As per Section 11 (f) of the National Institute of Technology Act – 2007, one Professor and one Assistant Professor or a Lecturer (now Associate Professor and Assistant Professor) of the Institute are to be nominated by Senate on the Board of Governors. The term of office members so nominated shall be of two years from the date of nomination as per Clause 12 (c) of the NIT Act, 2007.

The above matter was placed before the Senate in its 10th meeting held on 29th November, 2007. The Senate decided that the above nomination will be by rotation (for a term of two years) according to seniority and the list will continue from where the then incumbents had left.

In this connection, it is submitted that the membership of Senate nominee in the category of Associate Professor is lying vacant as the present term of two years of Dr. Sandeep Santosh, Assistant Professor Grade-I, Department of Electronics & Communication Engineering (in the category of Assistant Professor) as Senate Nominee member on BoG has expired on 29th March, 2024.

It is further submitted that the vacancy so created is to be filled from the category of Associate Professors of the Institute by Senate. Accordingly, the next senior most Associate Professor is to be considered for nomination as Senate Nominee member on the BoG in the category of Associate Professors.

In view of above, the Chairman of the Senate, in exercise of powers conferred by Section – 9 of the NIT Statutes, decide to nominate Shri Jaideep Gupta, Associate Professor, Mechanical Engineering Department as Senate Nominee member on the BoG in the category of Associate Professor, as Senate Nominee member on BoG.

At the outset, the Hon'ble Chairperson (Acting) welcomed the esteemed members of the BoG present in the 65th meeting of the Board of Governors with the following introductory remarks:

It was observed that, the Institute was facing large number of court cases and the number crossed even 125. Attention has been laid to reduce the litigations as the court cases are not only draining the resources in terms of Efforts, Time and Finances. Litigations are also leading to the demotivation amongst the Faculty and Non-Teaching Staff. Off late, the efforts made in this direction proved to be effective and the number of the court cases have been scaled down to less than 100. It is expected that this number will further be reduced drastically in near future.

It has also been noticed that dereliction of duties from the staff is also one of the contributing factors for increased litigations. To check this, efforts are being made to motivate the staff and also to curb the unwarranted practices and to improve the efficiency and productivity. Efforts are being made to revamp the administrative systems, and to rejuvenate the vigour and to speed up the administrative processes. Revamping and reorganize the sections, units, activities by merging and demerging, clubbing of various activities of the Institute and to entrust the Section/Unit/Activity to the right official at the right time and at right place, as and when need/ requirement arises. These proposed measures will put an end to the lethargy creeping in the administrative processes. There is also a proposal to change the nomenclatures of various sections like Establishment, General Administration, Stores, Accounts as Admin-I, Admin-II, Admin-III and Admin-IV etc. These sections will be supervised through a Faculty-In-charge and assisted by an official/officer from the Non-Teaching and overall control will be with monitored by the Registrar. These measures will tone up the administrative efficiency of the Institute in all spheres and bring more positive results and also to reduce litigations. Such changes, will bring the desired results in taking NIT Kurukshetra to new heights.

The Board appreciated the proposed good initiatives for implementation. Thereafter, the Chairperson (Acting) asked the Secretary to present the agenda items.



The cost per credit to be charged will be decided after discussion at the Senate meeting and further concurrence from the Ministry of Education will also be sought by giving a complete brief of the process alongwith the information of offering the minor degree courses by other NITs & IITs.



BoG 66.5 To consider and approve the recommendations of the Selection Committee constituted for the appointment of Professors.

The Institute had invited applications for the recruitment of Professors for various departments vide advertisement No.29/2019 and the last date of submission of application form was 31.10.2019. Total 14 nos. of applications were received. The applications were sent to the HoDs of the respective Departments/Director's Nominee for the Department to check the eligibility of the candidates through the duly constituted Screening Committee as per the criteria laid down by the MHRD under Recruitment Rules notified in the Gazette of India dated 24th July, 2017.

The recommendations of Departmental Level Screening Committee were placed before the Advisory Committee on Faculty Recruitment (ACoFAR), constituted as per Recruitment Rules, 2017. A final list of shortlisted candidates to appear before the Selection Committee was prepared by the ACoFAR. The final lists of candidates to meet the Selection Committee was prepared in a combined meeting of the Director, the ACoFAR, the HoD and three senior faculty members of the Department. Further. in the Departments where HoD is Professor/Candidate for the post of Professor or the Department have less nos. of Professors then the Department-wise Screening Committee as constituted by the Competent Authority were allowed to participate in the said combined meeting.

In the meantime, the Hon'ble High Court of Punjab & Haryana, Chandigarh in CWP No.30552 of 2019 (Vikas Mittal and Others Vs National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra and Others) had passed the interim stay order on 13.11.2019. The operative part of the Hon'ble Court direction is reproduced hereunder:

"In the premise, respondents are directed no to finalize the selection to the posts advertised vide impugned advertisement No. 29/2019 (Annexure P-9). It is however, made clear that the respondents are at liberty to proceed with the selection process"

Further, few faculty members of the institute have filed another CWP No. 19409 of 2020 (Shelly Vadhera & Others Vs National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra and Another) seeking to cancel the advertisement no.29/2019 as the

recruitment process was not completed within 6 months. However, no stay was granted by the Hon'ble High Court.

As per approval of the competent authority, the Selection Committee meetings for the recruitment of Professors were scheduled during the period from 20.11.2020 to 21.11.2020. The short-listed candidates were invited to appear before the Selection Committee for interview and also the list of the same was displayed in the Institute website. The Selection Committees were constituted under Clause 23(5)(a) of the Statute of NITs and interviews were conducted as per the schedule but due to the interim stay order dated 13.11.2019 of the Hon'ble High Court passed in CWP No. 30552 of 2019, the recommendations of the Selection Committee for the posts of Professors could not be placed before the Board of Governors of the Institute for approval.

The Hon'ble High Court vide its order dated 31.08.2023 has dismissed the CWP No.30552 of 2019. Therefore, the sealed covers containing the recommendations of the Selection Committees for appointment of Professors in various Departments of the Institute (Ref.:Advt.No.29/2019) were placed before the Board of Governors in its 62nd meeting held on 06.09.2023 to consider and approve the recommendations of the Selection Committee constituted for the appointment of Professors. The Board decided as under:

"The Agenda item was deferred for being taken up in the next meeting of the Board of Governors."

Thereafter, in reference to the decision of BoG taken in its 62nd meeting held on 06.09.2023, another agenda item was placed before the Board of Governors in its 63rd meeting held on 21.09.2023 to consider and approve the recommendations of the Selection Committee constituted for the appointment of Professors. The Board decided as under:

"This item was deferred for being taken up in future alongwith BoG Agenda item No. 62.5."

In this context, it is stated that the agenda item no. BoG 62.5 is related to appointment of Associate Professor against Advt.No.03/2018 with reference to the applicability of Section (9) One-time relaxation or measures of amendment in the

Statutes of NIT, Kurukshetra published in The Gazette of India on 30.06.2023 and BoG agenda item no. BoG 63.3 is related to the appointment of Professors. It is relevant to mention here that the Board of Governors in its 53rd meeting held on 21.08.2020 had decided that appointment letters be issued to the selected candidates for the post of Associate Professors against the Advt.No.03/2018 in terms of the order dated 05.12.2019 of the Hon'ble High Court without applying the relaxation in qualification as contained in letter of the MHRD dated 06.10.2017. Accordingly, appointment orders were issued to the selected candidates without applying the relaxation as decided by the Board.

Further, the Board is apprised that the Hon'ble High Court vide its interim order dated 10.01.2024 stayed the operation of Section (9) in CWP No. 354/2024 (Dr. Hanuman Devidas Chalak and Ors. V/S Board of Governors, NIT and Ors.) and linked the matter with another case No. CWP-15972-2023 (Subrata Ghosh and Ors. V/S Union of India and Ors.), which has been pending since July, 2023.

Thus the Agenda item no. BoG 62.5 pertaining to the recruitment of Associate Professors may not be taken up at this stage.

Further, it is appraised that the Hon'ble High Court of Punjab & Haryana at Chandigarh while dismissing the CWP No.19409 of 2020 (Shelly Vadhera & Others Vs National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra and Another), vide its final order dated 22.09.2023 has noted the following:

The petitioners are claiming that delay in the completion of recruitment process has caused prejudice to the petitioners, however, they have feigned ignorance of the fact that pendency of CWP No.30552 of 2019 and present petition has indubitably caused prejudice to those candidates who despite expiry of almost three years from the date of interview have not been declared successful. They must have become Professor in 2020 whereas till date they are wearily looking at the door of this Court."

Further, as per para 6 of the judgement in CWP No.19409 of 2	020, the
Hon'ble High Court recorded the submission of the respondents (institute) as	3:

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The Interview conducted on 20/21-11-2020 and final result would be declared as soon as present petition is disposed of."

Thus the two court cases vide CWP No. 30552/2019 & CWP No. 19409/2020 filed in the Hon'ble High Court regarding the appointment of Professors against Advt. No. 29/2019 have been dismissed and there is no pending issue in this regard.

The Board in its 65th meeting held on 06.03.2024 vide agenda item no. BoG 65.15 directed to place the matter before the Board after obtaining the Legal Opinion from Additional Solicitor General, Supreme Court of India.

In the meanwhile some faculty members filed a court case CWP No. 6752 of 2024 in the Hon'ble High Court of Punjab & Haryana, Chandigarh seeking to declare the results of the professor's posts against the Advt. No. 29/2019. The Hon'ble High Court of Punjab & Haryana, Chandigarh in its order dated 21.03.2024 directed as under:

"The respondents are expected to complete their formalities and decide the fate of the petitioners before the adjourned date".

Next date of hearing was 08.05.2024.

On 08.05.2024, as per the request of the Institute the case is adjourned to 24.05.2024.

On 19.04.2024, the Additional Solicitor General of India, Supreme Court of India, New Delhi forwarded the Legal Opinion on the above subject. The Legal opinion is being placed before the Board for its kind consideration.

In light of the above, the recommendations of the Selection Committees for appointment of Professors in various Departments of the Institute (Ref.:Advt.No.29/2019) will be placed on the table during the meeting of the Board.

The Board may consider and approve the recommendations of the Selection Committee.

- (1) These rules may be called the Central Civil Services (Implementation of National Pension System) Rules, 2021.
- (2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. Application:

Save as otherwise provided in these rules, these rules shall apply to the Government servants, including civilian Government servants in the Defence Services, appointed substantively to civil services and posts in connection with the affairs of the Union on or after 1st day of January, 2004, but shall not apply to,-

- (a) Railway servants;
- (b) persons in casual and daily rated employment;
- (c) persons paid from contingencies;
- (d) members of the All India Services;

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Provided that the rate of interest applicable for the period from 1st January, 2004 to 31st December, 2012 shall be as notified by Department of Financial Services in its Notification F. No. 1/3/2016-PR dated 31st January, 2019 and by Department of Expenditure in its Office Memorandum No. 1(21)/EV/2018 dated 12th April, 2019.

- (2)(i) Every case of delay in registration of the Subscriber in the National Pension System or commencement of contributions under rule 4 or deduction and crediting of monthly contribution of the Subscriber under rule 6 or crediting of monthly contribution by the Government in the Individual Pension Account of the Subscriber under rule 7 shall be examined by the Head of Department or Chief Controller of Accounts for fixation of responsibility;
 - (ii) If the Head of Department or Chief Controller of Accounts is satisfied that the delay is caused on account of administrative lapse, the delinquent official or officials shall be liable to pay the amount of pecuniary loss to the Government on account of payment of interest;
 - (iii) The responsibility and the amount of liability on the part of the delinquent official or officials shall be determined in the same manner as in the case of delayed deduction or remittance of Tax Deduction at Source under Section 201(IA) of the Income-tax Act, 1961. This will be without prejudice to any disciplinary action which the disciplinary authority may propose to take against the official or officials responsible for the administrative lapse in this respect.

9. Investment of the Accumulated Pension Corpus:

The Accumulated Pension Corpus in respect of a Subscriber shall be invested by such pension fund or funds and in such manner as may be notified by the Authority.

- 10. Option to avail benefits on death or invalidation or disability of Subscriber during service:
- (1) Every Government servant covered under the National Pension System shall, at the time of joining Government service, exercise an option in Form 1 for availing benefits under the National Pension System or under the Central Civil Service (Pension) Rules, 1972 or the Central Civil Service (Extraordinary Pension) Rules, 1939 in the event of his death or boarding out on account of disablement or retirement on invalidation. Government servants, who are already in Government service and are covered by the National Pension

System, shall also exercise such option as soon as possible after the notification of these rules.

- (2) The option shall be exercised to the Head of Office who will accept the same after verifying all the facts submitted therein and place it in the service book. A copy of the option shall be forwarded by the Head of Office to the Central Recordkeeping Agency through the Drawing and Disbursing Officer and the Pay and Accounts Officer for their record. The Pay and Accounts Officer shall also make suitable entry in the online system indicating the details regarding the option exercised by the Government servant.
- (3) (a) (i) Every Government servant shall, along with the option in Form 1, also submit details of family in Form 2 to the Head of Office;
 - (ii) If the Government servant has no family, he shall furnish the details in Form 2 as soon as he acquires a family.
 - (b) The Government servant shall communicate to the Head of Office any subsequent change in the size of his family, including the fact of marriage of his child.
 - (c) As and when a disability referred to in the proviso to sub-rule (6) of rule 54 of the Central Civil Service (Pension) Rules, 1972 manifests itself in a child which makes him unable to earn his living, the fact shall be brought to the notice of the Head of Office duly supported by a Medical Certificate from a Medical Officer, not below the rank of a Civil Surgeon. This may be indicated in Form 2 by the Head of Office. As and when the claim for family pension arises, the legal guardian of the child may make an application supported by a fresh medical certificate from a Medical Officer, not below the rank of Civil Surgeon, that the child still suffers from the disability.
- (d) (i) The Head of Office shall, on receipt of the Form 2, acknowledge receipt of the Form 2 and all further communications received from the Government servant in this behalf, countersign it indicating the date of receipt and get it pasted on the service book of the Government servant concerned;
 - (ii) The Head of Office on receipt of communication from the Government servant regarding any change in the size of family shall incorporate such a change in Form 2.

- (4) (i) The option exercised under sub-rule (1), may be revised at any number of times by the Subscriber before his retirement by making a fresh option intimating his revised option to the Head of Office. On receipt of the revised option, the Head of Office and the Pay and Accounts Officer shall take further action as mentioned in sub-rule (2);
 - (ii) A Subscriber who is discharged on invalidation or disability shall be given an opportunity to submit a fresh option at the time of such discharge;
 - (iii) Where such Subscriber does not exercise a tresh option or is not in a position to exercise fresh option at the time of discharge, the option already exercised by the Subscriber shall become operative;
 - (iv) Where no option was exercised by the Subscriber and the Subscriber is not in a position to exercise an option at the time of discharge, his case will be regulated in accordance with sub-rule (6).
- (5) In the case of death of a Subscriber while in service, the last option exercised by the deceased Subscriber before his death shall be treated as final and the family shall have no right to revise the option.
- (6) (i) Where a Subscriber who did not exercise an option under subrule (1) and dies before completion of service of fifteen years or within three years of the notification of these rules, his family will be granted family pension in accordance with the provisions of the Central Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 1972 or the Central Civil Services (Extraordinary Pension) Rules, 1939 as the case may be, as a default option;
 - (ii) Where a Subscriber is discharged from Government service on invalidation or disability before completion of service of fifteen years or within three years of the notification of these rules without exercising an option under sub-rule (1), and is also not in a position to exercise an option at the time of discharge, he will be granted invalid pension or disability pension in accordance with the provisions of the Central Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 1972 or the Central Civil Services (Extraordinary Pension) Rules, 1939 as the case may be, as default option;

- (iii) In all other cases, where no option was exercised by the Subscriber, the claim of the Subscriber on discharge from the service and that of the family on death of the Subscriber, shall be regulated in accordance with the Pension Fund Regulatory and Development Authority (Exits and Withdrawals under National Pension System) Regulations, 2015, as default option.
- (7) In cases where the option exercised by the deceased Subscriber in accordance with sub-rule (1) or the default option in accordance with sub-rule (6) for benefit under the Central Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 1972 or the Central Civil Services (Extraordinary Pension) Rules, 1939 becomes infructuous on account of non-availability of an eligible member of the family for grant of family pension under the Central Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 1972 or the Central Civil Services (Extra Ordinary Pension) Rules, 1939, such option would be deemed to have become invalid and the benefits admissible under the National Pension System shall be granted to the legal heir(s) of the employee in accordance with the Pension Fund Regulatory and Development Authority (Exits and Withdrawals under National Pension System) Regulations, 2015.

11. Retirement on superannuation:

A Subscriber, who is retired on his attaining the age of superannuation or, if the service of the Subscriber has been extended beyond superannuation, on expiry of such period of extension of service beyond the age of superannuation, shall be entitled to benefits as admissible under the Pension Fund Regulatory and Development Authority (Exits and Withdrawals under National Pension System) Regulations, 2015 to the Subscriber retiring on superannuation.

12. Retirement on completion of twenty years' regular service:

(1) At any time after a Subscriber has completed twenty years' regular service, he may, by giving notice of not less than three months in writing to the appointing authority, retire from service:

Provided that this rule shall not apply to a Subscriber, including scientist or technical expert, who is, -

 (i) on assignments under the Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation (ITEC) Programme of the Ministry of External Affairs and other aid programmes;

BoG 66.8 To consider the proposal for inviting competitive bids for the disposal of obsolete/unserviceable items.

The Secretary, Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Government of India, New Delhi vide letter no. M11012/01/2023-CDN dated 01.09.2023 requested to take appropriate action for ensuring disposal of pending matters. The Office Memorandum no. F.No.Q-15/08/2023-O&M-DARPG(e.No.8181) dated 01.09.2023 issued by Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances, Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions envisaged that Special Campaign 3.0 for institutionalizing Swachhata and minimizing pendency in Government Offices to timely disposal of the obsolete/unserviceable items is to be organized as it is essential to relieve the floor area occupied by these items, avoid further deterioration and generate the revenue to the institute.

In this regard, it is submitted that at this Institute, over two decades, items accumulated and waiting for disposal in large scale. Accordingly, the Central Store collected the list of obsolete/unserviceable items with sincere and earnest efforts through various committees at department/section level. These lists of items received from each department/section have been further examined by the two Central level committees- departmental and section level. These items have been divided in 5 categories like: i) furniture, ii) Electrical & Electronics, iii) Lab Equipment, iv) ICT items and v) Hazardous items like old batteries, transformers, PVC materials etc. Both the committees have recommended the final list of items to be disposed-off. However the reserve price for such items could not be estimated, and therefore for the purpose, another committee has been constituted by the competent authority. The committee is working towards estimation of the reserve value/price of already recommended items, and it is expected that the reserve value of these items may exceed twenty five thousand rupees as the number of items are running in thousands.

As per the Statutes 17(5), the Director shall have the power to write off irrecoverable losses up to a limit of ten thousand rupees and of irrecoverable value of store items lost or rendered unserviceable, due to normal wear and tear or obsolete up to a limit of twenty five thousand rupees subject to such stipulations as may be made by the Board from time to time.



Further, as per the GFR-2017, the approval of the Board required to dispose of the items having the reserve values more than twenty five thousand rupees as each item value is assessed and reserve price will be fixed by the committee accordingly.

It is pertinent to mention here that as per the procedure, the reserve price is kept confidential in sealed cover and will be used only when the items are auctioned through bids. A detailed list of such items is enclosed as <u>Annexure – 66.8 (i) on page 42</u> for consideration.

In view of the above, the approval of the Board is very much necessary to disposed of the items for the success of the campaign of Govt. of India. The Board may consider and approve the proposal so that the competitive bids for dispose of obsolete/unserviceable items may be invited as per the procedure laid down in the GFR-2017.
