appropriate guidelines. Subsequently, the students of other semesters will be called, keeping into consideration the evolving situation of COVID-19 pandemic. The Senate authorized the Chairman, Senate to decide the dates for calling the students of different semesters on campus.

However, teaching learning will commence for even semester as scheduled in online mode and as per the academic calendar until the students are called on campus. Even after the students are called on campus, the theory classes will still continue to be conducted in online mode till further notification. The practical classes will be conducted in offline/ hybrid mode.

The modalities of end semester examinations for even semester for the AY 2021-22 will be decided later on.

Proposal for teaching learning methodology for even semesters of UG & PG programs for AY 2021-22

At present, the classes and also the examinations of all UG & PG programs are being conducted in online mode as per directions of Central/State Govt. due to prevailing conditions of COVID-19. However, the Institute has successfully facilitated the lab. classes, dissertation & research related work of UG, PG and Ph D. students in hybrid/offline mode during this period by inviting the students on campus. Lot of requests have been received from the students, especially B.Tech. final year, for opening the campus for offline classes. Also, there are State Govt, guidelines to this effect for the residential Universities/Institutions.

In view of above and in line of the agenda item no. S 45.06, it is proposed that:

- (i) The teaching learning for final year students of UG and PG programs and the Ph.D. students be conducted in blended mode (theory classes in online mode & lab. classes in offline/hybrid mode) by following COVID-19 appropriate guidelines. The guidelines in brief are explained as under:
 - a. The students be invited on campus, the dates for which to be decided by the Chairman, Senate, suitably keeping into consideration the evolving situation of COVID-19 pandemic.
 - The students must be fully vaccinated for COVID 19.
 - The students must follow COVID appropriate behavior all the time during their stay in the campus.
 - In case of exigency, the students must take permission of the respective HoD/School Coordinator/Warden before leaving the campus.
- The teaching learning for 2nd semester of B Tech, be conducted in online mode only due to COVID 19 pandemic.
- (iii) The teaching learning for other even semesters of UG and PG programs will be conducted in online mode to start with and the decision to conduct teaching learning in blended mode on the similar lines as per point no. (i) above may be taken by the Chairman, Senate keeping into consideration the evolving situation of COVID-19 pandemic.

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- (iv) The modalities of end semester examinations for even semester for the AY 2021-22 will be decided later on. However, the mid semester exams. (both regular and reappear) will be conducted in online mode. The end semester reappear exams, for the session May/June 2022 will be conducted following the same mode as will be decided for regular even semester for AY 2021-22.
- (v) Examination of terminal semester of M Tech, and MCA students be conducted as per guidelines approved for AY 2020-21, although, in 42nd Senate meeting, under item S 42.10, it was decided that the Senate's decision vide S 36.08 regarding evaluation of PG dissertation/internship/project work notified vide Aad /2019/1238 dt. 21.11.2019 will be implemented wielf next academic year i.e. 2021-22.

The following decisions were taken: -

SCSA 62.01 To discuss and decide the modalities of end semester examinations of even semester of AY 2021-22.

The SCSA discussed the modalities of end semester examinations and decided that the online mode of examination will be followed for the even

semester of AY 2021-22 with the guidelines as approved by the Senate in its 40th meeting vide item no. S. 40 08 and will be notified again by the office of Dean (Acad.). The possibility and feasibility of the proctored examination may be explored by Prof. Brahmjit Singh. Dean (P&D)

S 46.04 To consider grant of mercy chance to the students to re-appear in the mid and/or end semester examinations of B.Tech., M.Tech., MBA and MCA after the expiry of maximum duration of the course as a one-time measure invoking the Diamond Jubilee Celebration.

The Institute is entering the Diamond Jubilee year and commencing with the year-long celebrations starting 1st July 2022. Invoking the Diamond Jubilee Celebration, it is proposed that a one-time mercy chance may be given to reappear in the mid and/or end semester examinations to all those students of B.Tech., M.Tech., MBA and MCA, who have completed maximum duration of their course and still have re-appears in some subjects.

It is pertinent to mention that as per the existing rules, there is a provision of mercy chance for eligible students of B.Tech. programmes after a gap of one year from the completion of maximum duration of eight years of the course (as per the eligibility conditions notified vide letter no. Acad./32nd Senate/171 dated 23.02.2018). For the rest of the programmes, no such provision exists and therefore, the registration of students is automatically terminated after the expiry of maximum duration of the course.

It is also proposed that all such students may be allowed to re-appear in mid and/or end semester examinations of the Academic Year 2022-23. These students may be charged Rs. 5000/- per re-appear as examination fees.

If approved, this one-time measure will be a great relief to all such students who have not been able to complete their degrees within the stipulated course duration.



The technology is changing at a very fast pace and so are changing the industry requirements of skilled manpower. This is reflected in the current trend of Industry 4.0 requiring automation and data exchange in manufacturing processes, cyber physical systems, IoT, cloud computing etc. The use of Artificial Intelligence, Data Science, and Machine Learning is revolutionizing the way industry works. Therefore, there is huge and urgent demand of skilled manpower in these areas.

To cater to the huge demand of skilled manpower in these innovative technology areas, the need is felt for starting new B.Tech. programmes in these domains. The same was discussed and reinforced in the meetings of all the Deans/HoDs of the Institute held on 14.02.2022 & 17.2.2022 respectively. After detailed deliberations, it was decided to explore the possibility for the establishment of 'School for Innovation Technologies' (A Multidisciplinary Approach) with following four different interdisciplinary UG courses from the academic session 2022-23 under self-financing mode with an intake of 120 in each course and tuition fee to be charged will be double of the normal tuition fee of B.Tech. programmes running in the Institute.

- i. IIOT (Industrial Internet of Things)
- ii. Robotics and Automation
- Al and Data Science
- iv. Al and Machine Learning

Further, no tuition fee waiver will be applicable to these students. The admission process and the reservation policy of the Govt. of India will be same as applicable for other B.Tech. programmes. These programmes are being offered in many reputed Institutions across the country and are running successfully.

These programmes may be started under the School of Innovation Technology (to be established) in self-finance mode with intake of 120 in each course. This way, the student strength may increase by 2000 in the next four years. Accordingly, the HoDs/School Coordinators may plan and prepare the proposals and suggest some other new UG/PG programmes as well. (Action to be taken by HoDs/School Coordinators in coordination with Dean (P&D)).

- HoD, Computer Applications put forth the idea of starting Master by Research Programme of two years' duration. (Action to be taken by HoD, CA).

- 8 HoD, Civil Engineering raised the issue of low placements of students of Civil Engg. To this effect, the Hon'ble Director suggested to include some subjects from the domain of CSE/IT etc., as appropriate, in the curriculum to enhance the placements. (Action to be taken by HoD, Civil Engg.).
- HoD, Humanities & Social Sciences was entrusted with the responsibility of proposing the course (s) to be offered to the students for their holistic personality development with value education, life skills, report writing skills, interview facing skills, psychometric skills etc. as the essential components. (Action to be taken by HoD, Hum. & SS).
- The Hon'ble Director suggested to re-design the curriculum with 75% courses to be department specific and 25% courses as open electives in line with the choice based credit system (CBCS), as visioned in the New Education Policy 2020. - The Hon'ble Director suggested that there should be a policy in place for weeding out the obsolete equipment/material. (Action to be taken by Prof. I/C Stores).
- The Hon'ble Director emphasized the need of NSS cell in the Institute and local community connect. In this regard, the office of the relevant Dean will initiate the action. (Action to be taken by Dean (SW)).
