1. Accreditation of M.Tech. programmes

Thirteen of the Nineteen M.Tech. programmes and the MBA programme were got accredited for three years.

2. B.Tech, Curriculum Revision in line with NEP-2020

The process for curriculum revision for all the B.Tech. programmes has been initiated in line with NEP-2020 focusing on value based education which will be made effective from the Academic Session 2022-23.

3. Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)

Efforts were made to enhance the collaborative research and academic activities by entering in an MoU with the Academic and R&D organisations. The following MoUs have been signed recently.

4. Establishment of Thought Lab in the Institute

- (ii) To gain insights on Holistic Personality Development by creating interest among youth for values and spiritualties etc.

5. Establishment of Indian Knowledge System (IKS) Cell in the Institute

Indian Knowledge System (IKS) is an innovative cell under Ministry of Education (MoE) at AICTE, New Oelhi. An Indian Knowledge System Cell has been inaugurated in the institute on 09.04.2022 to promote interdisciplinary research on all aspects of IKS, preserve and disseminate IKS for further research and societal applications. The vision of this cell is to establish, guide and monitor subject-wise interdisciplinary research groups comprising of researchers from institutes, centres and individuals. It contributes in promoting and enabling research to address the societal challenges faced today in areas such as holistic health, psychology, neuroscience, nature, environment, and sustainable development etc.

6. Establishment of Students' Council

To make the students participate in the student related activities of the Institute and develop their career, personality and organizational skills through interactive programs with the faculty, administration and society, a Students' Council has been constituted in the Institute.

A large number of Conferences / Seminars / STC / FDPs were organised in the Institute contributing to the growth and development of the faculty and students and also in enhancement of academic interactions with renowned academictans and researchers.  Governor of Haryana was the Chief Guest.
- Two days National Workshop on Value Based Education from April 9-10,
 2022 where Dr. K.K. Aggarwal, Chairman, NBA was the Chief Guest.
- Two days Workshop on Role of Bhagavad Gita in Promoting World Security and Peace from March 10-11, 2022 where Commander V K Jaitly was the Chief Guest.

8. Training & Placement

The Institute campus placement drive has taken of so very well for the Academic Session 2022-23 with leading companies visiting the campus for recruitment. The final year B.Tech. students of the Institute has bagging jobs at companies like Microsoft with an annual package as high as INR 51 lakh.

9. Cultural Exchange Program between Students of Telangana and Haryana. The Cultural Exchange Program between Students of Telangana and Haryana is being planned to be organized tentatively in the month of September 2022 at NiT Kurukshetra. In this program, it is planned to invite a delegation of nearly 100 students from NIT Warangal and other higher educational institutions from across the state of Telangana for which the invite has already been sent to NIT Warangal to coordinate. Shri G. Kishan Reddy, Hon'ble Minister of Tourism, Culture and Development of North Eastern Region of India has consented to be part of the proceedings subject to his availability.

18. Diamond Jubilee Convocation

The Institute has entered Diamond Jubilee Year of its inception (1963) and therefore, a series of activities are being planned to be organized as part of yearlong celebrations starting 1stJuly 2022. The Diamond Jubilee Convocation is one such significant event being planned for two batches in the month of October 2022.



11. Faculty Recruitment

Process of faculty recruitment, at the level of Assistant Professor Grade-I, has been initiated with the advertisement already floated for a total of 99 vacancies in various departments.

12. Green campus initiatives

Green campus initiatives have been put in process such as e-mobility, vehicle free zones, covered pedestrian paths, cycle tracks, piped music, beautification of campus through placing murals, national flag, graffiti and eco club etc.

13. Starting of a School in the Campus

It is planned to start a school in the campus under the aegis of Kendriya Vidyalaya Sanghathan and Ministry of Education for which the land has been identified and further process is being initiated.

14. Infrastructure Development

Keeping in view of ageing buildings, hostels and residential housing, plans are afoot in developing eco-friendly, net zero green buildings, international level hostels, hybrid classroom complexes, Multimedia labs for enhancing visual and audio content. This all is being planned to be set up during the next 5 years.

15. Starting of New Courses in Evolving Technology Areas

It is planned to promote development of Multi-disciplinary futuristic ICT based B.Tech level self-financing courses along with online diploma, certificate courses in niche technology areas, empathy and spiritual awareness etc., primarily focusing on revenue generation and self-sustainable education models keeping in line with NEP-2020 objectives.

Besides the above major activities, various routine academic activities are being conducted to improve Teaching, Learning and Research competence of the faculty, improve student learning, and student employability. In nutshell, constant efforts are made towards bringing in betterment in the overall academic ambience in the Institute and thus taking the institute to higher level of excellence.

Out of said 15 Assistant Professors Grade-II, the services of some Assistant Professors Grade-II were regularized on completion of Ph.D. degree in terms of the decision of the Board of Governors taken in its 43rd meeting held on 23.01.2018 as well as in terms of the MHRD, Govt. of India OM F.No.2-5/2017-TS.III dated 17.07.2017. As per Chapter-39 titled Confirmation stated in the Swamy's Complete Manual on Establishment and Administration, a probationer employee will be confirmed with effect from the date on which he successfully completes the period of probation. The relevant clause is reproduced below:

"A person appointed against a permanent post as a direct recruit with definite conditions of probation is to be confirmed in the grade with effect from the date on which he successfully completes the period of probation. Out of said 12 Assistant Professors Grade-II, the services of some Assistant Professors Grade-II were regularized on completion of Ph.D. degree in terms of the decision of the Board of Governors taken in its 43rd meeting held on 23.01.2018 as well as in terms of the MHRD, Govl. of India OM F.No.2-5/2017-TS.III dated 17.07.2017. In terms of the Clause-24(v) of the Model Recruitment Rules issued by the MHRD, Govl. of India vide OM FNo.33-7/2011-TS.III dated 14.03.2012 it has been clarified that "On award of Ph.D. degree, an incumbent will be given regular position with effect from the date of original contract appointment with probation of one year effer regularization. As par Chapter-39 titled Confirmation stated in the Swamy's Complete Manual on Establishment and Administration, a probationer employee will be confirmed with effect from the date on which he successfully completes the period of probation. The relevant clause is reproduced below:

"A person appointed against a permanent post as a direct recruit with definite conditions of probation is to be confirmed in the grade with effect from the date on which he successfully completes the period of probation. The decision whether he should be confirmed or is probation extended should be taken soon after the expiry of the initial probationary period, i.e., ordinarily within 6 to 8 weeks and communicated to the employee together with the reasons in case of extension. Even though the meetings of the DPC may be held after the termination of the period of probation of direct recruits, a person appointed against a permanent post with definite conditions of probation is to be confirmed in the grade with effect from the date on which he successfully completes the period of probation. A probationer who is not making satisfactory progress or who shows himself to be inadequate for the service should be informed of his shortcomings well before the expiry of the original probationary period so that he can make severe efforts at self-improvement."



The Character & Antecedents reports in respect of all above said 12 nos. of Assistant Professors Grade-II have been received from the concerned District Administration and nothing has been found adverse there in the reports. 



 To generate new knowledge by engineering in cuttingedge research and to promote academic growth by offering state-of-the-art undergraduate, postgraduate and doctoral programmes.

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- To identify, based on an informed perception of India, regional and global needs, areas of specialization upon which the institute can concentrate.
- To undertake collaborative projects which offer opportunity for long-term interaction with academia and industry.
- To develop human potential to its fullest extent so that intellectually capable and imaginatively gifted leaders can emerge in a range of professionals.

(C) Objectives:

- To provide the best educational infrastructure for imparting high class education in science and technology and a creative atmosphere for interdisciplinary research both by students and faculty.
- To increase the student capacity to meet the growing demands for industry.
- To maintain global standards in student-faculty ratio, research output, publications in journals and placement of students.
- To participate in and contribute to nation building through various flagship schemes of the Government of India/State Government requiring technological interventions thereby spurring economic growth for the welfare of the masses.
- To provide research and development consultancy, which will foster healthy industry-academia partnership, thereby providing a competitive edge to the indigenous manufacturing.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties here to express their common understanding as under:

(A) Ministry of Education shall

- (i) Provide financial support to the Institute to meet its recurring and non-recurring liabilities in such manner and on such conditions as prescribed by the Government of India, (hereinafter referred to as Gol) from time to time,
- (ii) Help raise other resources, including loan from HEFA for expansion of infrastructural facilities, which have a direct

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bearing on the performance of the Institute as committed in this MOU.

- (iii) Provide guidance and advice in administrative, financial, legal and such other matters as the Institute may require in fulfilling its mandate.
- (iv) Provide support in obtaining necessary clearances and approvals, as and when required, from various Ministries, Departments, and Agencies of the Central/State Governments.
- (v) Provide support in resolving any dispute with any other authority of the Central/State Government or a private party, as and when required.

(B) THE INSTITUTE shall comply with:

- (i) Without prejudice to what has been stipulated in the National Institutes of Technology, Science Education and Research Act, 2007, as amended from time to time and the Statutes framed thereunder, the institute is expected to recover user charges at rates not lower than cost recovery norms
- (ii) Specific provisions as contained in the OM No. 1/1/2016-ElliA dated 13.01.2017 in relation to revision of pay scales in accordance with the recommendations of the 7th CPC and any other instruction issued by MoE from time to time on issues pertaining to the Institute.
- (iii) The provisions of the GFR, 2017, including the instructions on financial advice for autonomous bodies, as mentioned in Rule 229(viii) and those concerning release of grants-in-aid, submission of audited accounts, performance report etc.
- (iv) Guidelines issued by the Central Vigilance Commission (CVC) in matters of vigilance and disciplinary proceedings etc.
- (v) Uniform accounting procedure in accordance with the guidance issued by MoF.
- (vi) Provisions of the National Institutes of Technology, Science Education and Research Act, 2007, the Statutes framed thereunder and the instructions issued by MoE from time to time with regard, inter-alia, to creation of posts and framing of Recruitment Rules.

(C) THE INSTITUTE shall also ensure to:

- (i) Finalize any understanding or MoU with any other party including similar organizations abroad in accordance with the provisions of the Act of 2007 and the Statutes framed thereunder, and the instructions issued by MoE from time to time.
- (ii) Frame Rules for its corpus fund indicating clearly the IRG that can be transferred to such fond or utilized from such fund and items for which such expenditure can be incurred.
- (iii) Have clearly defined Delegation of Powers' for deciding all administrative and financial matters.
- (iv) Shall run courses, to the extent possible, to be self supporting without the need for cross subsidization as well as over-charging from students for flagship courses.
- (v) Ensure that all its accounts are audited by internal auditors regularly and formal audit by the C&AG in terms of the provisions of the Act of 2007 and the Statutes framed thereunder.
- (vi) Ensure that all financial operations are done under the EAT, Module of PFMS.
- (vii) Present an outcome budget along with annual action plan so that it can be dovetailed in the outcome budget of MoE.
- (viii) Comply strictly with the timelines for submission of annual reports and annual audited accounts to MoE for the purpose of being tabled in Parliament within 9 months from close of the financial year.
- (ix) Forward to MoE any information required by it to satisfy any requirement related to Parliamentary Matter, RTI, Public Grievances, VIP References, Court Cases, Notices from Commissions and Statutory Authorities and also inputs for formulation of any policy.



BoG 58.14 To report the appointment of non-teaching posts at the institute.

The Institute had received twelve (12) requests/applications for the appointment under Compassionate Ground. A Committee was constituted vide letter No.Gen.-I/3716/7541 dated 16.11.2016 to consider these cases for appointment under compassionate grounds and recommendations thereof. After having several meetings, the Committee had considered all the cases for appointment under compassionate ground. The committee had scrutinized all the applications and found nine (09) applicants eligible. Three (03) applicants found ineligible due to lack of essential qualifications. The committee had met several times to examine the cases and after detailed discussions decided to develop some transparent system for such recruitment.

- 1. As per the scheme, the compassionate appointments can be made upto a maximum of 5% of vacancies falling under direct recrultment quota in any Group C or D posts (Now Group C only). No compassionate appointment can be made if there is no vacancy. At present there are 52 vacancies under direct recruitment quota in Group C posts. Therefore, as per the above restriction of 5%, three persons (52x5%) can be considered for appointment under compassionate ground (Ref.DoP&Ts O.M. No.14014/02/2012-Estt.(D) dated 16.01.2013, clause 7.f).
- Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India, Department of Revenue, Central Board of Indirect Taxes & Customs, New Delhi vide letter F.No.A.12012/52/2018-AD.III.B dated 05.05.2019 had circulated 100 points criterion for compassionate appointment to ensure transparency and maintain uniformity and to avoid litigation in the selection process.

Based upon the guidelines of DoPT, criterion as approved by the competent authority and information available in the office, the order of merit for the appointment under Compessionate Ground is as under:

The services of above Assistant Professors Grade-II were regularized on completion of Ph.D. degree in terms of the decision of the Board of Governors taken in its 43rd meeting held on 23.01.2018 vide Agenda Item No. 43.26and Clause-24(v) of the Model Recruitment Rules issued by the MHRD, Govt. of India OM F,No.33-7/2011-TS.III dated 14.03.2012along with probation for a period of one year from the date of original contract appointment on the same terms & conditions mentioned in their respective appointment letters. The Clause-24(v) of the Model Recruitment Rules issued by the MHRD, Govt. of India vide OM F, No.33-7/2011-TS.III dated 14.03.2012 is re-produced below:

"On award of Ph.D. degree, an Incumbent will be given regular position with effect from the date of original contract appointment with probation of one year after regularization. For all future records, the starting point of service will be the date on which the contract service started originally."

In terms of the decision of the Board of Governors taken in its 47th meeting held on 09.01.2019, vide Office Order No.Estt.-I/3084 dated 20.05.2019 the designation



of Assistant Professor with AGP of Rs.8000/- & AGP of Rs.7000/- were re-designated as Assistant Professor Grade-II w.e.f.01.01.2016.

As per Chapter-39 titled Confirmation in the Swamy's Complete Manual on Establishment and Administration, a probationer will be confirmed with effect from the date on which he successfully completes the period of probation. The relevant clause is reproduced below:

"A person appointed against a permanent post as a direct recruit with definite conditions of probation is to be confirmed in the grade with effect from the date on which he successfully completes the period of probation. The decision whether he should be confirmed or his probation extended should be taken soon after the expiry of the initial probationary period, i.e., ordinarily within 6 to 8 weeks and communicated to the employee together with the reasons in case of extension. Even though the meetings of the DPC may be held after the termination of the period of probation of direct recruits, a person appointed against a permanent post with definite conditions of probation is to be confirmed in the grade with effect from the date on which he successfully completes the period of probation. A probationer who is not making satisfactory progress or who shows himself to be inadequate for the service should be informed of his shortcomings well before the expiry of the original probationary period so that he can make severe efforts at self-improvement."

The Character & Antecedents reports in respect of all above said 03 nos. of Assistant Professors Grade-II have been received from the concerned District Administration and nothing has been found adverse in the reports. Further, there is no vigilance case or disciplinary proceeding is either pending or contemplated against the concerned faculty members.

The special reports about work and conduct of all the 03 Assistant Professors Grade-II have been obtained from the respective Head of the Departments and the same have been assessed by the committee constituted for the purpose. The committee has recommended for confirmation of all the 03 nos, of Assistant Professors Grade-II from the due dates of their confirmation.



The matter of Confirmation in respect of some Assistant Professors Grade-II was placed before the Board of Governors in its 55th meeting held on 29.07.2021 vide Agenda Item No.55.12and the Board decided as under:

"The Board considered the matter of confirmation of Assistant Professors Grade-II. After detail discussion, the Board decided that this issue be referred the Ministry of Education for obtaining the views of Ministry."

In compliance to the decision of the Board of Governors, vide letter No.Estt.-I/4009 dated 17.09.2021 and subsequent letter No.Estt.-I/1126 dated 06.04.2022, the matter was referred to the Ministry of Education, Govt. of India for advice.

Thereafter, in response to the Institute letter No.Estt.-I/1126 dated 06.04.2022, the Ministry of Education, Government of India vide letter F.No.10-4/2022-TS.III dated 20.04.2022 has clarified that the confirmation of Assistant Professors Grade-II may be carried out as per the terms and conditions contained in their appointment letters and Recruitment Rules prevailing at that point of time. BoG 58.17 To consider the proposal for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalaya in the institute campus from the academic year 2023-24.

The MHRD vide letter No.42-10/2019-TS.III dated 20 December, 2019 had sent a letter alongwith a letter of Commissioner, Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan note F.No.11029-8/2014-KVS (Admn.I) dated 17.12.2019 to furnish the proposals, if any for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas in the campuses of NITs.

In the letter dated 17.12.2019, it has been mentioned that at present 07 Kendriya Vidyalayas are functioning in ITTs, 02 in NITs (NIT, Silchar and NIT, Agartala) and 13 in the campuses of Central Universities. The main feature as prescribed for opening of KVs are as under:-

- e) Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan opens KVs in the campuses of Central PSUs or Institute of Higher Learning like Central Universities, IITs, etc. for the education of children of the employees of those institutions.
- b) Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan provides the teachers and other staff, however, all the financial liabilities are to be borne by the Sponsoring Project/IHL authorities. Besides, the Sponsoring Authorities have to pay the Administrative Overhead Charges (AOC) also to KVS @ 15% of the actual expenditure of the concerned project Kendriya Vidyalaya, in addition to recurring and non-recurring expenditure.

 Besides, the Sponsoring Authority has to provide land, building and other infrastructural facilities to KVS, free of cost.

d) Residential accommodation to 100% staff of the proposed KV.

 e) No Grants are given to KVS by Govt, of India for managing such KVs under Project/IHL Sector.

 The MoU is required to be executed between KVS and the Spensoring Authority.

A copy of the MHRD letter dated 20.12.2019 along with letter of Commissioner, Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan F.No.11029-8/2014-KVS (Admn.I) dated 17.12.2019 are enclosed as <u>Annexure - 58.17 (i) from pages 120 - 137</u>.

It is relevant to mention here that the Regional Engineering College Kurukshetra was established in 1963. A significant landmark in the history of this institution is the up-gradation of REC Kurukshetra to NiT Kurukshetra with Deemed University status with effect from 26th of June, 2002. The year 2007 was memorable for NiT Kurukshetra as the institute was conferred the status of an institution of National Importance by the Government of India. During the REC, Kurukshetra regime, a primary school was established in the campus for the education of children of the employees. Due to some reasons, the school has been closed.

The Institute is celebrating its Diamond Jubilee year starting from 1st July, 2022 to 30th June, 2023. In this yearlong celebrations, various activities like new innovative Departments will be established and construction works like lecturer half complexes, Hostels & Residential complexes will be made. Indeed, these have been proud moment for everybody associated with REC, Kurukshetra/NIT Kurukshetra to see the Diamond Jubilee Celebrations scheduled to be organized.

During the Diamond Jubilee Year, the Institute is planning to establish a Kendriya Vidyalaya in its campus for the education of children of the employees from the academic year 2023-24. As per the requirement of the Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan, Ministry of Education, Govt. of India, the sponsor i.e. NIT, Kurukshetra will be responsible to provide the following:

- 1. Permanent Vidyalaya building as per the specifications of the KVS.
- 2. 100% staff quarters to all the staff of the Kendriya Vidyalaya.
- All recurring and non-recurring expenditure including 15% administrative overhead charges and future development expenditure.

In this regard, the sponsor institute shall remit the budgeted amount of recurring/non-recurring expenditure in advance installments to the KVS i.e. first installment in the month of April and second in the month of October for each financial year.

In this context, it is stated that the institute has identified a piece of land measuring 5 acres for the establishment of permanent KV building and staff quarters in its campus. A building is also available for the commencement of KV classes I to V (single section in each class) from the academic year 2023-24 with consequential growth based on feasibility.

In view of the above, it is proposed that in terms of Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan letter F.No.11029-8/2014-KVS (Admn.i) dated 17.12.2019 an MoU is required to be executed between KVS and the Sponsoring Authority i.e. NIT, Kurukshetra to open a new Kendriya Vidyalaya in the NIT, Kurukshetra campus from the academic year 2023-24.

The matter is placed before the Board for consideration and decision.

The Secretary, HE & SE, MHRO has desired in the meeting held on 16.12.2019 to explore the possibilities of opening new Kendriya Vidyalayas in the campuses of (ITs/NITs/Central Universities functioning all over the country under the Ministry of HRD.

In this connection it is submitted that at present 07 Kendriya. Vidyalayas are functioning in IITs, 02 in NITs and 13 in the campuses of Central Universities, Details are given in Annexure-I.

In this regard the main features as prescribed for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas under Institute of Higher Learning (IHL) Sector are given hereunder:-

- a) Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan opens KVs in the campuses of Central PSUs or Institute of Higher Learning like Central Universities, IITs, etc. for the education of children of the wards of employees of those institutions.
- b) Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan provides the teachers and other staff, however, all the financial liabilities are to be borne by the Sponsoring Project/ IHL authorities. Besides, the Sponsoring Authorities have to pay the Administrative Overhead Charges (AOC) also to Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan @ 15% of the actual expenditure of the concerned project Kendriya Vidyalayas, in addition to recurring and non-recurring expenditure.
- c) Besides, the Sponsoring Authority has to provide land, building and other infrastructural facilities to KVS, free of cost.
- d) Residential accommodation to 100% staff of the proposed KV.
- e) No Grants are given to KVS by Govt. of India for managing such KVs under Project/ IHL Sector.

f) A complete set of proformae alongwith MoU to be signed: between KVS and the Sponsoring Authority is attached at Annexure-II.

Accordingly, it is requested that the Directors/VCs of such I/Ts/NiTs/Central Universities, where Kendriya Vidyalaya is not functioning presently, may be directed suitably to submit complete proposals for opening of Kendriya Vidyalaya to Kendriya Vidyalaya. Sangathan for further necessary action and also that a copy of the same may also be endorsed to KVS (Hqrs.).

KENDRIYA VIDYALAYA SANGATHAN (ADMN. -I SECTION)

NORMS FOR OPENING NEW KENDRIYA VIDYALAYA IN THE CAMPUSES OF PUBLIC SECTOR UNDERTAKING / INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING

Proposals are very often received from the Public Sector Undertakings for opening Kendriya Vidyalaya in their compuses. These proposals can be considered if the following pre-requisites are satisfied and the concerned department agrees to abide by the standard terms and conditions given below:

I PRE-REOUISITES:

The Kendriya Vidyalayas are meant to serve the educational needs of the children of transferable employees so that their education may not be disrupted owing to a change in their medium of instruction, consequent upon their parents' transfer from one linguistic region to another. Accordingly the transferability condition is central to the opening a Kendriya Vidyalaya. Keeping in this in view, the pre-requisites which should be satisfied for opening a Kendriya Vidyalaya in the campus of Public Sector Undertaking/Institute of Higher Learning are given below:

- 1. The Public Sector Undertaking should have branches/offices in the different linguistic regions.
- The employees of the Department should be (de-facto) transferable from one branch office to another and to Headquarters.
- 3. When there is a concentration of at least 500 employees of the Govi. of India Undertaking, and when there are at least 200 children (300 children in the case of hig cities) willing to be emolted in different classes of the proposed Kendriya Vidyalaya to begin with.
- 4. No alternative educational facilities should be available at the station.
- 5. The Public Sector Undertaking/Institutions of Higher Learning shall bear all the recurring and non recurring expenditure on the proposed Kendriya Vidyalaya.
- The Department shall provide, free of cost, suitable land and building for housing the Vidyalaya.
- The Department shall provide, free of cost, land and building for the future development of the Vidyalaya.

- The Department shall provide all equipment, free of bost to the Vidyalaya.
- 9. The Department shall provide spitable residential accommodation to the teaching and other supporting staff on the same basis and at the same rates as prescribed by it for its own employees.
- The proposed Kendriya Vidyalaya shall be administered and goverhed in accordance with the rules of the Sangathan, as amended from time to time.
- 11. The Sangathan shall not admit any liability towards the staff and students of any existing school running inside the compus of the Department.
- 12. The children of the employees of the Department will get first priority in matters of admission. However, the children belonging to the eligible entegories will be considered against seats available after accommodating the children of the simployees of the Department.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR OPENING OF A RENDRIYA VIDYALAY. IN THE CAMPUSES OF PUBLIC SECTOR UNDERTAKING/INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING

NOTE:

Acceptance of terms and conditions by the sponsoring authority is a pre-condition for the opening of a Kendriya Vidyalaya in the Public Sector/ Institution of Higher Learning. The sponsoring authority is required to submit, in quadruplicate the acceptance and confirmation of the terms and conditions coumerated below:

I. GENERAL

a) The Sangathan does not take over any existing school

b) It opens a new Kendriya Vidyalaya of its own with uniform curriculum and pattern of education

c) The Sangathan does not van KG or Pre-primary classes.

In no case the Sangathan will take the liability of appointing/ absorbing any of the staff member of the existing school in the service of the Sangathan. The existing staff members may, however, apply in response to the advertisement for various categories of posts advertised by the Sangathan from time to time

II. FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS:

A new Kendriya Vidyalaya may be opened in the campus of a Government of India Undertaking or Institution of Higher Learning, if it agrees to bear the recurring and non-vectoring expenditure, including accommodation, land and future developmental facilities as also the proportionate overhead charges on the proposed Vidyalaya

III. LAND AND BUILDING FOR THE PROPOSED KENDRIYA VIDYALAYA

The apprisoring authority will have to provide a suitable piece of land free of cost on which Vidyalaya building/staff quarters/ Hostel-playground will have to be developed and constructed by the sponsoring authority out of its own fund in accordance with Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan norms. The requirement of land as per location is given below.

The Sponsoring Authority will, however, be liable to provide land as per 'desirable norms' but where that does not become possible despite best efforts, they would be under obligation to make available land at least to the extent of 'minimum norms', free of cost. Demarcation of suitable land at site is pre-requisite for opening of Vidyalaya.

In case of existing building, at least 20 sooms of such sizes as to abcommodate at least 40 students per section are required. This accommodation may be sufficient for classes up to V with two sections including consequential expansion of the Kendriya Vidyalaya for 3-4 years. This may also include Principal's room, staff room, library room, office and accommodation for other miscellaneous activities like music, NCC, Scouting and Guiding, SUPW etc. A sketch map of the accommodation indicating the size of the rooms proposed to be provided may be enclosed. Temporary accommodation embe provided to bouse the classes shall not be withdrawn unless KVS is satisfied with alternate arrangements made in this regard by the sponsoring authority.

IV. RESIDENTIAL ACCOMMODATION:

Gent percent residential accommodation will have to be provided on prigrity basis by the sponsoring authority on the same terms and conditions as applicable to their own staff of corresponding status.

ADMISSIONS:

V.

Admissions in Kendriya Vidyalayas are regulated on the sole criterion of the test of transferability of the parent i.e. the number of transfers a parent has undergone during the praceding seven years. The children of the employees who have undergone more number of transfers during the preceding seven years will get preference over these children whose parents have undergone lesser number of transfers during the same period.

i) PRIORITIES TO BE FOLLOWED IN GRANTING ADMISSIONS IN KENDRIYA VIDYALAYS UNDER PUBLIC SECTOR UNDERTAKINGS/INSTITUTE OF HIGHER LEARNING

a) Children and grand children of employees of the Public Sector Undertakings/ Institutes of Higher Learning which finance the concerned Kendriya Vidyalayas.

b) Thereafter, the priorities given for Kendriya Vidyalayas under Civil/Defence Sector, as produced below, will follow in the same

sequence:-

 Children of transferable Central Govt, employees including exservicement.

ii. Children of non-transferable Control Covt. employees including ex-servicemen.

iii. Children of transferable and non-transferable employees of Autonomous bodies/Public Sector Undertaking Institute of Higher Learning.

iv. Children of transferable State Government employees,

- v. Children of non-transferable employees of State Government.
- vi. Children of transferable and non-transferable employees of Autonomous Bodies/Public Sector Undertakings/Institute of Higher Learning of the State Governments.

vii. Children from any other category...

No deviation from the aformatic admission policy as approved by the Gavt, of India will be made. The admissions to the proposed Kembrya Vidyalayas will not, therefore, be automatic. The students will be administered admission test and will be accorded admission to the class for which they are found fit and eligible. Children coming on transfer from other Kendriya Vidyalayas will be automatically admisted.

VI. STAFF:

The entire staff will be appointed by the Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan on the scales of pay and terms and conditions prescribed from time to time by the Sangathan.

VII. VIDYALAYA MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE:

The Vidyalaya Management Committee will be constituted in accordance with the pattern prescribed by the Songathan under the provisions of Article 28 and Article 29 (Chapter-IV) of Education Code for Kendriya Vidyalayas.

VIII: AFFILIATION:

The School will get itself affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi at the appropriate time.

- IX. In the event of violation of the terms and conditions for running the Kendriya Vidyalaya by the sponsoring authority the Sangathan will have the right to take action as per the MOD executed by the Sponsoring Authorities and KVS.
- X. Further, aforesaid terms and conditions are subject to modification in the light of the directive of Govt. of India/Board of Governors' decision taken from time to time.

The terms and conditions as referred to above are accepted and confirmed.



These are to be placed before the Board of Governors in its meeting to be held on 30th March, 2022 (or approval so that further necessary action may be initiated.

A copy of the above minutes of the 46th meeting of the Senate is enclosed as *Annexure* – 58.18 (iii) on page 143 - 144.

It is planned to promote development of Multi-disciplinary futuristic ICT based B.Tech level self-financing courses along with online diploma, certificate courses in niche technology areas, empathy and spiritual awareness etc., primarily focusing on revenue generation and self-sustainable education models keeping in line with NEP-2020 objectives.

The technology is changing at a very fast pace and so are changing the industry requirements of skilled manpower. This is reflected in the current trend of Industry 4.0 requiring automation and data exchange in manufacturing processes, cyber physical systems, IoT, cloud computing etc. The use of Artificial Intelligence, Data Science, and Machine Learning is revolutionizing the way industry works. Therefore, there is huge and urgent demand of skilled manpower in these areas.

To cater to the huge demand of skilled manpower in these innovative technology areas, the need is felt for starting new multi-disciplinary B.Tech. programmes in these domains. These are market driven courses and will also prove to be futuristic technology development courses in view of the current scenario in the world. These programmes are being offered in many reputed institutions across the world and are running successfully.

The NITs will be involved in initiating continuous interaction with the industry, sharing the industry experiences, understanding industry needs and providing the required support to the corporate world, as well as opportunities to students to work in alliance with industry. Further, the institutes will develop multi-disciplinary work culture and enhance industry institute linkage.



As the admission under DASA category is not to the extent as expected by the NITs and to attract more international students, these kinds of innovative, multi-disciplinary programmes may be offered with all international standards and the intake of students in each course can be upto 120 students or according to the infrastructure available with the respective Institute. With the start of these courses, large number of foreign students will be attracted to take admission in NITs.

To start these multi-disciplinary programmes with international standards, adequate funds are required. The operational charges/expenditure for first two years is minimal. Thereafter, in the subsequent years, the operational charges will increase, due to which their operation by using Government grant and with the normal tuition fee charged for B.Tech. programmes will be difficult. To cope with this increase in the expenditure, the Institute can avail the financial assistance from HEFA and the repayment of the same will be borne out of the fees collected from the students in these courses. These innovative programmes will sustain with the tuition fee to be charged @ double the normal tuition fee of existing B.Tech. programmes. Further, no tuition fee waiver may be applicable to these students.

Illustration: Students Intake - 120, Fees – Rs. 2.4 Lacs per student. The expenditure and the surplus which will remain with the Institute after four years will be as under:-

- Total Fees Collection—Rs. 28.80 Crores approx.
- Total Expenditure (Salary of Faculty, Staff and other Misc. Expenses)
 Rs. 24.27 Crores approx.
- Surplus Funds Rs. 4.53 Crores approx.

In this manner, if the Institute avails Rs. 50.00 Crores through HEFA, it can be repaid in 12 years easily. Besides, the Institute can also generate revenue through Consultancy and other services.

The NIT Kurukshetra is planning to establish a new School of Innovation Technology with four different multi-disciplinary B.Tech. courses from the academic session 2022-23 under self-financing mode. The Senate considered the proposal and as per Clause 8(xli) of the First Statutes of NITs, the Senate recommended to the Board for stating four new B.Tech. programmes. The Board in its 57° meeting



held on 30.03.2022 considered the proposal and decided that the matter be placed in the next meeting of the Board with more details.

It is relevant to mention here that the 13th meeting of the Council of NITSER is likely to be held shortly. In this regard, the Ministry has invited proposals for the agenda items from all the NITs and IIEST, Shibpur. In reference to the above, the institute has submitted some agenda items. One of the proposed agenda item for the NITSER Council meeting is "to consider the proposal for the introduction of innovative multi-disciplinary B.Tech. programme through self-finance mode in NITs".

The admission process and the reservation policy of the Govt. of India will be same as applicable for other B.Tech. programmes.

In view of the above, it is proposed that the new initiative of Institute for the establishment of innovative multi-disciplinary four B.Tech. programmes may be considered as pilot project from the academic session 2022-23 under self-finance mode with an intake of 120 students per programme. The admission process and the reservation policy of the GovL of India will be same as applicable for other B.Tech. programmes. "The tuition fee may be charged at double the normal tuition fee of existing B.Tech. programmes and also no tuition fee waiver may be applicable to these students."

The matter is placed before the Board for consideration and decision.

BoG 58.18 To consider the representation dated 11.11.2021 of Dr. Ram Kumar Tittal, Assistant Professor Grade-II, Chemistry Department, of the Institute against Charge Sheet dated 11.10.2021.

Dr. Ram Kumer Tittal had applied to this institute to the post of Assistant Professor in the discipline of Chemistry against the Advertisement No.14/2012 in which he had submitted NIL information at Sr.18 & Sr. No.19 where the information regarding the previous & present employment was required. In response to offer letter No.Gen.-1/SRD/12/2100 dated 01.04.2013, Dr. Ram Kumar Tittal had joined the services of this Institute on 25.04.2013(FN).

Vide letter No.NC/173-176/2013-2014 dated 02.05.2013, the Secretary, Management Committee, Nehru College, Chhibramau, Kannauj (UP) had informed to this Institute that Dr. Ram Kumar Tittal had applied for Leave without pay for a period of one year vide his application dated 22.04.2013 which was not approved by the Competent Authority and as such he was being absent from duty w.e.f.24.04.2013 from the said College without prior permission of the Competent Authority, so he was advised by the said College to behave as per rules. A copy of the letter dated 02.05.2013 is enclosed as <u>Annexure – 58.19 (i) on page 151</u>.

At the time of his joining in the Institute on 25.04.2013(FN), neither he was relieved properly by the Nehru College, Chhibramau, Kannauj (UP) to join the services of this Institute in response offer letter dated 01.04.2013 nor any Extraordinary Leave (without pay) was granted to him by the said College, meaning thereby, he was enjoying two employments simultaneously at the same time which is against the rules. As such, he had violated the Clause-13 of his offer letter dated 01.04.2013 which is reproduced below:

"If any declaration given/information furnished by you is false or if you are found to have wilifully suppressed any material information/facts, you will be liable to be removed from service and any such other action as the competent authority may deem necessary."

A copy of the relevant page of offer letter dated 01.04.2013 is enclosed as <u>Annexure - 58.19 (ii) on page 152</u>. Thereafter, vide application dated 28.02.2018 received through diary No.2399 dated 01.03.2018 Dr. Ram Kumar Tittal had requested to count the experience for a period of 04 years and 02 months for the services rendered by him with Nehru Coflege, Chhibramau, Kannauj (UP). His request was considered and vide letter No.Estt.-I/PF/5136 dated 05.10.2018, he was asked to explain his position for enjoying two employments simultaneously and for violating Clause-13 of his appointment letter dated 01.04.2013 as referred above. In addition to above, vide letter No.Estt.-I/PF/5135 dated 05.10.2018, the Principal, Nehru College Chhibramau, Kannauj (UP) was requested to furnish his comments in this regard as per record of their College. Copies of the letter dated 28.02.2018 & letters dated 05.10.2018 are enclosed as *Annexure* – 58.19 (iii) from pages 153 to 158.

In response to the letter No.EstL-I/PF/5136 dated 05.10.2018, vide representation dated 11.10.2018, Dr. Ram Kumar Tittal had explained that he had applied to NIT, Kurukshetra for the Post of Assistant Professor in the discipline of Chemistry against Advertisement No.14/2012 wherein essential qualification was Ph.D., relevant experience was none, other essential qualification was One Paper accepted for Publication in an SCI Journal, desirable requirements were two SCI Journal Papers or One Patent may be based on Ph.D. work and age was preferably below 35 years. He had further stated that he had fulfilled the minimum required condition and hence he had mentioned NIL experience at Sr. No.18 & 19 in his application form. As such his reply was found unsatisfectory and he was Charge-sheated vide Memorandum No.Estt.-I/PF/4289 dated 11.10.2021 under Rule-16 of CCS (CCA), 1965. Copies of the letters dated 11.10.2018 & dated 11.10.2021 are enclosed as *Annexure – 58.19 (iv) from pages 159 - 171*.

In other side, in response to this Institute letter No.Estt.-I/PF/5135 dated 05.10.2018, vide letter dated 15.10.2018 received through diary No.217 dated 23.10.2018, the Principal, Nehru College Chhibramau, Kannauj (UP) had furnished point-wise comments and also quoted the comments of Secretary, Management Committee, Nehru College Chhibramau, Kannauj (UP) which says that acceptance of employment in other Institution without prior permission of the previous Institute comes under the category of indiscipline and his language in his entire correspondence with

their College also comes under the category of indiscipline, so all the due payments along with salary in respect of Dr. Ram Kurnar Tittal, Lecturer, Chemistry Department are adjourned with immediate effect. The Principal has further stated that his resignation from their College has been accepted w.e.f.21.04.2013 vide their letter dated 19.05.2018. Copies of the letters dated 23.10.2018 & dated 19.05.2018 are enclosed as *Annexure – 58.19 (v) from pages 172 – 173*.

On the request dated 21.10.2021 of Dr. Ram Kumar Tittal, vide letter No.Estt.-I/PF/4677 dated 10.11.2021 the period to submit the written statement in response to the Chargesheet was extended w.e.f. 27.10.2021 to 10.11.2021. He had submitted his representation on 11.11.2021 to the Chemistry Department of the Institute meaning thereby he could not submit his written statement within the stipulated period. 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

- As per Institute Advertisement No.14/2012, the posts of Assistant Professors were advertised under Special Recruitment Drive for SC/ST/OBC and PwD Candidates in the prescribed format and accordingly, he had applied for the post of Assistant Professor in the Department of Chemistry vide which he had concealed the facts about his previous employment with Nehru College, Chhibramau, Kannauj (UP). He had submitted NIL' experience in his application form at Sr. No.18 & Sr. No.19 where the details of Previous and Present employment were required.
- He was offered the post of Assistant Professor in the Department of Chemistry vide letter No.Gen-1/SRD/12/2100 dated 01.04.2013.
 As per Clause-13 of his appointment letter, he had to declare all information regarding his previous employment but he violated the said Clause.
- 3. He had joined the services of this Institute on 25.04.2013(FN) in response to his appointment letter No Gen-1/SRD/12/2100 dated 01.04.2013. He was neither relieved properly by Nehru College, Chhibramau, Kannauj (UP) to join the services of this Institute in response to appointment letter dated 01.04.2013 nor any Extraordinary Leave (without pay) was granted to him, meaning thereby, he was enjoying two employments simultaneously at the time of joining to this Institute, which is against the rules of the Institute.
- 4. After joining the services of this Institute, he was also asked to furnish the complete detail of his previous employment in the Attestation Form but he had not given any detail of his previous employment with the Nehru College, Chhibramau, Kannauj [UP].
- 5. Vide letter No.30 30/173-176/2013-14 dated 02.05.2013, the Secretary, Management Committee, Nehru College, Chhibramau, Kannauj (UP) had informed to this Institute that his Extraordinary Leave (without pay) for a period of one year was not sanctioned by the College and he is running absent from his duty w.e.f 24.04 2013 onwards from Nehru College, so he was advised to behave as per rules. He had joined the services of this Institute without intimation to his previous department i.e. Nehru College, Chhibramau, Kannauj (UP).
- 6. Vide his application dated 01.03.20 (8, he had requested to count his experience for a period of 04 years and 02 months for the services rendered with Nehru P.G. College, Chhibramau, Kamauj (UP), but he has not shown any details of his experience in his application form for the post of Assistant Professor.
- 7. Vide letter No.Estt.-I/PF/5136 dated 05.10.2018, he was called upon to a explain his position. He submitted his reply on 11.10.2018 vide which he has narrated that he had joined his duty in NIT, Kurukshetra without permission of his previous employer.

In response to this office letter No. Estt.-I/PF/5135 dated 05.10.2018, vide letter No. % %/101/2018-19 dated 15.10.2018, the Principal, Nehru College, Chhibramau, Kannauj (UP) had informed to this Institute that he had joined the services of the NIT, Kurukshetra without taking proper relieving from his previous employer i.e. Nehru College, Chhibramau, Kannauj (UP) which shows indiscipline and had also informed that vide their letter dated 19.05.2018, his resignation from the post of Assistant Professor (Chemistry) was accepted w.e.f.21.04.2013 from their College

In response to this office letter No.Estt.-1/PF/5135 dated 05.10.2018, vide letter No. 70 w/101/2018-19 dated 15.10.2018, the Principal, Nebru College, Chhibramau, Kannauj (UP) had informed to this Institute that Dr. Ram Kumar Tittal had joined the services of the NIT, Kurukshetra without taking proper relieving from his previous employer i.e. Nebru College, Chhibramau, Kannauj (UP) which shows indiscipline and had also informed that vide their letter dated 19.05.2018, the resignation of Dr. Ram Kumar Tittal from the post of Assistant Professor [Chemistry] was accepted w.c.f.21.04.2013 from their College.

Herewith, undersigned is submitting the representation against memorandum letter no. Esti-I/PF/4289, dated: 11/10/2021 in following points.

- The applicant had applied to the post of Assistant Professor in the pay band 3 (Rs.15600-39100/-) and AGP Rs. 7000/- against the Advertisement No. 14/2012 wherein essential qualification was Ph.D.; relevant experience was None; Other essential qualification was One paper accepted for publication in an SCI journal; additional desirable requirements were two SCI journal papers or one putent may be based on Ph. D. work and ago was preferably below 35 years. Applicant fulfill the minimum required condition and hence mentioned NIL experience at Sr. 18 & Sr. 19 in the application form.
- 2. Although, service condition at Nehru College, Chhibramau, Kannauj (UP) were very easy but the teaching and research environment was not good, thus, applicant decided to move for better place.
- That the applicant has discussed with the principal of Nehru College, Chhibramau, Kannau. (UP) for applying to the post of Assistant Professor in the pay band 3 (Rs.15600-39100/-) and AGP Rs. 7000/- against the Advertisement No. 14/2012.
- 4. As per the suggestion and the condition of the principal Nehro College, Chhibramau, Kannauj, if applicant would not take the advantage of experience obtained at Nebru College, Chhibramau, Kannauj, he will be relieved. Thus, applicant has mentioned NIL experience at Sr. 18 & Sr. 19 in the application form for his betterment and academic
- The principal and secretary of Nehro College, Chinbramau, Kannauj (UP) have assured the applicant that he will be relieved from the service if he got selection.
- 6. However, the undersigned applicant was not relieved from his services despite submitting all the required papers and was asked to resign.
- 7. Later, applicant requested to the secretary through principal (the applicant's reporting officer) for one year (cave without pay from 24.04.2013 to 23.04.2014 via letter dated

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- 22.04.2018. This request was approved and forwarded (sanstuti sahit agrasarit) by the principal to the Secretary.
- The principal, Nebru College, Chhibramau, Kannauj was the reporting officer of the applicant who has approved the leaves. Applicant later joined the new services at National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra on 25.04.2013, FN
- Every matter was explained to the selection committee during interview and the same was
 explained to the Registrat (Incharge) before joining.
- On 19.05.2018, secretary of the Nehru-College, Chhibramau, Kannauj (UP) has provided the relieving letter (Letter No. N.C./20/office/2018-19, dated: 19.05.2018).
- After obtaining the relieving letter, on 01.03.2018 applicant has requested the administration for including his past experience.
- 12. That applicant has not committed any mistake intentionally. Also, every step was taken after the discussion with the administration (Principal, Nehru College, Chhibramau, Kannauj (UP) and Registrar (Incharge), National Institute of Technology Korukshetra (Hr.)).
- 13. For any financial mistake, it is submitted that last salary drawn at Nehru College, Chhibramau, Kannauj (UP) was 20.04.2013 and salary resumed at National Institute of Technology Kurukshetra from 25.04.2013.
- 14. It is worthly to mention that applicant has worked hard for accomplishing academic, research and administrative responsibility whatever assigned by the Institute of the Department.

23. Every Institute thall constitute for the benefit of its employees such provident or Pension and pension fund or provide such insurance exheme as it may death fill in such manner and provides find subject to such conditions as may be prescribed by the Statutes.

BoG 58.20 To inform about the case filed by Sh. Kulvinder Singh, Technical Assistant SG-II, Electrical Engineering Department of the Institute regarding promotion, denied to him being a SC candidate and subsequent directions given by the National Commission for Scheduled Castes, New Delhi in this regard.

The Ministry of Human Resources Development, Govt. of India vide letter No.F.35-5/2018-TS.III dated 20.02.2019 had communicated a new set of Recruitment Rules (2019) for the Non-teaching Staff of NITs. The same MHRD Recruitment Rules (2019) was adopted by the Board of Governors of this Institute in Its 50th meeting held on 20.06.2019.

As per MHRD Recruitment Rules-2019, Institute had invited applications vide notification No.Gen-I/3772/7060 dated 16.12.2019 from the existing eligible non-teaching employees for promotion. The details of vacancy, category, educational qualifications, experience, criteria for promotion and modalities of the test etc. were also mentioned in the notification. The modalities and the selection criterion for the promotion of non-teaching posts were prepared as per the Recruitment Rules (2019). In this notification, the promotional post of Technical Officer (Electronics & Communication Engineering) - 01 under UR category was published.

Shri Kulvinder Singh, Technical Assistant SG-II, Department of Electrical Engineering had applied for the post of Technical Officer, Electronics & Communication Engineering Department. The Departmental Promotion Committee Meeting for the said post was held on 22.01.2020. The DPC followed the selection criterion and assessed the work performance record (ACR) of the candidates. The DPC recommends none of the candidates for promotion to the post of Technical Officer, Electronics & Communication Engineering.

As per the recommendations of the DPC and subsequent approval of the Competent Authority, the offer of promotion letters were issued to the candidates selected for promotion in different cadres on 31.01.2020. However, the name Sh. Kulvinder Singh was not recommended by the DPC for promotion.



Thereafter, Sh. Kulvinder Singh had sent complaints to the Ministry of Education on 02.11.2020 and Central Vigilance Commission on 02.11.2020 that promotion was denied to him due to his SC Caste.

in this regard, an External inquiry Committee was constituted by the Director vide letter No.Gen.-I/3717/1379 dated 26.03.2021 to inquire the complaints made by Sh. Kulvinder Singh.

In this matter, a letter FileNo.K-9/Haryana-8/2021/SSW-II dated 18.06.2021 was received from the National Commission for Scheduled Caste, New Delhi regarding complaint made by Sh. Kulvinder Singh, Technical Assistant SG-II, Electrical Engineering Department of this Institute for promotion is denied due to SC Caste. As per annexure of this letter, Sh. Kulvinder Singh had sent a complaint on 10.06.2021 to the National Commission for Scheduled Caste, New Delhi. In this letter he had raised the allegations regarding his promotion in this Institute. A copy of the National Commission for Scheduled Castes letter dated 16.06.2021 is enclosed as Annexure – 58.20(I) from pages 185 to 187.

In response to the NCSC letters, vide this office letter No.Gen-I/3950/2147 dated 02.07.2021 and No.Gen-I/3950/3950/4316 dated 05.10.2021, the facts/information and response of the allegations had been sent to the National Commission for Scheduled Castes, New Delhi.

In this regard, the External Inquiry Committee had submitted its report on 09.09.2021. The General Observations of the External Inquiry Committee is as under:

1. "In order to verify whether SC-ST candidates are given fair representation in promotion or not, committee asked the registrar of NIT to provide the complete list of candidates selected against the posts notified vide notification No.Gen-l/3772/7060 dated 16.12.2019. Committee has also gone through the list of candidates who have been promoted to different post (Office order No.Gen-l/3773/842 dated 31.01.2020) and found that out of 25 persons promoted seven belongs to scheduled caste and of these six were



promoted against unreserved posts. The allegation of Sh. Kulvinder Singh that 'he has been discriminated because he belongs to scheduled caste' does stand the test of Scrutiny as many SC candidates were selected on merit against reserve and unreserved posts.

- Since BOG is the highest governing body of the institution, Sh. Kulvinder Singh should have made representation to BOG through its Chairman, before writing to higher authorities.
- 3. Sh Kulvinder Singh in his representation to the committee also mentioned about findings of the CAG report wherein some objections have been raised by CAG. Since the evaluation of the CAG report does not fall in the purview of the committee, it is for the competent authority to look into it as per rules.

The committee looked into all espects of promotion and selection process and found no merit in the complaints of Sh Kulvinder Singh."

In continuation to this office letter No.Gen.-I/3950/2147 dated 02.07.2021, the report of the External Inquiry Committee was sent to the National Commission for Scheduled Caste, New Delhi vide letter No.Gen.-I/3950/4257 dated 08.10.2021.

A letter FileNo.K-9/Haryana-8/2021/SSW-II dated 24.01.2022 was received from the National Commission for Scheduled Caste, New Delhi regarding personal appearance of the Director of the Institute at National Commission for Scheduled Caste, New Delhi on 22.02.2022.

The Director, of the Institute had appeared the hearing before the Hon'ble Chairman, NCSC on 22.02.2022. An upto date action taken report and all relevant documents including the relevant files, case diaries etc. were placed before the Hon'ble Chairman, NCSC.

In reference to the hearing dated 22.02.2022, a letter File No.K-9/Haryana-8/2021/SSW-II dated 22.03.2022 was received along with the minutes of hearing dated 22.02.2022 from the National Commission for Scheduled Caste, New Delhi. In this letter, the Commission had advised to the Institute to reinvestigate



the entire file noting of petitioner and give him personal hearing regarding the same. A copy of the National Commission for Scheduled Castes letter dated 22.03.2022 is enclosed as *Annexure* – 58.20(ii) from pages 188 to 190.

As per the advice of the NCSC, the Institute had constituted another Committee to re-Investigate the promotion case of Shri Kulvinder Singh, Technical Assistant SG-II, Electrical Engineering Department. The said Committee submitted its report on 01.04.2022. The recommendations of the Committee is as under:

The committee met on 01,04,2022 and had a personal hearing to Sh. Kulvinder Singh, in accordance with the terms and reference provided in the Office Order deted 28.03.2022. The committee examined the representations of Sh. Kutvinder Singh, Technical Assistant SG-II of the NIT. Kurukshetra. The committee also examined the file notings, files inviting applications and the proceedings of the DPC held on 22.01.2020 wherein the candidature of Sh. Kulvinder Singh has been considered elong with 03 others. The DPC allocated the marks for performance assessment and APARs (ACRs). After evaluation the DPC found 03 candidates ineligible. The DPC considered the candidature of Sh. Kulvinder Singh but could not recommend him for promotion as he was not meeting the benchmark requirement in respect of APARs prescribed for promotion and financial upgradation vide Govt. of India OM F.No.35034/3/2015-Estt.(D) dated 27/28.09.2016. The committee also observed that the contents of the above referred Gol OM have been circulated to all the Deans, Heads (all concerned) who will be acting as reporting and reviewing officers for the staff vide NITK Office Order No.Gen.-I/4141 dated 31.08.2017.

The committee further noted that the Recruitment Rules for promotion at NITs have been received in the year 2019 only. NIT, Kurukshetra invited applications for promotions from the staff in 2020. Accordingly, making of the gradings in the APARs must have been made based on the factual assessment of the officials by the respective reporting and reviewing officers. The committee further recommends that the employees performance reports falling short of the required benchmark be informed, so that they may improve their performance and such grievances can be evoided.

Further, during the re-investigation and interaction with Sh. Kulvinder Singh also he could not produce any evidence to establish that the gradings in the APARs (ACRs) have been made with any intension or promotion denied on caste basis. However since the post has not been filled his candidature can be considered in times to come."



The report of the External Inquiry Committee was sent to the National Commission for Scheduled Caste, New Delhi vide letter No. Gen.-I/3950/1136 dated 07.04.2022.

A letter FileNo.K-9/Haryana-8/2021/SSW-II dated 02.06.2022 was received from the National Commission for Scheduled Caste, New Delhi regarding personal appearance of the Director of the Institute at National Commission for Scheduled Caste, New Delhi on 27.06.2022. Accordingly, the Director of the Institute had appeared the hearing before the Hon'ble Chairman, NCSC on 27.06.2022.

A letter FileNo.K-9/Haryana-8/2021/SSW-II dated 13.07.2022 was received from the National Commission for Scheduled Caste, New Delhi regarding personal appearance of the Director of the Institute at National Commission for Scheduled Caste, New Delhi on 18.07.2022. A copy of the National Commission for Scheduled Castes letter dated 13.07.2022 is enclosed as <u>Annexure – 58.20(iii) on page 191.</u>

In the said letter, the Commission had raised the following questions:

- It may also be intimated if SC (SC/ST) Welfare Association is there
 in the Institution.
- If, so since when, if not, reason therefor.
- Details of quarterly meetings held with SC/ST Association, if any, may also be provided to the Commission.
- It may also be intimated, if due diligence was done by officers concerned while writing APAR of the Petitioner Sh. Kulvinder Singh.

In response to the above letter of NCSC, the Institute had sent its reply on 15.07.2022. It may be mentioned here that the Annual Confidential Report (ACR) system is being followed in the Institute to assess the yearly performance of the employees. Further, the institute had also sent letters to the former Head, Electrical Engineering Department and former Director of the Institute for their comments. The comments from the former Head, Electrical Engineering Department has been received.



Further, a letter No.K-9/Haryana-8/2021/SSW-II dated 21.07.2022 was received from National Commission for Scheduled Castes along with the minutes of Hearing and Hearing Notice for dated 26.07.2022 regarding denial of promotion to Sh. Kulvinder Singh due to discrimination on caste ground.

The minutes of Hearing held in the Headquarter of National Commission for Scheduled Castes on 27.06.2022 & 18.07.2022 vide which the recommendations of the Commission are as under:

- 1. The grading in the ACR/APAR of the Petitioner not to be conveyed to the petitioner, is an open violation of the DOPT Rules, for which the department is responsible. The Commission expresses its enger that no responsible officer in the entire department is eware that the employee has to show the grading found in the ACR of the employee. There is no fault of the petitioner in this case, so the commission recommends that the grading given in the ACR/APAR of the Petitioner should be upgraded and promoted to the post of Technical Officer at the earliest.
- It should be told to the Commission that what is the reason for not having SC/ST Welfare Association in the Institute. Why the Institute is not giving recognition to the SC/ST Welfare Association.

A copy of the National Commission for Scheduled Castes letter dated 21.07.2022 is enclosed as *Annexure* – 58.20(iv) from pages 192 to 194.

The Director, of the Institute had appeared the hearing before the Hon'ble Chairman NCSC on 26.07.2022. In response to the NCSC letter dated 21.07.2022, the Institute had sent its reply on 16.08.2022.

The matter is placed before the Board for information and further direction (if any).



The nestler was listed for hearing on 22.02.2022 at 10.30 A.M before the Vice Chairman, National Commission for Scheduled Castes (NCSC) in his chamber at 5th Ploor, LakNayakBhawan, Khan Market, New Delhi. The petitioner inform the Commission that the promotion process in NIT Kurukshetta, was initiated under recruitment rules vide notification No. 1/3377 /7060 thted 16.12 2019. He applied for the post of Technical Officer in ECE department by promotions in 2019 and he was only eligible and suitable candidate for single post. The DPC January 2020 had intentionally manipulated his ACR 2017: 18 and the adverse remarks were never communicated to him.
- 2. The authority informed the Commission that petitioner has made his compleint to different bodies office for almost similar nature regarding denial of a motion to higher prox of technical officer ECE and technical assistant SG-II wherein he was also mentioned that he is being discriminated because he belong to schedule caste and was office bearer of non-teaching association. The committee was constituted through office order to enquire regarding the said complaints. The committee has gone through all the complaint of petitioner. his representation to the committee, eligible criteria of different post, distribution of Mark for ACRs, assessment of laboratory /workshop development (if any). After chosidering all the aspects and going through material on record

BoG 58.22 To consider the proposal regarding the honorarium/remuneration to the Guest Faculty.

The matter for appointment of Temporary Faculty on contract basis against the sanctioned posts for semester to semester was decided in the 41st meeting of Board of Governors held on 31,01,2017. Accordingly, some Temporary Faculties were appointed in the year 2017 on semester to semester basis in the various Departments of the Institute. The system of appointment of Temporary Faculty on contract basis for semester to semester basis had some administrative difficulties due to Court cases.

Thereafter, to handle the teaching load of UG/PG programmes, the Institute had engaged Guest Faculties with Ph.D qualification against sanctioned vacant posts of faculty on semester basis with honorarium @ Rs.1500 per lecture subject to a maximum amount of Rs. 50,000/- per month in the pattern of UGC. A letter dated 28.01,2019 issued by the UGC regarding honorarium of Guest Faculty is enclosed as <u>Annexure – 58.22(i) from pages 198 to 199.</u>

In this context, a committee was constituted at the Institute level to examine the qualification, remuneration/honorarium and other related Issues of the Guest Faculty. The committee recommends the following for the engagement of Guest Faculty aligned with the guidelines/norms followed in other NITs:

- The Guest Faculty may be engaged only for academic assignments.
- Honorarium may be paid to the Guest Faculty for academic assignments including lectures, tutorials, lab classes, drawing classes, seminars etc. and examination related evaluation work.
- 3. Honorarium may be admissible @ 1500/- per contact hour plus 10% extra for examination related evaluation work. Lab classes, drawing classes, seminars, etc. of 02 contact hours duration may be treated as 01 contact hour for the purpose of honorarium/remuneration.

4. The maximum amount of honorarium of Rs.50,000/- per month may be enhanced to Rs. 70,900/- per month for candidates with Ph.D degree; and in case of non-availability of required no. of Ph.D degree candidates, Rs.57,700/- per month may be paid to candidates with M.Tech/PG degree in the line of 7th CPC Pay Matrix, Level-10 for the post of Assistant Professors Grade-II. The copy of relevant pages of the Ministry of Education (MHRD) letter dated 27.10.2017 regarding revision of Pay of faculty alongwith Pay Matrix is enclosed as Annexure – 58.22(II) from pages 200 to 201.

Subject: Revised guidelines for enhancement of the Rates of Honorarium of Guest Faculty.

Medam/Sir,

The Commission in its 537th meeting held on 10th December, 2018 considered the issue of enhancement of the rates of Honorarium of Guest Faculty in universities and colleges consequent upon the implementation of the recommendations of the 7th Pay Commission and resolved as follows:

- The Honorarium for Guest Faculty be enhanced to Rs.1500/- per lecture subject to a maximum of Rs.50,000/- per month.
- The Guest Faculty be appointed only against sanctioned post. However, for the universities where the sanctioned posts are not adequate as per the teaching working load; the number of Guest Faculty to be appointed can be up to 20% over and above the sanctioned posts.
- The qualification for Guest Faculty shall be the same as those prescribed for the regular Assistant Professors of Universities/Colleges in UGC Regulations.
- 4. The Selection procedure for appointing Guest Faculty shall be the same as those of regularly appointed Assistant Professors. However, the composition of the Selection Committee shall be as follows:
 - (i) The Vice Chancellor or his/her nominee shall be the Chairperson of the Selection Committee
 - (ii) One expert in the concerned subject nominated by the Vice-chancellor.
 - (iii) Dean of the concerned Faculty; wherever applicable
 - (iv) Head/Chairperson of the Department/School

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(v) An academician representing SC/ST/OBC/Minority/Women/Differentiyabled categories to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor or Acting Vice-Chancellor, if any of the candidates representing these categories is the applicant and if any of the above members of the Selection Committee does not belong to that category.

At least four members, including one outside subject expert shall constitute the quorum.

- Guest Faculty will not be treated like regular teachers for the purpose of voting rights or for becoming the members of the various statutory bodies of the university.
- The superannuated teachers may also be considered for engagement as Guest-Faculty subject to a maximum age limit of 70 years.
- The Guest Faculty will not be given the benefit of allowances, pension, gratuity and leave etc. as admissible to the regular teachers.

These guidelines will come into force with effect from the date of issue of this letter.

The contents of the letter may be brought to the notice of the affiliated colleges/institutions also.

I am directed to say that the Government of India have decided, after taking into consideration the recommendations made by the Pay Review Committee, to revise the Pay of Faculty and Scientific/Design Staff of Centrally Funded Technical Institutions following the pay revision of the Central Government employees on the recommendation of 7th Central Pay Commission(CPC). The revised pay and other service conditions as approved by the Government of India for the Faculty and Scientific/Design Staff in Centrally Funded Technical Institutions (CPTIs) are as under:

- For Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs), Indian Institute of Science (IISc.),
 Bangalore, Indian Institutes of Management (IIMs), National Institute of
 Industrial Engineering (NITIE), Mumbai and Indian Institutes of Science
 Education & Research(IISERs), National Institutes of Technology (NITs) and
 Indian Institutes of Information Technology (IIITs).
 - (a) The pay fitment in respect of the Faculty would be as per fitment table at Annexure1.
 - (b) The nomenclature of Assistant Professors (Contractual) is changed into Assistant Professor Grade-II (Presently in AGP 6,000 and AGP 7,000) and Assistant Professor Grade I (Presently in AGP 8,000 and AGP 9,000). There shall be no change in the terms and conditions of appointment, or nature of appointment as done earlier as per MHRD letter no. 23-01/2008-TS-II dated 18,08,2009 read with 16,09,2009. Institutes should put in place a process for discontinuation of non-performers. The initial pay for Assistant Prof. Grade –II (level 10) he mapped to cell no. 8 of the Annexure-I i.e. Rs. 70,900 instead of the 7 non-compounded increments.
 - (c) The pay of Directors of HTs/HMs/HSc/HSERs/NFTIE whose pay scale in 6th CPC was Rs. 80,000 (fixed) shall only be fixed at level 17 (i.e. Rs. 2,25,000/-fixed) and pay in respect of all other Directors who were in the existing pay scales of Rs. 75,000 Rs.5000 (Special Allowance) shall be fixed at Rs 2,10,000/- (fixed). 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BoG 58.23 To consider the matter for implementation of Annual Performance Assessment Reports (APAR) in place of Annual Confidential Reports (ACRs) for non-teaching employees of the Institute.

The Institute was adopting the criteria/procedure for writing of confidential reports of the ACRs as laid down by the Board of Governors in its 87th meeting held on 02.09.1996. The Board of Governors approved the recommendations of SAAC with regard to the review of forms/proforma being used by the Institute for writing of ACRs.

Further, the Board of Governors in its 4th meeting held on 08.12.2003 vide agenda item No.4.20 had desired that proforms for reporting Annual confidential Reports of both teaching and non-teaching employees be reviewed.

As per above decision of the Board, a Committee was constituted and the Committee submitted its report on 15.02.2007, which were placed before the Board of Governors in its 12th meeting held on 25.04.2007 vide agenda item No.12.22 and the Board of Governors approved the recommendations of the Committee and the revised ACRs proformas being used from the session 2006-07.

The instructions/guidelines regarding Maintenance and preparation of Annual Performance Appraisal Reports had been issued by the Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT), Government of India vide Office Memorandum No.21011/1/2005-Estt (A) (Pt-II) dated 14.05.2009. In this OM, the existing nomenclature of the Annual Confidential Report has been modified as Annual Performance Assessment Report (APAR) from the Reporting Period 2008-09.

The Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT), Government of India had Issued guidelines, format of Annual Performance Assessment Reports (APAR) and Time schedule for preparation/completion of APAR vide Office Memorandum No.21011/1/2005-Estt (A) (Pt-II) dated 23.07.2009. A copy of the DoPT letter dated 23.07.2009 is enclosed as <u>Annexure – 58.23(I) from pages 204 to 205</u>.



In this regard, it is submitted that vide letter No.K-9/Haryana-8/2021/SSW-II dated 19.08.2022, the Under Secretary to the Government of India, National Commission for Scheduled Castes has forwarded the minutes of Hearing dated 26.07.2022 in the matter of representation of Shri Kulvinder Singh, Technical Assistant SG-II, Department of Electrical Engineering, National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra regarding denial of promotion due to discrimination on caste ground. Subject:- Preparation and maintenance of Annual Performance Assessment Reports (APAR).

The undersigned is directed to invite the attention of the Ministries/Departments to the instructions contained in this Department's O.M. No. No. 21011/02/2009-Est.(A) 16/02/2009 and O.M. of even umber dated 14.05.2009 on the subjects of timely preparation and proper maintenance of APAR and making the APAR transparent for representation for upgradation, if any, by the officer reported upon. The matter of preparation and maintenance of APAR has been further reviewed in this Department keeping in view the system in this regard in respect of All India Services (AIS) and the undersigned is directed to convey the following decisions:-

- (i) All cadre authorities shall include a box in the APAR for reflecting by the reporting officer the pen picture of the officer reported upon where the reporting officer will be required to indicate his comments on the overall qualities of the officer including areas of strengths and lesser strength and his attitude towards the weaker sections. A column will also be added in the section relating to the reviewing authority for giving the reviewing authority's remarks on the pen picture reflected by the reporting officer. There will be no other separate column in the APAR for overall assessment apart from the pen picture.
- (ii) A provision may be made in the APAR in the relevant section for remarks by the reviewing officer to indicate specifically the differences, if any, with the assessment made by the reporting officer, and the reasons therefor.
- (iii)Numerical grading are to be awarded by reporting and reviewing authorities for the quality of work output, personal attributes and functional competence of the officer reported upon. These should be on a scale of 1-10, where 1 refers to the lowest grade and 10 to the highest. The guidelines given in Annexure-I shall be kept in mind while awarding numerical gradings.
- (iv) The format for the purpose of numerical grading in the three areas of work output, assessment of personal attributes and assessment of functional competency is in Annexure-II. For Group 'B' and 'C' officials however, suitable changes may be made by the concerned cadre authorities in the items of assessment as per functional requirements of the job and the next promotional post for them. The overall grade on a score of 1-10 will be based on 40% weightage on assessment of work output, and 30% each for assessment of personal attributes and functional competency. The overall grading will be based on addition of the mean value of each group of indicators in proportion to weightage assigned.

- (v) Wherever 'accepting authority' has been prescribed in the existing system in the cadre, columns may also be provided for such authority to give his comments on the remarks of the reporting/reviewing authority and details of difference of opinion, if any, with reasons for the same. In such cases, the accepting authority will also give overall grade on a score of 1-10.
- (vi) A schedule for completion of all activities relating to the APAR is given in Amexure-III.
- 2. The above provisions would be applicable for the APAR from the reporting year 2009-10 onwards. The concerned authorities may accordingly make necessary changes in the APAR format for numerical grading to be given by reporting and reviewing officer. This O.M. does not in any way affect the part to be filled in by the officer reported upon and other existing columns in the APAR format like artitude towards SC/ST/OBC, relations with public (wherever applicable), integrity, training requirement etc. for descriptive remarks.
- 3. All Ministries/Departments are requested to bring to the notice of all the offices under them for strict implementation of the above instructions.
