned to a third party, the creator(s) may also contact potential licensee(s) on their initiative maintaining confidentiality and taking all necessary care so as not to affect the value of the IP through appropriate agreements such as Non Disclosure Agreement (NDA) with the potential licensee(s) during technology marketing discussions.

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If NITK is not able to commercialize the IP in a reasonable time, then it may reassign the rights of the IP to the creator(s) of the IP. Optionally, if NITK has not been able to commercialize the creative work in a reasonable time frame, the creator(s) may approach the Director for the assignments of rights of the invention(s) to them.

(VI) Revenue sharing:

The net earnings from the commercialization of IP owned by NITK would be shared as follows:

Case	Net earnings	Inventor(s)' share	NITK's share
1	For the first amount Q		

2	For the next amount Q	40%
3	For the amounts more than 2Q	

It is suggested that amount Q be initially fixed at Rs. 10 lakhs. The creator(s) share would be declared annually and disbursement will be made to the creator(s), their legal heir, whether or not the creators are associated with NITK at the time of disbursement.

(VID Infringements, Damages. Liability and Indemnity Insurance:

As a matter of policy, NITK shall, in any contract between the licensee and NITK, seek indemnity from any legal proceedings including without limitation manufacturing defects, production problems, desiB1 guarantee, up gradation and debugging obligation.

NITK shall also ensure that NITK personnel have an indemnity clause built-into the ageements with licensee(s) while transferring technology or copyrighted material to licensees.

NITK shall retain the right to engage or not in any litigation concerning patents and license infringements.

(Mil) Conflict of Interest:

The inventor(s) are required to disclose any conflict of interest or potential conflict of interest. If the inventor(s) and/or their immediate family have a stake in a licensee or potential licensee company then they are required to disclose the stake they and/or their immediate family have in the company.

A license or an assignment of rights for a patent to a company in which the inventors have a stake shall be subject to the approval of the Dean (R&D) taking into consideration this fact.

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(IX) Dispute Resolution:

In case of any dispute between NITK and the inventors regarding the implementation of the IP policy, the aggrieved party may appeal to the Director of NITK. The Director shall be assisted in this regard by a three-member committee constituted by him, with at least one member nominated by the aggieved party. The Director's decision in this regard would be final and binding.

(X) Jurisdiction:

As a policy, all agreements to be signed by NITK will have the jurisdiction of the courts in Kurukshetra and shall be governed by appropriate laws in India.

Glossary:

- 1) "Author" means faculty, students, staff or visiting faculty who has/have written or created a creative work.
- 2) "Collaborative Activity" is the research undertaken by NITK personnel in cooperation with industry and/or another researcher(s) who are not NITK personnel.
- 3) "Confidential Information" information not in the public domain and declared confidential by parties as such in MOU/Agreement that has been signed by the parties.
- 4) "Conflict of Interest" or a "Potential Conflict of Interest" exists when an inventor/author is or may be in a position to use either creative work or influence for unmerited personal or family gain.
- 5) "Copyright" means the exclusive right granted by law for a certain period of time to an author to reproduce, print, publish and sell copies of his or her creative work.
- 6) "Copyrightable Work" is a creative work that is protectable under copyright laws. Copyright protection is available for most literary, musical, dramatic, and other types of creative work, including software, teaching materials, multimedia works, proposals, and research reports.
- 7) "Creators" are persons who have produced any original work.
- 8) "Cumulative Earnings" from a patent/patent application.
- 9) "Design Registration" Regisfi•ation of the novel non-functional features such as shape, or ornamentation of a product.
- 10) "MTK personnel" includes but is not limited to the faculty, students, staff or visiting faculty, researchers and scientists at NIT, KURUKSHETRA.
- 11) "Intellectual Contribution" means original technical or artisticcontrib
- 12) "Intellectual Property" includes but is not limited to copyrights and copyrightable materials, patented and p atentable inventions, tangible research results, trademarks, service marks and secrets.
- 13) "IP Assessment Committee (IPAC)" is a committed formed by the Dean(P&D)/ (R&D), which decides on the issues of ownership and patentability among others consisting of a Chairperson, and at least three additional faculty members.

14) "Invention" includes but is not limited to any new and useful process, formula or machine conceived or first reduced to practice in whole or in part, defined within the purview of the Patent Act. Inventor(s) and person(s) who produce and invention.

- .8 15) "Licensing" is the practice of renting the intellectual. property to a third party.
- 16) "Net Earnings" Earnings resulting from the licensing or commercialization of the IP, reduced by the outstanding actual expenses incurred in obtaining and commercialization of the IP.
- 17) "Patent" means the exclusive right granted by law for making, using or selling an invention.
- 18) "PCT Application" A PCT is a system of filing a patent application in several countries through a single application keeping the priority of the first filing in any of the counffies within the PCT system. This is administered by the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) in Geneva. It is not a patent ganting system.
- 19) "Protection of Layout of Integrated Circuits" Layout scheme of integrated circuits that are functionally important.
- 20) "Royalty" is the payment made to an inventor/author or an institution usually for legal use of a patented invention or any Intellectual Property when licensed.
- 21) "Significant Use of NITK Resources" is any usage of NITK's resources in the creation of the invention(s), excess of the routine use of office facilities, computers, library resources and resources available to the general public.
- 22) "Software" means anything executable in a computer.
- 23) "Teaching material" means any material that aids the process of teaching.
- 24) "Trade MarWService Mark" is a distinctive word, symbol or picture or a combination of these, which is used by a business entity to discriminate its products and services from those of other business entities.

"Trade Secret" Usually some information such as **know-how**of commercial or strategic value

A French Delegation comprising of five members of an education group called the n +i (National plus International) through the EduFrance visited our Institute on February 15, 2006. The delegation was led by Professor Trotignon Jean-Pierre, Professor & Executive Director, EduFrance (Reseau n+ i). Presentation of the Academic profile of the Institute was made before the Delegation by Officer In-Charge (Academic Affairs), Dr.Baldev Setia in the presence of the Director, Deans, Chairmen of various departments and the Registrar in the Board Room of the Institute. This was followed by the presentation by the leader of the French Delegation Professor Jean-Pierre. The team proposed the following Program-mes at the

Master's and Ph.D. levels for students of N.I.T. Kurukshetra.

The broad field of co-operation are:

Field of Co-operation

- Co-operation between the two Institutions (N.I.T. Kurukshetra and Institutes from out of (n+i) group) may be established within any field related to Science and Technology.
- Co-operation will concern the promotion and the exchange of students.
- The two Institutions will promote, to their students, the possibilities of studies and training in their partner institutions.
- Co-operation in the areas of Research, Long distance learning programs, short exchanges, invitation of academics, etc.

Programmes suggested by the Delegation include:

• Programmes for periods from 6 months to 2 years duration..

Master's degree with experience in France

The two mutually agreeing Institutions will study the possibilities of awarding a national master degree (India) for well selected students willing to benefit of one experience in France (one semester of research or one year, as a part of the national degree. It is basically one semester or one year done in one engineering institute of the "n+i" network, which will deliver credits in relation with the work done in France.

Funding and Finance

Presently, no financial liability falls on either of the Institutes falling in agreement for the proposed Academic exchange. However, it is expected that both Institutes will try to source the lowest fees to students and/ or to seek financial support for students for cooperative activities from appropriate fillnding institutions with no commitment as such.

The draft of Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) as sent by the French Delegation is attached alongwith.

The matter is placed before the Hon'ble Board for its kind consideration.

General agreement (STEP 1)

Exchange of Students

A cooperation for international Engineering training

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is signed between Name University (hereinafter referred to as N.U) and "n+i" Engineering Institutes (hereinafter referred to as

1. Preamble

N.U and "n+i" Engineering Institutes recognize:

- a. their mutual interest in the fields of training of engineers with international ambitions,
- b. the importance of the role of institutes of higher education's role in promoting international collaboration and increased **contribution** to social development, and N.U and "n+i" Engineering Institutes intend to:
- c. consider separately, a dual training, at post graduate level, to well selected students willing to complete their engineering training in Country and France.
- d. inform ministries (or official bodies) of Education from Country and France about their projects on order to get a legal statement.

The words the two institutions and collaborating institutions in the agreement refer to the N.U and "n+i" Network and exclusively with its partners "n+i" will act as co-ordinator on behalf of its higher education partners.

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2. Field of Cooperation

Cooperation between the two institutions may be established within any field related to Science and Technology,

Cooperation will concern the promotion and the exchange of students.

The two institutions agree to promote, to their students, the possibilities of studies and training in their partner institutions (N.U for French Students and "n+i" Institutes for Country Students).

Cooperation in the areas of Research, Long distance learning programs, short exchanges, invitation of academics, etc. . . could be discussed and will be subject of separate agreements.

3. Promotion and Exchange of Students

- 3.1 The exchange will concern students at first, but exchanges of academic staff (professors, researchers) could be considered in the future for joint supervision of Masters' projects.
- 3.2 This programme is focused on full time students having a minimum of 3 years background in Engineering, Technology or Sciences.
- 3.3 Each institution will select, among their students, highly motivated candidates for studies abroad (selection by N.U of candidates wishing to go to France and by French Engineering Institutes of French candidates for studies or training in N.U).
- 3.4 Students will apply through the "n+i" website. Each partner of this agreement (N.U and "n+i" Institutes) will have access to the application forms of students stored on the "n+i" data base by using a confidential login and password given by "n+i".
- 3.5 In order to respect the French law regarding the rights of people who have personal information stored in a data base, each partner, by signing this agreement certifies that:
 - a) they will never transfer the confidential login and password to anybody even from the same University or Institute,
 - b) they will never use this data basis for any purpose other different than the recruitment of students for Engineering Studies with "n+i" network.
- 3.6 Parties will check hard copies of application "paper" forms of candidates before sending them to the collaborating institution(s) within a reasonable time in advance of the start of the academic programme. These hard copies of the application forms will be sent to "n+i" network who will control and validate electronic applications forms.
- 3.7 N.U and "n+i" network welcoming students for a period from 6 months up to 2 years (or more) will inform the student what kind of qualification they will gain (degree, diploma, certificate, etc..).

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3.8 Students involved in this exchange will receive a certificate for a transfer of credits ECTS in respect with the training done abroad. If the work and the number of credits are in

adequation with the national regulations the students will receive the degree from the foreign institute.

- 3.9 Students of either institution, who wish to undertake a "n+i" programme will be assisted by the host institution for administrative registration and daily requirements including but not limited to accommodation, transport, office, library and laboratory facilities.
- 3.10 The student exchange shall bear on theoretical and practical academic teaching as well as on professional internships.

4. Master's degree with experience in France

The two institutions agree to study the possibility of awarding a national master degree (India) for well selected students willing to benefit of one experience in France (one semester of research or one year, as a part of the national degree. It is basically one semester or one year done in one engineering institute of the "n+i" network, which will deliver credits in relation with the work done in France.

5. Funding and Finance

- 5.1 Students will have to pay the local fees for tuition, insurance, transport and accommodation and any other appropriate expenses for the selected programme, but both institutions agree to source the lowest fees to students and/or to seek financial support for students for cooperative activities from appropriate ftmding institutions but they cannot be responsible if they fail to find any ftnding.
- 5.2 Scholarships (from Government (Embassies scholarships from France), Companies, Regions, International Programmes (EU, ASEM, ..) will, as much as possible, targeted on students participating in this exchange programme.
- 5.3 The collaborating institutions will offer logistic support for initiating the collaboration,

6. Management of the agreement and Administration

6.1 Negotiation, implementation and co-ordination of this agreement falls under the responsibility of:

- 6.2 The contact persons mentioned above can nominate a member of the academic staff within their institutions to co-ordinate the activities,
- 6.3 This agreement shall have a duration of four years, renewable for further four years unless either party gives notice of termination not later than six months prior to the expiry of the existing agreement,
- 6.4 This agreement will take effect upon ratification by the director of the N.U and the director of the "n+i" Engineering Institutes.

Hereby N.U and "n+i" agree to launch the programme (Promotion and Exchange of Students) in establishing collaboration according to the terms and conditions set out in the articles mentioned above.
