a) that the degree be awarded;
b) that the degree shall not be awarded.
i) The thesis is to be resubmitted.
ii) The thesis is rejected on the conclusion that the thesis is not genuinely the work of the candidate.
For (b) (i) above, the Committee, if required, shall provide to the candidate a list of all corrections and modifications to be made in the thesis, including suggestions made by the examiners during the thesis evaluation, and the result of the candidate will be declared after the candidate submits two copies of the corrected thesis certified by the internal examiner that the necessary corrections and modifications have been made.

## R-18

## INSTITUTE SCHOLARSHIP

## R-18.1

Those candidates who are admitted on full-time basis are considered on request, for the award of Institute scholarship of the amount as decided by the Board of Governors and directed by the Government of India from time to time. The scholar must submit a certificate to the effect that he is not in receipt of any financial aid from any other source for pursuing the Ph.D. research work. The scholars getting Institute scholarships are required to provide 8 hrs of work per week as directed by the Head of the Dept// Director.

## R-18.2

In addition, the scholars will be provided contingency grant in accordance with the rules of the Institute.
It is to be noted that admission to the programs and award of scholarship are not linked. Admission to a program does not guarantee the award of scholarship. Those who are not awarded scholarship (under exceptional circumstances like not fulfilling the scholarship continuation criteria etc) can continue with the program as selffinanced scholars. The Institute may provide fee waiver to the self- financed scholars subject to the final approval of Director on the recommendation of DRC/ SRC\& the Dean (Academic).

## R-19

## LEAVE AND ATTENDANCE

All full-time rescarch scholars (with or without scholarship) are required to mark their daily attendance in the attendance register maintained by the Deptt. The Chairman DRC/ SRC shall also maintain a proper leave account of each such scholar. The leave of a scholar should be recommended by his Supervisor and shall be sanctioned by the Chairman DRC/ SRC.
A full -time research scholar is entitled to avail leave as per Leave and Attendance Rules formulated and amended from time to time by the Senate. Presently these are as under:

- A full-time Ph.D. scholar may avaiI 8 casual leaves and 2 leaves in lieu of RH. The scholar will not be entitled to mid-semester breaks/vacations, summer and winter vacation. Any absence from the institute without sanctioned leave may lead to loss of fellowship for the period of absence.
- A full time Ph.D. scholar may be allowed to proceed on long duty leave (maximum up to one year) to some organization if required for research progress. However, it should be with the due approval of competent authority.
- A full time Ph.D. scholar may avail the duty leave for attending one conference/workshop/academic event per semester during vacation period only.
- Any additional leave of any kind can be permitted by the Director on the recommendation of DRC/SRC.
- The women research scholar will be eligible for Maternity Leave as per MHRD rules. However, the minimum registration period will be extended by the leave period only.


## R-20

## CANCELLATION OF REGISTRATION

Registration of a candidate can be cancelled in any one of the following eventualities, with due approval of the Director.
(i) If full time scholar absents himself/ herself for a continuous period of four weeks without prior intimation/ sanction of leave.
(ii) If a scholar resigns from the $\mathrm{Ph} . \mathrm{D}$. programme.
(iii)If a scholar fails to renew his registration within registration period as notified time to time.
(iv) If a scholar does not submit his semester progress report by the stipulated date or his academic progress is found unsatisfactory.
(v) If a scholar does not clear the comprehensive evaluation as stipulated.
(vi)If a scholar is found involved in an act of misconduct and/ or indiscipline and a competent authority has recommended termination. For all purposes, the conduct/ discipline rules applicable to B. Tech. / M.Tech. Students of the Institute shall apply to Ph.D. research scholars also.
(vii) If at any stage, information furnished by the scholar in his application is found false or incorrect.

## R-21

## GENERAL

## R-21.1

Notwithstanding anything contained in these Ordinances \& Regulations, all categories shall be governed by the rules and procedures framed by the Senate, and in force from time to time.

## R-21.2

Any doubt or dispute about the interpretation of these Ordinances and Regulations shall be referred to the Director whose decision shall be final.

## R-21.3

Eligibility for admission to Ph.D. programs in different disciplines may, from time to time, be reviewed, approved by the Senate, and implemented.

All exceptions and issues not covered above may be referred by the Director to the following committee.

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## S 35.04 To note the approval of Chairman, Senate for revised seat matrix for

 UG \& PG programmes due to implementation of EWS reservation.The MHRD vide letter no. F.No. 35-412018-TS.III dated 18th January, 2019 directed the Institute to implement EWS quota in all programmes. Accordingly, the SCSA in its $56^{\text {th }}$ meeting held on 28.3.2019 vide item no. SCSA 56.1 approved the revised seat matrix for all programmes including EWS reservation.

Later on, the MHRD vide letter No. 35-4/2019-TS.III dated 26.4 .2019 approved the increase of 215 seats ( 107 during 2019-20 \& 107 during 2020-21) for UG admissions and 124 seats ( 62 during 2019-20 \& 62 during 2020-21) for PG admissions due to implementation of EWS category ( $25 \%$ of actual admission). This increase has been finalized using the figure 1353 as actual admissions for UG \& PG of last year. Further, as per approval, the total student strength after increased intake for EWS during the session 2019-20 for UG and PG should be 1522.

After discussion with Competent Authority and in line with above MHRD letter, the revised seat matrix for UG \& PG admission was prepared. The Chairman, Senate approved the revised seat matrixes and these were sent to CSAB, CCMT and other concerned for UG \& PG admissions for academic year 2019-20 (relevant documents and revised seat matrixes attached from pages $\qquad$ to pages $\qquad$ o2).

The CCMT-2019 vide their email dated $1^{\text {st }}$ May 2019 expressed their inability to incorporate revised seat matrix at the last stage of CCMT-2019 process. Therefore, the earlier approved seat matrix for PG programme was considered by the CCMT-2019 for M.Tech. admissions during 2019-20. The Institute also apprised MHRD regarding the reply received from CCMT-2019.

## OFFICE MEMORANDUM

## Subject: Reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) for admission in Central Educational Institutions.

In accordance with the provisions of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act 2019, and the reference of Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment vide OM No. 20013/01/2018-BC-II dated 17th January 2019, enabling provision of reservation for the Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes, it has been decided to provide reservation in admission to educational institutions subject to a maximum of ten per cent of the total seats in each category. This would not apply to the minority educational institutions referred to in clause (1) of Article 30 of the Constitution of India.
2. The provision of reservations to the Economically Weaker Sections shall be in accordance with the directions contained in the OM No. 20013/01/2018-BC-II dated 17th January 2019 of the Ministry of Social Justice \& Empowerment and shall be subject to the following:
a) The reservations shall be provided to EWSs for admission in Central Educational Institutions, (as defined in clause (d) of section (2) of The Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006) from the academic year 201920 onwards.
b) The above reservation would not be applicable to the 8 institutions of excellence, research institutions, institutions of national \& strategic importance as specified in the Schedule to The Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006, as amended from time to time, and appended to this OM, and to the minority educational institutions referred to in clause (1) of article 30 of the Constitution.
c) Every Central Educational Institution shall, with the prior approval of the appropriate authority (as defined in clause (c) of section 2 of The Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006), increase the number of seats over and above its annual permitted strength in each branch of

study or faculty so that the number of seats available, excluding those reserved for the persons belonging to the EWSs, is not less than the number of such seats available, in each category, for the academic session immediately preceding the date of the coming into force of this O.M.
d) Where, on a representation by any Central Educational Institution, the appropriate authority is satisfied that for reasons of financial, physical or academic limitations or in order to maintain the standards of education, the annual permitted strength in any branch of study or faculty of such institution cannot be increased for the academic session following the commencement of this Act, it may permit such institution to increase the annual permitted strength over a maximum period of two years beginning with the academic session following the commencement of this Act; and then, the extent of reservation for the Economically Weaker Sections shall be limited for that academic session in such manner that the number of seats made available to the Economically Weaker Sections for each academic session shall not reduce the number and the percentage of reservations provided for SC/ST/OBC categories.
e) The scheme for implementing the reservation for the EWS shall be displayed on the website of the institution as soon as possible, but no later than 31st March 2019.
3. The Chairman UGC, Chairman AICTE and Chairperson NCTE and the Bureau Heads of the Department of Higher Education in the Ministry of Human Resource Development responsible for management of the Institutions of National Importance are requested to ensure immediate compliance of this OM.
4. This issues with the approval of the Minister for Human Resource Development.

I am directed to refer to the communications issued by the NITs Division in connection with above mentioned subject and to state that in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019, and the feference of Ministry of Social astice and Empowerment vide Office Memorandum No.20013/01/2018-BC-11 dated 17 January, 2019, enabling provision of reservation for the Economically Weaker Sections (EWSS), Offfice Memorandum No.12-4\%2019-U1 dated 17 ${ }^{\text {h }}$ January, 2019 was issued regarding implementation of ten percent reservation for the EWSs in Central Educational Institutions (CEIS).
2. In this context, the undersigned is directed to convey the approval of the Govermment for creating an additional 6,631 seats $(4,480$ additional seats during 2019 .. 2020 and 2,151 additional seats during 2020-2021) in 20 old National Institutes of Technology (NITs) and Indian Institute of Engineering Science and Technology (IIEST), Shibpur (West Bengal) at an additional financial allocation of 670.25 crore. The exact amount, which is made available in the approval, under Object Head - 31 and 36 is given in Annexure. These funds would be made available in two years viz. 2019-2020 and 2020-2021.
3. The scheme would be implemented by the NITs and IIEST, Shibpur in the following manner:-
(i) The Institutes, based on the funding indicated in Annexure, will start the process of execuition immediately.
(ii) Recruitment of faculty and non-faculty staff may be done within the sanctioned strength only as per extent guidelines / recruitment rules.
(iii) The works, which are in the Wegative list (as per OM No.16-2/2017-TC dated $16^{\text {th }}$ July, 2018) shalt not be proposed by the institution.
(iv) The Detailed Project Reports (OPRs) for infrastructure shall not be for more than the indicated amount, and snatl be subinitted by the institute before $1^{\text {st }}$ July, 2018 : for applaisal as per extant guidelines. After appraisal / approvaly the fastritute shall file application before HEFA for sanction.
(v) The HEFA loans would be totally serviced (Principal amount and interest) through additional Grant-in-Aid to the Institutions over a ten year peniod.
(vi) Wherever the institute is still under development phase and the infrastructure is not yet completed, no financial additionatity shall be allowed for infrastructure. Wherever constructions of campuses are. underway, necessary modification in the design may be attempted in order to optimize the costs.
(vii) After 2020-2021, the additional posts of the faculty and the additionality for scholarships / mainteriance expenditure would be factored in the regular budget requifements.
(viii) All Institutes shall monitor the implementation of scheme including creation and filling of seats in admissions and shall submit its report to the Committee constituted by the Ministry for overall monitoring of the Scheme in NITs / IIEST.
4. All the institutes are requested to kindly follow the instructions contained in this communication for smooth implementation of EWSs reservation.

## Sub: Proposed Guidelines for Improving Institute Academics

A committee was constituted for proposing guidelines / modifications for improving Institute academics vide letter No. D(Acad.)/2019/11 dated 1.1.2019 further modified on 3.1.19. In this regard, the committee held its meeting on 14.01 .2019 at 4.30 pm in the office of the undersigned. The following were present in the meeting:
I. Prof S.N. Sachdeva, CED (in Chair)
II. Prof J.K. Chhabra, CoED
III. Prof Rajoo Pandey, ECE Deptt.

After deliberations on the subject matter, the following guidelines / steps are proposed to improve the Institute academics which in the opinion of the committee may be implemented within the existing senate rules:


1. Time table and names of course coordinators must be made available at least a week in advance of the start of the semester. The course coordinator should hold a meeting with all the concerned faculty of the course in this week to give necessary instructions about coverage of the course.
2. The question papers should be set in a manner so as to meet the requirements of the Course Outcomes of the course.
3. The question paper in each course should be set in such a manner that a student has no choice to leave a topic if he/she wants to score very good marks. For this purpose, total questions to be set would be 05 with all questions to be attempted by the students. However, internal choice within a question may be given in one or maximum two questions. The questions should be fairly spread over entire syllabus to cover whole of the syllabus avoiding repetitions with previous year questions. The toughness level of a question paper should be such that $50 \%$ of it can be attempted by even an average student, $30 \%$ by good
 students and the rest $20 \%$ by exceptionally good students.
4. Academic calendar should ensure that all days of the week from Monday to Friday have almost equal number in the semester. In case of loss of some days) due to holidays / Institute festivals, the required adjustment in time table of the days to be followed in the last one / two weeks of the semester must be indicated by academic section well in advance preferably at the start of the semester itself.

5. Assignment sheets/quizzes (written), minimum 02 per course, must be given in the Tutorial classes and students must be asked to submit the solutions in a time bound manner. For the subjects with no tutorial, the same may be given in the lecture classes.

6. Course File consisting of (a) Scheme \& Syllabus with CO-PO mapping, (b) Lecture Plan, (c) Tutorial Plan with plan of delivery of assignment sheets / quizzes duly indicated; (d) Mid sem \& End sem question papers with one or two evaluated answer sheets must be kept ready for each course by the concerned faculty.
7. Practical records should be checked regularly preferably on each turn by the concerned faculty.
8. End Sem Project evaluation be made by a committee appointed by the HOD.

9. Only those students should be considered for the Best project award who apply for this award in response to a notification to be issued by the respective HODs in the last week of the semester. The students who apply for it would be evaluated through presentation made by the student / other means like running of the project / programme by a committee to be appointed by HOD, preferably consisting of all section heads of the department, wherever applicable.
10. Presently, many of the Lecture halts are inappropriately equipped with LCD projectors in a manner that both black board and projector cannot be used simultaneously. The LCD projector may be shifted to the side so that both can be used at the same time. For this purpose white boards may be provided on the side of existing black boards so that the same can be used both for Projection as well as by marker if some faculty so wants.
11. All Lecture class rooms may be provided with projection facility and PCs along with improvement in ambience through sound proofing, false ceiling and curtains / blinds. As PG accreditation is due shortly, the PG class rooms may be taken up on priority for this purpose.
