



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In accordance with the decision passed by the Hon'ble Division Bench of High Court of Punjab & Haryana, Chandigarh on 31.05.2024 in CWP No.15972 of 2023 and CWP No.354 of 2024, the Board considered the matter of recruitment of Associate Professors in NIT, Kurukshetra in the background of Section-9 of the amended Statutes of NIT, Kurukshetra notified on 30.06.2023.


In this context, the Board of Governors was informed that the one-time relaxations / measures for recruitment to the post of Associate Professor issued on 6th October, 2017 has not been exhausted in NIT, Kurukshetra till date due to pending litigations and decisions in the same have since been received on 31.05.2024. The Board was also apprised that the said one-time relaxations / measures stands implemented in all NITs except NIT, Kurukshetra. Taking cognizance of the fact, the Board of Governors of NIT, Kurukshetra, after detailed deliberations, unanimously decided to invite applications, through advertisement, from all eligible candidates in terms of Section-9 of amended Statutes notified by the Institute on 30.06.2023.

The Board further resolved that the one-time relaxations or measures for the then stagnated and eligible faculty of NIT, Kurukshetra shall be as per the one-time relaxation / measures issued on 06th October, 2017 as provided under Section-9 of the amended Statutes. The cut-off date of eligibility for all such one-time relaxation cases shall be 06th October, 2017 i.e. the date of relaxations conveyed with the approval of the Council and for all other cases, the last date of instant advertisement shall be the cut-off date of eligibility.

For recruitment to the post of Associate Professor in other cases not covered under the one-time relaxations / measures, the qualifications and other terms and conditions of appointment, as specified under Schedule-E, shall be applied in conjunction with Section-8 of the amended Statutes of NIT, Kurukshetra.

BoG 67.5 To consider and approve the proposal to include the names of current Directors of all IITs, IIMs, IIITs, NITs and SPAs in the Panel of Experts (Nominee of the Board) for the recruitment of Academic Staff in various subjects.

After detailed deliberations the Board decided that the Pay of all the 07 Assistant Professors be fixed and regularized as mentioned in the agenda; on regularization of their services on acquiring the Ph.D. degree in the Pay Band-3 of Rs.15600-39100 + AGP of Rs.6000/- +02 non-compounded increments from the initial date of joining, in terms of their appointment letters and Recruitment Rule prevailing at that point of time as well as MHRD, Govt. of India letter F.No.2-5/2017-TS.III dated 17.07.2017, MHRD letter F.No.10-3/2019-TS.III dated 28.03.2019 and DoPT OM No.1/1/2010-Estt.(Pay-I) dated 06.12.2012, FR-9(21) (a) (i) and Rule FR 27, GIO(9).

BoG 67.13 To consider the re-fixation of minimum pay in the Pay Band-3 of Rs. 15600-39100 plus AGP of Rs.7000/- in respect of Assistant Professors recruited in the year 2012 and 2013.

After detailed deliberations the Board reviewed its earlier decision taken in its 52<sup>nd</sup> meeting (Item No.52.12) held on 06.12.2019 in reference to the MHRD letter dated 17.06.2015. The Board decided that the pay of the 29 Assistant Professors be re-fixed at the minimum pay in Pay Band (PB)-3 in terms of Assistant Professors on contract with AGP of Rs.7000/- i.e. Rs.15600/- plus 07 non-compounded increments; after following the due procedure by issuing notice and providing them an opportunity of hearing. The Board authorized the Director to consider the representations, if any and also for personal hearing.







The Ministry of Education, Department of Higher Education, New Delhi vide letter F.No.35-2/2024-TS.III dated 27.03.2024 had issued a letter regarding observations of the President's Secretariat to prevent overlap between responsibilities of Director and Chairperson, Board of Governors. In this letter, it has been mentioned that in order to have a clear distinction between the responsibilities of Director and Chairperson and to prevent any overlap, the Ministry is requested to take appropriate action to amend the Statutes, if deemed necessary.

The instructions received from the Office of the Visitor of CHEIs necessitates that the existing clause 17 (15) of the Statutes of NITs, IIEST-Shibpur and NIT-Andhra Pradesh, respectively, may be amended to prevent existing overlap between the responsibilities of Director and Chairperson of BoG and to include a clause with respect to extending the tenure of the Chairperson, BoG.

As per provisions under Section 26 (2) of the NITSER Act, 2007, the Board of Governors of NITs & IIEST-Shibpur may, from time to time, make new or additional Statutes or may amend or repeal the existing Statutes. Accordingly, the Directors of the NITs and IIEST, Shibpur are requested to place the observations received from the President's Secretariat before the Board of Governors of their Institute for passing a suitable resolution for amending clause 17(15) of the Statutes of NITs, IIEST-Shibpur.

The resolutions of the Board may please be forwarded to the Ministry so as to enable us to facilitate placing the consolidated recommendations in respect of NITs & IIEST, Shibpur before the Hon'ble Visitor of NITs & IIEST, Shibpur for consideration and approval in terms of provisions under Section 26(3) & (4) of the NITSER Act, 2007.

The proposal for the amendment in Statutes to prevent overlap in functioning of Director and Chairperson:

1. At present, there are no provisions under the Statutes to extend the terms of incumbent Chairperson, BoGs or assigned the temporary

or additional charge of the post of Chairperson, BoGs of any other NITs or CFTIs in the event of occurrence of any vacancy in the office of Chairperson for any reason. As per the instruction received from the President's Secretariat, we may initiate the amendment to insert the following clause in Statute 14 of Statutes of NITs and IIEST, Shibpur:

- "(v) In the event of the occurrence of any vacancy in the office of the Chairperson of Board of Governors by reason of expiry of his or her tenure, death, resignation or otherwise or in the event of the Chairperson being unable to discharge his or her functions owing to absence, illness or any other cause, the Chairperson of an Institute of National Importance (INI) nominated by the Visitor to fill up the casual vacancy, may discharge the functions assigned to the Chairperson under section 16 of the Act, for a period of six months or till the nomination of a regular Chairperson whichever is earlier.

  Additionally, in case of expiry of tenure, the visitor may extend the term of the incumbent Chairperson for a period of six months or till the nomination of a regular Chairperson, whichever is earlier."
- 2. As the relevant provisions in the Statutes may be inserted under Clause (v) of Statue 14 of the Statutes in order to have a clear distinctions between the responsibilities of Director and Chairperson and to prevent any overlap of functions provided in the Statutes, it is therefore, necessary to delete Clause (15) of Statute 17 of Statutes of NITs and IIEST-Shibpur, which exists as under: "In the event of the occurrence of any vacancy in the office of the Chairperson by reason of his death, resignation or otherwise or in the event of the Chairperson being unable to discharge his functions owing to absence, illness or any other cause, the Director may discharge the functions assigned to the Chairperson under section 16 of the Act."

Copies of the letter F.No.35-2/2024-TS.III dated 27.03.2024, Clause 14 and 17 (15) are enclosed as <u>Annexure – 68.6 (i) from pages 34 to 38</u>.

In view of the above, it is proposed that agenda may be considered and approval may kindly be accorded for the amendments in the Statutes to prevent overlap between responsibilities of Director and Chairperson, Board of Governors (BoGs) as per the Ministry of Education letter dated 27.03.2024.

I am directed to inform that the Office of the Hon'ble Visitor of the Central Higher Education Institutions (President's Secretariat) in one of the proposal submitted by the IIIT Division of the Ministry for extension in tenure of existing Chairperson, BoGs, has returned the proposal with the following observations:-

(i) To revisit their proposal in view of the provisions contained in clause 16 (15) of the First Statutes of IIITs of the IIIT Act, 2014;

(ii) In order to have a clear distinction between the responsibilities of Director and Chairperson and to prevent any overlap, the Ministry is requested to take appropriate action to amend the Statutes, if deemed necessary.

- 2. The instructions received from the President's Secretariat in case of IIITs have also been brought to the notice of the NITs Division as the statutory provisions in case of 30 NITs, IIEST-Shibpur and NIT, Andhra Pradesh are identical to that of the provisions contained in the Statutes of IIITs. The instructions received from the Office of the Visitor of CHEIs necessitates that the existing clause 17 (15) of the Statutes of NITs, IIEST-Shibpur and NIT-Andhra Pradesh, respectively, may be amended to prevent existing overlap between the responsibilities of Director and Chairperson of BoG and to include a clause with respect to extending the tenure of the Chairperson, BoG.
- 3. As per provisions under Section 26 (2) of the NITSER Act, 2007, the Board of Governors of NITs & IIEST-Shibpur may, from time to time, make new or additional Statutes or may amend or repeal the existing Statutes. Accordingly, the Directors of the NITs and IIEST, Shibpur are requested to place the observations received from the President's Secretariat before the Board of Governors of their Institute for passing a suitable resolution for amending clause 17 (15) of the Statutes of NITs, IIEST-Shibpur.

- (2) If, in the opinion of the Chairman of the Building and Works Committee, any emergency has arisen which requires immediate action to be taken, he shall take such action and report the same to the Building and Works Committee and the Board at their next meeting.
- (3) The Building and Works Committee shall also perform such function and exercise such powers as may be entrusted by the Board, from time to time.

### 14. POWERS OF THE CHAIRPERSON, BOARD OF GOVERNORS

In addition to the powers provided in the Act, the Chairperson of the Board of Governors shall have the following powers, namely:-

- (i) he shall have the power to fix; on the recommendations of the Selection Committee.

  the initial pay of an incumbent at a stage higher than the minimum of the scale in respect of posts to which the appointments can be made by the Board under the provisions of the Act;
- (ii) he shall have the power to send members of the staff, except the Director, of the Institute for training or for a course of instruction, outside India subject to such terms and conditions as may be laid down by the Board from time to time. Incidentally, the visit abroad by the Director shall be approved by the Chairman, National Institutes of Technology Council:
- (iii) he shall execute the contract of service between the Institute and the Director or Deputy Director on behalf of the Central Government, but he shall not be personally liable of anything under such contract; and
- (iv) In emergent cases, the Chairperson may exercise the powers of the Board and inform the Board of the action taken by him for confirmation and ratification.

### 15. TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES OF MEMBERS OF THE AUTHORITIES OF INSTITUTE

Members of the Board and other authorities of the Institute and members of the Committees constituted under the Act or these Statutes or appointed by the Board and other authorities shall be entitled to traveling allowance, daily allowance and sitting fee for attending the meetings of the authorities and their Committees as laid down by the Board from time to time.

### 16. DEPARTMENTS AND CENTRES

The Institute shall be organized into such number of Departments and Centres, to be

known by such names, as the Board may, within the budgetary provision, approve from time to time, on the recommendations of the Senate.

### 17. THE DIRECTOR AND HIS POWERS

- (1) The Director of the Institute shall be appointed by the Visitor on contract basis on the recommendation of a Selection Committee constituted by him consisting of atleast five members including the Chairman who are experts in the field of technical education with experience at national and international level.
- (2) The Director shall be appointed for a period of five years and shall be governed by the terms and conditions of the Contract of Service entered into between the Institute and the Director in form specified in Schedule-A.
- (3) Subject to the budget provisions made for the specific purpose, the Director shall have the power to incur expenditure in accordance with the procedure as may be laid down in the ordinances.
- (4) The Director shall have the power to appropriate funds with respect to different items constituting the recurring budget up to a limit specified for the Head of Department in the Central Government for each item:

Provided that such appropriation shall not involve any increase in the budget and any liability in future years:

Provided further that every such appropriation shall, as soon as possible, be seported to the Board.

- (5) The Director shall have the power to write off irrecoverable losses up to a limit of ten thousand rupees and of irrecoverable value of store items lost or rendered unserviceable due to normal wear and tear or obsolete up to a limit of twenty five thousand rupees subject to such stipulations as may be made by the Board from time to time.
- (6) The Director shall have the power to donate obsolete equipment or store items, as identified by a Committee constituted for this purpose by the Director, to any educational institution in the vicinity of the Institute up to such limits as may be decided by the Board from time to time.
- (7) The Director, where he is the appointing authority, shall have the power to fix, on the recommendations of the Selection Committee, the initial pay of an incumbent at a stage higher than the minimum of the scale, but not involving more that five increments, in respect of posts to which appointment can be made by him under the powers vested in him by the provision of the Act or these statutes.
- (8) The Director shall have the power to employ Teaching Supporting Staff in the Laboratories, Technicians or Technical Instructors and Skilled Workmen, paid from contingencies from time to time, for not more than one year on such remuneration as may be decided by the Board.
- (9) The Director shall have the power to send members of the staff for training or to attend course of instruction inside India subject to such terms and conditions as may be specified by the ordinances.
- (10) The Director shall have the power to sanction temporary allocation of any building for any purpose other than that for which it was constructed.
- (11) If for any reason the Registrar is temporarily absent for a period not exceeding one month, the Director may take over or assign to any faculty member or member of staff of the Institute, any of the functions of the Registrar as he deems fit:

Provided that if at any time the temporary absence of the Registrar exceeds one month, the Board may, if it thinks fit, authorise the Director to take over or

assign the function of the Registrar, for a period exceeding one month.

- (12) All contracts for and on behalf of the Institute except the one between the Institute and the Director shall when authorised by a resolution of the Board passed in that behalf be in writing and be expressed to be made in the name of the Institute and every such contract shall be executed on behalf of the Institute by the Director, but the Director shall not be personally liable in respect of anything under such contract.
- (13) The Director may, during his absence from headquarters, specifically authorise in writing the Deputy Director or in his absence, one of the Deans or the Senior most Professor present to sanction advances for travelling allowance, contingencies and medical treatment of the staff and sign and counter-sign bills on his behalf.
- (14) The Director may, at his discretion, constitute such committees, as he may consider appropriate for smooth functioning of the Institute.
- (15) In the event of the occurrence of any vacancy in the office of the Chairperson by reason of his death, resignation or otherwise or in the event of the Chairperson being unable to discharge his functions owing to absence, illness or any other cause, the Director may discharge the functions assigned to the Chairperson under section 16 of the Act.
- (16) The Director may, with the approval of the Board delegate any of his powers, authorities or responsibilities vested in him by virtue of the Act and Statutes to one or more members of Academic or Administrative Staff of the Institute.

### 18. THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR.

- The appointment of the Deputy Director shall be made by the Visitor on the recommendation of the Selection Committee constituted by the Central Government with prior approval of the Visitor consisting of at least five members including the Chairman who are experts in the field of technical education with experience at National and International ievel.
- (2) The appointment shall be for a period of three years initially which may be extended by two times for one year each on recommendation of the Board.
- (3) The Deputy Director shall be governed by the terms and conditions of the Contract of Service entered into between the Institute and the Deputy Director in the form specified in Schedule-B.
- (4) The Deputy Director shall have all the powers of the Director during the vacancy in the post of Director of the Institute.
- (5) The Deputy Director shall assist the Director in academic and administrative work and in maintaining liaison with other institutions of higher learning and research, and also with industrial undertakings and other employers.

### 19. DEANS

- (1) The Institute shall establish not more than six Deanships.
- (2) The Director shall appoint the Deans with intimation to the Chairperson. Board of Governors.
- (3) The Dean shall hold his post for two years extendable by one more year.
- (4) Only Professors or Associate Professors shall be eligible for becoming Deans.
- (5) Broad functions of Deans are enumerated in the Schedule 'C'.

The National Institute of Technology Kurukshetra, Kurukshetra (hereinafter referred to as the Institute) having its Headquarter at Kurukshetra (Haryana) and represented by its Director (hereinafter referred to as the Institute) which term and expression shall mean and include, unless repugnant to the context, its successors, assignees, administrators of the Institute.

### WHEREAS

- 1. This MoU is executed in terms of Rule 229 (xi) of the General Financial Rules, 2017 (hereinafter referred to as GFR, 2017) and the subsequent instructions issued by the Ministry of Finance, Department of Expenditure, (hereinafter referred to as MoF) with the objective of improving efficiency of the expenditure, making the action plan outcome oriented, maintaining financial discipline and measuring performance of the Institution on key parameters against the targets set so as to improve its performance.
- 2. The Institute has the pre-defined Vision, Mission and Objectives as outlined hereunder:-

### (A) Vision:

• To be a role-model in technical education and research, responsive to global challenges

### (B) Mission:

- To impart quality technical education that develops innovative professionals and entrepreneurs
- To undertake research that generates cutting-edge technologies and futuristic knowledge, focusing on the socio-economic needs

- (ii) Help raise other resources, including loan from HEFA for expansion of infrastructural facilities, which have a direct bearing on the performance of the Institute as committed in this MOU.

- (v) Provide support in resolving any dispute with any other authority of the Central/State Government or a private party, as and when required.

### **(B) THE INSTITUTE** shall comply with:

- (i) Without prejudice to what has been stipulated in the National Institutes of Technology, Science Education and Research Act, 2007, as amended from time to time and the Statutes framed thereunder, the institute is expected to recover user charges at rates not lower than cost recovery norms
- (ii) Specific provisions as contained in the OM No.1/1/2016EIIIA dated 13.01.2017 in relation to revision of pay scales in accordance with the recommendations of the 7<sup>th</sup> CPC and any other instruction issued by MoE from time to time on issues pertaining to the Institute.
- (iii) The provisions of the GFR, 2017, including the instructions on financial advice for autonomous bodies, as mentioned in Rule 229(viii) and those concerning release of grants-in-aid, submission of audited accounts, performance report etc.
- (iv) Guidelines issued by the Central Vigilance Commission (CVC) in matters of vigilance and disciplinary proceedings etc.
- (v) Uniform accounting procedure in accordance with the guidelines issued by MoF.
- (vi) Provisions of the National Institutes of Technology, Science Education and Research Act, 2007, the Statutes framed thereunder and the instructions issued by MoE from time to time with regard, inter-alia, to creation of posts and framing of Recruitment Rules.

- (ii) Frame Rules for its corpus fund indicating clearly the IRG that can be transferred to such fund or utilized from such fund and items for which such expenditure can be incurred.
- (iii) Have clearly defined 'Delegation of Powers' for deciding all administrative and financial matters.
- (iv) Shall run courses, to the extent possible, to be self supporting without the need for cross subsidization as well as over-charging from students for flagship courses.
- (v) Ensure that all its accounts are audited by internal auditors regularly and formal audit by the C&AG in terms of the provisions of the Act of 2007 and the Statutes framed thereunder.
- (vi) Ensure that all financial operations are done under the EAT Module of PFMS.
- (vii) Present an outcome budget along with annual action plan so that it can be dovetailed in the outcome budget of MoE.
- (viii) Comply strictly with the timelines for submission of annual reports and annual audited accounts to MoE for the purpose of being tabled in Parliament within 9 months from close of the financial year.
- (ix) Forward to MoE any information required by it to satisfy any requirement related to Parliamentary Matter, RTI, Public Grievances, VIP References, Court Cases, Notices from Commissions and Statutory Authorities and also inputs for formulation of any policy.

The panel of experts (Nominee of the Board) for recruitment of Academic Staff (excluding the Director and the Deputy Director), or promotion in various subjects was approved by the Board of Governors in its 58<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 25.08.2022, for a period of two years w.e.f. 05.09.2022 to 04.09.2024. The validity of present panel of external experts (Nominee of the Board) for recruitment of Academic Staff will be expired on 04.09.2024. Therefore, a valid panel of external experts (Nominee of the Board) for the selection committee is required.

In this context, it is relevant to mention here that in reference to the e-mail dated 05.07.2024 of NITs Division, Ministry of Education regarding recruitment plan - Rozgar Mela/Mission Recruitment; the Institute has submitted the information regarding number of posts projected to be filled in next 3 - 4 months (July, August, September & October - 2024). ## BoG 68.11 To consider and approve the recommendations of the Selection Committees constituted for the appointment of Assistant Professors Grade-II in Level-10 (Ref.:Advt.Nos.04/2024 to 39/2024).

The Institute had invited Online Applications for the recruitment of Assistant Professors Grade-II in Level-10 vide advertisement Nos.04/2024 to 39/2024 for various Departments and the last date of submission of application form was 25.04.2024. Total 1963 nos. of applications were received. The applications were scrutinized by the respective Department Level Scrutiny Committee following the criteria laid down by the Ministry of Education under Recruitment Rules notified in the Gazette of India dated 24<sup>th</sup> July, 2017 and the guidelines/procedure for the selection of faculty in NIT system.

In this context, it is relevant to mention here that in reference to the e-mail dated 05.07.2024 of NITs Division, Ministry of Education regarding recruitment plan - Rozgar Mela/Mission Recruitment; the Institute has submitted the information regarding number of posts projected to be filled in next 3 - 4 months (July, August, September & October - 2024).

Therefore, the Institute has planned to complete the recruitment process in a phased manner. Accordingly, in the first phase (July, 2024), the recruitment processes for the Departments of Physics, Computer Engineering, Computer Applications, Business Administration, Architecture and Planning & Mathematics were completed. In the second phase (August, 2024), the recruitment processes for the Departments of Electrical Engineering was initiated. The applications were scrutinized by the respective Department Level Scrutiny Committee following the criteria laid down by the Ministry of Education under Recruitment Rules notified in the Gazette of India dated 24th July, 2017 & Amended Statute of NIT, Kurukshetra published in Gazette of India dated 30.06.2023 and the guidelines/ procedure for the selection of faculty approved by the BoG.

As per the procedure, all the eligible applicants for the Departments of Computer Engineering, Computer Application, Business Administration and Mathematics were called to appear for the Screening Test for the post of Assistant Professor Grade-II in Level-10. The Screening Test was qualifying nature only. The

screening test was not conducted for the eligible applicants for the Departments of Physics and Architecture & Planning as the ratio of the eligible applicants are less than the prescribed criteria i.e. for one post: upto 10 candidates and for 2-3 posts: upto 20 candidates etc. The list of eligible candidates for both the Departments were prepared as per the eligibility criteria mentioned in the advertisement. All the eligible applicants for the Departments of Electrical Engineering for the post of Assistant Professor Grade-II in Level-10 are called to appear for the Screening Test scheduled to be held on 16.08,2024.

The lists of shortlisted candidates in the screening test and as per the eligibility criteria for the Departments of Computer Engineering, Computer Application, Business Administration & Mathematics and also the list of shortlisted candidates as per the eligibility criteria for the Department of Physics and Architecture were placed before the Advisory Committee on Faculty Recruitment (ACoFAR). A final list of shortlisted candidates to appear for interview before the Selection Committee was prepared by the ACoFAR. The lists of candidates to meet the Selection Committee were finalized in a combined meeting of the Director, the ACoFAR members, concerned Department Head and three senior faculty members of the respective Department/other Department. The short-listed candidates were called to appear for interview before the Selection Committees and also the list of the same was displayed in the Institute website. The lists of shortlisted candidates in the screening test and as per the eligibility criteria for the Department of Electrical Engineering will be placed before the Advisory Committee on Faculty Recruitment (ACoFAR). A final list of shortlisted candidates to appear for interview before the Selection Committee will be prepared by the ACoFAR. The list of candidates to meet the Selection Committee will be finalized in a combined meeting of the Director, the ACoFAR members, concerned Department Head and three senior faculty members of the respective Department/other Department. The short-listed candidates will be called to appear for interview before the Selection Committee scheduled to be held during 17.08.2024 to 18.08.2024 and also the list of the same will be displayed in the Institute website. The details of vacant positions, no. of applications received and interview schedule is enclosed as <u> Annexure – 68.11 (i) from pages 62 to 63.</u>



As per approval of the competent authority, the Selection Committee meetings for the recruitment of Assistant Professors Grade-II in the Departments of Physics, Computer Engineering, Computer Application, Architecture and Planning, Business Administration & Mathematics were scheduled during the period from 19.07.2024 to 28.07.2024. The Selection Committee meetings for the recruitment of Assistant Professors Grade-II in the Department of Electrical Engineering will be held during the period from 17.08.2024 to 18.07.2024. The Selection Committees were constituted under Clause 23(5)(a) of the Statute of NITs and interviews were conducted as per the schedule. - vi) Degrees from Govt. Institution / Govt. University departments.

### Note:-

- 1. Post-Doctoral Fellows (PDFs) from the above Institutions in the same order of priority.
- 2. First Class in the Qualification (UG/PG) means First Class as specified by the University/Institution. If not specifically mentioned by the University/Institute, then 60% aggregate marks or 6.5 CGPA.
- 3. For the posts in Sciences/Humanities/Management, the qualifications at PG level will be prioritized on the above basis.

Experience will be considered if acquired in any of the following Institutions only:

- i) Teaching Experience at IIT / NIT
- ii) Fully Funded Central Educational Institutions.
- iii) IIMs & Other management Institutions ranked by NIRF up to 50 for any two years.
- iv) State Educational Institutions funded by respective State Government.
- v) Other Educational Institutions ranked by NIRF up to 100 in Overall, Universities, Engineering, for any two years.
- vi) International / National experience as Post-Doctoral Fellow with National Agencies of respective countries and Post-Doctoral Fellowships offered by Institutions, which are in QS / THE World Rankings up to 500 will be considered for the post of Assistant Professor Grade-I.

Teaching experience as mentioned above and as per RRs in an Institution/ organization will only be considered for calculating total experience.

## BoG 68.12 To consider the confirmation of Dr. Dharmendra Singh Yadav, Assistant Professor Grade-I recruited by way of direct recruitment against Advt. No. 08/2022.

Dr. Dharmendra Singh Yadav was appointed to the post of Assistant Professor Grade-I on probation for a period of one year vide letter No. Gen.-1/3795/2396 dated 07.06.2023 in the Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering in the Pay Level-12 of Pay Matrix Rs. 101500-167400/- as per 7th CPC against Advt. No. 08/2022 by way of direct recruitment on the recommendations of the duly constituted Selection Committee of the concerned department and subsequently approved by the Board of Governors in its 59<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 22.10.2022. Thereafter, he joined his duty on 28.06.2023.

As per Chapter-39 titled "Confirmation in the Swamy's Complete Manual on Establishment and Administration", a probationer will be confirmed with effect from the date on which he successfully completes the period of probation. Dr. Dharmendra Singh Yadav has completed his period of probation on 27.06.2024 and he may be considered for confirmation on the post of Assistant Professor Grade-I w.e.f. 28.06.2024.

It is worth mentioning here that the verification of Character & Antecedents in respect of Dr. Dharmendra Singh Yadav has already been conducted by the respective District Authorities concerned and has been received by the Institute. Further, it is also stated that there is no vigilance case or disciplinary proceeding is either pending or contemplated against him as per records of the Institute.

The special reports about his work and conduct has also been obtained from the respective Head of the Department and the same has been assessed by a committee constituted for the purpose. The committee has recommended his confirmation on the post of Assistant Professor Grade-I from 28.06.2024.

Under Clause 24(a) of the NITs Act, 2007, the Board is the appointing authority in case of academic staff in the post of Assistant Professor or above.
