Further, the decision to start such M. Tech. programmes in part-time mode in other departments/schools will be taken on the basis of the admission response in the pilot M. Tech. programme as above.

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- (iii) The duration of M. Tech. Weekend Degree Programme (part-time) will be three years out of which two years will be for course work and one year will be for dissertation/project/internship.
- The classes will be conducted on weekends (Saturdays and Sundays). The faculty and the supporting staff providing their services will be paid remuneration as decided by the Director, which will be in line with the remuneration paid to faculty and supporting staff in other comparable institutes.
- (v) The classes will be conducted in offline mode, however, the hybrid mode may also be explored.
- (vi) There will be no requirement of GATE for admission in M. Tech. Weekend Degree Programme (part-time)
- (vii) The students admitted in M. Tech. Weekend Degree Programme (parttime) will not be eligible for campus placement through Training and Placement Cell of the Institute.
- S 49.11 To consider to continue the award of digital degrees from 19th Convocation onwards.

The Senate decided to continue the award of digital degrees along with the hard copies from 19th convocation onwards.

S 49.12 To consider the proposal for relaxation of experience for admission in M.Tech. programmes under sponsored category.

The Senate considered the proposal and decided to retain the existing experience requirement as such for admission in M.Tech. programmes under sponsored category.

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## S 49.13 To consider the proposal for establishment of seven (07) RECK-72 Alumni Scholarships.

The Senate considered and approved the proposal for establishment of seven (07) RECK-72 Alumni Scholarships with appreciation to the RECK-72 Alumni. A scholarship of Rs. 20,000/- and a certificate will be given to the economically weaker and top ranked students of B.Tech. 5<sup>th</sup> semester from all seven branches based upon their second year results. These scholarships will be effective from the academic session 2022-23. For formalizing and implementing the guidelines, following Committee will be constituted on par with the Committee constituted for RECK-71 Alumni Scholarships:

## S 49.14 To consider the relaxation in eligibility criteria for admission under Study in India scheme and other schemes except DASA and MEA.

The Senate considered the proposal but was not agreed upon. From Academic Year 2023-24, qualifying JEE (Mains) will be eligibility criteria for admission under all types of supernumerary quota in B. Tech.

programmes except for admissions under ICCR quota for which the exemption of JEE (Mains)/SAT examination is already in place since

inception of this quota.

S 49.15 To decide the date of start of the semester for the purpose of collecting semester registration fee and refunding the amount after cancellation of registration.

The Senate considered and approved the proposal as under:

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- The semester registration fees be collected from the commencement of the semester whereas the start of classes for a semester as per Academic Calendar may be considered as the commencement of the semester for all UG and PG students, while for Ph.D. students, the date of enrolment in the Ph.D. programme may be considered as the commencement of the semester (Odd or Even as the case may be).
- (ii) Those students who withdraw their admission before the commencement of the semester, may be allowed to withdraw their admission without charging the semester registration fees for the commencing semester.
- (iii) In case of Ph.D. scholars, if a scholar submits his/her Ph.D. thesis in the semester which happens to be the semester (Odd or Even) in which he/she got initially enrolled, then no registration fee be charged up to the date of his/her initial enrolment in that semester (Odd or Even).
- S 49.16 To consider and decide the relaxation of the requirement of publishing a paper within two years of initial registration for the full time Ph.D. scholars of 2020-21 batch for continuation of Institute scholarship.

The Senate deliberated on the proposal noting the fact that a full time research scholar receives Institute fellowship for a maximum duration of five years, from the date of initial registration of the Ph.D. programme subject to fulfilling the requirements of eligibility for the scholarship over the successive years of Ph.D. registration period. After detailed deliberations, the Senate decided as under:

- (i) The award of Institute scholarship (JRF) to the full time Ph.D. scholars at the time of admission to the Ph.D. programme will be for two years from the date of initial registration subject to satisfactory performance in each semester. This applies to all the currently enrolled full time Ph.D. research scholars as well.
- (ii) The full time research scholar will be eligible for upgradation to SRF after two years only on having one research paper with affiliation to

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NIT Kurukshetra out of the Ph.D. work accepted/published in non-paid SCI/SCIE/ Scopus /Web of Science Journal. The evaluation for the same will be carried out by the External Review Committee (ERC) as per norms. Till the time the requirements for SRF are fulfilled, case is recommended for upgradation from JRF to SRF by the ERC and the notification is issued, the full time research scholar will continue receiving the Institute scholarship as JRF upto a maximum of five years from the date of initial registration in the Ph.D. programme subject to the satisfactory performance in each semester. This applies to all the currently enrolled full time Ph.D. research scholars as well.

- (iii) All the currently enrolled full time Ph.D. research scholars whose scholarship has got discontinued due to non-fulfillment of the requirements on account of publication and has not been restored as yet, will resume receiving the Institute scholarship (JRF/SRF as the case may be) from the date of notification of this decision and continue receiving throughout the successive years upto a maximum of five years from the date of initial registration in the Ph.D. programme subject to the satisfactory performance in each semester. The research scholars receiving JRF will be eligible for upgradation to SRF as per guidelines mentioned at Sr no. (ii) above.
- (iv) These modifications will be incorporated in the Ph.D. Ordinance/ regulations being revised for academic year 2023-24 onwards.

## S 49.17 To consider the credit award/audit course rules for student activities under students' clubs.

The Senate desired that the Office of the Dean (Student Welfare) coordinate the preparation of guidelines for evaluation of student activities under the domain of students' clubs/sports/technical societies etc. and provide the compiled guideline document to the office of Dean (Acad.) so

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NIT Kurukshetra that the agenda item may be prepared accordingly for consideration of the

Senate.

S 49.18 To discuss and decide relaxation in tuition fee being charged for gap period for UG & PG programmes of the Institute.

The Senate considered the proposal and decided that a nominal continuation fee of Rs. 5000/- per semester may be charged from the students for the gap period in which the students have not actually attended the Institute and used the resources. In addition, the penalty of Rs. 5000/- per semester will also be charged from the students in case the gap is without prior permission. This decision will be implemented w.e.f. academic year 2022-23.

The Senate considered the request of Mr. Md. Ashfaque Ahmed, M.Tech. (Cyber Security) student of Computer Engg. Deptt. and allowed the cancellation of his admission without payment of 2<sup>nd</sup> semester registration fee on humanitarian grounds as a special case. This will not be quoted as a precedence.

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S 49.21 To consider the proposal for constituting committee for framing the guidelines for instituting the award/scholarship/fellowship in the name of individuals.

The Senate authorized the Chairman, Senate for constituting the committee to frame the guidelines for instituting the award/scholarship/fellowship in the name of individuals.

The Senate authorized the Chairman, Senate for constituting a Committee to suggest the steps to be taken to fill up the vacant seats in M. Tech. programs after National Spot Round of CCMT-2023 w.e.f. Academic Year 2023-24.

S 49.23 To consider a proposal received from the Coordinator (SVE) as the Sustainability Plan for the School of VLSI Design & Embedded Systems (SVE).

The Senate considered and approved the proposal. Consequently, the School of VLSI Design & Embedded Systems will run as a separate entity and the merger of both the M.Tech. Programs- (i) VLSI Design, and (ii) Embedded System Design of the School of VLSI Design and Embedded System with the Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering stands withdrawn.

S 49.24 To consider the requests of three Ph.D. research scholars for extension in registration/re-registration period after expiry of maximum period allowable under Ph.D. ordinance.

The Senate considered the requests of three Ph.D. research scholars and decided that:

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- These three Ph.D. research scholars and similar other cases registered in the Golden Jubilee year or after and whose registration/re-registration period has expired or is expiring by 31st August, 2023 after maximum allowable period as per respective Ph.D. ordinance, will be allowed to register afresh in Ph.D. programme on request basis in line with the mercy chance given to all UG & PG students on the occasion of Diamond Jubilee Year Celebration.
- (ii) In lieu of mercy chance, such research scholars will be charged one-time additional amount of Rs. 20000/- besides the usual fee chargeable for fresh registration.
- (iii) Such research scholars will not be allowed to submit their Ph.D. thesis before two years from the date of their fresh registration.
- (iv) Such research scholars will also be charged semester fee as applicable.
- (v) Furthermore, their earlier course work, comprehensive examinations and publications, if completed, will also be considered towards their Ph.D. thesis submission.

It is pertinent to mention that there are 05 seats in each M.Tech. specialization under sponsored category and that for the last couple of years, there has been very less number of admissions under sponsored category.

In view of above and in order to increase the number of admissions in M.Tech. programmes, the request of DRDO may be discussed in the Senate for appropriate decision.

The relevant documents are attached as Annexure S 50.10 from pages 162 to 168.

The Senate may consider and decide.

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S 50.16 To consider the proposal to enhance the intake in M.Tech. programmes under self-finance.

The number of admissions in M.Tech. programmes in the Institute has been low consistently for the past few years and are on a declining trend. As a result, the Institute facilities and infrastructure are not being utilized optimally and also low number of admissions is adversely affecting the research outcome and NIRF ranking of the Institute.

In view of this, it is proposed to enhance the intake, equal to the sanctioned intake, in each M.Tech. programme under self-finance. The self-financed candidates will not get any financial support from the Institute, GATE score will not be mandatory for admission to under self-finance. The admission to these seats will be made through Spot Counselling by issuing notification on the Institute website with details in this regard. The fee structure of the candidates admitted under self-finance will have 50 % higher tuition fee compared to the un-reserved candidates admitted to the M.Tech. programmes through CCMT counselling. There will be no relaxation in the fee irrespective of the category of the candidate.

It is pertinent to mention that some of the NITs such as NIT Warangal, NIT Delhi already have enhanced seats in their M.Tech. programme under self-financed category. The relevant documents are enclosed as Annexure S 50.16.

If approved, the admissions will be made under this category from the academic year 2023-24 after getting the approval of the BoG of the Institute.

The Senate may consider and decide.

No. NITKKR/GEN.-1/3783/01(E).—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (2) of section 26 of the National Institutes of Technology, Science Education and Research Act, 2007 (29 of 2007), with the approval of the Visitor of the National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra, the Board of the National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra, hereby makes the following Statutes to amend the First Statutes of the National Institutes of Technology, namely:-
- These Statutes may be called the First Statutes of the National Institutes of Technology (1) (Amendment) Statutes, 2023.
  - They shall apply to the National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra. (2)
  - They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.
- In the First Statutes of the National Institutes of Technology (hereinafter referred to as the principal Statutes), in statute 1, in sub-statute (1), for the words "The First Statutes of the National Institutes of Technology", the words and figures "the National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra Statutes, 2017" shall be substituted.
- Throughout the principal Statutes, for the words "Ministry of Human Resource Development", wherever they occur, the words "Ministry of Education" shall be substituted.
- In the principal Statutes, in statute 23,-
  - (a) in sub-statute (5), in the opening portion, the words "or by promotion" shall be omitted;
  - (b) for sub-statute (12), the following sub-statute shall be substituted, namely:—
- "(12) Some of the posts may be exempted from the purview of the personal interview for selection, which may be decided by the Board and in case where the interview is compulsory, the Selection Committee shall examine credentials of all the candidates who have been called for interview, interview the eligible candidates and recommend the names of suitable candidates to the competent authority for approval and appointment thereafter.".
- 5. In the principal Statutes, in Schedule 'E',-
  - (a) against serial number 1, for entries in column (2), the following entries shall be substituted, namely: —

"Assistant Professor, Grade – II (to be appointed on contract basis) in Level-10 of the Pay Matrix of the 7<sup>th</sup> Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, as the case may be.";

(b) against serial number 2, for entries in column (2), the following entries shall be substituted, namely:—

"Assistant Professor, Grade-II (to be appointed on contract basis) in Level-11 of the Pay Matrix of the 7<sup>th</sup> Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, as the case may be.";

- (c) against serial number 3,-
  - (i) for entries in column (2), the following entries shall be substituted, namely:—

"Assistant Professor, Grade-I in Level-12 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, as the case may be.";

- (ii) in column (4), for the words "reputed academic Institute", the words "Institution of repute" shall be substituted;
- (d) against serial number 4,-
  - (i) for entries in column (2), the following entries shall be substituted, namely:-

"Associate Professor in Level-13A2 of the Pay Matrix of the 7<sup>th</sup> Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, as the case may be.";

(ii) for entries in column (4), the following entries shall be substituted, namely:—

"Six years after Ph.D. of which at least three years experience at the level of Assistant Professor Grade–I in Level-12 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, as the case may be, or equivalent in an Institution of repute or Research & Development lab or relevant industry; or nine years total working experience, of which three years shall be after Ph.D. and with three years experience at the level of Assistant Professor Grade–I in Level-12 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, as the case may be, or equivalent in an Institution of repute or Research & Development lab or relevant industry.";

- (e) against serial number 5, -
  - (i) for entries in column (2), the following entries shall be substituted, namely:—

"Professor in Level-14A of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, as the case may be.";

(ii) for entries in column (4), the following entries shall be substituted, namely:—

"Ten years after Ph.D. or thirteen years total working experience, out of which seven years shall be after Ph.D. and with three years experience at the level of Associate Professor in Level-13A2 of the Pay Matrix of the 7<sup>th</sup> Central Pay Commission or four years at the level of Associate Professor in Level-13A1 or combination of Level-13A1 and Level-13A2 or equivalent in an Institution of repute or Research and Development lab or relevant industry.";

- (f) against serial number 6,-
  - (i) for entries in column (2), the following entries shall be substituted, namely:—

"Professor (Higher Administrative Grade) in Level-15 of the Pay Matrix of the 7<sup>th</sup> Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, as the case may be.";

(ii) for entries in column (4), the following entries shall be substituted, namely:—

"Six years as Professor in Level 14 or equivalent or Level 14A or equivalent or a combination of service in Level 14 and Level 14A in an Institute of National Importance:

Provided that upto a maximum of 40% of the total number of Professors in position, after rendering regular service of six years as Professor may be granted Higher Administrative Grade scale after fulfilling the eligibility conditions and on the recommendations of duly constituted Selection Committee.";

#### (g) in Note 1,-

- (I) for paragraph (1), the following shall be substituted, namely:—
  - "(1) Any change in the pay scale shall be through an open advertisement and on the recommendations of the duly constituted Selection Committee, except where specifically exempted in these Statutes:

Provided that the Assistant Professor Grade–II appointed on contract basis in the Institute shall be, on successful completion of one year of service in Level-10 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission, may be upgraded to Level-11 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or grade pay or pay level, if found suitable by a duly constituted Selection Committee, but not through open advertisement.";

- (II) in paragraph (6), for sub-paragraph (a), the following sub-paragraph shall be substituted, namely:—
  - "(a) Permanent faculty with fifty years of age or above-
  - (i) The Assistant Professors Grade–II in Level-11 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission shall be mapped at the level of Assistant Professor Grade–II in Level-12 of the Pay Matrix of the 7th Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or grade pay or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, provided that they have at least 10 credit points in their service.
  - (ii) The Assistant Professors Grade-I in Level-12 of the Pay Matrix of the 7<sup>th</sup> Central Pay Commission shall be mapped at the level of Associate Professor in Level-13A2 of the Pay Matrix of the 7<sup>th</sup> Central Pay Commission, provided they have at least 25 credit points in their service.
  - (iii) The Associate Professors in Level-13A1 of the Pay Matrix of the 7<sup>th</sup> Central Pay Commission shall be mapped at the level of Associate Professor in Level-13A2 of the Pay Matrix of the 7<sup>th</sup> Central Pay Commission, provided that they have at least 25 credit points in their service:

Provided that they have been found suitable through a Selection Committee duly constituted under the Statutes.";

- (III) for paragraph (7), the following paragraphs shall be substituted, namely:—
  - "(7) For faculty in the Department of Architecture, following shall be essential qualifications without insisting on credit point requirements at Assistant Professor level:
    - (i) M.Arch. or M.Plan. with one-year professional experience: Assistant Professor Grade-II in Level-10 of the Pay Matrix of the 7<sup>th</sup> Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or grade pay or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, as the case may be;
    - (ii) M.Arch. or M.Plan. with two years of professional experience: Assistant Professor Grade-II in Level-11 of the Pay Matrix of the 7<sup>th</sup> Central Pay Commission or any other corresponding pay scale or grade pay or pay level approved by the Central Government or the Council, as the case may be.
  - (8) The qualifications and other terms and conditions of appointment of academic staff as specified under Schedule 'E' shall be read in conjunction with the guidelines or clarifications issued with the approval of the Council on 13<sup>th</sup> September, 2017; 30<sup>th</sup> November, 2017; 4<sup>th</sup> December, 2017; 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2018; 20<sup>th</sup> April, 2018; and 16<sup>th</sup> April, 2019.
  - (9) The one-time relaxation or measures for the then stagnated and eligible faculty of the National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra shall be as per the relaxations issued with the approval of the Council *vide* communications dated the 6<sup>th</sup> October, 2017 and 17<sup>th</sup> November, 2017:

Provided that one-time relaxation or measures contained in the communications dated the 6th October, 2017 and 17th November, 2017 shall have no validity and stand exhausted after the first round of

recruitments initiated after issuance of those one-time relaxations or measures and shall not have any validity for subsequent rounds of recruitment of the faculty in the National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra.".

(h) in Note 2, for the words "since the last promotion" wherever they occur, the words "since the last appointment" shall be substituted.

The Board of Governors of the Institute in its 60<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 27.03.2023 had approved the proposal of rolling advertisement along with guidelines to be followed for the recruitment of Faculty under Four Tier Flexible Faculty Structure. The faculty recruitment process through rolling advertisement was initiated in the month of June, 2023.

The Institute had invited Online Applications for the recruitment of Assistant Professors Grade-I, Level-12 (Ref.:Advt.No.17/2023) & Assistant Professors Grade-II, Level-10 (Ref.:Advt.No.18/2023) through rolling advertisement for the year 2023-24. It is relevant to mention here that as per the procedure followed in the rolling advertisement there is no last date and applications will be accepted throughout the year. Applications will be processed periodically. The last date of submission of online application form for the First Round of rolling advertisement was 21.07.2023.

Due to urgent requirement of faculties in the Departments of Computer Engineering, Business Administration, Mathematics & Mechanical Engineering the recruitment process were initiated for these Departments in the first phase. The applications were scrutinized by the respective Department Level Scrutiny Committee following the criteria laid down by the Ministry of Education under Recruitment Rules notified in the Gazette of India dated 24<sup>th</sup> July, 2017 and the guidelines/procedure for the selection of faculty approved by the BoG.

All the applicants for the post of Assistant Professor Grade-II (Level-10) were called to appear for the Screening Test which was qualifying nature only. The list of shortlisted candidates in the screening test and eligibility criteria as per the advertisement was placed before the Advisory Committee on Faculty Recruitment (ACoFAR). Similarly, the recommendations of Department Level Screening Committees in respect of Assistant Professor Grade-I (Level-12) were placed before the Advisory Committee on Faculty Recruitment (ACoFAR). ACoFAR.
