- (iii) **Approval of the Chairman, Senate regarding extension in maximum registration period for the duration of maternity leave period (maximum six months).**

As per clause R-19 of Ph.D. ordinance which states, "The women research scholars will be eligible for maternity leave as per MHRD rules. However, the minimum registration period will be extended by the leave period only", there is no mention of extension in maximum registration period for submission of Ph.D. thesis for a maternity leave case. Due to this, the maximum registration period for submission of Ph.D. thesis is same for all research scholars and hence, the female research scholars are at disadvantage. In view of this, the Chairman, Senate has granted permission to extend the maximum registration period by the maternity leave period only (maximum six months) in case of female research scholars for submission of Ph.D. thesis.

At the outset, the Hon'ble Director I/c and Chairman, Senate welcomed all the members of SCSA and briefed the members regarding agenda items. Thereafter, the agenda was taken up.

The following decisions were taken:

SCSA 60.01 To consider and decide on extension of formula based evaluation up to Nov/Dec 2021 examination session

SCSA deliberated on the agenda in detail and approved that the formula based evaluation scheme notified vide no. Acad/2020/274 dated 11.05.2020 be effective up to Nov/Dec 2021 examination session with the following points to be incorporated in the notification to be issued from the office of the Dean (Academic):

1. The students of B.Tech. 5th and 7th semester who were blocked for AY 2021-22, due to pending reappears, will be again provisionally promoted to the respective semesters for AY 2021-22 subject to passing 1st year (1st and 2nd semester) and 2nd year (1st to 4th semester) respectively up to Nov/Dec 2021 examination session, failing which they will be reverted back and have to register for 5th and 7th semester in AY 2022-23.

The candidate availed maternity leave of six months w.e.f. 03.07.2017 to 02.01.2018 vide letter reference no. Acad/17/ dated 12.07.2017 as per Clause R-19 which states that "The women research scholar will be eligible for Maternity Leave as per MHRD rules. However, the minimum registration period will be extended by the leave period only".

The candidate requested for extension in department on 22.12.2020. The case was discussed in DRC of Civil Engg. Department held on 24.02.2021 and DRC recommended "the extension for a period of six months i.e. up to 29.07.2021 for submission of thesis in lieu of maternity leave availed by the scholar."

As per clause R-6.2(a & b) of 2014-15, the minimum and maximum time for period of registration for thesis submission is two and five years respectively for full time Ph.D. research scholars and three and six years for part time Ph.D. research scholars.


In Clause R-19 of Ph.D. ordinance which state that "The women research scholar will be eligible for Maternity Leave as per MHRD rules. However, the minimum registration period will be extended by the leave period only", there is no mention of extension in maximum registration period for submission of thesis for a maternity leave case. However, as per interpretation of Clause R-19 female research scholars get benefits only in minimum registration period for submission of thesis (two/three and half year) not in maximum registration period for submission of thesis. Due to this female research scholars are at disadvantage stage as compared to other research scholars who get maximum five/six years for full time and part time for submission of thesis.







However, the students of M.Tech. (2nd year) & Ph.D. were permitted to avail lab. facilities at the Institute vide notification no. Nil dated 16.10.2020 and no. Acad./2020/1063 dated 16.12.2020 following the guidelines and subsequently, the students of B.Tech. (8th & 4th semester) were also allowed for offline lab. classes and final practical exams. vide notification no. Dean (R&C)/20/04 dated 30.1.2021.

Further, the Senate in its 44th meeting held on 30.9.2021 vide agenda item no. S 44.05 approved the schedule for offline lab classes, final practical exam., project/dissertation work etc. during October – December 2021. The schedule along with guidelines was notified vide notification no. Acad./2021/1136 dt. 2.10.2021. Approximately 2700 students visited the institute as per this schedule with the students, faculty and staff of the Institute/hostel following the appropriate COVID-19 protocol. To get feedback on the management of hostels and difficulties faced, if any, during this period, a meeting was held in the office of Dean (Acad.) on 18.11.2021 with Dean (SW), Chief Warden (Boys & Girls) and Prof. I/C (Acad.). (Copy of the minutes of the meeting is enclosed). During this period, as shared by Chief Warden (Boys & Girls), the hostels were run smoothly while following the appropriate COVID-19 protocol.

Recently, in pursuance of order issued by Haryana State Disaster Management Authority, Haryana Chandigarh vide memo No. DMC-SPO-2020/12773 dt. 27.11.2021, the District Magistrate of Kurukshetra has issued order whereby the fully residential universities in the district are directed to plan re-opening their campuses for physical classes as per their respective semester schedules after adopting SOPs for COVID appropriate behaviour. University Administration may endeavor to get

all students, faculty members and staff (including the outsourced ones)
fully vaccinated (copy attached).



Now, in pursuance of order issued by the Haryana State Disaster Management Authority, Haryana, Chandigarh vide memo No. DMC-SPO-2020/12773, dated 27-11-2021 and in view of powers conferred upon me under the Section 30 and 34 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, I, Mukul Kumar, I.A.S., District Magistrate-Cum-Chairperson, District Disaster Management Authority, Kurukshetra hereby extend the Mahamari Alert-Surakshit Haryana from 28-11-2021 (05:00 AM onwards) to 31-12-2021 (till 05:00 AM) in district Kurukshetra alongwith guidelines to be implemented (during the period) issued vide orders dated (DMC-SPO-2020/5215) dated 02-05-2021 and modified subsequently vide orders dated 09-05-2021 (DMC-SPO-2020/5435), 16-05-2021 (DMC-SPO-2020/3093), 23-05-2021 (DMC-SPO-2020/5761), 30-05-2021 (DMC-SPO-2020/6008), 06-06-2021 (DMC-SPO-2020/6221), 13-06-2021 (DMC-SPO-2020/6415), 20-06-2021 (DMC-SPO-2020/6642), 27-06-2021 (DMC-SPO-2020/6864), 04-07-2021 (DMC-SPO-2020/7195), 11-07-2021 (DMC-SPO-2020/7567), 18-07-2021 (DMC-SPO-2020/7899), 24-07-2021 (DMC-SPO-2020/8096), 31-07-2021 (DMC-SPO-2020/8419), 08-08-2021 (DMC-SPO-2020/8743), 22-08-2021 (DMC-SPO-2020/9299), 05-09-2021 (DMC-SPO-2020/9818), 18-09-2021 (DMC-SPO-2020/10401), 03-10-2021 (DMC-SPO-2020/10943), 15-10-2021 (DMC-SPO-2020/11380) and 11-11-2021 (DMC-SPO-2020/12059).

The following modifications are provided in earlier orders:-

- i. In indoor spaces, gatherings of upto 50% of the hall capacity are allowed with a ceiling of maximum 200 persons whereas in open spaces, gatherings will be allowed upto 500 persons. For gathering exceeding 500 persons prior NOC from District Administration, KKR shall be mandatory subject to strict observance of social distancing and COVID-19 appropriate safety norms.

The following relaxations shall continue as permitted vide earlier orders:-

- a) Restaurants, bars (including in hotels and in malls), gyms, spas and club houses/Restaurants/Bars of the Golf Courses) are allowed to open to their full capacity with adherence to requisite social distancing and other COVID-19 appropriate safety norms.

- c) Fully residential Universities in the district are directed to plan re-opening their campuses for physical classes as per their respective Semester Schedules after adopting SOPs for COVID

S 45.07 To consider the proposal for extending the attendance relaxation of maximum 10% to all the students having less than 75% attendance during COVID-19 period.

The Senate in its 30th meeting held on 6.6.2017 vide item no. S 30.04 considered the minimum attendance requirement as eligibility for appearing in end semester examinations and decided that minimum requirement of attendance for being eligible to appear in the end semester exam. shall be 75%. However, this may be relaxed upto a maximum of 10% i.e. upto 65% by the Director.

Those having attendance below 65% are not allowed to appear for the end-semester examination of that/those course (s) and shall be notified as "Detained". All such students, depending upon their attendance shall be further categorized into two categories A & B, as follows:

Category A: (Attendance between 50 % to 64 %) A student has two options

Option 1: To repeat the course through classroom/lab studies and obtain whatever grade he can obtain

Option 2: He/She is permitted to attend classes of the next semester and can appear for the mid-semester examinations of that/those course(s) when the opportunity is available. However, such student is restricted to a grade of "D" only.

Category B: (Attendance below 50%) Such students have to mandatorily repeat that/those course (s).

The classes have been conducted in online mode since the odd semester of AY 2020-21 until the odd semester of AY 2021-22 due to COVID-19 pandemic. During this period, the students have faced difficulties due to issues like internet connectivity, their remote locations, and frequent failure of electricity in their respective areas. Besides, some of the students themselves or someone in their families got infected of COVID-19 due to which their online classes suffered badly. These reasons resulted in their low attendance in some of the courses leading to their detention.

In view of above, it is proposed to extend the benefit of maximum 10% relaxation in attendance to all the students having less than 75% attendance for academic year 2020-21 and odd semester of AY 2021-22 as a one-time relief measure on account of COVID-19 pandemic.

If approved, the students falling under Category-B above, having basic attendance greater than or equal to 40% but less than 50%, will qualify to opt for maximum 'D' grade in such courses. The students having attendance below 40% have to mandatorily repeat such courses.

The Senate may consider and decide.

Item 30.04 To consider the attendance requirement as eligibility for appearing in the End-semester examinations.

Presently, a student, registering for courses of studies in a semester is required to have 75% attendance in each course to be eligible to appear for the end semester examinations. In course (s) where the attendance is less than 75%, the student is not eligible to appear for the end-semester examination in that/those courses(s) and is declared 'Detained' in that/those course (s).

However, the Institute rules provide for some attendance benefits in lieu of some authorized activities, cultural, technical & sports events, medical compulsions and unforeseen compelling reasons. According this has turned out to be a very complex process. Also, it is very difficult to quantify some of intangible works. As per the general feedback of the faculty, it has led to unnecessary documentation and accounting without addition to any academic value.

It is proposed that the minimum requirement of attendance for being eligible to appear in the end semester shall be 75%.

However, this may be relaxed upto a maximum of 10% i.e. upto 65% by the director. Those having attendance below 65% are not allowed to appear for the end-semester examination of that/those course (s) and shall be notified as 'Detained'. All such students, depending upon their attendance shall be further categorized into two categories A & B, as follows:

Category A: (Attendance between 50 % to 64 %) A student has two options

Option 1: To repeat the course through classroom/lab studies and obtain whatever grade he can obtain

Option 2: He/She is permitted to attend classes of the next semester and can appear for the mid-semester examinations of that/those course(s) when the opportunity is available. However, such student is restricted to a grade of 'D' only.

Category B: (Attendance below 50 %)Such students have to mandatorily repeat that/those course (s).

A Tabular presentation is given below:

The Senate may kindly consider and approve the proposal.

Thereafter, presentations were made by Dean (Academic) and Heads of Departments of Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Humanities and Social Sciences, Civil Engg., Electrical Engg., Computer Engg. & IT, Electronics & Comm. Engg., Mechanical Engg. and Production and Industrial Engg. Presentations were duly interspersed with discussions.

It was resolved to adopt the new revised curriculum for the Bachelor of Technology Programme of the Institute w.e.f. 2017-18 batch onwards. Further, the Director was authorized to consider the suggestions etc. of the members in consultation with Dean (Acad.) and others, if required.

Further, grading system needs to be introduced and an agenda may be put up for deliberations in next Senate.

- S 30.04 To consider the attendance requirement as eligibility for appearing in the End-semester examinations.**

The issue was deliberated upon in detail. The Senate approved the proposal of criteria of minimum requirement of attendance for being eligible to appear in the end semester examinations as proposed in the agenda.

- S 30.05 To consider change in awards after re-evaluation.**

The Senate discussed the issue w.r.t. two aspects

- 30.05.1 Possible shortcomings in the existing rule of re-evaluation
30.05.2 Continuance/Discontinuance of the procedure of re-evaluation.

For 30.05.1, it was decided that if the re-evaluated marks change the status of a student in that paper from "Fail to Pass", it will be considered, even though the change in marks may be less than 15%. This shall also apply to the existing candidates whose cases are under consideration presently.



S 45.08 To consider the proposal for additional extension of six months beyond 24 months of the initial registration for passing the Ph.D comprehensive examination during COVID-19 period.

As per Clause R-9 of Ph.D. Ordinance, the candidate is required to pass the comprehensive examination within 12-18 months from the initial date of registration. If due to compelling adverse circumstances, a scholar is not able to pass the comprehensive examination within 12-18 months period, then on his/her request and the recommendations of DRC, an extension may be allowed for a maximum period of six months only i.e. upto 24 months of his/her initial registration.

It is pertinent to mention that during the period of COVID-19 pandemic, the students have faced difficulties on multiple accounts such as limited or not so frequent interaction with the supervisors, less access to lab/library facilities etc. Besides, some of the students themselves or someone in their families got infected of COVID-19 with some causalities even in the families. Therefore, few students could not pass the Ph.D. comprehensive examination within the stipulated time.

Requests of the scholars have been received in the Academic Section seeking extension of time period beyond 24 months of their initial registration for passing the Ph.D. comprehensive exam.

In view of this, it is proposed to provide additional extension of six months beyond 24 months of the initial registration for passing the Ph.D comprehensive examination to all such scholars as a one-time relief measure on account of COVID-19 pandemic during the period starting from even semester of AY 2019-20 until the odd semester of AY 2021-22. The minimum registration period requirement will get extended by six months, the period of additional extension. If the scholar has got deregistered on account of non-clearance of Ph.D. comprehensive examination, the duration of his/her deregistration period will be counted as dead period, however, the scholar will be required to pay the normal semester fee for the dead period. Further, the scholarship for the duration of additional extension will be stopped. Other terms & conditions will remain same.





- **Abstract:** TIG welding is one of the most widely used welding techniques due to its versatility and ease that can be maintained in almost all type of working conditions. Stainless Steel (SS304) possessing high strength and toughness is usually known to create major challenges during its welding. Stainless Steel (SS304) is suitable for TIG welding with good weld ability and production economy. In this study, Taguchi's DOE approach is used to study the effect of welding process parameters on weld bead hardness. Three input parameters current, gas flow rate and no. of passes were selected to ascertain their effect on the hardness of weld bead. The results show that during the welding of Stainless Steel (SS304) current is the most significant factor followed by no. of passes and gas flow rate in that order. The experimentation has been carried out by using L-9 OA as standardized by Taguchi and the analysis has been accomplished by following standard procedure on raw data as well as S/N data analysis. It is revealed that all the three selected parameters—current, no. of passes and gas flow rate—affect both the mean value and variation around the mean value of the selected response i.e. weld bead hardness. The results have been validated by confirmation experiments.

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


